Remove 'Non-Conforming' Highway Signs

The State Highway Department has announced that "boards" have been brought under control along 18 miles of Interstate highways within New Jersey.

A Department spokesman said all outdoor advertising which failed to conform with regulations promulgated under a 1963 State law has been eliminated on Interstate Rte. 287 from New Durham Road to Middlesex County to Rensselaer Terrace in Somerset County.

Action is currently underway to identify and eliminate non-conforming signs on all other sections of the Interstate System covered by the new law.

The 1963 State Law was passed on a section of the Federal Highway Act which declared it in the public interest to encourage and assist the States to control the use of and to improve areas adjacent to the Interstate System by controlling and removing outdoor advertising.

The provisions of the State Law and the regulations promulgated by the Highway Department

are in accordance with the Federal Act. The new law requires that all signs on Interstate highways be of a certain type and size. Signs which do not conform to these regulations are considered "non-conforming" and must be removed.

The Highway Department spokesman said it is probable that the signs on other sections of Interstate highways will be brought under control in the next few months.

But he added, the main purpose of the State law and the regulations is to preserve the scenic beauty of the Interstate System and to prevent outdoor advertising of the type which tends to distract motorists.

According to the regulations adopted by the Department after a public hearing last June, Interstate highways within commercial or industrial zones are exempt from the new law.

The regulations also allow for signs which are necessary for the safe operation of the highway.

Official signs erected and maintained by public officers or agencies in accordance with State or Federal law.

2. On-premise signs which advertise sale or lease of the property on which the sign is located or the activity conducted at that location.

3. Signs which advertise activities conducted within 1/2 mile of the highway. The number, size, location and spacing of such signs, however, are strictly regulated. For example, no such signs are permitted within two miles of an interchange, and there may be no more than two such signs in any one mile.


4. Signs which are of a type of scenic beauty, historic interest, or educational value. These are also subject to strict regulations.

5. Signs which are of a type which are required for the safety of the highway.

Administrative details of the program are available in the Highway Department's Division of Maintenance and Operations and permits may be obtained at its District Offices.

Copies of the regulations are available in the Department's New Jersey State Highway Department, 1000 Parkway, Atlantic Township, NJ 08412.

WASH POLYESTER FIBERED PILLOWS

Some pillows filled with polyester fibers are washable, some are not, points out Miss Gena Thomas, extension home furnishing specialist at the College of Agriculture, Rutgers University. If the hang-tag says "washable," this means to hand-wash them. If your washing machine has a special short-washing cycle, which includes slow speed and gentle agitation, you may wash the pillows one at a time by machine. In either case, wash them with care. The pillows may be dried in an automatic tumblers-type dryer on a LOW temperature setting. Or line-dry them, turning pillows end to end several times as they dry. Or place the pillows on a drying rack or slatted surface to dry, turning occasionally to permit air circulation.

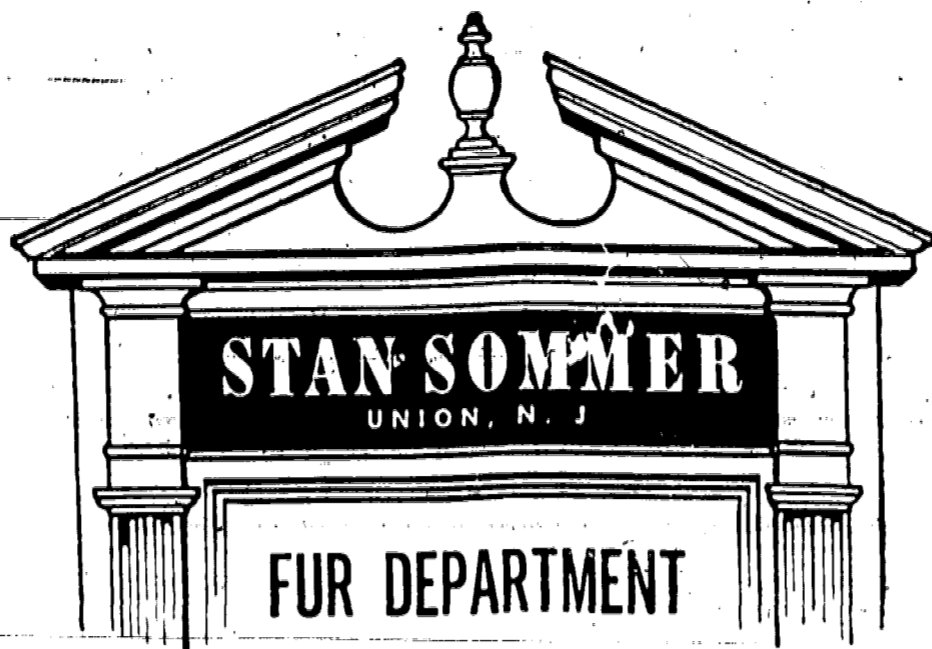

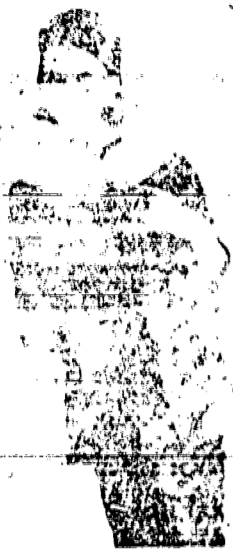

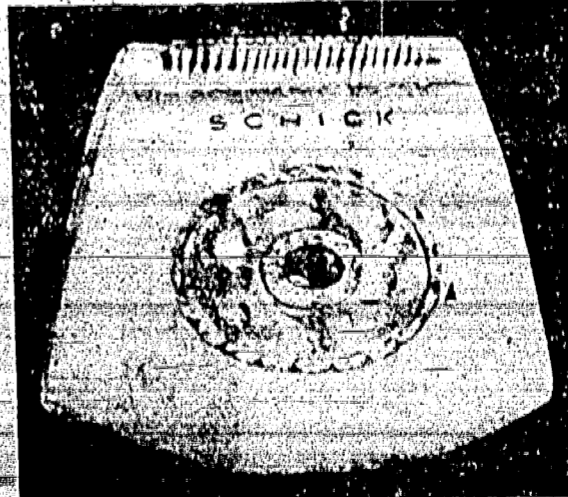
