The Christmas news was very simply the fact that Almighty God, stripping himself of His might, had entered the world in love for all men. The power of the story is in the notion that the Divine should enter into the struggle of His own creation and put Himself at the mercy of that which He had made.

There is nothing religious about this. Nor was the good news a trumpet blast for the establishment of a church or clergy. Nor was it confined to the narrow limitations of Judaism with all of its insights. Rather, the Gospel was for all men breaking through sect and creed and race and nationality.

How does modern Christmas time tell the story?

If in the spirit of this gift we join with Jewish friends in singing Hallelukah songs and appreciating the beauty of this religious observance and if in turn Jewish friends rejoice with us in the singing of Christmas carols and if Protestant attend midnight Mass with Catholic neigh-

bors and Catholic neighbors can enter Protestant parishes to join in praise this Christmas act of God will not have been in vain. For the good news—the Gospel of Christ, Peace on Earth, the freedom of love and the sword—was offered to all men, that they might be saved.

From what are we to be saved? From fear which separates us, from our door-holes behind trivial creed and vague words.

The birth of the Christ Child may symbolize freedom and release for the captive, food for the hungry, gifts and human dignity for a world that lacks the best insights of those different elements in society which make up the community.

Let us not rush the preparation of part of the Christmas story by turning to the songs of the Nativity. Let us rather sing the songs of the Nativity and other songs of the Nativity. Let our hearts be open to the possibility that they will see the good in the gift of our Father when we sing, "Hallelukah."
