



# Birthday of Baha'i founder celebrated by faith

The following information on the founder of the Baha'i faith was prepared by Mrs. L. C. Rouse on behalf of the Springfield group of Baha'is.

The birthday of a man who was exiled and imprisoned for more than 40 years was celebrated Nov. 12 in more than 31,000 localities throughout the world—2,300 of which are in the continental United States. His name is Baha'u'llah.

"Baha'u'llah, in the judgment of many, possessed the tenderness of St. Francis, the courage of Socrates, the meekness of Moses, the sanctity of Confucius, the missionary vigor of Muhammad, the moral majesty of Isaiah, the compassion of Buddha and the saintliness of Jesus. Today, several millions of people throughout the world hail this person as the hope for world peace and the savior of all mankind." This testimony was written in 1951 by Dr. David Rhyss Williams, First Unitarian Church in Rochester, N.Y. The one of whom

this was written died in 1850 near the prison city of Acca in the Holy Land. Who is Baha'u'llah? Born Mirza Husayn Ali, on Nov. 12, 1817, Baha'u'llah was the eldest son of Mirza Abbas of Nur, a valet of a minister of state in Tihran, Iran (then Persia). His family was wealthy and distinguished, many of its members having occupied important positions in the government and civil and military services of Iran. They were descendants of the ancient Sassanid Kings of Persia. According to written accounts of his early life, Baha'u'llah did not attend school, re-

ceiving what little teaching he had at home. From childhood, he was marked with characteristics that set him apart from others. He loved the outdoors and was noted for his kindness and generosity. He had an extraordinary power of attraction, felt by ministers, people of the court and children, alike. When Baha'u'llah was 22 years of age, his father died, leaving him responsible for the care of his family and management of their extensive family estates. Five years later, Baha'u'llah heard of the teachings of a young descendant of Muhammad, called the Bab (Arabic for gate). This young man proclaimed that he had appeared to prepare the way for the coming of one greater than himself, who would be the promised one of all religions and who would found a universal religion -- the kingdom of God on earth. The Bab was violently opposed by the Islamic priests and the government and was imprisoned and exiled.

Baha'u'llah immediately accepted the Bab's claim and became recognized as one of the most powerful and fearless exponents of the Bab's teachings. His first imprisonment came about because of his belief in the Bab, who was publicly martyred in Tabriz, Iran, on July 9, 1850. Following this tragic event, Baha'u'llah suffered another imprisonment and the torture of the bastinado. His next imprisonment, lasting four months, was in the "Black Pit" of Tihran. It came about because of an attempt on the life of the Shah by a young follower of the Bab who had become deranged following the martyrdom of the Bab. Although Baha'u'llah was proved innocent in the Islamic courts, the Muslim clergy conspired with the government to have him imprisoned. While confined here, Baha'u'llah reported that he received the God-given intimation of the mission that was to be his.

language and script, a universal system of weights and measures, a world court to adjudicate world problems, and an international police force to enforce its decisions when necessary. He said that man would in this day achieve spiritual maturity and that the vast and undiscovered resources of the entire planet would be exploited to the best advantage of all people. He established a new world order, and said, "The earth is but one country and mankind its citizens." Who is Baha'u'llah? Baha'is believe he is the messenger of God to this age -- in this age. They have dedicated themselves to the establishment of the kingdom of God on earth as laid out by Him. Although his followers do not have pictures of him (he wished them instead to worship God and not himself, the messenger of God) they happily show pictures of his most holy shrine at Bahji. Baha'u'llah, to Baha'is, is the "Glory of God." It is his birthday they celebrate Nov. 12.

## KEEPING UP WITH THE JONESES

The traditional American game of keeping up with the Joneses is changing, according to a recent report by the U.S. government. The ground rules remain the same, if you simply mean having what the other guy has and darn the consequences. But how much you'll need to keep your head above water, or, on the other hand, how far you'll go into debt if you don't watch out, no longer means precisely what it did only a few years ago. In a pamphlet called "Retired Couple's Budget for a Moderate Income," the Bureau of Labor Statistics points out that one of the most significant things about the decision in any particular case is simply where you happen to live in these United States.

Broadly speaking, it costs more to live in the city than in rural districts, and less to live in the South than in any other part of the country.

The most expensive place of all, as tabulated in this report, turns out to be Honolulu, which required a budget of \$4,434 in 1966. That figure includes \$1,286 for food, and \$1,502 for housing.

The cheapest city was Baton Rouge, La., where the total budget ran to \$3,486, with \$1,016 for food, and \$968 for housing. These are just a few of the sample figures. The entire table shows striking variations among selected areas from coast-to-coast and beyond.

## High school chemists attend lectures at Princeton today

More than 200 honor science students from area high schools are attending the 1968 Chemical Caravan at Princeton University today. The Caravan is a full day of lectures and demonstrations dramatizing career opportunities in the chemical industry.

Students attending include Jerry Bleich of 546 Winchester ave., Rosemary Bruno of 329 Nottingham way, Jean K. Morrison of 1869 Cider Mill rd., all of Union; Doris A. Linkletter of 94 Pembroke dr., Kenilworth; John Orak of 314 E. Blanche st. and Walter S. Drozdowski of 824 Deymour ave., both of Linden; Donald L. Kuehne of 1623 Larkspur dr., Mountainside; Martin E. Feder of 312 W. Fourth ave. and Eileen L. McMahon of 375 W. Fourth ave., both of Roselle; Richard Miserendino of 198 Maple st., Roselle Park; and David M. Margulies of 29 S. Derby rd., Springfield.

This will be the ninth annual Caravan sponsored by the Chemical Industry Council of New Jersey, of which Max A. Minnig, president of Witco Chemical Corporation, is chairman. Frank M. Norton, corporate vice presi-

dent-operations of Allied Chemical Corporation, is this year's Caravan chairman.

"We welcome the cooperation of Princeton University in staging the 1968 Caravan program," said Norton. The caravan last year was held at Rutgers University.

At Princeton, the Caravan program will be conducted by the staffs of the University's Departments of Chemistry and Chemical Engineering. Following a morning session of lectures and demonstrations, the students will lunch at the Princeton Armory, be serenaded by one of Princeton's glee clubs and, during the afternoon, go on guided tours of the industry's chemical research facilities in the neighborhood of Princeton.

The outstanding students attending the Caravan each year are selected from public, private and parochial schools in the state on the basis of academic achievement in the sciences. The Chemical Industry Council represents 160 member chemical companies with over 1,100 plants and laboratories in the state with a current employment of more than 100,000 people.

## Survey specifies county's needs for college facilities

A study released recently in Trenton by the State Department of Higher Education and the Higher Education Facilities Commission shows that Union County will need to provide facilities for 3,700 fulltime students in two-year colleges by 1975-80.

The study entitled "A Plan for Meeting New Jersey College and University Facilities Needs Through 1980" was prepared by Robert Heller Associates.

According to the study, 19,300 Union County residents will be enrolled as undergraduates in colleges and universities within or outside New Jersey in 1975-80. The study predicts 3,800 of them will attend state colleges, 1,850 Rutgers University, 400 Newark College of Engineering, 3,700 two-year colleges, and 9,550 private colleges within New Jersey or colleges and universities outside New Jersey.

The study confirms the figures announced recently by Union College, Cranford, in developing a master plan for its 30-acre campus. Union College announced it plans to provide for 2,000 fulltime students by 1975-80 and it is anticipated that the Union County Technical Institute in Scotch Plains will provide for the remaining 1,700. These plans are based on the assumption that a Coordinating Agency for Higher Education will be in operation and making use of the two existing institutions.

State-wide the study says the demand for undergraduate education will increase by 57 percent between now and 1980 from 140,000 in 1967 to 220,000

in 1975-80, and the fulltime undergraduate enrollment of New Jersey students at the public institutions of higher education will increase from 41,000 in 1967 to 109,000 by 1975-80.

THE HELLER STUDY says the total costs of providing the needed facilities at public colleges and universities will be \$738 million. Funds required from the state will be \$473 million between now and 1975 after deducting self-liquidating facilities, funds already available and likely Federal assistance.

"Now that the final study is completed, the data and the recommendations will be most useful to the Department of Higher Education and the State Board of Higher Education in developing the state's master plan for higher education," Chancellor Ralph A. Dungan said. "The Heller study provides detailed support for what has been said often before—that New Jersey is far behind in providing the higher education the state requires, and that the cost of catching up will be great. The Heller study emphasizes again the vital importance of the bond issue before the voters in November."

According to the Heller report, the six state colleges, including Newark State, enrolled 20,755 students in 1967, and they and two additional state colleges—one in the north and one in the south—should have facilities for 44,700 fulltime students by 1975-80.

In addition, the study said enrollment should be increased

as follows in the other public institutions: Rutgers University, 12,000 to 20,800; Newark College of Engineering, 2,600 to 3,400; and county colleges, 5,500 to 42,000.

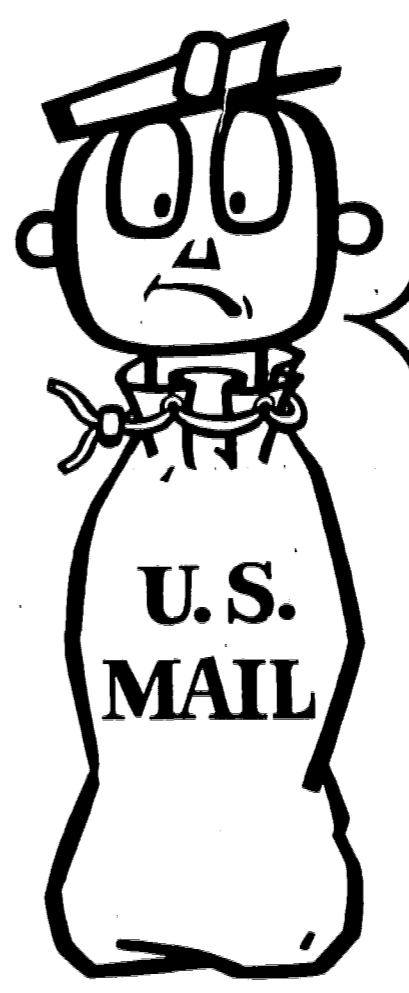

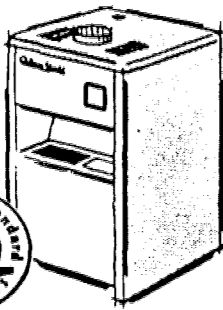

### Hospital study unit would be created by Assembly bill

A bill creating a "Commission on Hospital Care and Related Services" will be introduced tomorrow. It was announced by Assemblyman Joseph Azzolina (R-Monmouth). To date, New Jersey has no legislation which requires a need for a hospital or other health care facility or service, Azzolina noted. He said any person or group can establish a hospital regardless of the need for such a facility. Azzolina's legislation will require "certificates of need" before health care institutions expand either their services or their facilities.

"This legislation will create cooperation between private enterprise and the State government for the benefit of all. And, for the first time, the State of New Jersey through this Commission will establish recognized need as the basis for new or expanded facilities," Azzolina said.

Azzolina explained that no expansion of services or construction of a health facility shall be permitted without the issuance of a "certificate of need."

Richardson, president of the college, who noted that "the college is optimistic that the newly formed Advisory Council will provide added insight into the problems of minority youth and the role which Montclair State College should perform in confronting these problems."

He further observed that "the Montclair State College academic community recognizes the magnitude and depth of the urban situation and the myriad social problems that beset contemporary America. It wishes to serve all communities, including the subcommunities

in the urban sector largely neglected or not correctly understood until now." The Advisory Council is composed of ten members drawn from various North Jersey communities including Newark. Serving as the chairman of the council is Dr. Clifford C. Davis, president of the Riverton Laboratories of Newark.

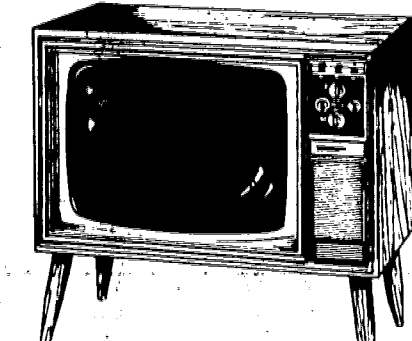

### Concert Sunday at Art Museum

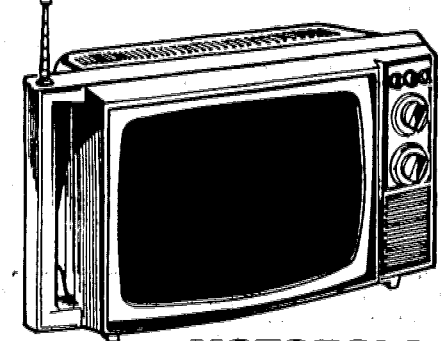
