#### Heide is second in prep shotput, third in discus

Last Saturday Dayton Regional senior Bruce Heide of Mountainside competed in the fourth annual international prep track and field meet held in Chicago. Coach Martin Taglienti of the Dayton track team attended the meet along

In the shotput event, Bruce finished in second place, with a toss of 64.934, behind Daye Kurrasch of California, who threw 63-1019 and will attend UCLA in September.
On his last attempt in the shotput, Bruce

tossed the 12-pound iron ball 67-8, but he also fouled in the process. The throw was measured and announced to the crowd of spectators because of the distance.
In the discus throw, Bruce finished third with

a heave of 1876, which established a school record, breaking his own record. Finishing in first place was Ed Kwiatkowski of Colorado a toss of 190-2. Lee Kunz of Ontario, Canada, was second with a toss of 189-0. Coach Taglienti commented, "It was the

greatest contingent of high school and prep school athletes ever assembled for a meet. It also was one of the greatest track and field meets I have ever witnessed. It was a real experience for both Bruce and myself."

Heide, who stands 6.5 and weighs 230, competed against athletes who were as big and even bigger. One boy he competed against was. 6-6 and weighed 260. Coach Taglienti added, "We are very grateful to the Board of Education and the residents of Springfield and Mountainside for their support in helping us get to the meet." Besides the competition, there were track clinics for coaches.

IN HIS YEARS at Jonathan Dayton, Heide has compiled an outstanding list of personal accomplishments. The list includes:

#### 44-year career ends Miss Keith retiring at Dayton

post as coordinator of social studies for the Union County Regional High School District, it will mark the end of a 44-year career education, 29 years and two months of which

have been spent here. Miss Keith, a native of Clinton, N.Y., came to Jonathan Dayton Regional High School, Springfield, as a social studies teacher in 1946: year later she was named department chairman, and she was appointed to the post of coordinator in 1959.

When she arrived in the district, Dayton was its only school, with a staff of 33. Now, Miss Keith's department alone numbers 38, and it has grown from the six basic original courses-Early American History, World History, Geography, U.S. History, Principles of American Democracy and Modern European History-to a 29-course curriculum, included are a variety of one-semester subjects, allowing students to take two separate courses each year.

Miss Keith has encouraged the development of courses according to students' desires and interests, and two of these-"The Changing Role of Women" and "You and the Law"have proven to be especially popular.

"The students today are very concerned about their rights," she noted, explaining the high enrollments in the two subjects. "This was one reason we instituted 'You and the Law': the

responsibility to teach some respect for the

She explained that part of the course involves students to get a better understanding of the complexities and particular problems faced by law enforcement agencies and the court

ANOTHER OFFERING which has carned great interest is a second-year psychology course, with emphasis on child psychology. As part of the program, the teenagers work with and observe young children to gain some knowledge of the growing up process, "To me, the popularity of this program is an indication that the teenagers really are interested in

family life," Miss Reith commented. During her years with the district, Miss Keith has seen extensive changes in students' interests-from the late '40s and the '50s, when "the big thing in the schools was athletics," to the protest demonstrations of the '60s, to the

more socially conscious attitudes of the '70s. "I think the students today are seeking other ways to solve problems," she said. "They may not be active in the sense of strikes and marches, but they are becoming actively 'involved' and are becoming more responsible for getting things accomplished."

The social studies students in the district are encouraged to learn more about their society. outside of class as well as in, by attending meetings of boards of education and local governing bodies, and when possible, of the state legislature. "We hope we can create an interest in government and in politics," Miss Keith noted, "because, after all, these young people will be the ones who will have to make the decisions in the future."

SHEPARD KOLLOCK 1750-1839

Founder of the New Jersey Journal Forerunner of Today's Daily Journal

Shepard Kelleck was been at or near towes. De laware in September, 1750. After receiving a good education, he went to Philadelphia, and, in that city ocquired the knowledge of printing in his uncle's printing thep that was to give him an indisputable place in the history of the notion and early journal.

At the age at 20 he left Philodelphia and settled at St Kitts in the West Indies, where he began the publishing of a newspaper

It was while there that he may possibly have met Alexander Hamilton and formed a friendship, which was reestablished later when the two young men met in America as afficers in the same artiflety regiment in the Continental Armys.

After a brilliant military career which saw Kollock tive from 2nd Lieutenant to Captain, he asked for and was granted his release from the Army on condition he establish a newspaper to counteract Tary propaganda and to be published somewhere in the vicinity where the aimy was then encomped.

Moore was taken by the Mountainside Rescue Squad to Overlook Hospital, Summit, for treatment of a leg injury. No summons was issued against Barnet





#### Mrs. Wilson sets contributions limit on reelection bid

Assemblywoman Betty Wilson this week announced that she will limit individual contributions to her reelection campaign to a maximum of \$250 per person and that she will not accept any corporate contributions.

"Accepting large contributions from wealthy individuals or corporations is unacceptable in my view," Mrs. Wilson explained. "Recent state and national scandals have demonstrated the insidious effect that large sums of money can have on some politicians.

"I believe that those of us who hold or seek public office have an obligation to remove even the appearance of being influenced by 'fat eats' or special interest groups. We cannot do so if we allow our campaigns to be financed by large or corporate contributions '

Assemblywoman Wilson, who has sponsored several pieces of legislation designed to strengthen New Jersey's conflicts of interest law described public confidence in government as being "at its lowest level in our

'This confidence can be restored," she ad-ded, "only if the public is assured that office bolders are concerned with the public welfare and not with any private interest."

Mrs. Wilson noted that her campaign support

has traditionally come from small contributors. "I prefer to keep it that way," she said. "Small individual contributions cannot be interpreted as incurring any obligation."

traffic hazards if not eliminated. The State Police and the State Association of Chiefs of Police join in reminding New Jersey's residents and visitors that fireworks are illegal in this state. Handgun controls get PTA backing

In the face of the increasing incidence of deaths from handguns - particularly among children and youth - the National PTA, during its 79th annual convention in Atlantic City. voted to support legislation favoring handgun

The Illinois PTA proposed: "That the National PTA support legislation that will restrict the manufacture of handguns and handgun ammunition." The National PTA's Legislative Program Committee expanded on this by further proposing: "That the National PTA support legislation which will ban the manufacture, importation, assembly, or sale of the 'Saturday Night Special'," a handgun which is inexpensive, easily obtainable, and frequently involved in homicides.

The PTA's views on gun control will be conveyed to Congress by the group's coordinator of legislative activity, a PTA volunteer who promotes the organization's positions on legislative action affecting education and the welfare of children and youth.

That is, vitamin C can combine with inorganic sulfates in such a way that the sulfate may later be transferred easily to other chemicals inside the cell. The group of compounds Dr. Verlangieri has been studying are various sulfate compounds.

At this point, Dr. Verlangieri believes human testing is warranted and badly needed. Side effects must be weighed in any such study, he

notes.
"With too high a level of vitamin C — beyond about 1,000 milligrams a day - some people have been found to develop kidney stones, gastrointestinal upsets and drying out of the mucous membranes, or they may suffer spontaneous abortions," he says. "But at levels lower than that there do not seem to be harmful

#### Union, Essex counties have highest dentist ratio in state. Education, Health, and Law and Public Safety.

New Jersey counties having the highest ratio of dentists per 100,000 persons, according to a study released this week by Hulph A. Dungan. NJ Chancellor of Higher Education

Union, Essex, Morris and Warren counties have a 76.3 ratio while the state ratio is 65.8 per 100,000. The national figure is \$2.1 while New Jersey's seven southern counties have a 50.9

The study reveals the average age of New Jersey's active derauts and dental hygienists is 48 years old. The survey is the second report in a health manpower series and similar reports will be compiled on other licensed health resternantale

The information contained in the report is based endala collected from a uniform survey ed all beensed bealth prefessionals in New Jersey. The survey activity was undertaken by New Jersey Departments of Higher

and funded under contracts with the Bureau of Health Resources Development of the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare and the New Jersey Regional Medical Program, Inc.

The report, which is based on responses from approximately two-thirds of New Jersey's licensed dentists and dental hygienists, contains detailed information on the location, age, activity status and other characteristics of these health professionals.

Some of the findings of the report are: Over 1.500 dentists are actively practicing in New Jersey, while over 2.100 additional dentists hold mactive or retired New Jersey licenses. Of those who do practice in New Jersey about 10 percent consider themselves to be practicing in part-time capacity

Over 16 percent of New Jersey's active dentists received their dental education in the state, and over one quarter received their dental education in Pennsylvania, New York or Delaware

Over 71 percent of the dentists practicing in New Jersey are forty or more years old, as compared with the situation for the general population of the state over 24 years old, 68 percent of whom are over 40 Nationally, luraryer, only 57.8 percent of active dentists are over 40. In general, therefore, New Jersey's dentists can be considered to be slightly older than the general population and substantially older than the active U.S. dentist work force

#### Grants for research

In 1975 the New Jersey Historical Commission awarded 77 grants for research, local hotory and teaching, under three grant programs. Sevenly-two of the recipients live in 17 of the state's 21 counties. Five persons living. in Eliness, Missouri, Ohio and Pennsylvania also received grants for research in New

#### Urban areas told to use vacant land for parks system

Planned use of vacant land in Newark for parks as the basis of "rebuilding the city the right way this time" was urged this week by the New Jersey Conservation Foundation.

In a report resulting from an 18-month study of Newark as one of the nation's most problem ridden cities, the private statewide organization recommends a drastic reordering of priorities in future planning to help cure cases of "urban blight." Basic to those priorities would be taking advantage of the existing vacant land to construct a system of parks to help improve water quality, passive recreational facilities and living conditions.

"Newark and many other cities have an unprecedented opportunity today to rebuild their run-down sections," said Richard E. Galantowicz, NJCF land-use expert who authored the report. "Because of various social upheavals of the past decade, plus increasing decay of deserted buildings and abandonment of urban renewal and highway projects, there is currently a great amount of open space available to work with. What we're saying is that the cities should be built correctly this

To achieve that end, he explained, future redevelopment should be based on a carefully researched and constructed open space plan. Such a plan would show which unused lots are vital to replenishing the city's underground water supply and would designate those areas as permanent parkland "Water tables are now so low the supply is being contaminated from salt water seeping into it and rendering it unfit for municipal purposes," he noted

#### Premiums for car insurance compared in free publication

New Jersey drivers who would like to shop for their auto insurance now have available to them a handy guide to premium rates that should aid them in choosing their insurers, State Insurance Commissioner James J. Sheeran said this week.

The information is contained in a booklet prepared by the Property-Liability Actuarial Division of the Department of Insurance at the request of Dr. Eleanor J. Lewis, director of consumer services. It was compiled from data supplied by the companies.

Entitled "Consumer Tips on Auto Insurance," the booklet offers a comparison of rates filed by the Insurance Service Office, a rating organization for about 230 companies, and by about 50 independent companies.

The rates, which are given for all 27 rating territories into which the state is divided, are those that would be charged for a typical standard-make car used for pleasure driving only with no operator under 30 and with no liability are \$15,000 per person, \$30,000 per accident for bodily injury and \$10,000 per accident for property damage. The rates include basic Personal Injury Protection (No-Fault). including loss of wages to \$100 a week, and

Uninsured Motorists Coverage. This booklet will give consumers a good view of how the rating system produces rates that vary considerable from territory to territory and from company to company," Dr

Lewis said. "It should be pointed out that the rates given are for one particular kind of car, which, typically, would be a six-cylinder, non-sports car, but could also include some four-cylinder and some eight-cylinder models. The kind of car one has affects the rates, so the guide can offer only a sample comparison, which should provide for the interested consumer a good starting point from which to conduct a shopping tour that will yield the best bargain."


