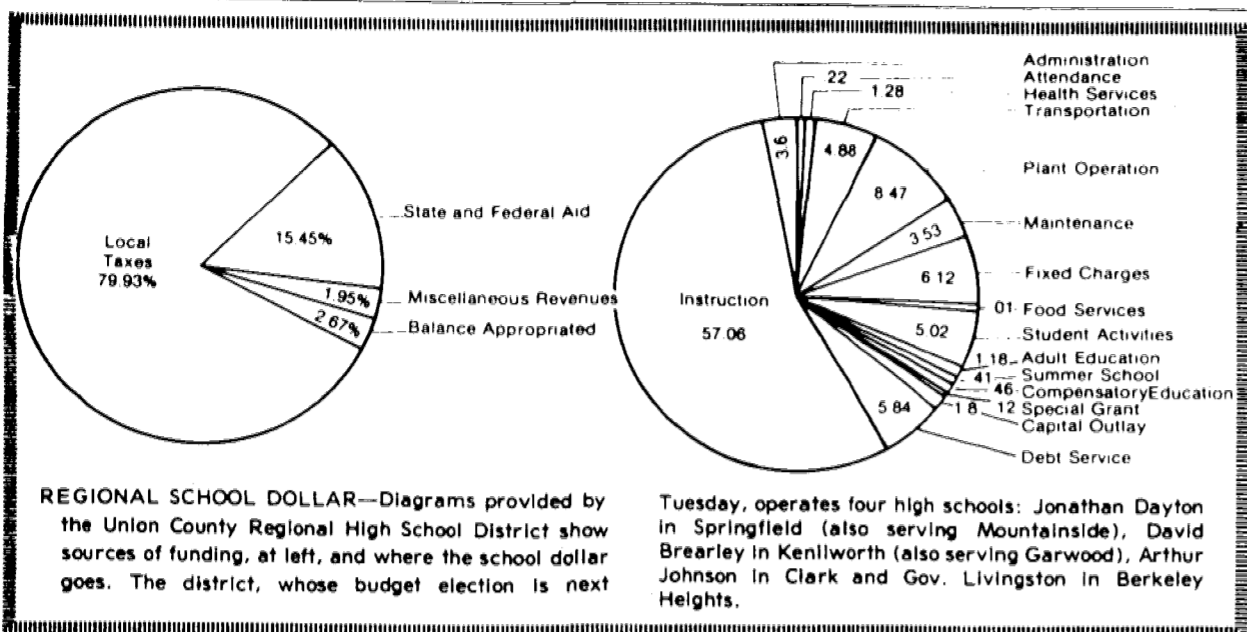


School budget is defeated by 2 votes

Regional schools budget, board balloting scheduled for Tuesday

Voters in Springfield, Mountainside, Kenilworth, Berkeley Heights, Clark and Garwood go to the polls next Tuesday for the Union County Regional High School District election, postponed by the blizzard of Feb. 6. Three of the communities will elect members of the nine-person regional board. Charles E. Vitale, board president, is unopposed in Kenilworth, as is incumbent William Keyes in Berkeley Heights. Residents, industries clash over dead end

Mountainside residents on Willow road say they were promised, when they purchased their homes, that the street would forever remain a dead end. Representatives of the adjacent Sheffield street industrial park say an exit leading onto Willow road would be the only solution to their rush hour traffic congestion. And both groups have locked horns on the ongoing issue that has come to a head with the recent snowstorms. "We bought our homes with the assurance that the street would never be opened," said one resident, and he said those assurances came from the Mountainside mayor and Borough Council and their realtors. "In the event the street was opened," said one couple, "our peace and quiet would be sacrificed and our property values would go down."

Willow street residents say they can sympathize with the businesses in that daily traffic tie-ups are frustrating and a nuisance, but, according to Felix Mongrello, "they created their own monster." "They started building up the industrial park," said Mongrello. "It wasn't the people who did this." "They are responsible for their own dilemma," said Georgette and Roger Bengue. "We didn't suddenly block our street to them. It was that way when they established themselves there." The residents said business shortsightedness is responsible for the problem, and they feel it is unfair that they should be made to suffer the consequences. "If they weren't far-sighted enough to see the problem," said Mrs. Mongrello, "then don't blame the residents." Joseph Siejk said the routing of traffic onto Willow street would dramatically alter the ambiance of the quiet, dead-end street. He said the cars would put an end to children being allowed to play in front of their homes and would cut into the residents' freedom of movement. "They should have car pools," said Siejk, "or open up Rt. 78."

Siejk said the continuation of Rt. 78 through the Watchung Reservation would ease the situation and produce an accessible highway to North Jersey and Newark. But it will be several years before Rt. 78 is completed, if at all, since environmental groups have been fighting the building. "I don't feel sorry for anyone living in Scotch Plains or Berkeley Heights who works here," said Siejk, "because they're stopping Rt. 78." Although police traffic officers and staggered work hours may help, most business representatives say they can only be considered temporary "stop-gap" measures. All-State Legal Supply Co. president Harry Busch said the Willow road exit is "the only long-term solution. A policeman is only a 'band-aid' answer."

But residents say the proposed exit falls short of a workable solution, also. They say traffic will only build up one block over and there will be a jam on Summit road instead of Sheffield street. A reduction of cars going into the industrial park is the only answer, according to the residents, but they're not prepared to call for a lay-off of employees. "We're not denying business or progress," said Siejk, "The more people that are put to work, fine." But Siejk and his neighbors say they do not feel compelled to aid the businesses at what they say would be an expense to their lifestyles. That, they say, is the businesses' problem.

Three selected as nominees for Navy Academy

Three Mountainside students are among 60 Union County residents nominated by Congressman Matthew J. Rinaldo R-12, to compete for vacancies at U.S. service academies in 1978. Russell Laustsen of Saddle Brook road, Richard Schmedel of Deer Path and Brad Weiner of Ridge Drive have been nominated to compete with 16 others for vacancies at the Naval Academy in Annapolis. Rinaldo said his nominations were based on college test scores of the applicants. Those nominated by the congressman will be required to compete for appointment through a process administered by the academies. Rinaldo said final appointments to fill vacancies allocated to the 12th congressional district will be made by the academies following their evaluation of the candidates' college entrance examination results, their academic and extracurricular records in secondary schools and their potential for careers as officers in the armed services.

Glass project this Saturday

The Jonathan Dayton Regional High School Key Club will resume its "glass-in" project this Saturday after snow forced a cancellation last month. Key Club members asked town residents to bring glass, sorted by color, and newspapers, tied into bundles, to the high school parking lot between 8 a.m. and 3 p.m. The club sponsors the recycling project on the third Saturday of each month.

Williams faults 2 on board Esemplare and Mazzucca chosen

The 1978-79 \$2.1 million Mountainside school budget was defeated Tuesday by two votes, 252 to 250. Shocked Board of Education members shook their heads and voiced their disappointments when the decision was announced at the conclusion of the board's regular meeting. However, they did not call for a recount.

Lipda Esemplare and Anthony Mazzucca ran neck-and-neck in their uncontested races for two seats on the board with Esemplare winning 347 votes to Mazzucca's 323. Board members did not comment on the final tally, but earlier, board member Dr. Arthur Williams criticized co-members Patricia Knodel and Charles Speth for violating board ethics by publicly denouncing the budget after the board majority had approved it. "I am deeply incensed by a letter from Mrs. Knodel and Mr. Speth that appeared in the Mountainside Echo and the Plainfield Courier-News," said Williams. "The board passed a code of ethics that I hoped would have precluded this kind of attitude."

Williams said one code bylaw calls for all board members to support the majority rule, and he said the letter should have not made reference to the fact that both Knodel and Speth were board members. "If you had signed the letter with just your names, without adding 'Board of Education' underneath them," said Williams, "I would have nothing to say to you."

Knodel countered Williams' remarks by stating she had a right to her freedom of expression, regardless of the board's ethics. She assailed Williams for alluding to censorship should this type of incident continue. "This code of ethics was not meant to muzzle any board member," said Knodel. "No code of ethics in this country will deny any board member his freedom of speech. This is not Nazi Germany; this is the United States." Although the argument was not resolved, Williams said actions such as Speth's and Knodel's letter-writing contributes to a lack of communication between the board and Mountainside voters and creates dissension within the body itself. "This does divide the town," said Williams, "and it divides our board."

The election turnout was described as lighter than in previous years, with 630 votes being cast from a total of 4,984 registered voters. The budget will now go before the Borough Council, who will decide how much money should be slashed from the total. The Board of Education, however, has the final say on what items will be cut.

Chiefs' group to work with borough police

The Mountainside Borough Council has reportedly agreed to allow members of the N. J. Association of Chiefs of Police to work with borough Police Chief Edward Mullin to iron out problems regarding alleged police misconduct which may have prompted a recent ordinance establishing the position of director of public safety. Haledon Police Chief Roy Martin said he is one of three chiefs who will "study department operations and work with Chief Mullin in coming up with solutions to the problem." Chiefs Howard Runyon of Passaic Township and James Moran of Westfield also will be involved in the project.

The association's recent meeting with the council was "very cordial," according to Martin, who said the purpose of the study centers on hopes that the council will reconsider its proposal to appoint a public safety director, which the association has charged will strip Chief Mullin of most of his duties. "We've assisted other communities where they have proposed bringing in a civilian director," said Martin, "and in all cases the proposals have been dropped. We haven't failed in any community." Martin said the chiefs will meet periodically with Mullin and will report back to the council "when we've made up a report."

Although some public officials declined comment, most expressed optimism regarding the chiefs' involvement. Councilman Nicholas Bradshaw said he "appreciated the interest of the police organization to land whatever help they can," while Councilman Donald Halbsgut called the move a "positive step." Councilman Timothy Benford said the governing body "thought it prudent" to accept the association's offer of assistance "at no cost to the borough" and added that the study

"may give us a better understanding of police procedures and recommendations that will benefit the community." There have been reports that at least part of the police department problem concerns personality conflicts between certain borough officials, but Councilman Tom Spina disagreed and said the council has been justified in action it has taken regarding the police question. "There's no personality conflict," said Spina. "The council has had very good grounds for any of the action it's taken up to this time, including the director of public safety ordinance."

DOT to report about alignment plan for Rt. 78

The N.J. Department of Transportation will staff a one-day information center next Thursday, Feb. 23, to inform the public of progress made in development of the Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) for Interstate Rt. 78 in Union County. Department personnel and consultants will staff the information center at the Berkeley Heights Municipal Building from 3 to 9 p.m. A draft of the FEIS is ready for Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) review. The FHWA review is intended to provide the Department of Transportation with comments which the department will use to revise the draft. Final FHWA approval is expected in late spring. Some mitigation measures incorporated into the Rt. 78 design involve the alignment in the wetlands area; a shift in alignment away from the Sayre House, Springfield, to

Lung patients offered class in breath control

The fourth in a series of physical reconditioning programs for patients with lung disease will be offered in April by the Central New Jersey Lung Association and Alexian Brothers Hospital, Elizabeth.

Applications for the eight-part series, scheduled to begin April 3 from 2:30 to 4 p.m. at the hospital, are available from the Lung Association, 1457 Raritan rd., Clark, 07066.

Classes will focus on breath control and diaphragmatic (belly breathing) techniques, respiratory medications, use of respiratory therapy equipment in the home, reconditioning exercises, diet planning, emotional aspects of lung disease and other subject matter.

Respiratory care nurses, respiratory therapists and physical therapists will conduct the sessions under the supervision of Dr. Brian Collins, medical director of the hospital's Lung Unit.

To allow for individual attention, class size will be limited to 15 patients. Wives, husbands or close family friends are encouraged to participate to

familiarize themselves with the patient's condition and to learn how they can be of assistance when problems arise.

New land use plan yields maximum use

Serving the interests of nature, budgets of homebuyers and profit goals of developers is something akin to juggling a dozen fresh eggs while walking a tightrope. Yet, architect Ronald Sebring, partner of the Manasquan-based architectural planning firm of Dinklage-Sebring, says it can be done.

"As our society has become more aware of its responsibilities with respect to the natural environment, and as there is less attractively situated land for residential development, the developer of homes has had to face increasing difficulties and complications," Sebring said.

Due to the time loss resulting from adherence to greater number of governmental imposed building restrictions and procedures about the long-term interests of buyers, Sebring completed in 1975 a rather revolutionary system. Called the "Land Use Intensity Matrix," the system determines the

best use of land. The resultant recommendations state how land can be developed for environmental protection and the creation of homes which will be sufficiently attractive to consumers, so that developers can expect profit from their investments within a stated time frame.

Drexel University's architectural school recognized the system, even before it was put to use, with a citation award. But now, after the successful implementation of the system, it has proven most effective in a "practical test in the field."

As used for the development of Anchoage Harbor on Silver Bay in Toms River the system takes into consideration the implications of soil and hydrology, indigenous vegetation and wildlife, customer demography and psychology, local municipal educational services and available transportation and utilities.

The system provided the groundwork for rezoning the site to conform with DEP rules, designating everything from how home foundations should be situated for efficient construction to the determination of the pricing which resulted, in part, in the community's success. Also important were the designs of the townhomes, also provided by Dinklage-Sebring.

FHA subsidy lowers rates at Barnegat

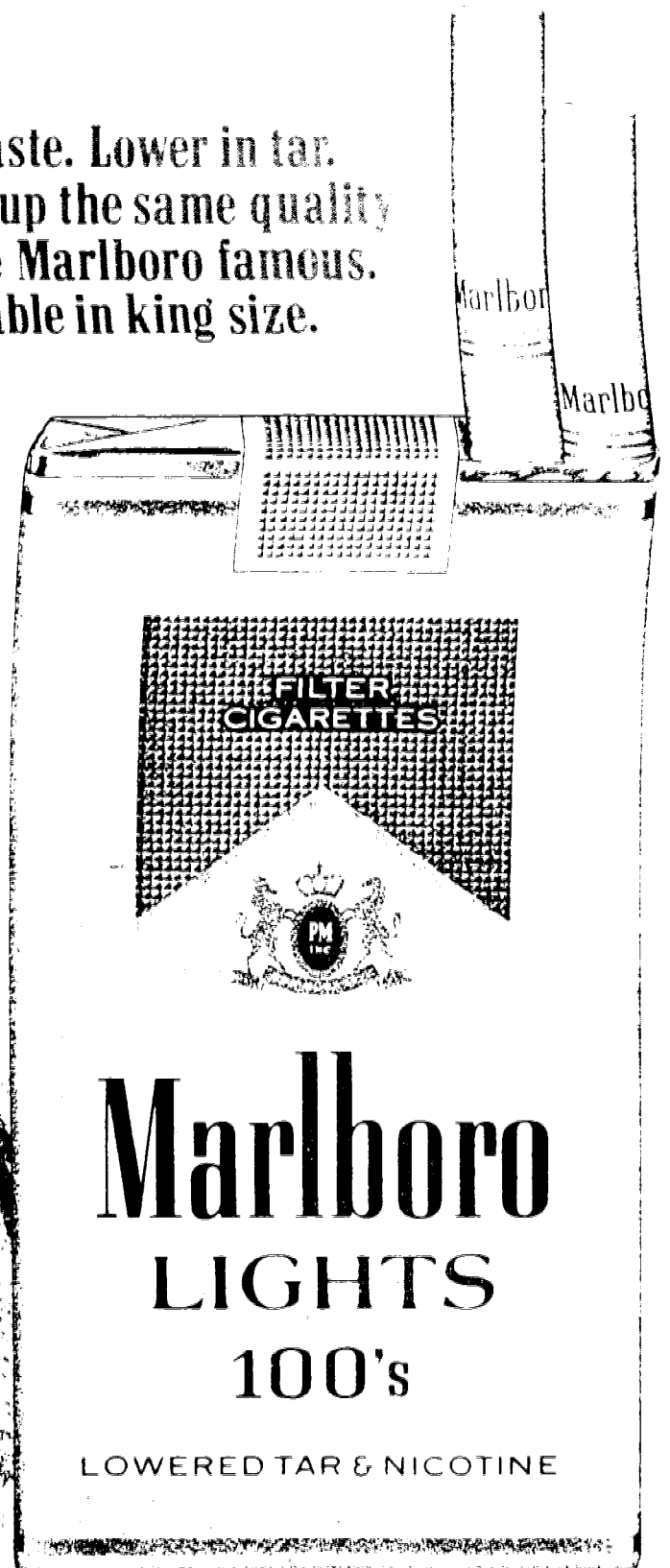

Grocery prices show increase by 0.2 percent

Retail grocery prices in the New York-Northeastern New Jersey area edged down 0.2 percent between November and December. It was reported today by Herbert Beinstock, Regional Commissioner of the U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics.

The December change primarily reflected declines for coffee and eggs, as well as lower prices for a number of pork and poultry items. Over the year ending December 1977, area grocery prices rose 6.6 percent.

Seasonally adjusted, the food at home index was down 0.9 percent between November and December. Beinstock noted that the December decline compared favorably with a 1.3 percent rise for the prior month.

Over the last half of 1977, Beinstock said relative stability in food prices contrasted with increases averaging one percent a month during the first half of the year.

The December 1977 and December 1977 increase of 6.6 percent followed a dip of 0.2 percent in the preceding year, according to Beinstock. Coffee prices, up 81 percent over the year ending December 1977, accounted for over half the food at home index rise.

The food at home index was 196.9 in 1977, equals 100 in December. Expressed in terms of purchasing power, the New York-Northeastern New Jersey area consumer had to spend \$196.90 to purchase the same grocery basket of nearly 90 items which cost \$100 in the 1967 base period. Beinstock noted that between November and December the price of 49 items went up, 33 declined and six remained unchanged.

Boat show will open for silver celebration

In the background, the Captain and her Two Mates, three pretty gals, chosen from over 50 Jersey girls, on the Convention Hall stage, on Sunday, Feb. 5, will begin their nine-day reign as "ambassadors of good will" in behalf of all show visitors and the press.

The visitors can expect a "boating industry presentation" including a majority of today's popular name brand boats, both sail and power, in all sizes, types and in all price brackets.

In the power boat division, small but fast and sleek outboards will lead the way. Moving up, day cruisers and overnighters with outboard or stern-drive options will be exhibited.
