Presidents have trivial sides, too

Everyone knows George Washington is the "Father of our Country" and that Abraham Lincoln freed the slaves. But who was the only bachelor in the White House? What does the S. in Ulysses S. Grant stand for? Who was the only president born in New Jersey?

With Presidents' Day being celebrated Monday in Union County and around the nation, now might be a good time to learn some things about our presidents that haven't received much space in most history books.

For example, the only bachelor ever to be president was James Buchanan. For those know-it-alls who answered correctly, here is the followup question: Who acted as "First Lady" during his tenure? The answer: Harriet Lane, daughter of his sister, Jane. She served as Buchanan's hostess during presidential social functions.

The "S." in Ulysses S. Grant stood for Simpson. The most unusual middle names belonged to Warren GAMALIEL Harding, Rutherford BIRCHARD Hayes, Richard MILHOUS Nixon, Lyndon BAINES Johnson.

Surprisingly, half of the 40 presidents did not have middle names. John Quincy Adams, our sixth president, was the first chief executive with a middle name. And except for William Henry Harrison, our ninth president who died in office after




only 31 days, we did not again have a chief executive with a middle name until Grant, the 18th president.

The lone Garden State native was Grover Cleveland, who was born in Caldwell. Cleveland is the only president to serve two, non-consecutive terms. By a formal ruling of the State Department, Cleveland is referred to as our 22d and 24th presidents.

In the longevity department, John Adams and Herbert Hoover were the only presidents to reach 90 years of age after leaving office. Being vice-president must cause less strain since Franklin Delano Roosevelt's former number two man, John Nance Garner, lived to 98 and another, Levi Morton (Benjamin Harrison's VP) was 96 when he died.

In the family department, the aforementioned (and short-lived) William Henry Harrison had the most children of any president, six sons and four daughters. Hayes was next with eight children, seven of them sons. Thomas Jefferson had the most daughters, five (he also had one son).







Visiting Nurses group hears talk

New Jersey is one of just a handful of states in the nation that require certification of home health workers, according to Nancy Grippe, RN, coordinator of certification of home health aides for the New Jersey State Department of Health. She made the comment at the annual meeting of the Visiting Homemakers of Central Union County, where she was the guest speaker.

Grippe offered a detailed account of the status of home care in the state as well as in the nation. She reported that only 10 states in the nation, New Jersey among them, have any requirements for certifying home health workers.

All home health aides employed by the

Visiting Homemakers are state certified, having completed a 60-hour course approved by the State Department of Health and the National Home Caring Council.

More than 3,000 aides were certified by the state in 1983; Central Visiting Homemakers trained 73 during the year,

Grippe said that there is a low retention rate of aides in the home care field and Central Visiting Homemaker agency is constantly recruiting and training aides to meet the needs of home care in the 18 communities it serves.

The speaker quoted a study concerned with qualities one should look for in selection of good, "stay with the job" aides. Women over 50 years of age, whose children are grown and probably out of the home, and women who are in good health, make the most competent home health aides and remain in the home care field for many years, she said.

Central Visiting Homemakers will begin recruiting for the April class and will be looking for women and men who fit this description, she said.

Puppetry course aimed at the hearing impaired

The silent world of the deaf and hearing impaired and the magic world of entertainment will come together in "Puppetry for the Hearing Impaired," a non-credit course being offered in March at Union County College.

"Because of their own extreme abilities with pantomime, deaf people have realized that puppetry is an art which can be used in their presentations and in development of their own talents," Prof. Eileen Forrestal, coordinator of the UCC interpreters for the deaf program, said.

During the four-session course, students will learn to make puppets and develop professional skills for performing a skit, Prof. Forrestal said, and they will see the connection between sign language and means of communication.

"I hope people will come, not only to learn a new skill, but more importantly, to have fun," Karen Schnitzspahn, inexperience is not tension 206 or 238.

Schnitzspahn is director of "Karen & Company Puppets" and has some knowledge of sign language. She has been actively involved with "Kids on the Block," a nationally-acclaimed program for handicapped children, which uses puppets to visualize the handicap problem, in order to make children more sensitive to the needs of the handicapped. A sign language interpreter will help Ms. Schnitzspahn instruct this course.

"We want the students to know that there will be an interpreter at class so that they will feel comfortable about attending," Prof. Forrestal said.

The course will meet on Saturdays, beginning puppetry as an effective March 3 from 9 a.m. to 12 noon at the Cranford Campus. Tuition is \$35.

Pick of the LPs, "Doin' It My Way," by Howard Johnson (A&M Records).

With this, his second A&M album, Howard Johnson plans to take up where he left off with "Keepin Love New," his 1982 debut. Considering the success of the album, you'd have to agree that the 26-year-old Florida native made a wise decision.

"Keepin' Love New," released in May 1982, became a Top 10 Black album. It yielded a major single in "So Fine," a Number One dance and Top Five R&B hit. Johnson himself was dubbed "the prophet of R&B.

"The first album showed me that I could reach that core R&B audience." Howard says. "What happened with 'So Fine' really boosted my confidence because I'd never considered myself a singer of dance-oriented material. I grew up singing gospel, classical and middle-of-the-road songs, but I never really thought I had that much excitement until I got onstage after 'So Fine.' The people just brought it out of me. I really credit the audience with what has taken place, giving me the inspiration and confidence to be able to venture into other areas."

With "Doin It My Way," Johnson has continued to mime the dance music vein "because that's what got me started." He used different producers this time, moving from the team of Kashif, Morrie Brown and Lawrence Jones to Mic Murphy and David Frank, who have achieved fame as the System, Kashif, now a successful solo artist himself, was unavailable—when—it—came—time for Howard to record, a turn of events that Johnson calls "a blessing in disguise."

"I wanted to go with a different sound." he explains. "I heard about 'You Are in My System,' by the System, and I started getting calls from friends who said. 'Do you have a new record out?' Did you change your name to the System?' When I finally heard the song, I realized that Mic Murphy and I have similar

voices. I also love the high-tech sound they get, so I gave Mic a call, and within four or five weeks, they were producing my album."


The results? Replies Howard, "How do you describe perfection? How do you describe chemistry in motion? It's what I had been looking for. I was in the studio for nine days to do eight songs. I really could not have asked for more—it was perfection, like clockwork."

Most of all, continues Johnson, Murphy and Frank "let me sing. I love my first album, but it's a producer's album. The second album is a Howard Johnson album. I think people will realize that my voice has more range to it. I have a range of five octaves, and they let me use it. I'm also a pretty melodic singer, and that comes out in this album as well."

The material on "Doin' It My Way" was written by the System. "Lyrically." says Howard, "the songs were fine-tuned for me. Musically, they're very high-tech and advanced." Most of all, the songs draw on a variety of colors within the dance music spectrum. They are straight-ahead dance items, such as "Let's Take Time Out" (the first single), "Let This Dream Be Real" and the title song; there also are mid-tempo numbers ("Much Too Much," "Jump Into Fire"), where "my voice is a little fuller and more expressive."

The ever-confident Johnson plans to reveal other aspects of his talent, his way, with a ballad, his songwriting, his instrumental abilities, as his career progresses. "I'm taking things one step at a time,"

'We went into seafood 16 years ago

when George, who was my father, passed away," Friedman said. "I decided at that time that there was no seafood restaurant in this area. We always sold a tremendous amount of peel-your-own shrimp. It was one of our highlights. Jumbo shrimp and hotdogs were our biggies.

'We decided to change our image a bit a seafood restaurant as opposed to a tavern," he continued. "We bought a lobster tank with live lobsters, which became a big thing. We started to feature live lobsters, soft shell crabs and Florida stone crabs in season.

"While seafood consumption is just fine, one can't argue with success, or the hungry masses, Friedman said.

"We still sell hotdogs. Just recently we went back to selling our footlongs by popular demand. I tried to phase them out, but people wouldn't let me.

"I'm not going to fight them," he added. "I'm going to give them what they want."






