'Helping Hand' proves reassuring

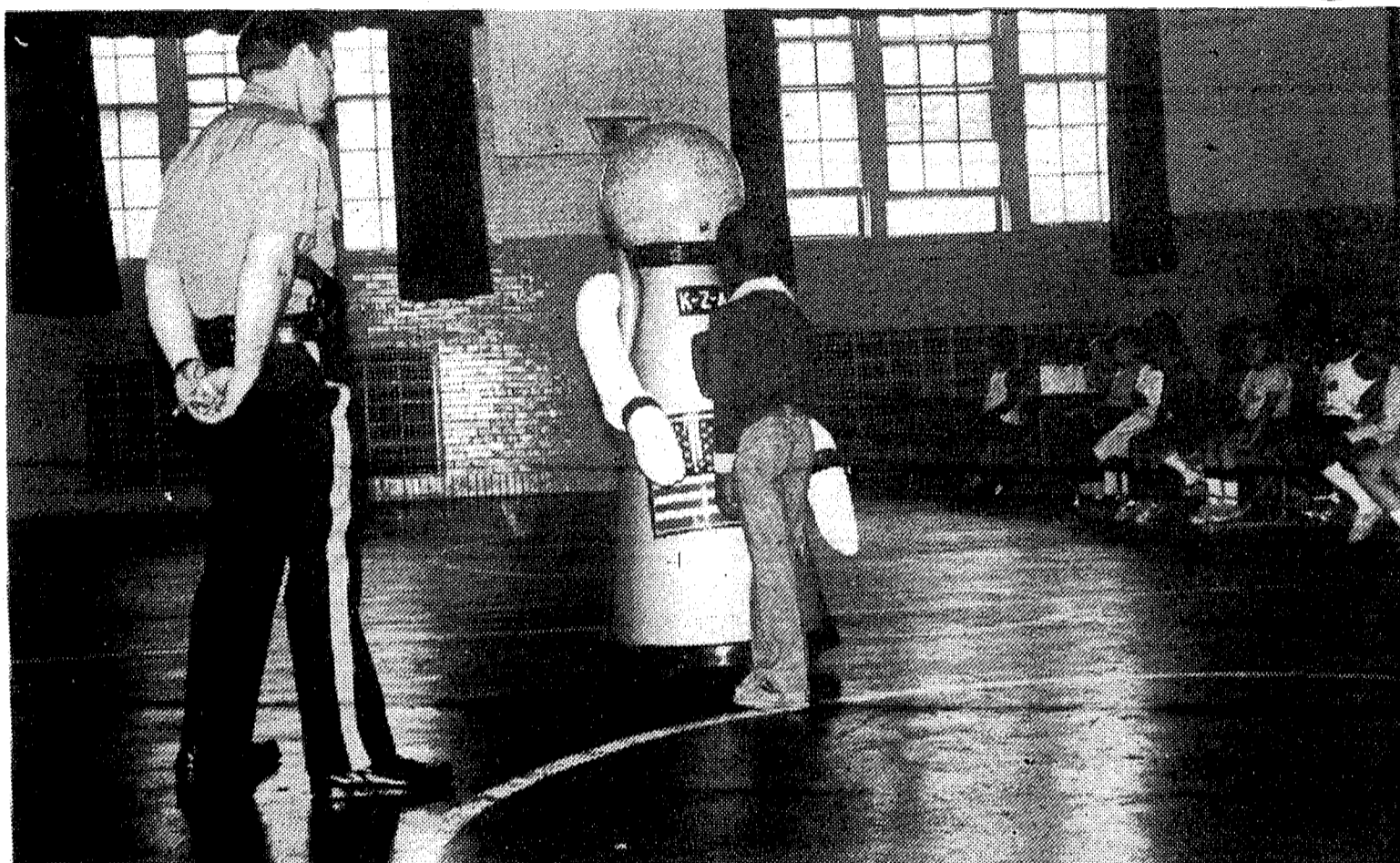
A five or six block walk alone for a six-year old child can be a pretty frightening experience. What helps some children to have successful journeys to and from school is a red helping hand posted in windows of houses on their route-to-school.

The "Helping Hand" program, which began about 10 years ago, has since been replaced in some communities by Neighborhood Watch and Block Parent associations. The goal is simple: to provide a haven for children who might encounter problems on their trips to school.

The citizens who volunteer to serve as helping hands sign a waiver to permit a local, state, and FBI background check. Cindy Matta, who is attempting to organize the program in Springfield, said that the checks are kept confidential. The head of the group is informed when volunteers qualify, and not given the reason if an applicant fails.

Once a volunteer is checked, they are issued the helping hand card to place in a front window of their home. Traffic and Safety Officer Joe Dugan suggests that a volunteer remove the hand if they will be out.

"It may discourage the kids if

they go to a house with a hand and get no response," he explained.

Dugan began the program in Roselle a year ago. He has under 200 volunteers which he considers, "not a great percentage." Dugan said he has seen "a great amount of success with the program. We are trying to bridge the communication gap between kids and the police."

Dugan spoke to school children, K-4, to explain the hand's significance to the children. He also reinforces the program by school visits, accompanied by a talking car, a robot, and a talking dog. "We try to present a message to the kids they will respond to," Dugan said.

At the beginning of the school year, Dugan gives the school children a coloring book full of safety tips. He collects the books at the end of the year and issues each child a decal of the safety robot.

Matta said the volunteers are also given a set of guidelines for incidents that may arise when

they do take in children. "The volunteer does not administer food or first aid. They should immediately call the parent, the school, and the police, if there is a problem. The house is really used as a holding station," she said.

Getting lost, a skinned knee, and a need for a bathroom, are some of the common reasons children seek a helping hand. In Linden, Union, and Roselle, where the programs are operating, no serious incidents have been reported.

Union is in the process of revamping their 10-year program. Joyce Garbinski, the representative of Union Township PTA's, said that many of the original volunteers have taken jobs, causing a shortage. The Optimist Club in Union donated the group's helping hand posters.

Roselle Park is one of the communities that has organized a block parent association. "Block Parent" signs are placed in windows of volunteers during the day. At night, 30 community

members run a "Green Light" program. Participants of this group place a green bulb in an outside light. The green light is a welcome sign to teenagers who may have problems while they are out at night.

The programs all use the support of the local board of education, municipal government, and the police department. Although the program is relatively inexpensive, some expenses are incurred for the helping hand posters and the police background checks. About 20 local merchants made Roselle's program possible. Linden's program at School 6, which began in January, has not amounted to any costs.

Joyce Mazurowski, president of the PTA at School 6 and founder of the program, said her volunteers made the hands from red construction paper and had them laminated at a vocational school. A police officer made the background checks for the 18 volunteers. Dugan also did the background checks in Roselle.

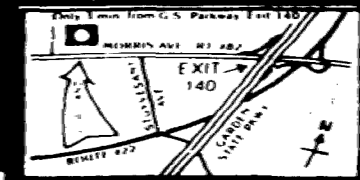



50th joins academics, business

Union County College continues its year-long 50th Anniversary celebration by joining the educational community and the world of business and industry in a seminar on the College's Cranford Campus on Thursday, March 15, according to Mrs. Linda Leifer, director of alumni affairs and anniversary chairperson.

The education/business seminar, "Union County College and The World of Work," will use the theme, "Partners for Progress—A Dialogue," to open discussion and facilitate the sharing of ideas between the two related fields, Mrs. Leifer said.

Leaders from the academic world, business, and government will participate in the day-long event, which will open with a keynote address by Dr. Dale Parnell, president of American Association of Community and Junior Colleges.

A panel discussion, moderated by Dr. Norman Will of Glen Ridge, seminar chairperson and chairperson of the College's English/Fine Arts/Modern Languages Department, and represented by membrs of education and business, will respond to the address. The day will conclude with an afternoon of workshops that will focus on specific questions facing the related fields as they work together for progress in Union County.

"Since its inception in 1933, Union County College has been serving the people of Union County by providing a strong liberal education and preparing students for further education and the world of work. Now, as the College celebrates its 50th anniversary, we are offering this seminar as a means to assess ourselves—to see where we are and where we need to go," Mrs. Leifer said.

Among the questions to be explored by the seminar will be: "How well is higher education and specifically UCC serving the needs of the business and industry's community?" and "How can the College and the world of work join together in an effort to keep up with the demands created by new technologies?" The results of the ideas shared throughout the full-day program, will be collected and a summary will be distributed to all participants as a record of the day and as a starting point for future activities, Dr. Will said.

The education/business seminar, co-sponsored by the College's faculty and

the Boards of Trustees and Governors, marks the seventh event in the 50th Anniversary Celebration calendar. 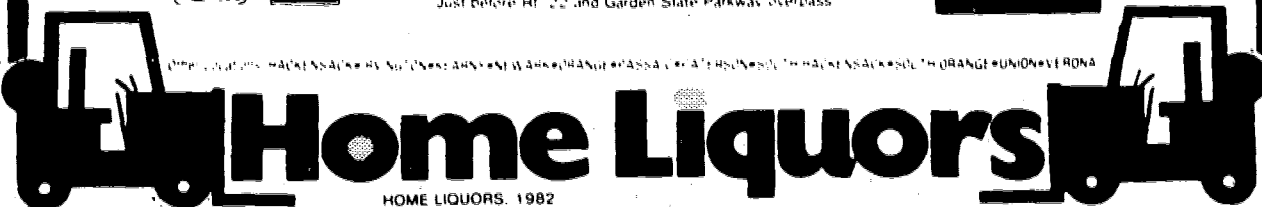

Horticulture series schedules lectures

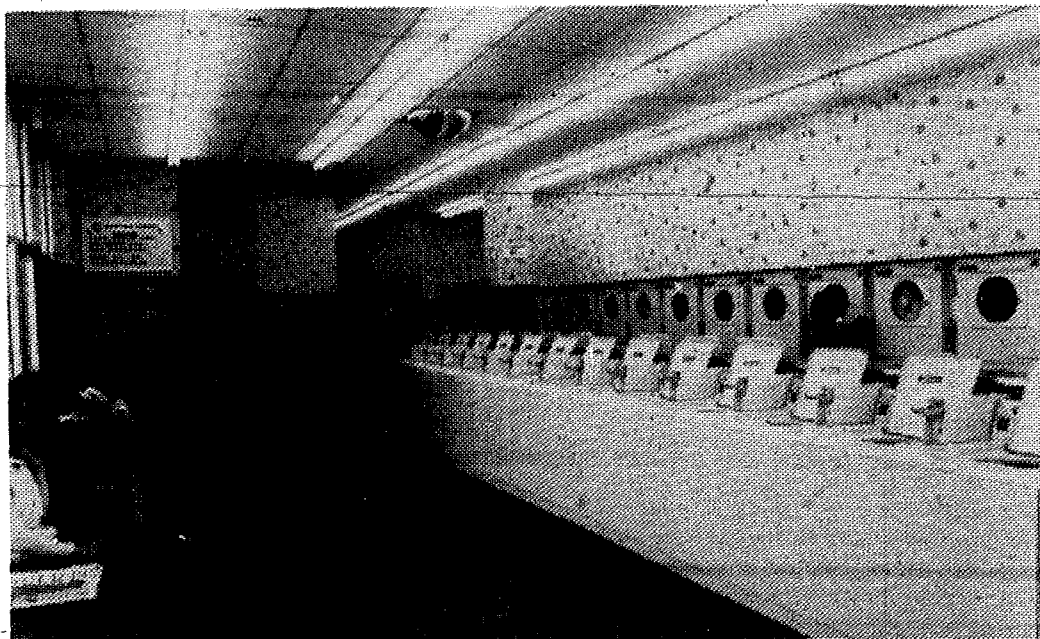
The Spring 1984 Home Horticulture series of lectures by the Union County Cooperative Extension Service has been announced by Agricultural Agent Stephen Bachelder.

Tapes will help decide future of Old Rahway

A crew from Suburban Cablevision TV-3 recently videotaped the inside of the closed Rahway Theater. The video views will serve as a backdrop for a discussion of the theater's future as an art center in a half-hour show to be aired three times during the next two months.

Janet Shalestik will be hostess at the discussion program to be aired March 14 at 8:30 p.m., March 26 at 9 p.m. and April 5 at 7:30 p.m. Representatives of the county government and county arts groups will participate, together with representatives of Rahway Landmarks, a nonprofit corporation that plans to acquire the "Old Rahway" for conversion to a county arts center.

Rahway Landmarks' fund drive, which was launched in June of last year, raised approximately \$85,000 of its \$175,000 initial funding goal.

The Arts Center fund drive is managed by Union County manager Arthur J. Grisi and coordinated by Eric Rickes, a Rahway Landmarks trustee and past president of the Rahway Chamber of Commerce.

The 1,440-seat Rahway Theater has been closed since Nov. 1981, following a short-lived venture as a showplace for X-rated films. It opened in 1928 as a combined vaudeville-movie facility and is among the last of its breed to remain intact with its original architecture preserved.

Pick of the LPs, "Singing Whale Songs in a Low Voice," by Steven Miller (Windham Hill Records HP-104).

Steve Miller, guitarist, producer, composer, arranger and engineer knew from a very young age he was a musician. Miller recalls walking with his parents in New York's Washington Square Park at age seven listening to street musicians. He announced "I want to do that!" He went home to New Jersey became a radio and record addict and picked up a guitar. By high school, he was playing music of the Hendrix era and beginning to discover the jazz of Davis, Towner, Coltrane, Coleman, McLaughlin and Morgan via his devotion to WRVR in New York City.

Miller took his determination westward after high school, studying at the University of Arizona and graduating from San Francisco State in communications. He found the joys of the other side of the microphone at KSFS and then KFRC, and springboarded into his early professional music work with synthesizer pioneers Bernie Krause and Malcolm Cecil. These associations of the mid 1970s produced and created music for a variety of radio and TV spots as well as giving Miller his first taste of "being around the studio" with the likes of Gil Scott, Heron and Brian Jackson and "around the bend," working with Cheech and Chang on synthesizer music for "Next Movie."

In the late 1970s, the great ear we hear behind so many of the recent Windham Hill records, he began his career in

record production. First came work with Andy Narell's "Hidden Treasure" and Stickman off the steel drummer-pianist's "Inner City and Hip Pocket" albums, respectively. He produced "Punk Polka" for San Francisco Bay area favorites, the Toons, and engineered some of NPR's popular "Jazz Alive" programs, featuring such artists as Stan Getz and Billy Harper. Steven Miller's path now crossed with Windham Hill founder and guitarist Will Ackerman, who knows a great ear when he hears one.

Before long, Miller was a force in Windham Hill recording sessions. He assisted in the producing and engineering of important long-playing albums. "The great ear" is now a full-time Windham Hill recording cog and will be a force on the upcoming albums of others. He also is producing and writing along with Andy Narell and under the auspices of Windham Hill, all the music for the Apple Computer television commercials.

And now, Steven Miller takes his boyhood aspiration and another step with his own LP (self-written, produced, engineered and arranged), "Singing Whale Songs in a Low Voice" (HP-103). Miller lays down his own jazz-fusion style, drawing off the influences of that ear that has listened to so many hours of rock, folk and jazz. Steven joined forces recently with his "best girl," Ellen, and got married. They live near Washington Square Park in New York, that same neighborhood where he first announced exactly what he would be today.

Dr. Zomzely, who began his violin studies in Europe, continued with

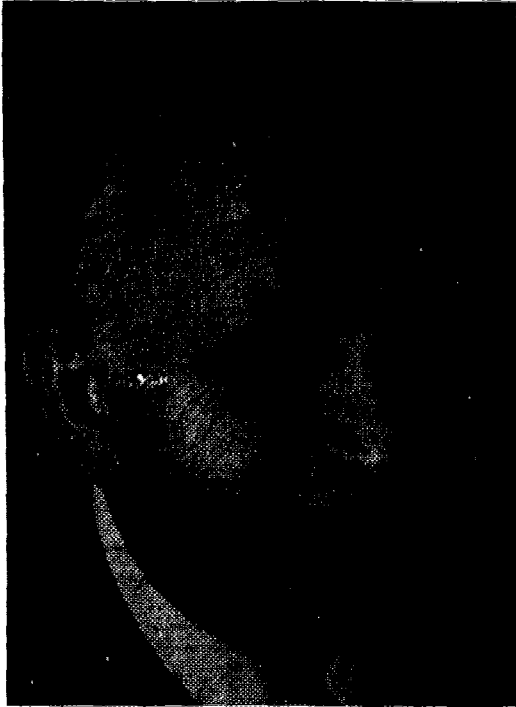

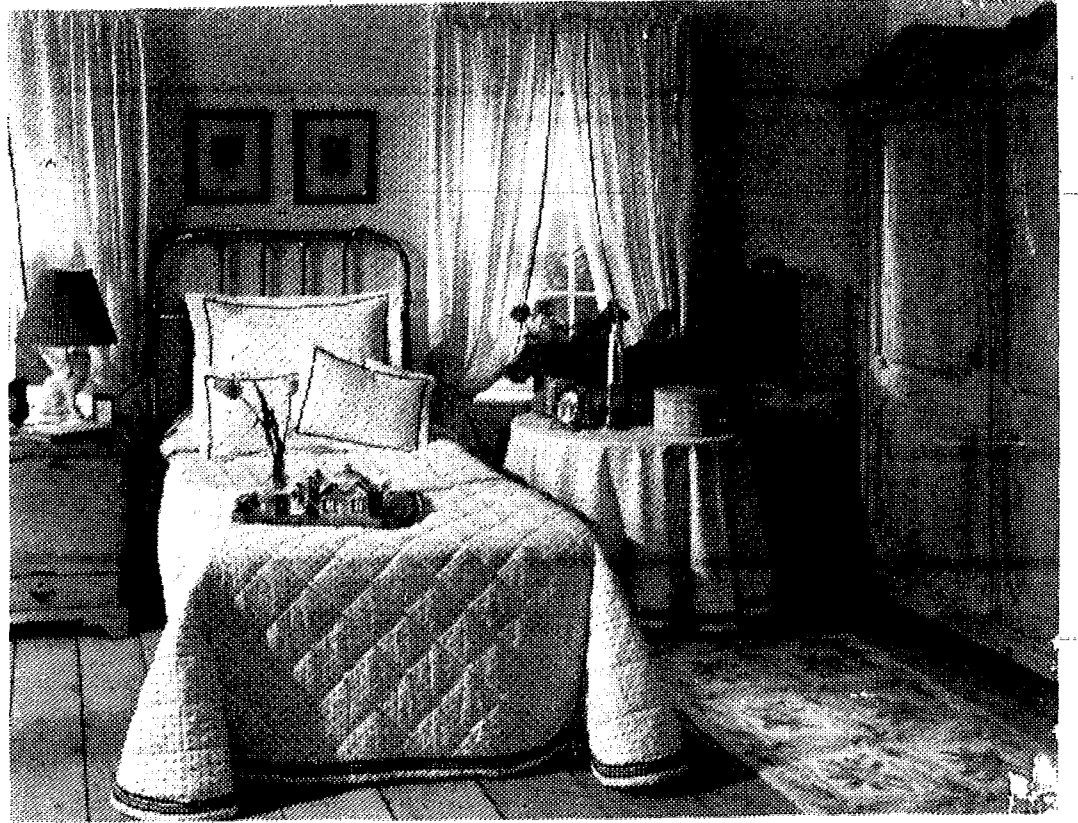

- Barbecue grills.

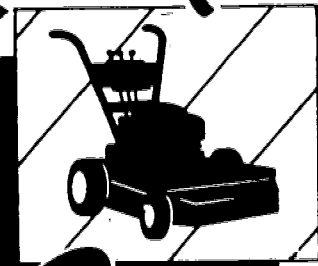

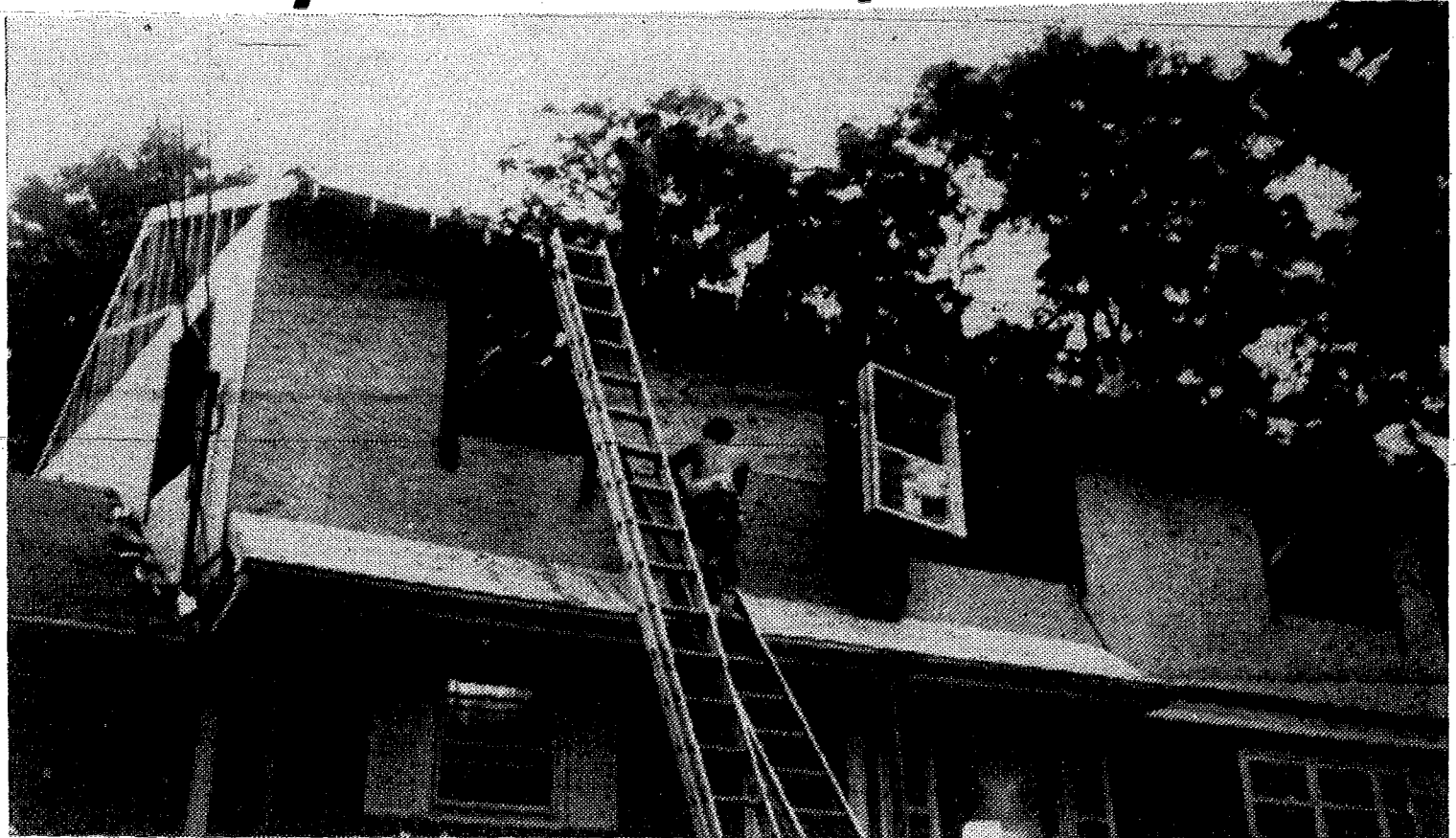

Goldfish aquarium cheers home

A natural beauty that can be enjoyed within the home are ornamental fish. The fascinating movements, bright and distinctive color and various shapes of ornamental fish are a delight for the whole family.

Enclosed porches (or California or Florida rooms) are ideal locations for goldfish aquariums. Goldfish, unlike tropical fish, do not need a heated aquarium and are a great addition to spring and summer living.

Goldfish are fun, goldfish are beautiful and, in fact, a study conducted by researchers at the University of Pennsylvania in 1980 concluded that watching ornamental fish in home aquariums was a definite benefit in relieving stress.

So, if you have some extra space and would like something your whole family could enjoy, consider an aquarium without ornamental goldfish.

To go about starting a goldfish aquarium, you will first want to locate a good dealer. If you have a friend who has an aquarium, ask for a reference; otherwise the phone book lists most tropical fish retailers.

Tropical fish are warm-blooded and require a heated aquarium. Goldfish do fine in an aquarium with a water temperature of around 65 degrees.

When visiting a tropical fish store, get an idea of different sizes of aquariums and type of equipment you will need. A goldfish aquarium should be covered with a reflector using fluorescent lights which do not throw off a significant amount of heat.

In terms of a stand for your aquarium, your dealer will have a selection, but you could also consider building one to match the decor of your room. This is relatively simple but be sure it's very sturdy since the weight of the aquarium and water is quite heavy.

A good idea is to build an open stand out of 2 x 4's and then cover the front with decorative paneling to match your room decor and leave the back open so that the wiring and tubing from your aquarium's pump and filter can be stored out of sight.

In addition to the reflector you will also need a good filter since goldfish are rather messy. Your dealer can help with a selection.

Even though you don't need a heater, it's a good idea to use a thermometer to make sure the water temperature does not rise beyond 80 degrees F.

A recent development in thermometer technology is the liquid crystal digital thermometer which affixes to the outside of the aquarium, yet measures most accurately the water temperature.

If you are going to keep a lot of fish you will also want a separate air pump in addition to the filter to add more oxygen to the water.

Decorating your goldfish aquarium can be great fun. There are multi-colored gravels, highly decorative backgrounds, hundreds of ornaments as well as plastic plants so real in reproduction it's almost impossible to distinguish them from live plants.

Most good retailers will have a complete assortment, and your selection should be based on the size of your aquarium and the amount of money you decide to spend.

Once you have set up your aquarium, you should add a chlorine neutralizer to the water and initially add only a few fish. These fish will help develop the proper biological condition necessary to maintain a fully stocked aquarium. After three or four weeks, assuming everything is functioning properly, you can then go ahead and add the rest of the fish.

Aquarium maintenance is much simpler than people think. Every two weeks a partial water change (not greater than 20 percent), by siphoning the water from the bottom of the aquarium, is all that's required.

A device called the Hydro-Clean allows efficient siphoning by separating the debris from the gravel and removing it with the water from the aquarium. On a monthly basis, your filter will require minimal maintenance. That's all there is.

Following this simple routine, your goldfish will live a long and prosperous

life. In fact, one of the biggest problems people have is spending too much time maintaining their aquarium. On a daily basis, goldfish should be fed a small quantity of flake food or pellet.

Goldfish are truly beautiful and have been increasing dramatically in popularity. There are many different body shapes and colors to choose from in a variety of price ranges. They will survive at much lower temperatures.

Goldfish and tropical fish form the basis for a truly rewarding life-time hobby—and one the whole family can enjoy.

Insulating home will lead to energy \$avings

According to most energy experts, higher energy costs are a predictable fact.

Though millions of homeowners across the United States have taken the initiative and insulated their homes, many should upgrade their insulation levels.
