New Jersey jaunts

It's no place for drive-up campers

(Editor's note: This is the first of a series of articles on outings to spots of interest in the state, all within easy driving distance of Union County.)

A cold rain filtered down through a thick cover of trees, slowly saturating our camp site. The warm, dry comfort of "civilization" was a three-mile hike or a one-mile canoe trip away. In either case, we would be thoroughly soaked by the time we got back. So, we decided to make the best of our trip to the wilderness and spent the day fishing in the rain.

The relative seclusion of the Round Valley Wilderness Camping area adds much to the sense of meeting head-on the challenges of the great outdoors. One does not dash back to the car after forgetting a toothbrush.

Located in Lebanon, N.J., the wilderness camp sites are part of the Round Valley Recreation Area that opened in 1976 after the valley, surrounded by the Cushetunk Mountains, was dammed up and flooded to create the Round Valley Reservoir.

As Park Superintendent Jim Apffel pointed out, the park's picnic and bathing areas — used mostly by day-trippers — are invisible from the wilderness camp sites. Because of the way

the park is laid out, picnickers and campers rarely come in contact with each other.

Round Valley, Apffel said, is one of the few parks in the state to have actual wilderness camp grounds. It is not for the park-the-car-and-pitch-the-tent camper, who likes to watch Mets games on a television hooked up to his car battery.

"Our biggest problem is that people think we have drive-up camp sites," the supervisor said. "We have to be careful to explain to them that they must to be willing to hike."

Wilderness camping requires more planning than recreational camping. Back-packers must be prepared to lug all their equipment — tent, sleeping bag, food, clothing, first aid kit — in one haul.

The trail is rocky, winding up and down hills. The rigorous three-mile hike to the nearest camp site — the furthest site requires a six-mile hike — can leave even the heartiest camper out-of-breath and dripping with sweat.

But for nature lovers, the walk is well-worth the effort.

Deer, perhaps because they are protected in the park, are plentiful. Other numerous animals include raccoons, opossums, chipmunks and squirrels. Apffel, who has been at the park since it opened, also noted a recent increase in the numbers of migratory birds.

"There are so many different types of birds," he exclaimed. "Because the reservoir is so new, some birds are just finding out about it."

Along the trail in the woods, Apffel said, an abundance of "normal farm birds and wood birds" can be seen and heard. From the shoreline, observers can spot Canada geese, ducks, loons, hawks and even an occasional eagle. Turkey vultures, with wing spans of three to four

feet, can often be seen circling high overhead.

Wilderness camping's 'nofrills' approach to everyday amenities is another consideration for campers.

"A lot of people expect showers and running water," Apffel said.


They will find outhouses — generally clean, but still outhouses — and hand-pump

wells.—Approximatley 10 outhouses serve the 116 camp sites, with most sites being within a hundred yards of a toilet.

The wells are another matter. On a recent trip in mid-May, the closest well to our camp site broke down and the next closest was more than two miles away.

It's graduation day

Gov. Thomas Kean will be in Union County for two graduation ceremonies today. He will be the principal speaker at the college in Union Township which bears his family's name and also will take part in the 50th anniversary commencement at Union County College, Cranford.

Kean College

Gov. Kean will speak at 10 a.m. today when 1,844 students are graduated by Kean College of New Jersey in Union during commencement exercises on the Townsend Green.

The governor and three others. Dr. Lena F. Edwards, George Segal and Celeste Holm, will receive honorary degrees.

Edwards, Segal and Holm will receive honorary doctorates in humanities.

Kean will receive a doctor of laws degree. He is being recognized for legislation he initiated since first being elected to the State Assembly in 1968: the Educational Opportunity Act, the Green Acres Act, the Coastal Facilities Act, the Clean and Safe Streets Act, and the Consumer Protection Agency Act.

He also is being cited for his work since becoming governor in January 1982. including his advocacy of a revenue bank to finance infrastructure repairs and for streamlining state government. fostering higher education, and economic development, particularly in the area of high technology, college of-

Dr. Edwards, of Lakewood, formerly of Jersey City, is a surgeon gynecologist. who, when she retired from private practice in 1960, became a missionary to migrant farm workers in Texas, and was awarded the Presidential Freedom Medal for her efforts. She also has educated people in poverty-stricken areas of New Jersey to the benefits of the Pap test for uterine cancer and received a Humanitarian Award in 1973 from the American Cancer Society for that work.

Segal, who lives and works on a farm in South Brunswick, is a sculptor recognized for his plaster-bandage figures of ordinary people posed in environments ranging from the dinner table to a steel mill and a restaurant booth. He was graduated from Rutgers University in 1950

Celeste Holm, winner of an Academy Award for her performance in "Gentleman's Agreement." has played both dramatic and musical roles and has been active in New Jersey encouraging participation in the arts.

Of the 1,466 undergraduates, 387 completed their course work in February and another 185 will complete it in August. Among the 378 graduate students, 38 completed their course work

in February and 40 will complete it in August.

When the governor looks out across the Townsend Green to deliver his address, he will see beyond the audience the library and farm buildings constructed by his great-uncle, U.S. Senator Hamilton Fish Kean. The school, then called Newark State College, acquired the Kean property in 1954 and moved there from Newark in 1958. In 1973 the college adopted the name Kean. John Kean, chairman and chief executive of the Elizabethtown Gas Co., and a cousin to the governor, is an original trustee of Kean College. He and the governor represented their family in the transfer of land to the college.

Union County College

Gov. Kean and U.S. Sen. Bill Bradley will keynote the 50th anniversary commencement of Union County College today, according to Dr. Leonard T. Kreisman of Westfield, acting president of the college.

'As a public institution, Union County College is especially honored to welcome both Gov. Kean and Sen. Bradley as we celebrate our golden jubilee mencement," Kreisman said.

"It is most appropriate that Gov. Kean and Sen. Bradley can join us for our 50th anniversary commencement, since Unioń was founded in 1933 as a federal emergency relief project to combat unemployment and has been a prominent member of the state's higher education systems since 1933," Kreisman said.

One of the state's 19 community colleges, Union County College was created in 1982 through the consolidation of Union College, Cranford, founded in 1933, and Union County Technical Institute, Scotch Plains, founded in 1960.

The commencement, which caps a year-long Golden Jubilee celebration. will begin at 6 p.m. at Fables Sanctuary on the Cranford campus. The raindate is

There are about 800 candidates for associate in arts, associate in science, and associate in applied science degrees, certificates and diplomas. The figure includes students enrolled in two-year associate degree programs at the College's Cranford and Scotch Plains campuses, as well as students from the Schools of Nursing and Schools of Radiography of Elizabeth General Medical Center and Muhlenberg Hospital which conduct cooperative programs with the college. Other students are enrolled in one-year academic programs leading to a certificate or diploma.

In addition to Kean and Bradley, a number of student representatives are also scheduled to address the graduation exercises. Kreisman will deliver the charge to the graduates.



'One-Plus' calls to begin July 1

New Jersey Bell announced that, effective July 1, its customers will have to first dial "1" when placing calls outside their area code.

Customers who do not dial "1" will hear a recorded announcement telling them to dial again using the new procedure.

The phone company is introducing One-Plus dialing to provide 152 new central office or telephone exchange codes to meet increasing customer demand for both voice and data services.

Many of the company's central switching offices are near capacity and the introduction of One-Plus dialing will eliminate the immediate need to create another area code within the state.





reservoir can be drunk as is. While some may feel better about boiling it first. Apffel assures that the water is "very clear, very pure."

"I personally think it's one of the cleanest I've ever seen," he said, explaining that the rocky hills surrounding and feeding the reservoir act as a "natural filter."

While the water is clean, those venturing onto it in boats are advised to use extreme caution. The 55 billion gallon reservoir is 80 to 120 feet deep in most parts. Winds, whipping around the hills and over the water, can easilly kick up swells that make travel by canoe all but impossible.

"Through the years, there have been fatalities," Apffel said, noting that the majority of deaths occur when canoes and other small boats capsize. Due to the depth of the reservoir, the water temperature remains very cold until mid-or late-spring and the occupants of overturned boats soon experience hypothermia — the rapid loss of body heat

From October through April. Apffel said, someone in the water for more than 15 minutes "is as good as dead."

Even during the spring and summer, boaters are required to wear life jackets and urged not to overload their crafts. Weather conditions for boating also must be considered. Apffel said many boaters attempt to make it back to their camp sites in high winds instead of beaching their craft, walking back to camp and retrieving the boat later.

"We have people who seem more concerned with their equipment than their lives," he said.

Proper planning, and a healthy respect for the water can keep a weekend hiking or fishing trip from ending in disaster.

"In an emergency, medical or otherwise, there is really nobody there." the supervisor noted.

Such a warning may be enough to dissuade some from making such a trip in the first place. But for those looking to get away from it all and willing to "rough it", few sites in the Garden State are comparable to the Round Valley Wilderness Camping area.

HOW TO GET THERE

Take Route 22 west into Hunterdon County. An access road leads directly to the park off Route 22. Watch for "Round Valley Recreation Area" signs.

FEES AND REGULATIONS

The camp site fee at Round Valley is \$5 per night. A maximum of six persons, using one tent unless otherwise authorized, are allowed at each site. Reservations are not required but are strongly advised during the summer months. The reservation fee is \$3.

Furred pets and alcoholic beverages are prohibited in all overnight facilities.

Fishermen should be advised that a valid New Jersey fishing license is required. Scuba divers must obtain a permit and register at the park's main office.

Detailing hundreds of occupations and professions, it reveals where the new industries are offering real opportunity while older ones are phasing out. Just a super book in many ways!

More specific is "Dream Jobs: A Guide to Tomorrow's Top Careers" by Robert W. Bly and Gary Blake (\$8.95, Wiley Press softcover) which should be mandatory reading for any young person poised to make important life decisions as well as anyone considering a change in career direction. 



Focus on entertainment

By MILT HAMMER

Pick of the RPs, "Rhyme and Reason," by Missing Persons (Capitol Records).

The evolution of pop music has seen the form come full circle, from the fresh expressionist art of its earliest days to the mundane play-by-play formulae employed so readily today. Hackneyed uses of simile and metaphor, usually creeping in under the guise of "poetic license" and the tired three-chord progressions favored by the majority of today's pop practitioners, have in actuality taken contemporary music through what can only be termed a retrogression.

There are, however, a number of groups that feel a responsibility to return popular music to a higher art form, to lead the movement back toward realism; realism in concept and approach, realism in songwriting, realism in instrumentation. One group so committed is Missing Persons who, with its new album, "Rhyme And Reason," has achieved desired change while remaining true to its original musical conceptualization.

It was in 1980 that percussionist Terry Bozzio, guitarist Warren Cuccurullo and vocalist Dale Bozzio, following a tour of duty with Frank Zappa's band, decided to form their own group. Relying on their formidable instrumental and vocal prowess to assimiliate a pop sound with a totally new approach, they fashioned a scope far broader than the standard radio fare of the day. With the addition of fellow Zappa alumnus Patrick O'Hearn on bass and studio veteran Chuck Wild on keyboards. Missing Persons was born. immediately demanding the attention of the established music industry by releasing a mini-LP that sold over 10.000 records in Los Angeles alone via mere door-to-door distribution.

Capitol Records signed the group in March 1982 and reissued the mini-album; sales rose to over 250,000, unprecedented for an LP by a new band. Missing Persons' first full album, "Spring Session M," abetted by three worldwide hits, "Words," "Destinations Unknown," and "Walkin' In L.A.." was released in October 1982 and to date has sold more than three-quarters-of-a-million records.

"Rhyme And Reason," Missing Persons' brand new recording, is a reaffirmation of their overall philosophy, a very definite compositional maturation consistent with the desire to effectuate excellent pop music. Ambitious as it is aggressive, the new album dares to stand for realism, as evidenced at first glance by its cover artwork, a striking black and

white portrait of Dale Bozzio that evokes the magic realism of the German 1920s.

Indeed, the Missing Persons have chosen to address real issues; the struggles of love and faith, disdain and dreams, the hopelessness of unanswered questions. "Rhyme And Reason" makes a statement for general goodness without sacrificing any of its musical strength. Musically, the album is rather eclectic, drawing from various stylistic influences to create a vivid full-color sound that creates dramatic contrast to the black and white imagery of the artwork and lyrics themselves.
