## Sunday is National Ice Cream Day

Sunday is National Ice Cream Day.

The celebration salutes the dairy farm families and industry employees whose daily work assures the continued availability of ice cream and related products.

It's also a salute to Americans young and old alike who have made ice cream one of their favorite dairy treats. On the average, the American public consumes more than three billion quarts of ice cream per year, which amounts to nearly 15 quarts or four gallons of ice cream per person.

The purpose of the day is to call attention to this nutritious and

wholesome food which is enjoyed by over ninety percent of the U.S. population.

National Ice Cream Day was first established on July 15, 1979 by Dairymen, Inc., a regional milk-marketing cooperative. In 1983, the date was formally recognized by President Ronald Reagan and congressional leaders.

Americans hold the record for sweet teeth as they consume more ice cream than citizens of any other nation in the world, with Australia and New Zealand only distant runners-up. U.S. production of ice cream and related products keeps up with this ever increasing

demand. In fact, an extravagant 10-scoop ice cream cone for every single person on earth could be served from American production of ice cream alone. Each year the U.S. produces enough ice cream to fill the Grand Canyon. The top five producers of ice cream in the United States include California, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Texas and New York.

The top five flavors of ice cream are vanilla (32percent), chocolate (9percent), neapolitan (6.4percent), vanilla fudge (4.1percent), and a relative newcomer, cookies 'n cream (3.8percent). Ice cream and related products utilize more than

nine percent of the fluid milk produced in the US. Frozen desserts account for 21 percent of the total milk used in all manufactured products.

Eighty-three percent of U.S. household purchase ice cream products for home consumption. More than 80 percent of all ice cream products are also sold through groceries and convenience stores. Nearly half of all ice cream is sold in half-gallon containers. Ice cream is eaten most often as an afternoon and evening snack. It is most popular at take-out type outlets, where more than 30 percent

is soft serve.

Ice cream contains nutritious ingredients, such as calcium and phosphorus, which are needed for strong bones and teeth; vitamin A, which keeps the eyes in good condition, body tissues in good repair and helps fight off infection; riboflavin, which nourishes body cells; and thiamine, which helps to burn the food eaten and keeps

nerves healthy, as well as giving an appetite so we eat the food needed for growth.

The famous explorer, Marco Polo, introduced the Western world to the forerunner of ice cream when he returned from China in the 13th century with a recipe for milk-honey-fruit juice concoction. During the 1904 World's Fair a food concessionaire, who ran out of clean dishes, discovered the first ice

cream cone. He used a crisp, waterlife Persian pastry made by a neighboring food merchant. Needless to say, it was an instant hit.

The world's largest ice cream sundae consisted of more than 21,000 pounds of premium ice cream—4,667 gallons—7,000 pounds of toppings, and reached a height of nearly 12 feet high. The world's largest banana split is said to have been more than mile long, using 1,500

gallons of ice cream, 11,400 bananas, and 380 gallons of topping. The father of our country, George Washington, had such an appetite for ice cream that he consumed more than \$200 worth of ice cream in the summer of 1790. He was also said to have had ice cream making equipment at his Mount Vernon home.

The technology of the 1960s gave us many new exotic flavors of ice

cream and a space age scooper designed to make the perfect cone, but the price was outrageous like ice cream from an aerosol can. In the 1980s, a demand for high quality products, a renewed quest for the ultimate gourmet experience, and a vigorous national health craze has virtually revolutionized the freezer case. There are super premium ice creams and premium ice milks, elegant European desserts, and ice creams in array of flavors.

## Warming up to ice cream

Cold hands and warm hearts match up with the warm memories of cold ice cream. Remember when Father brought home a quart of ice cream Friday nights to celebrate payday? Some grandfathers reserved for themselves the privilege of buying each child's first ice cream cone.

The song, "Won't You Have an Ice Cream Soda With Me," is a reminder of Saturday nights in a small town. If couples could agree on chocolate or rootbeer or strawberry, they had a good start on a lasting relationship.

A dish of ice cream at bedtime is "quality family time" in many homes today. In fact, about half the ice cream consumed in the United States is eaten as a snack and the rest as dessert. With the explosion of flavors and types available in ice cream stores, more and more people are enjoying it away from home too.

Home electricity, which made refrigerators and freezers a necessity in nearly every home, was not even available in many rural areas two generations ago. In homes that could not have refrigerators and freezers, ice cream was only an occasional treat. Ice cream making provided entertainment as well as dessert for special events. Ice had to be secured and the work of turning the crank built appetites, as well as expectations. Today's electric ice cream makers may use



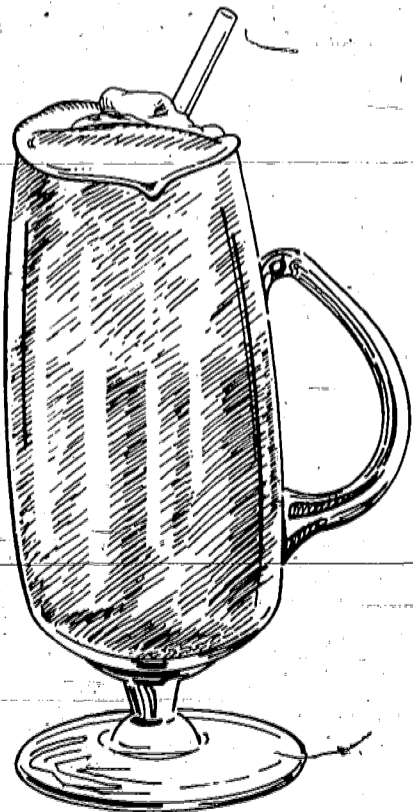
Cover with chocolate topping. Freeze several hours or overnight. To serve, let stand at room temperature about 15 minutes; cut into squares.

The easiest way to crush cookies for crumb crusts is to place them between two sheets of waxed paper. Crush using a rolling pin. Remove top sheet; pour crumbs from bottom sheet into measuring cup.

### TRI-COLOR CAKE 6 to 8 servings

- 1 angel food loaf cake
- 1 pint chocolate ice cream, softened
- 1 pint raspberry sherbet, softened
- 1 cup whipping cream, whipped and sweetened
- ½ teaspoon almond extract

Cut cake lengthwise into 4 equal layers. Spread chocolate ice cream on 2 layers; spread raspberry sherbet on remaining 2 layers. Stack layers on serving platter, beginning with chocolate and alternating with sherbet; freeze. Fold almond extract into whipping cream; decorate top and bottom edges of cake with whipped cream piped through a decorator tube. Return to freezer until cream is firm, at least 1 hour.



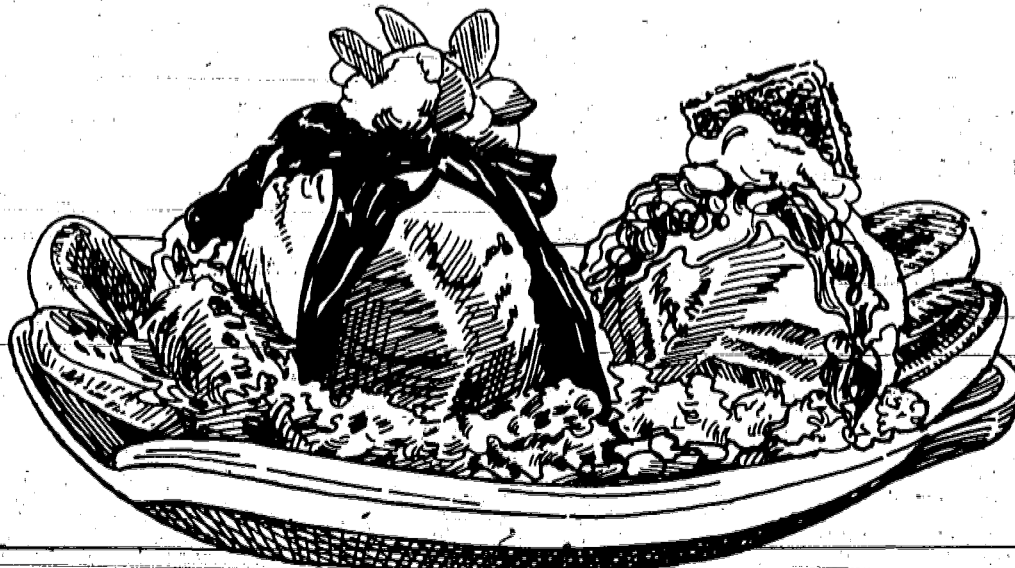
ice cubes from the freezer and table salt to speed the freezing process, but frozen dessert is a memorable treat.

### CHOCOLATE PEPPERMINT DESSERT

Yield: one 8-inch square

- 1 cup chocolate wafer crumbs
- 3 tablespoons butter, melted
- 1 quart peppermint ice cream, softened
- ½ cup chocolate fudge topping

Combine crumbs and butter. Press mixture onto bottom and part way up the sides of an 8-inch square baking pan. Freeze until firm. Spread ice cream over the frozen crumbs.



## 'Topping off' the dessert

Let your imagination go wild when you take that half-gallon package of ice cream from your freezer. Old favorite toppings like chocolate, butterscotch and strawberry are only a beginning.

Try a chocolate covered cherry sundae. Just top cherry or cherry vanilla ice cream with crushed cherries, chocolate syrup and whipped cream.

A Confetti Parfait combines vanilla ice cream and drained fruit cocktail in a tall glass. Alternate the layers with toasted coconut.

When fresh peaches come to the market, make a Peach Blossom Parfait. Just top peach ice cream with diced peaches and fresh strawberries.

Berry-Berry Sundae has that all-American look. To serve it, spoon strawberries and blueberries onto vanilla ice cream.

The kid in you will love Chocolate Peanut Butter Sundae. Top chocolate ice cream with softened crunchy peanut butter or a prepared peanut butter topping and extra peanuts.

Your refrigerator has the ingredients or the old favorite, Turtle Sundae. Just top vanilla



cream in package sizes to fit your eating habits. Fresh ice cream tastes best. Top it with fruits or sauces you enjoy and eat happily.

### ROCKY ROAD ICE CREAM Yield: 2 quarts

- 1½ cups sugar
- 4 teaspoons cornstarch
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- 3 cups milk
- 3 squares (1 oz. each) unsweetened chocolate
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1½ cups whipping cream
- 1 cup miniature marshmallows
- ¾ cup toasted broken pecans

Combine sugar, cornstarch and salt in a 2-quart heavy saucepan. Gradually stir in milk. Add chocolate. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until thickened. Boil and stir 2 minutes. Chocolate does not completely dissolve; the mixture looks very speckled. This does not affect the finished product. Stir a small amount of hot mixture into eggs. Return all to saucepan. Cook over low heat 1 minute, stirring constantly. Do not boil. Place in large mixing bowl. Beat on medium speed or mixer until mixture becomes smooth and all the chocolate is dissolved. Stir in whipping cream. Chill. Churn-freeze. After freezing, transfer ice cream to a plastic freezer container. Stir in marshmallows and nuts. Ripen in freezer at least 3 hours before serving.

### SOPHISTICATED RASPBERRY SHERBET Yield: 2 quarts

- 2 pints fresh raspberries, washed
- 1¼ cups currant jelly
- 2 cups light cream or half and half
- ½ cup creme de cassis

Place raspberries in blender container; cover. Puree until smooth. Place raspberry puree and currant jelly in 2-quart saucepan. Heat over a low heat until jelly is melted, stirring frequently. Cool to lukewarm. Stir in cream and creme de cassis. Chill 1 hour. Churn-freeze. Place in plastic freezer container. Let ripen in freezer 3 hours before serving.

## Acting helps 'Bueller'

That chronicler of teen angst, director John Hughes, is back with Ferris Bueller's Day Off, his best film since his first major release of a few years ago, "Sixteen Candles."

This film is aided by the stellar acting abilities of Matthew Broderick ("War Games") as the title character, one of the best of the current group of young actors and actresses. Overall, it is a warm, funny movie, although it loses some of its steam near the end of the movie.

Ferris Bueller is the most popular kid in his high school, where he is friend and idol to almost the entire student body. He manages to charm his parents, friends and many other people so that he can get away with almost anything. His aim in this story is to take one of his periodic days off.

### Focus on film

Bueller is joined by his girlfriend (Mia Sara) and best friend (another superb performance, by Alan Ruck) as they journey for an adventurous foray into Chicago.

But not everybody is completely charmed by Bueller, despite his elaborate efforts. His youngest sister thinks he gets away with too much, as does the assistant principal (Jeffrey Jones, the Emperor in "Amadeus") of his high school, who quickly becomes his nemesis.

Even though Hughes borrows ideas from some other films, including scenes where Broderick speaks directly to the audience a la Woody Allen, this is mostly a charming and original film. Hughes has an empathy with young people that is missing from other teen flicks, which are preoccupied with gross, low-grade humor.

Of local interest, Ruck, who is actually 29, is currently starring at the McCarter Theater in Princeton.

# Country music means Reba McEntire

Pick Of The LPs, "Whoever's in New England" by Reba McEntire (MCA Records).

We can divide the history of country music into periods represented by its most influential artists. Depending on our years, country music can mean Patsy Montana, Molly O'Day, Kitty Wells, Patsy Cline, Loretta Lynn or Tammy Wynette. For those of us living in the 1980s, country music means, and will continue to mean in the years ahead, Reba McEntire.

In 1985 Reba emerged as a consensus choice to assume the mantle of premier female vocalist in country music. She did so by capturing a trio of country laurels; the

Country Music Association's coveted Female Vocalist of the Year award (for a second consecutive year); the Academy of Country Music's Top Female Vocalist award; and the fan-voted Music City News award for Best Female Vocalist. Music journalists voting in Rolling Stone's Critic's Choice Poll named her as the only woman in its "Top Five Country Artists of the Year" category. Reba responded with a year's worth of solid chart successes, sending both "How Blue" and "Somebody Should Leave" to number one, and placing "Have I Got a Deal For You" and "Only in My Mind" near the top. The crowning event in this banner year came in November when she was

asked to join the Grand Ole Opry as a member. The announcement of her membership was part of a CBS television special celebrating the Opry's sixtieth anniversary, which aired in January, 1986.

On her new album "Whoever's In New England," Reba has come up with 10 strong songs that demonstrate her versatility and breadth of feeling. Her string of successes means that tunesmiths now offer Reba their finest efforts, and the new record, solid throughout,

her work relevant and moving.

Reba openly admits that in choosing the material for "Whoever's in New England," she was, as she puts it: "bending over backwards to find songs for the women. 'I've Seen Better Days,' 'Whoever's In New England,' 'Little Rock,' and 'If You Only Knew' maintain a McEntire tradition that includes earlier hits like 'Can't Even Get the Blues,' 'You're the First Time I've Thought About Leaving,' and 'Somebody Should Leave.'"

The LP features stellar instrumental work throughout. According to Ms. McEntire: "We got the best pickers possible. We had the best musicians from Nashville and L.A. combined, including Leigh Reynolds, my guitar picker, and Snuffy Elmore, my ex-fiddle player who came in with Johnny Gimble. I want to continue to bring some of my guys in to get that stage feeling in with the record feeling." Reba's brother, Pake, contributed many of the vocal harmonies.

Reba says of the effort as a whole:

"After listening to the demos, recording it, doing the harmony, the final tracks, the mixing, and everything, it's an album that I haven't gotten tired of yet, and that's unusual, I hope everybody else likes it as much as we do." Reba takes another career step forward with the production of her first music video. Based on the first single from the new album—the title track—the video was filmed on location in Boston and New Bedford. The producer/director of "Whoever's In New England" is Jon Small, whose past credits include all of the Billy Joel videos as well as Joel's HBO special. He has additionally produced and directed videos by Hall and Oates, John Cougar Mellencamp, Night Ranger, Chicago and more. Writer/director Jeff Schock's credits include Billy Joel, the Romantics, Refugee and others.

# Film production rises in state

Feature film production in the state during the first half of 1986 alone has nearly outdistanced the 1985 total of 18 projects. Sixteen full-length motion pictures have already been shot in whole or part on this side of the Hudson, with at least three more slated to begin this summer. At this rate, 1986's feature film total will be a all-time record for the state according to Joseph Friedman, executive director of the New Jersey Motion Picture and Television Commission.

The Commission's production list includes many major studio and independent releases, mixed in with a number of low budget projects. Among the more prominent titles are two features from Touchstone Films. The first, "Outrageous Fortune," stars Bette Midler and Shelley Long in a fast paced contemporary comedy directed by Arthur Hiller on location at Newark Airport. The second, Martin Scorsese's "The Color Of Money," is a sequel to Robert Rossen's classic "The Hustler," with Paul Newman reprising his original role. Scenes were shot at Resorts International Casino Hotel, and on the boardwalk in Atlantic City.

Alan Parker, director of such esteemed films as "Midnight Express" and "Fame," brought his production of EMI's "Angel Heart" to sites in Hoboken and Fairfield. This mystery thriller, in the tradition of "The Maltese Falcon," stars Mickey Rourke.

Continental Cinema's comedy-drama "once Again" was produced entirely on location in Jersey City, Hoboken, and Bayonne. Martin Balsam, Frances Sternhagen, Richard Cox, and Jessica Harper head the impressive cast.

The producers of "I Love New York" apparently were enamored of New Jersey as well. Scenes from the Manhattan Film production, starring Scott Baio, were completed in Jersey City.

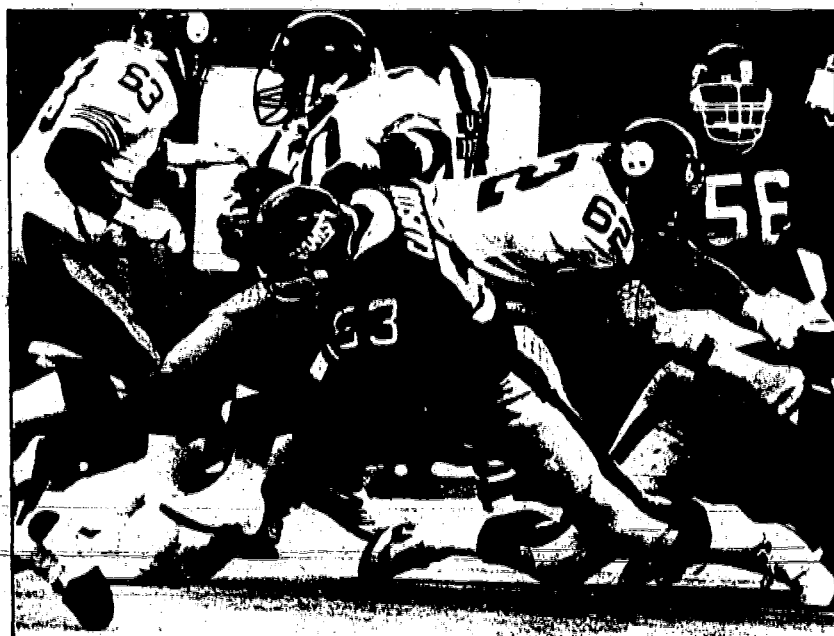
