The Shore: beaches, boards, boats

The Jersey shore has it all — whether it's a quiet sunny stroll along the beach, the refreshing spray of the surf, the excitement of boardwalk rides or the thrill of cutting through the water on a speedboat.

New Jersey's 127 miles of Atlantic coastline, the longest stretch of white sand beach in America, has quiet coves, quaint towns and bustling resorts which offer a vacation for every interest and budget.

"Our beaches, boardwalks and boating facilities offer the opportunities to enjoy an unforgettable vacation," says Victoria D. Schmidt, director of the Division of Travel and Tourism, New Jersey Department of Commerce and Economic Development. "In addition to natural attractions offered by the beach, the Shore, Southern Shore and Greater Atlantic City regions have organized a number of activities throughout the summer months."

Atlantic Highlands holds free band concerts each Sunday night in July and August. Free concerts are held during July and August on Wednesday nights in Sea Isle City, and

on Thursday nights in Margate.

The Ocean Grove Auditorium, largest in the state, will carry on its summer music tradition with concerts by the Ferko String Band, The Singing Boys of Pennsylvania, the New Goither Vocal Band and the Lettermen.

In Margate, Lucy the Elephant's 17th Annual Antique and Collectibles Show will take place Aug. 30.

On the waterways, the annual "Night in Venice" festival in Ocean City will bring more than 100 gaily decorated boats to the bay area off the city's shore Saturday.

Other summer events include a Sand Sculpture contest in Wildwood July 26 and the 40th Annual Clamshell Pitching Contest in Cape May on Aug. 22, 23 and 24.

Since 1870, New Jersey's boardwalks and amusement piers have been an important part of the Garden State's lure for tourists.

From Sandy Hook to Cape May, visitors can take a leisurely stroll along the boardwalks to watch the ocean waves and enjoy the fresh air. Thrill-seekers will appreciate the action and excitement of the amusement rides and arcades

located on the many piers along the Jersey Shore.

"New Jersey's boardwalks have always had a special appeal," according to Schmidt, noting that "The amusement piers and boardwalks make for an excellent outing for families."

The "boardwalk" as we have come to know it was founded in Atlantic City more than 100 years ago. The fine, white sand that drew visitors to 19th century Atlantic City managed to find its way into the lobbies of elegant hotels and the parlor cars of the railroad, ruining carpets and stuffed chairs.

To solve the problem, in 1870, the city council approved a \$5,000 expenditure to build a mile-long "walkway of boards," 10 feet wide and 18 inches above the sand.

The first boardwalk, designed in sections so that it could be removed at the end of the season and stored until the following summer, was an instant hit with the public.

After a storm washed away sections of the original boardwalk in 1883, council approved construction of a new one, 20 feet wide and five feet above the beach.

The new boardwalk had railings to

prevent people from falling onto the sand, as they often did during Easter parades and on holiday weekends. City officials also built the boardwalk so that horse-drawn coaches could drive from the street onto the beach.


By 1890, shops lined the length of the boardwalk, and city officials expanded the promenade to its present size, four miles long and 40 feet wide.

Atlantic City today is one of the most popular vacation, entertainment and family resorts in the world, with its boardwalk casino-hotels and attractions receiving more than 30 million visitors annually.

Boardwalks in other communities along the shore also offer exciting amusements, games of chance or quiet places to sit and enjoy the salt air.

The boardwalk and amusement piers of the Shore Region's Asbury Park, Point Pleasant, Seaside Heights and Seaside Park, as well as the Wildwoods in the Southern Shore Region, turn the shore into a festival of fun throughout the summer months.

The Ocean City boardwalk will be the host for several special events this summer, including the Miss Crustacean Hermit Crab Beauty Pageant and Races on Aug. 13, and the Ocean City Baby Parade on Aug. 14.

New Jersey also will be the host for fairs and festivals honoring everything from Shakespeare to seafood and country music to Mozart.

"Good food and music abound in the different celebrations held throughout New Jersey during the summer," explains Schmidt. "Our fairs and festivals are as diverse as the people who live here."

The state's unique cultural vitality and variety will be on display in a series of festivals throughout the summer months, beginning in June in the Shore Region as the Garden State Arts Center in Holmdel serves as host for Polish, Italian, Ukrainian, Jewish and Irish festivals.

The Skylands Region's Action Park in McAfee will hold ethnic festivals throughout August at the theme park. The festivals will honor the Irish, German and Poles and will also celebrate polka dancing.

Other ethnic festivals include a German Oktoberfest at Six Flags Great Adventure in Jackson Aug. 18.

One of the most popular festivals among music lovers is the Waterloo Music Festival at Waterloo Village, Stanhope, in the Skylands Region. The festival will feature jazz and bluegrass music each weekend in July, and on Aug. 2, 3, and 10. In the same region, Action Park will host a dixieland festival on Aug. 16.

Other music festivals include the New Jersey Mozart Festival at the Ocean Grove auditorium in the Shore Region today, July 31 and Aug. 5.

The New Jersey Shakespeare Festival will take place at Drew University began June 25 and runs through December.

The New Jersey State Fair will be held Aug. 1-10 at the new Garden State Park, Cherry Hill, in the Delaware River Region. Other fairs still to come in the Garden State include Somerset County 4-H Fair in Bridgewater, Aug. 13-15, and the Flemington Fair in Flemington, Aug. 29 through Sept. 1.

A main staple of any fair or festival is food, and some of the appetizing celebrations planned in the Southern Shore Region include a lobster celebration in Wildwood Aug. 19.

Summertime is for kids, too! More children's events

"Star fighters" can enter the realm of a real-life video game at New Jersey's newest amusement center, one of the many attractions for children in the Garden State.

Planet Photon, first of a chain of futuristic amusement centers, opened recently on Route 22 in Kenilworth and has become an instant success.

At the unusual new operation, teams of participants are armed with simulated laser weapons and protective head gear before facing off in a harmless confrontation through the mazes and corridors of an imaginary space age battleground.

There is no age limit to participate, but players must be at least 4 feet, 6 inches tall. Teams of up to 10 players strive to penetrate the opposing team's defense and overtake their base goal, scoring as many points as possible by shooting light rays along the way.

Another new and popular attraction for youngsters is Kid's World in Long Branch, designed for children ages 2 to 12. A former amusement and fishing pier, the amusement park includes a theater, water slide, pool, giant jungle gym, petting zoo, haunted mansion and "soft" play area. Kid's World, which is open on weekends, will be open daily beginning June 14.

New Jersey is divided into six tourism regions.

In New Jersey's Gateway Region, the Terry Loo Zoo, a family owned attraction in Scotch Plains, includes tigers, elephants, giraffes, gorillas, tropical birds and a petting zoo. Owned by Frank Terry, a former World War II fighter pilot, and his wife, Louise, the zoo houses many animals which were raised by the owners.

The Turtle Back Zoo in West Orange is another favorite spot for children in the Gateway Region, with more than 650 animals and birds, pony rides, a train ride and a petting zoo. Both zoos are open year-round.

In the Skylands Region, Santa Claus is in residence year-round at

the Land of Make Believe in Hope. The attractions also offers puppet shows, river and train rides, a haunted house and a picnic grove.

New Jersey's 127 miles of continuous beachfront, from Atlantic Highlands to Cape May, is a perennial favorite for families and children. In addition to sunbathing, water sports and other beach-related pursuits, the shore, Greater Atlantic City and southern shore regions also offer adventure and excitement away from the sand and surf.

In the shore region, Six Flags Great Adventure in Jackson, the nation's largest seasonal theme park, features rides, attractions, entertainment and a drive-through jungle safari.

In the Greater Atlantic City region, Lucy the Elephant in Margate is a favorite of children during the warm weather months.

Kid stuff

Built in 1881 to attract real estate buyers, "Lucy" is now a national historic landmark. Six stories high, it includes a museum and gift shop. Storybook Land in Cardiff is a family run park with rides, live animals, eateries and life-sized depictions of characters from famous children's stories. The Easter Bunny and Santa Claus are in residence during their holiday seasons.

The southern shore region is home to the Cohanzick Zoo in Bridgeton, with animals from throughout the world in a 1,000 acre park.

In the Delaware River Region, Action Mountain in Pine Hill features family entertainment, amusements and water sports, while the Clementon Amusement Park in Clementon includes boat rides on a picturesque lake and family-oriented amusement. At the Malibu Grand Prix Fun Center in Mt.

Laurel, pint-sized automotive enthusiasts can try their skill at video games and racing cars.

Children can also enjoy nature's beautiful environment by hiking along New Jersey's 4,000 miles of trails. The Appalachian Trail, the longest trail in America, meanders over 70 miles of rugged mountain terrain in Passaic and Sussex counties from the New York border to the Delaware Water Gap.

Other significant walkways include the 60-mile-long Delaware and Raritan Canal State Park Trail in the Delaware River Region and the 40-mile-long Batona Trail through the Pinelands in south central New Jersey. Other trails of considerable length are the 42-mile-long Lenape Trail through the Gateway Region and the 27-mile Patriot's Path through the Skylands Region.

The Basking Ridge Environmental Education Center in the Skylands Region also is a popular attraction for children. The first fully solar heated and cooled environmental education facility in the United States, it contains classrooms, exhibit areas, an auditorium, a laboratory and a bookshop.

Other places where children can enhance their learning experiences include the Flat Rock Brook Educational Center and the Trailside Nature and Science Center, both located in the Gateway Region.

"New Jersey is a treasure chest of wonder, a fun-filled recreation and discovery for children of all ages," said Victoria D. Schmidt, director of the New Jersey Division of Travel and Tourism, Department of Commerce and Economic Development. "A family vacation in the Garden State this spring will show visitors why 'New Jersey and You Are Perfect Together' every season of the year!" she said.

Other "interesting sites and activities" are listed in a seasonal calendar of events available free by calling or writing the New Jersey Division of Travel and Tourism, CN 826, Trenton, 08625, (609) 292-2470.

During July and August, Trailside Nature and Science Center, Coles Avenue and New Providence Road, Mountainside, is offering a wide variety of summer programs for children 2½ years old through the 7th grade.

Children ages 2½-6 years old can participate in a series of programs entitled "Natural Beginnings." The series will include:

"The Two Of Us," designed for 2½-4 year-olds and their parents to explore different things in nature.

"Tadpoles," a program for 4-6 year-olds to heighten their awareness of the natural world.

"Dinosaurs and Other Reptiles," 4-6-year-olds will learn about the lives of dinosaurs.

"Animal Neighbors." This program will teach 4-6-year-olds about different animal groups.

Children who have completed grades one and two can participate in a variety of nature and science programs including:

"Junior Scientists," includes experiments with optical illusions, magnets and prisms.

"Trailside Rockets." Demonstrations on rocks and minerals and how to add or start a rock collection.

"Wigwams in the Watchungs." A demonstration on how to live like a Leni Lenape Indian.

"Nature Investigations." Investigation of insects, frogs and birds.

"Nature Creations." Involves creating a masterpiece using natural materials.

Children who have completed grades three and four can participate in the weekly series entitled "Huck Finn Days." A mini raft race, fishing trips, hikes and hand cranking ice cream are some of the events scheduled throughout the summer in this series. Also, children can learn about "Native American Crafts" and "Earth Encounters" which will include exploring the reservation. Programs for children in grades 5-7 include:

"Backpacking." A demonstration on the fundamentals of backpacking. Includes an overnight

camping trip in the reservation.

"Knots and Lashing." A demonstration on basic knots and lashing techniques.

"Introduction to Wilderness Survival." Demonstration of basic survival techniques including constructing a shelter and purifying water.

Pre-registration is mandatory for all sessions. Further information on programs, schedules, fees and registration can be obtained by calling Trailside at 232-5930.

Contest, display on gardeners' agenda

James Nichnadowicz, program associate in agriculture for the Union County Cooperative Extension Service, 300 North Avenue, East, Westfield, has announced the start of the second annual Union County Cooperative Extension Service garden contest.

Anyone who has a vegetable or flower garden may enter. First prize is \$50 worth of garden supplies donated by a local garden center. To enter, contestants should mail a color picture of their garden, a listing of all crops grown and varieties and a diagram of the garden showing where the different types of plants are grown along with name, address and phone number to: Nichnadowicz at the Union County Cooperative Extension Service, 300 North Avenue, East, Westfield, N.J. 07090.

Much of the fertilizer placed on the vegetable patch in spring has now been taken in by the plants or washed and leached out of the soil by rain or irrigation. It is time to replace these lost nutrients by sidedressing the plants with an application of fertilizer. This additional boost of nutrients has been shown to greatly increase vegetable yields.

Before sidedressing, however, check to see if it is needed. There may already be enough nutrients present. The only way to know for sure is to either have the soil tested or by knowing the signs of a healthy plant. In general, gardeners who use mainly inorganic fertilizers, such as 5-10-5 or 5-10-10, will need to sidedress. Those who use organic materials, manure,

compost, can usually skip sidedressing. The nutrients from these fertilizers are released slowly throughout the growing season.

The following table of sidedressing times is an approximation. Sidedressing should be done whenever symptoms of nutrient deficiencies appear. A general yellowing of the plant indicates an immediate need for sidedressing.

If no deficiencies appear, sidedressing can be done according to the following schedule: beans, 4 to 6 weeks after planting; beans, not needed; broccoli and cauliflower, 2 to 3 weeks after planting; 4 to 6 weeks after planting; cabbage, 2 to 3 weeks after planting; cantaloupes and cucumbers, when vines begin to run; eggplants, 3 to 4 weeks after planting; 6 to 8 weeks after planting; lettuce leaf and heads, 3 to 5 weeks after planting; peas, not needed; peppers, after first fruit set; sweet corn, when corn is 12-18 inches tall; tomatoes, after first fruit set.

To sidedress put a small handful of 5-10-5 or 5-10-10 around the outside of each plant. Try not to over do it as this will burn roots. Also, any fertilizer that falls on the foliage should be washed away to prevent a burn.

The Union County Cooperative Extension Service tests soil for a fee of \$6. Questions may be answered by calling 233-9366.

More than 100 of the highest rated annual flowers will be featured at the 22nd Rutgers University Vegetable-Flower Open House to be held on the Cook College campus July 28 from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Those flowers selected for the Display Garden this year include both All-America Selection winners and other varieties which have consistently scored high in Rutgers trials the past five years.

At the vegetable research farm, visitors will see variety trials of tomatoes,

peppers, squash, cucumbers and melons. New disease-resistant asparagus varieties developed at the New Jersey Agricultural Experiment Station, research and row covers and plastic mulches, herbicide trails on potatoes and parsley, and studies on squash for use in international agriculture will also be featured.

A demonstration vegetable garden will provide many helpful ideas for the home gardener, including use of old carpeting between the rows to reduce weed growth.

Rutgers faculty will conduct guided tours at both locations on Ryders Lane east of U.S. Route 1 near New Brunswick. They will also conduct plant clinics where visitors may have their garden problems solved.

An illustrated lecture, "Four Seasons in the Rutgers Display Garden," will be given hourly starting at 9:30 a.m. at Holy House near the flower garden.

Glassblowing at fair

An exciting addition to the seventh annual Allaire Crafts Fair will be a demonstration of traditional glassblowing techniques by Wheaton Village gaffers at historic Allaire State Park Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The rain date is Sunday.

The juried show and sale of sophisticated crafts presents an interesting and affordable selection of pottery, woodcarving, jewelry, hand-forged metal, stained glass, fiber art and handmade wearables by 51 New Jersey craftspeople.

According to Hortense Green, New Jersey State Council on the Arts crafts coordinator, "Allaire fair reaches a large crafts conscious public and it is our hope that the glassblowing demonstrations, as

well as those in ceramics, fiber, metal, and wood, will promote further understanding about the artistic process and hopefully inspire others to try their hand at a craft."

Providing live bluegrass music and back by popular demand is the Magnolia Road Band. Picnic facilities are available.





Of the 152 million drivers in the country, 14.5 million are 65 years or

older and more than 18 million are between 55 and 64 years of age.

Yet those over 65, who make up 9.5 percent of all drivers, account for just 6.2 percent of all accidents and those between 55 and 64, who account for 12.1 percent for the driving population, have just 7.2 percent of the accidents.

By comparison, the 18 million drivers between 20 and 24 years of age, who account for nearly 12

percent of all drivers, have almost 22 percent of all accidents.

With some insurers, notes the I.I.I., the discounts start as early as age 50, but with the majority of companies, the discounts don't start until age 65. The discounts range from 10 to 15 percent.

If you are driving less often or driving in less populated areas, you may further reduce your premium. For instance, if you used to drive to

work in the city every day but now you use the car only for "pleasure

use," your rates probably will go down.

Tips on safeguarding a building

Here's a checklist of things you can do to safeguard your apartment:

Examine your building's security. Is lighting adequate in stairwells, parking lots, laundry rooms and around the exterior of the building? Are there grilles or grates on ground floor windows? Are laundry rooms and basement storage areas kept locked?

•Install deadbolt locks on all exterior doors. The tenant usually pays for these. Don't master-key your lock to magement locks — the key might fall into the wrong hands. You can give a friend a key marked "do not duplicate" in a sealed envelope.

Be sure to let your apartment superintendent know whom to contact in case of an emergency.

•Look for special security features in your building. If there's an alarm button, be sure you know where it is.

•If you go on vacation, tell a friend or the building superintendent where you are going and for how long. Leave an address and phone number where you can be reached.

•Know your neighbors. Get together to improve security in your building. Many large apartment buildings have organized tenant patrols that help police by watching for crime in and around the building. Many also provide escort service for people who have to be out at night.



Selecting a retirement home

The continuing care retirement community or CCRC has been called an extension of the American dream. It usually includes a comfortable apartment, gardens, companionship, and the security of medical attention. If you're considering moving into a CCRC, knowing what questions to ask now can protect your dream from turning sour in the future.

Ninety thousand elderly Americans live in CCRCs. They offer residents long-term guarantees for independent housing units and health and medical care for a one-time entry fee and periodic fees thereafter. A life-care contract, complete with medical assistance is much like an insurance policy. Yet a contract with a life-care facility is only as good as the financial plan behind it.

Since the mid-1970s, 50 of these life-care communities in the U.S. have declared bankruptcy or experienced financial difficulties. When these facilities fail, residents are often without legal recourse. Most CCRC failings are due to a miscalculation of contract buyer's needs and the costs of fulfilling these

needs. Too few life-care communities use the expertise of a professional actuary in their long-range financial planning, according to the American Academy of Actuaries. An actuary could help ascertain whether the money reserves of a CCRC are adequate to meet the promises made to residents. No existing or pending federal legislation mandates actuarial review, and industry-wide standards for actuarial examination don't exist.

While all states license and inspect nursing homes at life-care developments, only 11 states have broader statutes comprehensively regulating these communities. Consumers now rely on state laws for contract protection. Only seven states require reserve funds to cover unexpected costs a CCRC might experience.

To protect yourself, follow these tips:

- When considering a CCRC, look at its financial health, not just its plush carpets, or activities calendar.
- See if an actuary has been involved in the formulation of the

CCRC. Ask to see his report. If the information is not available, skip that "dream" community for another that's more awake to financial reality.



Limiting risks of European vacations

Only you can decide whether the excitement or relaxation of a European vacation outweighs the risks of terrorism this year, but one security advisory group believes you can take steps to limit those risks.

Although the threat of terrorism has caused an estimated 20 to 25 percent of potential European travelers to change their plans this year, the Dictograph Security Information Bureau cited State Department statistics showing that only 12 Americans were killed in terrorist incidents last year out of 6.4 million who visited Europe.

Although it stresses that no one should tempt danger for the sake of a vacation, the information bureau, located in Florham Park, said those who must travel to Europe can find comfort in the tightened security policies now in effect at most European air terminal and cruise ship ports, and by taking sensible precautions, can increase their personal safety even more. Reiyng

largely on statistics and analyses of past terrorist incidents, it compiled this list of common sense safety precautions for traveling abroad:

Dress: Do not flaunt your Americanism by wearing flashy jewelry or clothing that would quickly identify you.

Carriers: When traveling within Europe, use the trains or, if you must fly, choose a carrier from a neutral country, such as Switzerland.

Airports: Avoid large airports, if possible, by traveling to smaller, less prominent airports. Spend as little time as possible in the airport shops, restaurants and ticketing areas.

Hotels: Although a big hotel is likely to be more security conscious than a smaller one, a small hotel is less likely to be a target for terrorism. In either case, ask for a room on a lower floor where you will be closer to help in an emergency.

Public Places: When visiting

museums, landmarks and other public buildings, beware of suspicious, untended shopping bags and briefcases that could contain explosives. Do not investigate. Notify guards or clerks.

Outdoors: Avoid places where Americans congregate, such as American Embassies which usually have enough guards but sometimes are the scenes of ugly venturing into quaint local places that might turn out to be hangouts for various warring factions.

Comotions: If you hear shouting, screaming or shots, get down on the ground quickly. Don't try to determine what's happening. You can laugh it off later if the noise turns out to be unbridled revelry or a car backfiring.

Passports: If you feel that your ethnic-looking name might single you out for trouble, you may drop a maiden name or middle name on your passport, although a legal name cannot be changed on a

passport without a court order. However, frequent travelers should consider obtaining additional passports.
