

## 'Elvis and Me' honest novel

About a dozen or more books have been written about Elvis Presley since his death on Aug. 16, 1977, and they all offered different interpretations of the kind of man they found the superstar to be. Fans and non-fans of Elvis Presley have been inundated with pictures and printed material on him, and the only other book one could tolerate and perhaps accept is the one written by his wife, Priscilla Beaulieu Presley, whose collaborator was Sandra Harmon.

In "Elvis and Me," originally published last year by G. P. Putnam's Sons in New York, and in paperback by Berkley Books of New York, Mrs. Presley creates an honest portrait of the complex person who claimed her when she was only 14 and became so integral a part of her life that she invariably knew little else than a limited life with Elvis Presley.

When the book was first published, it made number one on the New York Times best selling list, was a Literary Guild Main Selection and was serialized in People magazine. And no wonder!

his father, Vernon Presley; his grandmother, Minnie May Presley, and his entourage led by Joe Esposito and his bodyguards.

She says that Elvis taught her everything; how to dress, how to do her hair, how to drive, how to live in his bizarre world...to stay up all night and sleep the day away...or at least, until late afternoon. She learned how to cope with his black moods. She and Elvis' entourage moved with him almost rhythmically, dependent on the atmosphere of his moods.

It seems Priscilla's description of the boy who never really grew up is accurate to the point of pain. She would probably be distressed to know how much she could whet a reader's appetite by reaching into the darkest corners of the star's life. Among the very intimate stories she reveals is Elvis' fear of hurting himself because he was a sleepwalker. She tells of how he slept with his parents, Vernon and Gladys, until he was an adult, and that later, he had always had someone stationed nearby while he slept, to see that he would not wander off during this time.

### On the shelf

If anyone could turn Elvis inside out in the telling of what life was really like in the midst of his private kingdom, it was Priscilla. Interestingly, she tries to be kind in telling the truth about this phenomenal blockbuster, but in the telling of it, she brings him so close to the surface, one can see his pores and blemishes.

She talks about how she first met him in 1956 in Germany, where he was stationed. Her father, Capt. Joseph Paul Beaulieu, was a career Air Force officer, and she lived there with her parents. She reveals Presley's strange behavior in Germany during the two years she spent with him, visiting him each evening, spending hours with him in his bedroom and swearing that they never did anything to be ashamed of because he wanted her "pure" when he married her. She talks of the many prescription drugs he gulped in a day, and how she tried to keep up with him when he insisted that she take them too. She became addicted for a short period of time, but was able to drop them freely by

Priscilla explains that before and after they were married, he was said to have had affairs with his leading women...and the futility of her intense jealousy. She tells of how Elvis talked her parents into letting her come to live in his Graceland mansion home in Memphis, Tenn., which he shared with his father, his father's new wife, grandmother and Elvis' assorted relatives and paid companions, and to attend high school there. It was there that she became very well acquainted with

He was his mama's boy, and he apparently never got over her death. There was no one actually to take her place, to advise the boy who never grew up what to do in impossible situations which he had created and from which he could not extricate himself without his mama's assistance.

In "Elvis and Me", Priscilla follows Presley's career, rides the turbulent waves with him throughout his life, participates in his super successes and the fat, bloated period of his life. She claims that when she became pregnant with his child, he was at once excited and exhilarated about the prospect of becoming a father. When their daughter, Lisa, was born, he played at being the proud father, although he treated her more like a toy doll than a real baby.

He was generous to a fault with gifts for everyone he knew, but it wasn't long after the baby was born that he really started to drift away from Cilla, as he called his wife. After the divorce, Elvis and Priscilla remained friends, but it was the beginning of the end for the super star. As with many super stars, he couldn't handle all that

## Schedule set by orchestra The Garden State Chamber Or-

chestra, recipient of a \$20,000 grant from the New Jersey State Council on the Arts, has announced that its 1986-87 schedule will begin Sunday.

The orchestra has expanded to five concerts now a total of 15 concerts, in each of the three locations, John Harms Center for the Arts in Englewood, the Morris Museum in Morristown and Kean College of New Jersey in Union.

The dates for the first of the series will be Sunday at 7 p.m. at Kean College: Nov. 7, 8 p.m., at John Harms Center, and Nov. 8, 8 p.m. at Morris Museum.

Highlights of the orchestra's" season, under the direction of Frederick Storfer, include a New Jersey commemoration to the Statue of Liberty with a premiere by Fredrick Kaufman entitled "Mother of Exiles." Each site will include a local chorus.
