Halloween happenings

AAA Halloween safety tips

The frightening part of Halloween isn't ghosts and goblins, but the increased potential for automobile accidents involving young pedestrians.

"Trick-or-treaters and motorists can have a safe and happy Halloween, if they take several important precautions," advises Matthew J. Derham, president of the AAA New Jersey Automobile Club.

Prior to Halloween, parents and children should review these safety tips:

Try to trick-or-treat when it's still light outside.

Wear a costume that makes it easy to walk, see and be seen.

Make certain that costumes are light in color and use reflective tape that can be seen by motorists in the dark.

If masks are worn, enlarge the eyeholes so children can see in all directions, and caution them to take masks off before crossing streets. For greater safety, make-up can be used instead of a mask.

Flashlights should be carried to light the way.

Children should always trick-or-treat with a parent, older sibling or group of friends — never alone.

Plan the trick-or-treat route in advance, picking well-lighted, familiar streets. Also determine what time children are to return home.

All traffic safety rules should be obeyed. Cross only at corners, walk on sidewalks or facing traffic where no sidewalk is available, and never cross the street between parked cars or in the middle of the block.

Children should wait until they are home to sort, check and eat treats.

The best advice for drivers on Halloween night is to be aware of the unexpected. Turn headlights on at dusk and drive carefully; limit speed on residential streets to no more than 15 miles per hour between 5 and 9 p.m. Be on the lookout for children darting out from between parked cars and take extra care when backing out of a driveway or turning on red.

Derham says, "The AAA New Jersey Automobile Club would like to remind the public that Halloween can be a fun time for everyone, children and motorists alike. All it takes is a little extra caution."

The foods you eat make a difference in the way you feel and act — a good reason to choose those foods that help your body stay strong and healthy. A balanced diet, one which provides sufficient proteins, carbohydrates, fats, vitamins, minerals and water, is vital for both your general and dental health.

During childhood, protein, vitamins and minerals — especially calcium, phosphorus and fluoride — are essential for strong teeth. Since teeth begin to form 3-6 months before birth, the diets of pregnant women must also provide sufficient nutrients for the developing of baby's teeth.

Among adults, a lack of certain nutrients may be a factor in causing gum disease, the main cause of tooth loss in adults, because it is more difficult for the mouth to resist infection.

If you are like many people, you probably eat more food than you

really need and the excess may often take the form of sugar-rich between-meal snacks such as candy, soft drinks, baked goods, ice cream and pre-sweetened cereals. The decay process begins with plaque — that sticky, colorless layer of harmful bacteria constantly forming in the mouth. When you eat foods that contain sugars and starches, this bacteria produces acids that can destroy tooth enamel. Each time acid is produced, it attacks the tooth for about 20 minutes. After repeated acid attacks, cavities can result.

The New Jersey Dental Association would like parents to be aware of the problem that Halloween sweets and poor oral health can cause. Although the Dental Association cautions against too much sugar in the diet, it by no means advocates depriving children of their Halloween fun. The answer is proper oral hygiene.

Dr. Herbert Bressman, NJDA president, notes that, "Special care should be taken on Halloween when our children are more vulnerable to dental disease. The importance of brushing and flossing cannot be emphasized enough."

The Association also asks that good judgment be exercised when buying treats for neighborhood children. It is possible to combine fun with good dental health and still maintain the tradition of Halloween.

The Linden Halloween Committee, in cooperation with the Linden Recreation Department, announces Halloween safety rules:

1. Children should not eat or use any treats until parents have seen and inspected everything in their Trick-or-Treat bags!
2. Make sure mask holes are large enough to easily see through.
3. After dark children should take a flashlight along to light the way and to let drivers see them.
4. Make sure to Trick-or-Treat with someone.
5. Bright, reflective colors should be worn so that drivers can see children when it gets dark.
6. Walk on sidewalks. If there are no sidewalks, walk as near to the curb as possible.
7. When crossing or walking on streets, observe safety rules and stay away from moving traffic.
8. Don't wear costumes that are too long or loose, to avoid tripping.
9. Do not run across streets or run out from between parked cars — pay attention to traffic lights.

With the approach of Halloween, it is time again for parents to plan for the safety of the young trick-or-treater.

The New Jersey Poison Information and Education System has some safety tactics to protect the young child and keep the evening safe and enjoyable.

Children should be out while it is light. They should visit only those homes of close friends. As they visit the neighborhood, they should travel in groups, and if they are young, should be accompanied by an adult. Only well-lit homes should be stopping-off points. Reflective costumes or those with reflective

tapes will make drivers aware of the presence of children.

—Remind children not to open candy until they reach home and the candy is inspected by an adult. Candy should be wrapped. Lois Honcharuk, nurse educator for New Jersey Poison Information and Education System, reminds parents, "When purchasing candy, purchase only those that are double wrapped. The single items should be wrapped and then bulk wrapped. This limits the possibility of tampering. Should you decide to use small toys as a substitute for candy, make sure that there are no sharp edges."

—Make sure that make-up and other items used by children are non-toxic. Non-toxic will be stated somewhere on the package.

—Should an exposure occur, call the poison control center immediately. Keep the number of the poison control center on your phone for rapid reference. The phone number is 1-800-962-1253. An experienced poison control specialist is available 24 hours a day. If a tampering is suspected, the local police should be notified.

Consumer tips

Safe trick-or-treating

To insure a happy Halloween the Union County Division of Consumer Affairs recommends the following safety tips from the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission:

Warn children not to eat any of their treats before they get home. Examine all treats carefully for evidence of tampering before allowing children to eat them.

Look for costumes, masks, beards and wigs labeled "Flame Resistant." Although this does not mean these items won't catch fire, such labeling indicates that they will resist burning and should extinguish quickly once removed from the ignition source. Flimsy materials and outfits with big, baggy sleeves or billowing skirts should be avoided to minimize risk of contact with candles or other sources of ignition.

Make or buy costumes light and bright enough to be clearly visible to motorists. For greater visibility at night, costumes can be decorated or trimmed with reflective tape which will "glow" in the beam of a car's headlights. Bag or sacks should also be light colored or decorated with reflective tape which is usually available in hardware, bicycle, and sporting goods stores. Children should also carry flashlights to see and be seen more easily.

Costumes should be short enough to prevent children from tripping and falling. Children should wear well-fitting, sturdy shoes. Mother's high heels are not a good idea for safe walking.

Hats and scarves should be tied securely to prevent them from slipping over children's eyes.

Apply a natural mask of cosmetics rather than have a child wear a loose-fitting mask which might restrict breathing or obscure vision. If a mask is used, however, make sure it fits securely and has eyeholes large enough to allow full vision.

Swords, knives and similar costume accessories should be of soft or flexible material.

Smaller children should always be accompanied by an older responsible child or an adult. All children should use the sidewalk rather than walk in the street, and they should walk, not run, from house to house. Children should be cautioned against running out from between parked cars or across lawns and yards where ornaments, furniture or clotheslines present dangers.

Children should only go to homes where residents have outside lights on as a sign of welcome. Children should not enter homes or apartments unless they are accompanied by an adult.

Those receiving trick-or-treaters should remove anything that could be an obstacle from steps, lawns and porches. Candlelit jack-o'-lanterns should be kept away from landings and doorsteps where costumes could brush against the flame. Indoor jack-o'-lanterns should be kept away from curtains, decorations or other furnishings that could be ignited.

Jane Wyman book called exceptional

Coffee table books have always been a special favorite of this reviewer. They decorate one's living room or library and they attract the attention of perusers. And when a coffee table book boasts of exceptional qualities, such as subject matter and rare and wonderful photographs, then one is more apt to keep it on one's lap rather than on the table.

One such book is "Jane Wyman. The Actress and the Woman," an illustrated biography by Lawrence J. Quirk, published this year by Dembner Books in New York City and distributed by W. W. Norton & Co. Inc., New York.

melodramas. Among her roles at Warners was that of girl reporter Torchy Blane, Ronald Reagan's love interest in "Brother Rat."

She wasn't really taken too seriously by the studio, however, until, at the age of 31, in 1945, after 48 movies, she played the role of Ray Milland's leading lady in the startling drama, "The Lost Weekend." She had been loaned out to Paramount Pictures for this one, and when her own studio realized her potential, she was given more to do in Warner films. In 1946, she was loaned out to Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer to do "The Yearling," with Gregory Peck, where as stoic-faced Ma, she established herself, at long last, as a serious actress.

Her immense contribution to the history of motion pictures was Warner's superb casting of Wyman as the deaf-mute Belinda in "Johnny Belinda" in 1948. She received an Oscar for her performance, and that year had to compete against such top rate actresses as Irene Dunne for "I Remember Mama," Olivia De Havilland for "The Snake Pit," Barbara Stanwyck for "Sorry, Wrong Number" and Ingrid Bergman for "Joan of Arc."

In 1949, Quirk wrote, Jane Wyman had reached her peak as an actress. From then on, he pointed out, she had some personal ups and downs with marriages, births and divorces.

She starred in a number of movies after that and among her outstanding films were "A Kiss in the Dark" with David Niven, "It's A Great Feeling" with James Stewart, "Stage Fright" with Marlene Dietrich, "The Glass Menagerie" with Kirk Douglas, "The Blue Veil" with Richard Carlson and Natalie Wood and "So Big" with Sterling Hayden. She made several films with Bing Crosby, and another with Ray Milland called "Let's Do It Again," a comedy in which she does a wonderfully sexy dance number.

Wyman made two movies with Rock Hudson, "The Magnificent Obsession" in 1954 and "All That Heaven Allows" in 1955, and she became a kind and caring friend to the sensitive and then growing actor.

She continued to make films, although for Jane Wyman, they were becoming a dying art...that is, her kind of films. She turned to television in the 1950s, and in the 1980s became one of the highest paid stars.

The wonderful Wyman qualities, her talent and beauty, continue to be in evidence even in her senior years. As the imposing Angela Channing in CBS-TV's "Falcon Crest," she still gives as much as she gets.

In this excellent biography of Jane Wyman author Lawrence Quirk has a book he can be proud to call his own.

And she continues to astound this long-time fan in the continuing saga of the many lives of Jane Wyman.

On the shelf

The book, which delightfully delves into the personal and professional life of the star of television's "Falcon Crest," offers five decades of insights into the real Jane Wyman, before and now, and produces rare background material on her 75 movies, with nearly as many outstanding photographs to accompany the text. There also are very personal photos of what her life was all about while she was indefatigably giving so much to insatiable movie audiences. The fans of the silver screen hungrily and thirstily gobbled and gulped up her many movies and asked for more.

According to Quirk, an established author and biographer, who has written a novel and 15 biographical books on stars such as Joan Crawford, Paul Newman, William Holden, Robert Taylor, Warren Beatty and Gloria Swanson, Wyman was nominated for four Oscars and won one for "Johnny Belinda." She has been married five times, including twice to the same man, and once to the president of the United States, Ronald Reagan.

But perhaps this reviewer is getting ahead of herself. Quirk begins with a lonely child in Missouri who turned to dancing as an escape and tackled Hollywood during the depression years. Beginning in 1932 Wyman had scattered roles as a chorus dancer in films, and from 1936 to 1939 became a contract player at Warner Brothers Studios. She appeared in numerous B movies in roles that were so similar that one couldn't differentiate between them. Later, during the war years, Wyman managed to wangle some bigger roles over at Warner Brothers, and she ultimately got to play second leads in light comedies and

Cosmopolitan distribution

Plovers, shorter-billed but stouter-built birds than the sandpipers, often seen scurrying about the beaches and estuaries of the world, have a cosmopolitan distribution. Generally migratory, they cover great distances between their breeding grounds and winter haunts.

For the birds

One of them, the Golden Plover nests on the shore of the Arctic Ocean. During its fall migration, large flocks of these golden-yellow feathered shore birds travel non-stop from the Canadian Maritime Provinces to Brazil. The bird spends its winter on the pampas of Argentina.

Its migrations, much written about, are legendary. If you go to the Hawaiian Islands during the Yuletide season, you'll surely see the Golden Plover on the grass behind the beach at Waikiki and elsewhere. These Siberian nesters winter in Hawaii, southern Asia and Australia.

Ornithology is an exacting science. Consequently, I must mention that there are two distinct species of Golden Plover; the Lesser and the Greater. While the former is a North American bird, the latter is a rare visitor from Europe to Greenland and Newfoundland. The Greater Golden Plover is larger

and whiter than the Lesser.

The Plover family includes the Dotterels, also a short-billed shore bird that someone once regarded as stupid and easy to catch; hence its name. I've seen the tawny-throated Dotterel in grasslands behind the beaches south of Lima, Peru. It's a gorgeous bird. Its antics cast the Dotterel as dumb. But its behavior is contrived. Try to catch one and you'll exhaust yourself as you attempt to snare it.

If you visit Western Alaska during the summer, you could see a Eurasian Dotterel. It's a rare breeder on the Arctic coast north of Nome. Its cinnamon underparts, grey back and white eyestrike are unmistakable.

But you don't have to travel to Hawaii, Alaska or South America to see Plovers. In the Middle Atlantic States, particularly in mid-September, the Killdeer Plover utters its frequently reiterated cry which resembles the words "kill deer" or the syllables "kill-dee" from asphalt parking lots in suburban and rural areas. Watch for this brown-backed bird as it runs about nervously, uttering its call. It has four black bands across its whitish chest.

Eight species of Plover occur in North America. Some of them frequent the dry upland; others such as the Semipalmated Plover and Piping Plover, prefer areas near the beaches. Although you believe parking lots in the fall are for cars, they are also FOR THE BIRDS....

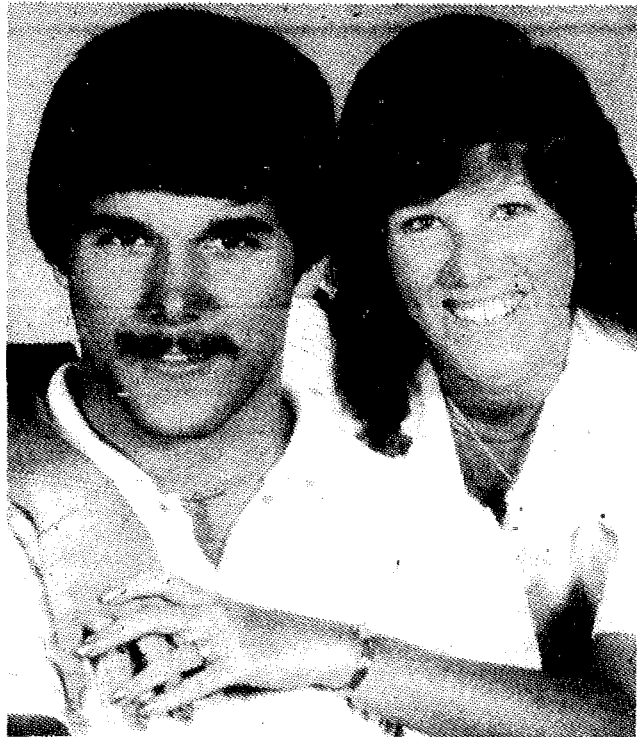

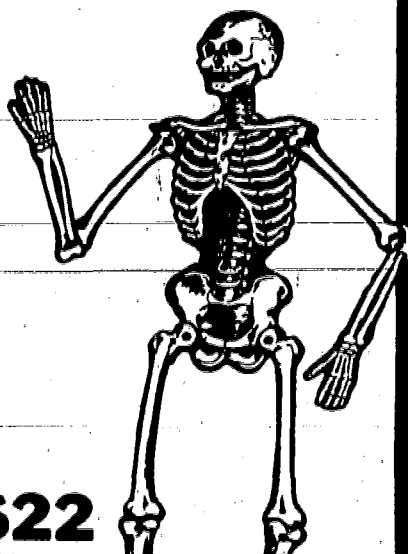

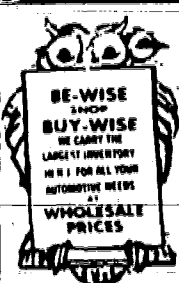

Music is historical



REBA MC ENTIRE

Pick of the LPs, "What Am I Gonna Do About You" by Reba McEntire (MCA Records).

We can divide the history of country music into periods represented by its most influential artists. Depending on our years, country music can mean Patsy Montana, Molly O'Day, Kitty Wells, Patsy Cline, Loretta Lynn or Tammy Wynette. For those of us living in the 1980s, country music

means, and will continue to mean in the years ahead, Reba McEntire. member. The announcement of her membership was part of a television special celebrating the Opry's 60th anniversary, which aired in January.

The awards continued this year, when Reba, the former rodeo barrel racer, was chosen in October as the 1986 entertainer of the year and top female vocalist at the 20th annual Country Music Association Awards show.

The 31-year-old performer, who gave up her rodeo career seven years ago, became the first singer to win number female vocalist three straight years since Tammy Wynette did so in the late 1960s.

Reba kicked off 1986 with a bang by releasing the Number One album, "Whoever's In New England," from which the hit singles "Whoever's In New England" and "Little Rock" were pulled; and making her very first music video — the hot-LP title track. Shot on location in Boston and New Bedford, Reba blazed new trails for country music in that part of America by shooting her video there and making regular concert appearances in the Northeast to introduce new fans to her kind of country.

The September, 1986 release of "What Am I Gonna Do About You," Reba's most comprehensive and artistic album to date, will further enhance her already solid reputation as one of music's premier vocalists. The first single — the title track — is one of those emotion-packed jewels

Reba responded with a year's worth of solid chart success, sending both "Home Blue" and "Somebody Should Leave" to number one, and placing "Have I Got A Deal For You" and "Only In My Mind" near the top. The crowning event in this banner came in November when she was asked to join the Grand Ole Opry as a

'Rose' adaptation better than book

The year is 1327 and the Benedictine monks in an Italian monastery are mysteriously dying. A Franciscan monk named William of Baskerville is seeking to discover why and how they are dying.

Such is the premise of Umberto Eco's novel "The Name of the Rose" and the current movie adaptation of the book, directed by Jean Jacques Annaud, which stars Sean Connery and F. Murray Abraham. An unlikely bestseller if there ever was one, the book's 600-page-plus length included lengthy discussions on languages and religion.

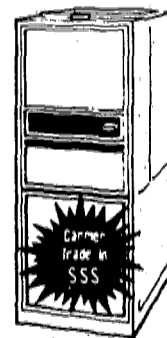
