A 'need for speed' motivates Ciasulli

Speed, adrenaline, perspiration, rubber from slick tires flying into your face at speeds of more than 100 miles per hour — this is race car driving — and one man's hobby.

During the normal course of the year Michael Ciasulli sits in his office at Maxon Pontiac-Honda in Union running the dealership. He deals with happy customers, irate customers, customers threatening to sue him, working employees, non-working employees, paperwork and all other "hassles" that arise.

To unwind and relax, instead of sitting in an overstuffed chair listening to Tchaikovsky on the stereo, Ciasulli sits behind a steering wheel listening to the roar of an engine.

"If I didn't have all this pressure around me, I don't think I'd have a hobby that goes to this extreme. When I get in the car I'm in my world," he says.

The name Ciasulli and cars seem to be synonymous. His father Robert Ciasulli ran the Maxon dealership until his death two years ago. Ciasulli and his brother Tim now run the Union business.

Mike grew up around cars. He remembers when the Union facility was being built and the dealership was being moved from Hillside. The first customers at the Union dealership were driven around in golf carts. "I remember driving the golf carts and having races with them," he says.

From racing golf carts at the dealership to motorcross in high school Ciasulli has

always enjoyed racing. It was only a matter of time until he went to race on a grander scale.

The brothers raced offshore motor boats together until 1984. During the time they raced they were quite successful placing second in the 1984 Motor Boat World Championships.

Racing and the Ciasulli name have also been known to go hand in hand. Anyone who listens to the radio while driving to work in the morning probably hears commercials for another Ciasulli — older brother Bob, who has had a successful career racing cars.

In 1984 the father of the Ciasulli brothers died. Realizing that boat racing was fun, but "if there was an accident we'd both be gone and there'd be no one to run

the business," a decision was made that the two brothers would not race together. Tim went on to race motor boats while Mike sat behind his desk running the dealership full time.

Mike had grown up at the dealership. He helped around the place since adolescence and after graduating from the University of Miami, in 1981, it became his profession. Instead of Mike and Tim taking time off from work to race, Tim went on to a successful boat racing career. He was runner up in the 1985 national championships and holds two speed boat records. Mike sat back and watched.

A "small rivalry" has always existed between the two brothers ever since they were small, he says, and for him, something was missing.

"Tim was out racing boats and having a good time and I was sitting around running the dealership. I wanted to go out and have some fun," he says, clenching his fists.

Mike says he had a "need" — as Tom Cruise said in "Top Gun," "the need for speed."

"It's like a bad vice. You've got to keep going back to it," he says.

Mike made a decision. He was going to race cars.

Making a decision and realizing it are two different things, Ciasulli recalls, noting that it's not possible just on a whim to get behind a steering wheel on a track and race. The first step was to get a license. To do that he had to attend a variety of race car driving schools. After doing this he received a provisional license.

The second step was getting a car to drive.

With a man surrounded by cars you may think this wouldn't be a problem. Originally it wasn't because he decided to race showroom stock. All he had to do was take a brand new car off the showroom floor, such as a Trans-Am, put in a roll cage and add some safety features.

With Maxon supporting him, Mike went out and in his first year won the North Eastern Roadracing Championship.

Still, something was missing.

There was the roar of the engine, but not of the crowd — no crowds, no hype, no excitement. "The stands were empty. Nobody came to watch," he says.

Mike did not want to drive around an oval. He wanted to race — really race. "I thought, if I was on a race track I wanted to be in a race car. I figured if Paul Newman could do it at 60 then I could do it at 26."

The next step was to get a race car. Because his knowledge of mechanics and building race cars are

limited, "I'm a salesman not a mechanic." Mike entrusted his crew chief from the previous year to go out and build him a car.

Unfortunately for Ciasulli, 1985 turned out to be the low point in his career. The building of the stock car did not go as planned and

Ciasulli found himself with no car, no crew chief and out \$15,000 with the 1985 season coming up.

He then contracted with a group of men in Georgia to build his car. The car was ordered in January 1985 and was supposed to be delivered to him by June. The car

didn't show up until November.

These are not factory built cars. "The cars are built separately by hand from the ground up. Each has its own personality," he says.

In the meantime Ciasulli kept his racing skills sharp by driving showroom stock. While racing he was

reprimanded for driving recklessly and almost had his license revoked.

By the time he received his car — one that could achieve speeds of 190 miles per hour and go from 0 to 60 in 4.5 seconds — there was only one race left. He had only 30 days and one test session before that time.

"I've never been in a full blown race car before and here I was in danger of having my license revoked. People were telling me I couldn't drive," he says.

With less than 30 days before his first race second thoughts started popping into his head.

"Then I looked over at my brother who was setting records and having a good time," Mike says.

Again, he recalls, a "need" arose. He went to his test session. "There were some bugs to take care of. But it felt good. I felt comfortable in the car."

On Nov. 30, 1985, Mike made his debut on the fastest track on the circuit, Daytona Beach, Fla. He qualified 14 out of a field of 35. He never finished the race because of motor troubles but it was the start of something new.

As 1986 came it was time for the first full season on the circuit. With Maxon, The Protector, Audivox and Pontiac behind him, Mike went on the road. During the second race he was officially welcomed into professional racing. In Charlotte, N.C., going 120 mph, Mike hit a concrete retaining wall. He came out all right but a little shook up. "That was my indoctrination into racing."

At the end of the season he finished 10th overall. Out of those top 10, eight are professional drivers. "That's all they do is race. I did the whole circuit and gained some respect out there."

New Kennedy book is based on secretary's diary

Sometimes a personal secretary to a dignitary can tell more about that person's life — qualms, habits, idiosyncrasies, personality — than a member of that person's family; including, sometimes, a spouse, if there is one. And that seems to be true of Barbara Gibson, who served as personal secretary to Rose Kennedy. The matriarch, now in her 90s, unpinned her Paris-original hat and thoroughly unveiled herself before the caring Gibson.

Gibson, who claims that Mrs. Kennedy suggested that she keep a diary of her days in the woman's employ during the 1970s, because it would be nice for Gibson's children to have, not only kept a diary, but wrote a book from those notes, with Caroline Latham, called "Life With Rose Kennedy — An Intimate Account." It was published this year by Warner Books Inc., New York City. Gibson dedicated the book to her two children and their children.

What does a secretary do for someone like the legendary Rose Kennedy? Why, she answers and writes letters for the woman. Mrs. Kennedy is a devout Irish Catholic

and would insist on walking to church each Sunday, whether it was from her Hyannis Port winter home in Massachusetts or her Palm Springs summer home in Florida. In spite of the fact that Mrs. Kennedy would persist in having her daily walk and swim and persuade biographer Gibson to accompany her in pools and oceans, (is this, too, a secretary's duty?) Gibson found herself worrying over and caring for the stubborn old lady. In addition to this, she soon became chauffeur and reservations secretary for the many Kennedys who came to the summer homes for the day, weekend, weeks and vacations, with luggage, kids, friends and servants.

Gibson, the secretary, soon found that her many duties included being a companion, and oftimes, a confidant — although Mrs. Kennedy seemed to discourage a personal relationship. Occasionally she even established a class distinction between herself and those in her employ.

Mrs. Kennedy never worried about catching cold in a cold-water ocean. She said she found it relaxing

— and so it was, for both of them. Mrs. Kennedy would sometimes recall her days as the daughter of a Boston mayor, John Fitzgerald; the wife of an ambassador to England, Joseph Kennedy; the mother of nine children, among them, the president of the United States and two senators; and the grandmother of dozens of youngsters, all vying for her attention and her love.

On the shelf

She rarely spoke of her feelings after the death of her husband, Joseph; the accidental death of her son, Joe Jr. and her daughter, Kathleen; the assassination of two of her sons, John and Bobby; or the retardation of her daughter, Rosemary. In her most distressing moments, she found solace in her religion.

The remaining children, Eunice Shriver, Patricia Lawford, Jean Smith and Ted Kennedy, who con-

spired among themselves, always used the catch phrase, "Don't tell Mother." And Gibson, amusedly, abided by their wishes.

Gibson reveals some truths about the then octogenarian, an eccentric woman, who would wear Paris originals to benefits, give generously to charities, but restrict her finances outlandishly. She kept one housekeeper, who refused to make meals for anyone save Rose Kennedy, and who liked to sing Irish duets with her. Gibson tells her famous story about Mrs. Kennedy insisting that a 59 cent bag of potato chips be returned to the store because there still was a half-eaten bag of chips in the kitchen.

According to Gibson, even Mrs. Kennedy's grandchildren were in awe of her. She restricted their Christmas checks, restrained them from becoming too extravagant and watched over them when they sat at her dinner table to be sure they didn't take second helpings at one sitting. That is, unless they were thin or underweight.

Years later, after Gibson left Mrs.

Kennedy's employ — at a time when Mrs. Kennedy required a nurse-companion rather than a personal secretary — Gibson visited her in Mrs. Kennedy's Palm Springs home. There seemed to be some intimacy at the meeting, but Gibson felt that Mrs. Kennedy didn't really recognize her. However, upon leaving, Gibson was told by the old woman that she seemed to remember "a very pleasant association," and the author agreed enthusiastically. It was that. And more.

"Life With Rose Kennedy" is a pleasant, well-written book, and it offers some new and very personal insights into the phenomenon that is Rose Kennedy. It also contains some interesting family pictures of the Kennedys and some with the family and the author.

It's a commendable book, one that any reader interested in any phase of Kennedy life would pounce on for news, tidbits, gossip, amusement and real-life, every day drama with one of the most famous women in the world.

'Vulgar' words not tolerated

Teachers supervising the program may have chosen to simply let the student continue instead of disrupting the entire event. Most schools we know of don't tolerate vulgar language in the classroom or at school-related functions and sanction such behavior as they see fit.

You may be interested in knowing that last summer in a U.S. Supreme Court judgment, teachers were given brand new disciplinary powers. Included was the right to suspend students for using vulgar language.

Q. Can business men or women now become elementary or high school principals? My neighbor said this is happening today throughout the country.
