

Editor's Notebook



I always referred to her among the staff as the Grande Dame of the Assembly because she carried herself well.

There weren't too many legislators like her, nor do I expect there to be too many like her in the future. Assemblywoman Maureen

Ogden announced she will retire this year after she completes her seventh term as a member of the New Jersey Assembly. New Jersey residents, not only those from her 21st Legislative District, but residents across the state, certainly will miss this "citizen's politician."

She has been dubbed the "citizen's politician" because she has acted in the best interests of her constituents during her tenure in the Legislature. Whether the legislation is targeting domestic violence or opening adoption records to adoptees, Mrs. Ogden - and I feel I can deviate from our style that prevents us from using courtesy titles - has listened to the concerns of her constituents and has tried to support those who need her help.

Worrall Newspapers has endorsed Mrs. Ogden's bids for reelection since at least 1987, pre-1991 redistricting, when I was managing editor of our Maplewood newspaper and she served in the Assembly's 22nd Legislative District. We have always felt that government at every level needed elected officials of Mrs. Ogden's caliber. By the way, when she served in the 22nd district, her colleague in that district was Rep. Bob Franks. Talk about a wellrepresented district.

Following state redistricting after the 1990 Census, Mrs. Ogden had to fight and conquer another battle. While the number of municipalities remained the same when sh moved from the 22nd district to the 21st district, the make-up of those towns had changed. During a conversation we shared in 1991, Mrs. Ogden said she felt like she was running for election for the first time. Who in Roselle Park, Union, Springfield or Kenilworth knew her? I recall her asking me what these towns were like and to help her become familiar with some of the issues facing their residents.

She and then-Essex County Freeholder Monroe Lustbader won the Assembly seats in their new district in 1991. Some will still say they were swept into office with a majority of Republicans because of voter dissent with Gov. Jim Florio's \$2.8 billion tax package, but I'd still like to credit intelligent voters for their victory.

Last week, I spoke to Mrs. Ogden about her reason for choosing this year as the time to retire from the Assembly. She said she planned to leave two years ago, after serving 12 years, to give someone else a chance to enact policy. Term limits, she said, are good for a healthy government, and 12 years in the Assembly is enough time to effect change.

Well, we got to keep her in the Legislature for two additional years. State residents are better for having representation from the Grande Dame of the Assembly.

Shooters reach quota in effort to cut deer

On Monday the sharphooting program in the Watchung Reservation came to a conclusion as the last of 50 deer were killed.

While Dan Bernier, chief of park operations for the county, was prohibited from speaking with Worrall Community Newspapers, because the bureau objected to several word choices in last week's local story published in the Summit Observer and Mountainside Echo, Public Information Officer Peggy Salisbury provided factual information regarding the sharpshooting program.

"An administrative decision was made that factual information will be distributed through the Office of Public Information," stated Salisbury.

Of the 50 deer, 28 were female; 22 were male. Twenty-two of the does were pregnant and it has been estimated that all save one was carrying twins; the exception was believed to be carrying triplets, according to Salisbury.

It will take "several weeks" for pathologists at the Division of Fish, Game and Wildlife to ascertain the precise conditions of the killed females.

Additionally, 22 males were shot: 10 button bucks, an anticriess male deer less than one year old, and 10 bucks that had shed their antlers. The high number of dead males was an indication that the sharpshooting "should have taken place earlier in the year to avoid shooting antlerless deer," said Salisbury.

Six of the shot deer were fawns, one of which was pregnant, Salisbury added. Also, 37 deer were killed with one shot, which testified to the accuracy of the selected agents, reported Bernier, according to Salisbury.

Officials plan to count the remaining deer in the park, but Salisbury stressed. that such a count would not involve deer located at locales other than the

"There are deer in other pieces of private property and other parks. We're not talking about the entire deer population in the County of Union," said Salisbury,

Banasiak re-elected UCUA chair

Blanche Banasiak of Elizabeth was unanimously re-elected to serve a second year as chairwoman of the Union County Utilities Authority, during the UCUA's ninth annual reorganization

Also elected, during the meeting held earlier this month, was Garland Booth as vice chairman, Kathy Pulcomer as treasurer, and Bill Wolf as secretary. Following the elections, Banasiak reviewed some of the UCUA's 1994 accomplishments.

"Tonight's meeting is not only the formal opening of a new year for the UCUA, it is an opportunity for us to review the accomplishments of the year just past," said Banasiak. "On Feb. 11 start-up of Union County's long-awaited Resource Recovery Facility took place."

Between Feb. 11, 1994 and Dec. 31, 421,123 tons of waste were processed at the facility and nearly 215 million kilowatt hours of electricity were produced, said Banasiak. In addition, 11,344 tons of ferrous metals were recovered, according to the chairwoman.

When the plant opened, the tipping

fee fell from \$106.59 to \$71.50.

The chairwoman then listed some of the authority's other major accomplishments from the past year. These included increased resident participation in the Special Household Waste Collection Program, an increased county recycling rate to more than 50 percent, start-up of the state's first Used Fluorescent Lamp Recycling Program, an agreement with the county to establish a Truck Route Enforcement Unit to ensure trucks traveling to and from the Resource Recovery Facility use the proper roads, implementation of reform policies at the authority dealing with car use and compensatory time, formation of the Business Liaison Committee and active participation in the municipal waste flow control debate. In addition, at Banasiak's direction, the Authority held an orientation to educate them on the UCUA. A similar workshop will be held this year as

"One of my goals as chairman is to improve communication between the UCUA and the community. That is why the Business Liaison Committee

was established. In addition, I am determined to have an open door policy with the county's mayors. I think it is essential that everyone have a clear understanding of how the authority operates," she said.

In closing, the chairwoman discussed her involvement in a new demanufacturing program. "Late in 1994, I announced that I have taken steps to initiate a demanufacturing program in Union County. This is an effort to identify, locate, process and market the valuable components of manufactured products that have his. torically been discarded," she said.

"I believe this program will make a major contribution to the development of a farsighted effort to minimize not only the dimensions of our waste stream, but also the costly economic losses that are now incurred by society's inattention. Value should not be thrown into a scrap heap...or into a resource recovery plant. It should be located, processed and used...and that is the point of our demanufacturing program," said Banasiak.

Teen-agers ready for health conference

Some 400 students from Union County public and parochial high schools will explore ways to work through problems common to all teenagers at Go to Health, an annual youth health awareness conference given by the National Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence of Union County, Inc. on March 27 and 28.

Designed to help young people develop a positive self-image, an important step in preventing alcohol, tobacco and other drug use, the conference will be held each day at the Cranford campus of Union County College from 9:30 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Go to Health will focus on ways young people interact with their peers and learn to overcome obstacles that impede healthy growth. This year students will attend workshops on making sexual choices, improving family relations, resisting peer pressure and reacting to media influences. They will explore coping strategies through interactive theater. Teachers and counselors accompanying students will attend a workshop on crisis response in the schools.

The Go to Health conference is sponsored by the Board of Chosen Freeholders, Schering-Plough Corporation and the ASSIST Coalition for Smoke Free Essex/Union Counties.







Mill stars find dual roles real 'fun'

Both Jonathan Wade and Nancy Bell, stars of "The Prisoner of Zenda," current production at the Paper Mill Playhouse, Millburn, find their dual roles "challenging" and "fun to do," rather than difficult and nearly impossible.

It seems that Wade's roles of Rudolph Rassendyll, an English gent-Jeman, and Rudolf, Crown Prince of Ruritania, were so energizing, that the versitile actor lost 10 pounds during the early rehearsals. But he takes it all in stride, as does the lovely Bell, who also exerts herself endlessly in the roles of Rose, Lady Burlesdon and Princess Flavia of Ruritariia.

Both were happily inclined to talk about dual roles during dual conversations last week.

"It's getting easier as I get into shape," said Wade, "Really, it just gets easier and easier."

"It's not so bad," echoed Bell, "It past takes a couple of seconds in getmg myself together. I take a deep breath and switch railroad tracks.

Waste explained that it can become confusing when playing the "two difbecaute characters at the same time. I have to place my voice in a different place - a higher register for the prince and a slightly different accent for the English gentleman. I can tell he admitted, "that Angelo del Rossi, Robert Johanson and I worked a ibng time on getting a distinct differ-

ence between the two characters. "It was especially difficult when I

myself. That took a long time to get it right. It was exhausing all of our

The most difficult feat for Bell, she said, is all ironed out, especially in the last act, when she has to make a quick second change in costume and wig from the Princess to Lady Burlesdon. "I'm ready to come onstage quickly because," Bell laughed, "there are three women backstage who attack me with clothes and wigs. They have to put a dress on what I'm already wearing. And I just stand there. It's fun! It's even more fun when people gasp and say, 'How do you do that?'

It's great," Bell reiterated, "I just stand there. I have a person back there who takes my hair off, and puts the

"I have to give a lot of credit to my dresser. Jackie," interceded Wada. "Shels the head dresser. She's incredibly right there with everything. She's wonderful! I have a guy nearby who dresses like me," he said, "but even so. I run around making costume Shanges. It's pretty difficult, but the most difficult part of the play is when I'm having a conversation with myself, as I told you before."

Does he really have the red hair that adom both characters?

Wade laughed wholeheartedly. 'No, it's a wig. I have brown hair. But it's pretty much the same style as my hair. It's a great wig,"

Bell, who is familiar with the Paper Mill Piayhouse - she played Lucie Manette in "A Tale of Two Cities"

was having a conversation with and Estelle in "Great Expectations" - said of her roles in "The Prisoner of Zenda," "I love it. They are my favorite roles. I'm getting to do a lot of things on stage that I never did

> "For example," she said, "the audience enjoys seeing a wonderful sword fight, especially, when it's a woman fighting. It's not something you get to see often. It's really different from the Dickens' roles - which I liked too.

"But this is exciting, you know, when after rehearsing several weeks, you take a big, deep breath and jump into it, and perfect it. The accent helps too. I did British accents several times before in other plays," she said.

Wade, who is new to the Paper Mill Playhouse, said he was really chtranced by everything about it. "The people are all wonderful. It's been one of the best ensemble casts I've ever worked with. Everybody works together and the commitment is so great to the script - really, the level of commitment is so high. Everyone has respect for each other. No one is selfish. And that's been a

"When you perform for these people, you get such an adrenalin rush that it seems like you can do 10 performances in a row, as long as there is an audience. The energy supply is endless. Your will to entertain overcomes your body's need to rest," he

Bell declared that "when I'm working at the Paper Mill, especially in this play, I feel that I'm in an old movie.

There are very few theaters that have the resources that the Paper Mill has, and the costumes and sets are so lavish and everything is on a grand scale. It may take a lot of energy but it's really fun."

She admitted that "five shows a weekend, one on Friday night, two on Saturday and two on Sunday - are real killers, but you get two days off offer that. I'm happy to be working with Robert again. I've worked with him three times. We speak each other's language. We are able to comminicule well. Michael Anania is bulliand, and so is Greg Barnes with their amazing designs; Michael with scena and Grag with costumes. The Paper Mill has some of the best designers in the business."

What do they both think about "The Prisoner of Zenda" as a Broadway

"I think it's suitable for Broadward," said Wade, "At least I hope so - in the sense that it is a speciacle. It's areal epic in which Robert calls it a miller-chaster ride. Once you get on it, you just can't stop.

Straight plays don't usually do well on Broadway, but of course this one can because of its pace and the way it moves," he said.

"If it does go to Broadway," added Bell, "that would be nice. Any straight play to Broadway is difficult. But I do feel this one could make it. And that would be terrifie!"

And they indicated enthusiastically, they both would climb aboard for that "fantastic roller-coaster ride all the way to Broadway,"

Pleasing the patient is priority for surgeon

As a plastic surgeon with more than 25 years of experience and having performed more than 3,000 nasal operations, I deal with people seeking nasal surgery on a daily basis. I still hear, particularly from older people, the admonition that it is wrong to interfere with the will of God by changing someone's appearance. The common complaint is that anyone who would undergo this type of surgery is vain and vanity is simply sinful.

The plastic surgeons word for vanity is self-respect and the desire for self-improvement in the great majority of cases is legitimate and understandable.

Even in the short span of 25 years I have seen many changes in performing surgery on the nose. It was not too long ago that people who had nasal operations were hospitalized for several days. Blood loss could be considerable and on occasion, blood transfusions had to be given because of the amount of blood lost at the time of surgery. Noses were packed tightly so the bleeding could be controlled. This was a most unpleasant experience for the patient and the post-operative surgical period was not only filled with discomfort but with actual pain. Today with the many advancements in nasal surgery the procedure has become efficacious, whereas a nasal operation 25 years ago might take as long as two hours or more, today most surgeons are able to perform the surgery in 45 minutes or less. The patients are sedated and have their choice of being totally awake, being in a twilight zone or, indeed, being totally asleep. The patient undergoes

the surgery on a same-day basis and returns home after several hours. Ninety-eight percent of the nasal operations do not require any nasal packing and blood loss is extremely limited if it occurs at all. The recuperation period is quite short and the procedure is without pain during and after surgery.

In spite of the many improvements made and although the surgery is a routine procedure, rhinoplasty is not for everyone and many considerations, not only anatomical but psychological, have to be made by the surgeon prior to accepting a patient for this type of procedure. A happy surgeon is he who is selective in the patients he accepts for this type of procedure. The surgeon must make every attempt to study and know his patients well, prior to any comtemplated surgery.

Psychologists tell us that selfimage, that is, the way a person pictures himself, is probably one of the most important "components of achievement and happiness. If, indeed, by operating on a nose you can increase that self-image, then for the surgeon, as well as for the patient,

it is a most rewarding experience. Changing the contour, size and shape of a patient's nose is serious business since that patient will have, the "new nose" for the rest of their

life. Every effort is made to understand what the patient's goals are and should the patient decide to go ahead with the surgery, every effort is made to achieve those goals.

The patient is encouraged to see our photographer who takes several views of the face and profile. By drawing on those photographs, the patient can get a good idea of what the before and after will be. Although the patient is shown pictures of other patients who have had nasal surgery and their before and afters, seeing it on their own profile and face is a better way for the surgeon to understand what the patients want.

The patients are encouraged to meet with others in their age group who have had the same type of nasal surgery performed. The patients are left with those who have already had the surgery and the patient can ask any questions he has of those people, since they have already been through the same type of surgery.

Some of the most frequent questions asked are the following:

It is the goal of the plastic surgeon to please the patient. The patient should be encouraged to get second opinions since in plastic surgery there is an artistic sense of expression. We have found by our experience that the informed patient makes the best patient and they should be encouraged to ask all and any questions they have concerning the surgery. Making people happy by improving their selfesteem is a great source of satisfaction and gratification for the surgeon per-

Laser study of eye problems agreed to for St. Barnabas

"St. Barnabas and Dr. Perl are at the forefront of new refractive techniques," said Ronald J. Del Maure, chairman and chief executive officer of St. Barnabas.

The study will examine the effectiveness of the procedure in improving the vision of patients with farsightedness and astigmatism. The Holmium Laser uses a crystal to produce a narrow, uniform beam of infrared light to change the shape of the comea. The laser is administered by placing a fiberoptic probe in contact with the

In addition to the clinical study using the Holmium Laser, several other procedures performed at St. Barnabas have the ability to correct refractive errors: Radial Keratotomy for low levels of myopia, or nearsightedness; Automated Lamellar Keratoplasty for moderate to high levels of myopia, and Arcuate Keratotomy for astigmatism.

The same friction that brakes use to stop a vehicle's wheels also causes brake components to wear out and need replacement. By practicing good driving habits, motorists can make their brakes last longer and reduce repair expenses. When stopping, slow the vehicle gradually instead of stopping suddenly. It's a good idea not to ride your brakes on steep hills. Downshifting helps slow the car and limits the amount of braking that's needed.

"Often the first sign of worn brakes is a brake pedal that seems to require more pressure to stop the vehicle,"

explains Town, "Scraping, squeaking or chirping noises that come from the wheels when the brakes are applied, are other signs of potentially excessive brake wear. If your vehicle pulls to the left or right when you apply the brakes, it could mean trouble.'

Master Cylinder- Brake fluid reservoir should be checked periodically to ensure proper fluid level.

Brake Lines-: Steel brake tubing running from the master cylinder to all four wheels should be inspected for leaks caused by damage or rust. Brake hoses- Rubber brake hoses




