## From The Editor's Notebook

I'm having difficulty understanding what the New Jersey League of Municipalities does.

Yes, I know that when municipal councils and township committees consider resolutions recommended by the League of Municipalities, the governing body doesn't blink an eye to pass them. I've covered several towns and when these resolutions are read, council people seem to sit in awe when the League of Municipalities is mentioned in the text.

I also know the League sponsors an annual convention in November for any and all officials from across the state. The convention is held in Atlantic City, and from what I have experienced, there's more action in the casinos and hotel bars — until 4 a.m. — than there is at the seminars that are offered.

I also know that towns pay dues to the League of Municipalities based on, I believe, the size and population of the town.

But other than lobby state government, I don't understand the purpose of the League of Municipalities, and why towns — and therefore taxpayers — have to fund it when they really don't get much of a return for their money.

The League is part of a recently formed coalition "that will work to ensure voter ratification of Public Question No. 3, the state mandate-state pay amendment, in November. Approval of the public question would amend the state Constitution to limit the imposition of future unfunded mandates on school districts, municipalities and counties." This came from a press release prepared by the coalition.

Is this what the League does in return for annual dues?

The League was instrumental in lobbying our state legislators to support bill A-1908/S-7, the state mandate-state pay bill, which gives municipal councils and school districts the option to publish legal notices by title only. It's ironic that a taxpayer-funded group would support a measure that would leave taxpayers in the dark when it comes to actions taken by their governing bodies.

Who asked for their opinion? Who asked for their interference? The League of Municipalities certainly didn't go to the people who pay the taxes that eventually fund the group and ask how they felt about the public notice advertising bill.

But that's one of the questions I have about the League of Municipalities. Whom does it represent?

If any of our elected officials can shed some light on this topic, please let me know.

Residents served by New Jersey-American Water Company no longer will receive a quarterly bill.

Water meters will be read on a monthly basis, and residents will receive a bill every month.

New Jersey-American is saying that the monthly readings will make plumbing leaks evident more quickly, and help avoid high bills because of water loss.

I'm looking at the new method as a conservation technique. Leaks during a drought period should be fixed more quickly.

## Summit, UJB merger impact on county unclear

What the impact will be locally with the recent decision by UJB Financial Corp. and Summit Bancorp. to merge has not yet been determined.

The announcement of a definitive agreement to merge was made Sept. 11 and at that same time it was made known that a "cost-reduction process" would be forthcoming.

But what the impact will be on Summit's 15 branches and UJB's 22 branches in Union County is still up in the air.

"We have not made that determination yet," said C. Scott Rombach, senior vice president for corporate communications for UJB, when asked how the 37 branches would be affected.

With branches scattered throughout the county, including several in Union Township, Summit and Chatham, it is not unlikely that at least some of the banks in the county will be subjected to either consolidation, closure or a reduction in workforce. The new corporation will operate under the Summit name.

The streamlining effort will be headed by Summit Chief Executive Officer and President Robert G. Cox, who will be the new bank's president in addition to serving on its board of directors, and John G. Collins, UJB financial vice chairman. Their mission is to cut \$78 million in annual operating costs through the elimination of duplicative systems and "other merger synergies."

According to published reports, the new Summit intends to close 50 branches, the majority of those closures coming in South and Central New Jersey. An unspecified number of jobs will be eliminated.

"The prompt integration of Summit and UJB Financial will generate cost savings that will offset the initial dilution to UJB Financial shareholders, and is expected to add savings per share in 1997. The transaction will enable the combined entity to achieve returns that neither company could realize on a stand-alone basis," said T. Joseph Semrod, UJB's chairman. "We remain dedicated to building shareholder value."

Under the terms of the merger, which was approved Sept. 11 by boards of directors of both banks, Summit's shareholders will receive .90 shares of UJB common stock for each share of Summit common stock in a tax-free exchange. The merger will be accounted for as a pooling-of-interests. Based on the average closing price of UJB common stock, the transaction's value is estimated at \$31.95 per share, or a total of \$1.2 billion.

The new corporation, Summit Bank Corp., will have assets of \$22 billion, deposits of \$17.6 billion and shareholders equity of \$1.7 billion. The merger will create New Jersey's second largest bank, celebrating a top three spot in 13 of the state's 21 counties. Summit will command the number one market share in four of the nation's top 25 counties ranked by per capita income. The company will retain a strong presence in eastern Pennsylvania.

"This strategic partnership has compelling benefits for us and is an important part of our previous stated growth plan," said the 58-year-old Semrod, who will serve as chairman and chief executive officer of the new corporation. "It is a solid blend of two common business cultures and philo-

sophies and substantially enhances our market share in the largest market in the nation. We are poised at the threshold of some very exciting business opportunities."

The transaction is expected to close in the first quarter of 1996, subject to regulatory and shareholder approvals. UJB anticipates incurring a one-time restructuring charge of about \$54 million after taxes.

First Union, with \$16.1 billion in assets, is the state's top bank, that dis-

tinuation coming as the result of its plans to acquire First Fidelity Bank. First Union is based in Charlotte, N.C.

Summit Bancorp., headquartered in Chatham, has assets of \$5.5 billion. UJB is a Princeton-based financial services company with \$15.9 billion in assets. It operates 277 community banking offices and 277 automated teller machines through United Jersey Bank and New Jersey Savings Bank in New Jersey and First Valley Bank in Pennsylvania. The company pro-

vides financial services through its major lines of business including commercial banking, retail banking, mortgage banking and investment management. These core businesses and nine non-bank subsidiaries offer a full array of financial services to individuals, businesses, non-profit organizations, government entities and other financial institutions.

Merrill Lynch & Co. is acting as UJB's financial advisor and Keefe, Bruyette & Woods Inc. is Summit's.

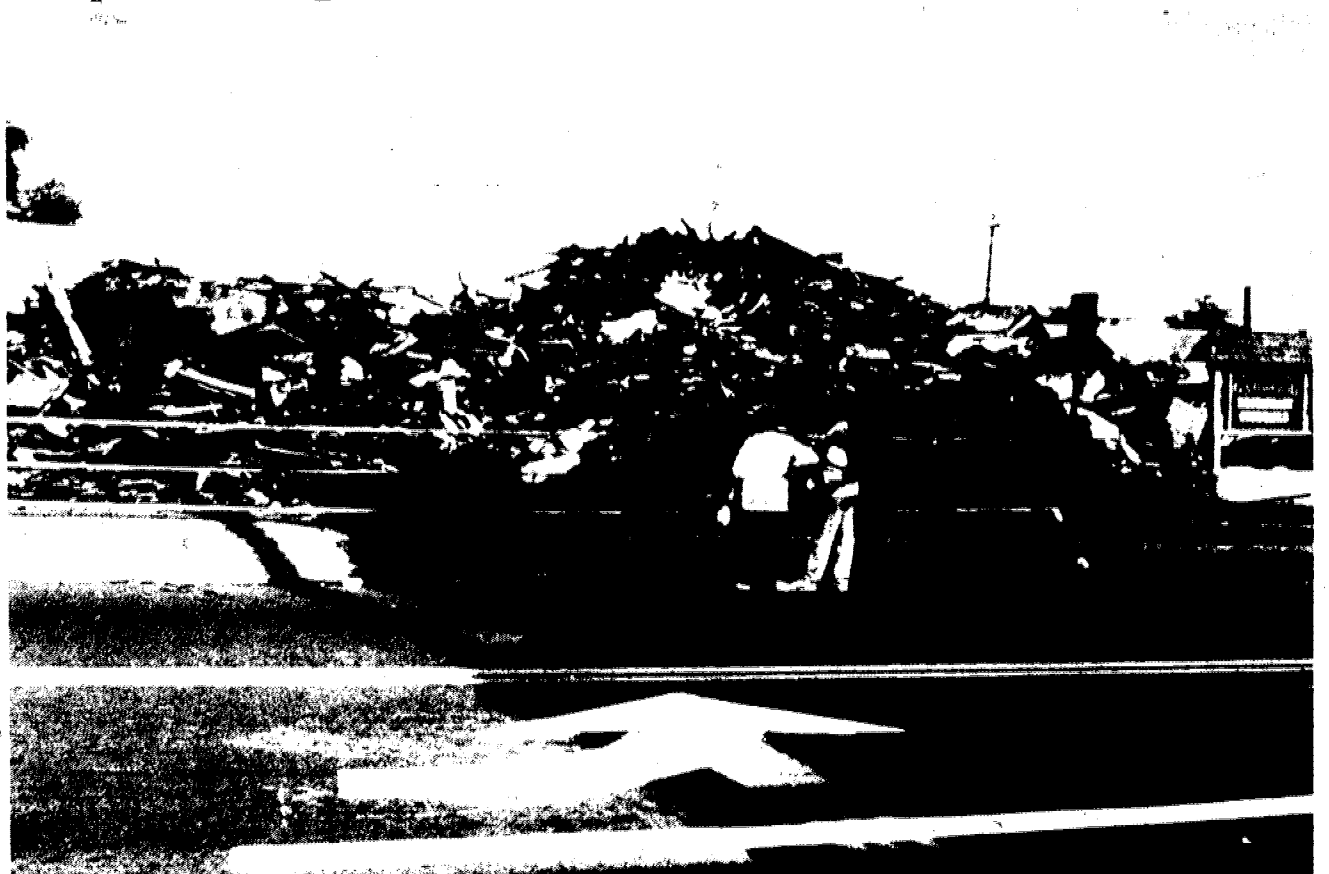

## Workshop to assist small-business owners

A workshop to teach small business owners how to bid on government contracts will be sponsored by the Union County Economic Development Corporation and the Union County Chamber of Commerce on Oct. 5.

The workshop, "Selling to All Levels of Government," will provide small business owners with a practical understanding of how the government buys goods and services. Topics will include where to get information about contracts and subcontracts, how to submit a bid, and what to do if you have problems.

Workshop presenters will include procurement special-

ists and program directors from the Small, Women and Minority Division of the New Jersey Department of Commerce; the Divisions of Purchasing from the County of Union and the City of Elizabeth; the Union County Economic Development Corporation, and the Air Services Development Office at Newark International Airport.

## Marrero named chairman of Kean's trustee board

Jacinto "Jack" Marrero has been named chairperson of Kean College of New Jersey's Board of Trustees. He succeeds Larry Lockhart who was elected chair in 1990 and has served as a trustee since 1985.

Marrero, a Princeton resident, was appointed to the board in 1993. He brings a lifetime of community service and human relations experience. Since 1969, he has served in several positions with The National Conference of Christians and Jews, and is currently its executive director of Greater New Jersey.

Two other board members, Sister Rose Thering and Kenneth Estabrook, have been named vice-chair and secretary, respectively.

Thering, who has served the board

since 1994, is the executive director of the National Christian Leadership conference for Israel. A professor emerita in the College of Secondary Education at Seton Hall University from 1968-89, Thering, a West Orange resident, is widely recognized for her work in building bridges between Jews and Christians.

Estabrook, who joined the board this year, is a founder of and now is of counsel to Lindabury, McCormick and Estabrook, a 32-lawyer firm formed in 1954, located in Westfield. A resident of Summit, he also serves as chairman of the Union County Alliance, a broad based coalition designed to provide a long-range vision for Union County's economic renewal and revitalization.

## Water-saving tips offered to lessen drought woes

Municipalities in Union County effected by the drought emergency are Berkeley Heights, Elizabeth, New Providence, Springfield, and Summit, according to the Union County Board of Agriculture.

Gardeners in these towns are permitted to water plants, trees, shrubs, and vegetable gardens with a hand-held hose with automatic shut off, watering can, or bucket any time during the day.

Gardeners in the other Union County towns can water as they normally do.

The following recommendations have been made to help gardeners conserve water:

- Water frequently, deeply and thoroughly. This will encourage rooting and greater tolerance.

- Mulch soil surface. Mulching cuts down on water loss due to evaporation.

- Shelter Container plants. Move containers to shade areas to keep them from drying quickly in hot windy areas.

- Install a drip or other water conservation irrigation system. Slow drip and deep watering systems can save up to 60 percent of all water used in garden care.

- Water early in the day.

- Aerate lawns.

- Cut lawns to proper height. Let lawns reach a height of 3-4 inches. Longer blades of grass can mean 3 to 4 days longer between waterings.

## County remains tops in Moody's eyes; keeping interest down

Union County has been awarded the coveted Aaa bond rating by Moody's Investors Service, Inc., one of the nation's oldest and largest bond rating and financial services agency, according to Union County Manager Ann Baran.

The highest quality Aaa rating indicates the county holds the strongest ability to repay its debt, which translates into a lower interest rate.

Union County has held the non-insured or "true" Aaa bond rating since 1976. Currently, the rating is held by only four other New Jersey counties — Bergen, Middlesex, Morris and Somerset.

This highest quality credit rating resulted in the Sept. 14 sale of bonds totaling \$31,785,000 to Chemical Securities, Chemical Bank, which will be used to fund the cost of capital improvements in the county. These bonds, with a 4.40 percent interest rate and an average life of six years, will fully mature in 10 years. Savings over the lifetime of the issue is estimated at \$1 million as compared to an Aa rated issue.

The county made a presentation to Moody's Investors Service in May, and brought together business leaders from all sectors of the county. The representation was diverse and included various speeches as well as a tour of the entire county.

"We are taking a business approach in the way we manage the organization, with a focus on delivering quality for value," Baran said. "Through the Union County Alliance, our county government has worked closely with the private and public sectors to address economic and social issues that will stimulate economic growth and development, and put the economy on a stronger foundation."

Linda Di Giovanni, chairwoman of the county's Freeholder Board, said she was pleased with the announcement. "Speaking on behalf of the board, we are pleased to receive the news. The improvements we have made to all aspects of the county, and the savings we have realized, reflect the county's sound administrative and financial management. This is particularly impressive when you

consider the progress we have made despite recent economic downturns in the area of the county."

"Union County's economic strength and currently low outstanding debt will continue to benefit its taxpayers," said county Finance Chairman Freeholder Frank Lehr. "This rating indicates that Union County is credit worthy and a good investment, and will help us continue to save taxpayer dollars and sell our bonds at a lower interest rate."

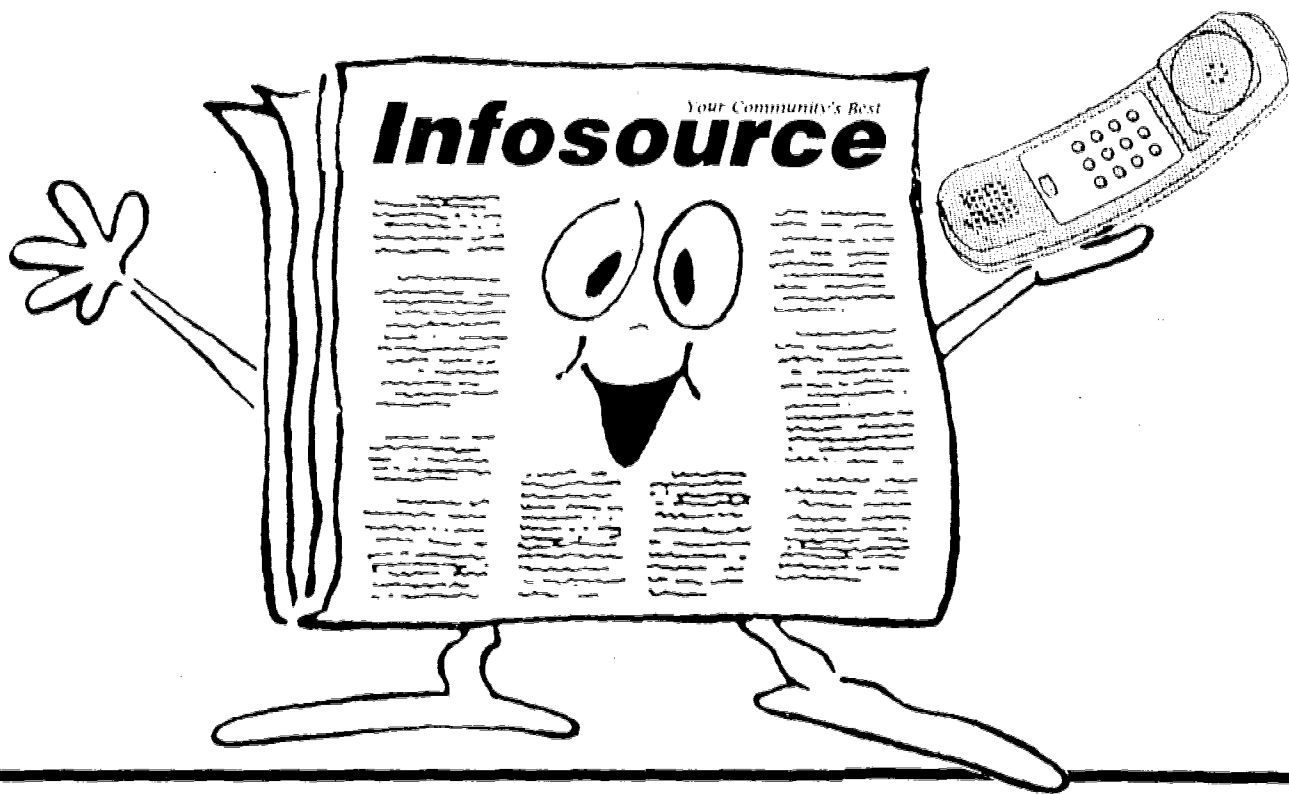
The 76 projects being funded by the sale of the bonds will benefit the citizens and taxpayers of Union County in the areas of infrastructure, recreation, transportation, education and general public service and safety. Areas addressed by the specific projects include flood control and storm sewers, park improvements, reconstruction of county roads and bridges, and expanded educational facilities and equipment.

The bid from Chemical Securities was accepted over three other bidders — First Fidelity and Midlantic, both at 4.50 percent and Prudential Securities, at 4.55 percent.

# Helm's Company plans annual harvest festival

The 2nd New Jersey Regiment, Helm's Company, a re-creation of an actual fighting unit of the Continental Army during the American Revolution, will be present throughout the day at Trailside Nature and Science Center's Annual Harvest Festival on Sunday.

Sponsored by the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders and the Division of Parks and Recreation, the festival will be held from 1 to 5 p.m. Special performances will accent a day filled with on-going adult and children's activities such as Helm's Company.

At 1:15 p.m., a Weed Walk by Wind and Wolf Company will show which plants in the Watchung Reservation have medicinal and/or edible uses. Since only a set number of participants can be accommodated, pre-registration, the day of the festival only, will be required.

Magic shows, Colonial style, will be presented by the Colonial Conjuror, William Meyers, at 2, 3 and 4:15 p.m. Dressed in early American costume, Meyers will use 18th Century props and live animals to perform unbelievable feats of "hocus-pocus." Eighteenth century music will be brought to life by Eclectic Consort at 2:30 and 4:30 p.m. Ballads, reels and

other dance tunes are sure to get toes tapping.

Native Americans will be saluted throughout the day. Bob Grant will demonstrate the Indian flute and speak about his ancestors, the Chippewa Indians, at 1:15 and 3:30 p.m. At another location, at the same performance times, the Old-Time Lakota Dancers, Order of the Arrow Boy Scouts, will be performing native American dances. Trailside's own planetarium will present Native American Skylore at 2, 3 and 4:15 p.m.

Colonial fare such as fresh pressed apple cider, baked pies, organic produce, baked potatoes and barbecued beef and chicken will be on sale throughout the day. Pumpkins and mums also will be featured sale items.

# Nominations are sought for historic preservation

The Union County Office of Cultural and Heritage Affairs is now seeking nominations for the 10th annual Historic Preservation Commendations to be awarded early next year.

Union County Freeholder Linda-Lee Kelly, liaison to the Cultural and Heritage Programs Advisory Board, said "The historic preservation commendations illustrate the variety and scope of Union County's historic resources. The projects cited represent the historic preservation efforts of individuals, organizations and local governments throughout Union County."

The annual historic preservation awards are sponsored by the freeholders, the Division of Parks and Recreation, Office of Cultural and Heritage Affairs, and the Cultural and Heritage Programs Advisory Board. Each year nominations are solicited from the public. While the nominated project must be in Union County, it is not necessary to reside in the county to propose a candidate.

"Commendations are awarded in six categories which include building preservation and restoration, continuing use, adaptive use and structure, object or site preservation," said County Manager Ann Baran. "There are also categories for leadership and preservation education. Since the inception of the program, awards have been given to preservation projects, groups and individuals in 13 Union County municipalities."

Author offers readers something new

Summit-born film historian Thomas J. Harris, who at the age of 29, has three published books under his belt, and the promise of an accepted screenplay in the works. The young man, who had been interested in the movies at a very young age, came by this office the other afternoon to talk about how he pursued his career, wrote his books and his recent successful screenwriting endeavors.

The books are "Courtroom's Finest Hour in American Cinema," published in 1987 by Scarecrow Press; "Children's Live-Action Musical Films," a critical survey and filmography, published in 1989 by McFarland & Co. Inc. of Jefferson, N.C., and "Bogdanovich's Picture Shows," the only book-length analysis in English of Peter Bogdanovich to date, which was published in 1990 by Scarecrow Press.

"I wrote those books because they were subjects that weren't covered before," Harris said. "The only reason to do a book is when the subject is unfamiliar to people. Otherwise, rewriting other people's books is useless."

"Now," he said, "I'm a screenwriter, represented by one of the top agencies in the country, Creative Artists Agency in Beverly Hills. The agency is send a script from one of the major studios for a feature film. It's the first screenplay I've had accepted

and produced, and I've been working on screenplays for the last five years," Harris declared.

It all started when he was 16 and got a videocassette recorder and found a documentary on Alfred Hitchcock. "It became like an obsession to me. I took a couple of film courses in college. It became an independent endeavor. I just became my life," Harris exclaimed. "I just kept buying books on film and had read books by people who had degrees. Then, I picked a small, narrow subject, sat down one summer and wrote my first book in eight weeks. There was a lot of interest, but the people out there told me it wasn't commercial enough, even though they said it was very well done. So, I finally found this academic publishing house in Jersey, which is now in Lanham, Md., called the Scarecrow Press. And they had published it in 1987."

"Courtroom's Finest Hour in American Cinema" is a critique of eight American made motion pictures which the author believes represent the best of courtroom-oriented cinema. In the book, Harris gives special emphasis to Otto Preminger's "Anatomy of a Murder," which he said he feels is the finest courtroom picture and it includes an appraisal of the film by its star James Stewart.

"I was 21 when Scarecrow Press published my book. And after that, I decided to do a couple more books," he said.

His second book, "Children's Live-Action Musical Films," which covers 15 feature films including "The Wizard of Oz," "Hans Christian Andersen," "Tom Thumb," "Babes in Toyland," "Mary Poppins" and "Dr. Doelittle," Harris discussed the "origins of the films and aesthetic and thematic similarities" and illuminates the "neglected contributions of such creative talents as Moss Hart, Charles Vidor, George Pal and Bryan Forbes."

In Harris' third book, "Bogdanovich's Picture Shows," there is an assimilation of "all positive and negative criticism of the director's work over the years and reinterpreting it from a 1990s perspective." The author said he hopes "to provide for the first time a true portrait of a filmmaker who has been sometimes misunderstood, sometimes misguided but always fascinating."

"For my last two books," Harris recalled, "I went to California and interviewed a lot of people there. Bogdanovich helped me with my third book and a lot of his friends talked to me. When the book came out," Harris smiled, "Bogdanovich bought 10 copies."

Veteran film historian Doug McClelland has said of Harris: "He was obviously a prodigy who had knowledge and appreciation of film beyond his years and he's also a very fine writer. Tom is a very intelligent young man, and I predict that he's going to have a lot of success."

In turning to screenwriting, Harris had some valuable assistance from Bogdanovich. "He got me into the agency, and I'm grateful to him for that. You know, you have to meet people, know people and people have to like you. It's a people business. You have to know how to deal with people who have gargantuan egos and know how not to offend them. And," he mused, "you have to have the patience of a saint."

"The screenplay I wrote is an original script, and the agency is getting it set up now for one of its clients," he said.

Harris has a great admiration for directors, particularly directors who write scripts. "I admire the directors who have written first. They are the true filmmakers, such as Billy Wilder, Stanley Donen, Joe Mankiewicz, Preston Sturges, Alfred Hitchcock, Frank Capra, Elia Kazan, Vincente Minnelli, Michael Powell, Mitchell Leisen and Satyasil Ray."

"Such directors wrote the script and directed the film, and you don't have to stretch to recognize qualities in them as you do to directors who didn't write the script," he said.

Harris plans to go on writing biographies and filmographies. He said, "I'll be doing a book on George Sidney and Charles Walters, the directors, respectively."

Harris, who has lived in Summit all of his life, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. See HARRIS', Page B5

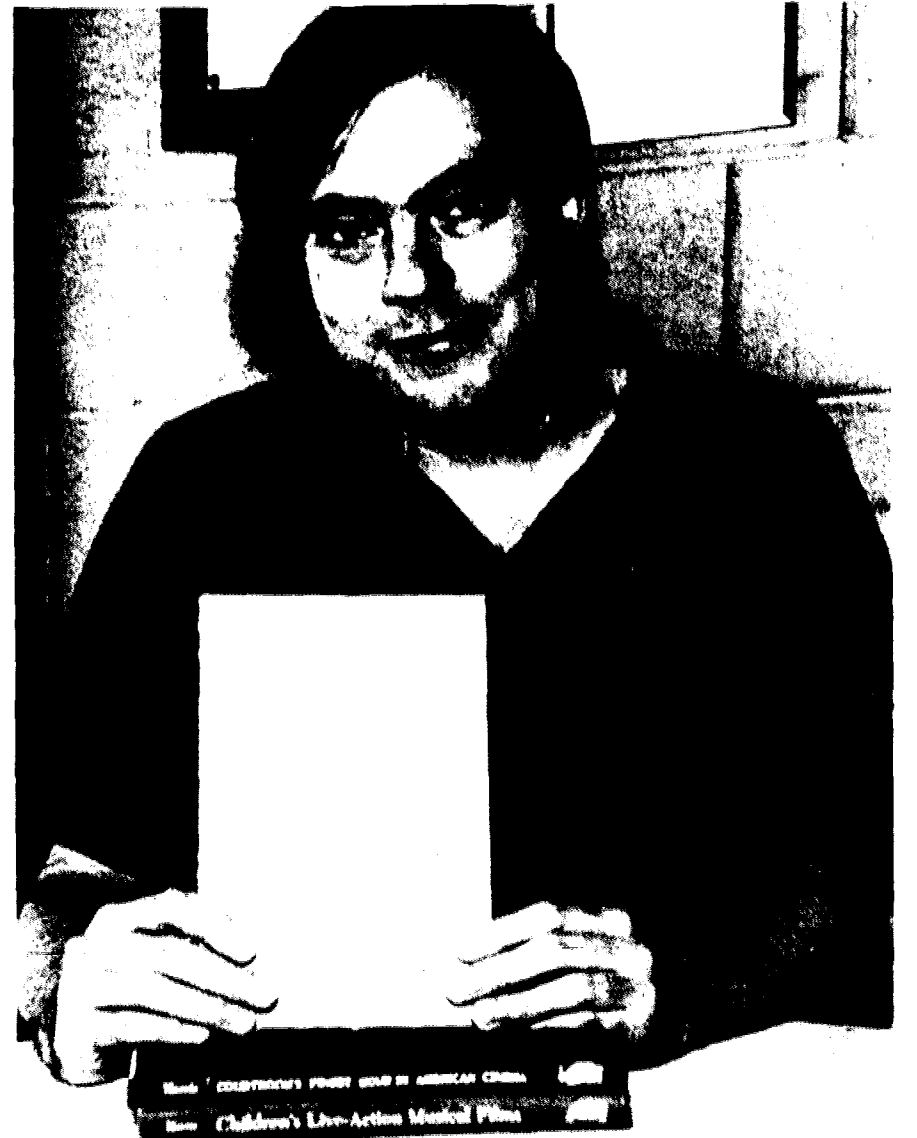

The Paper Mill Playhouse in Millburn has planned some innovative ideas for its fall season of productions and staged a preview at the Renee Fossaner Art Gallery at the theater of its offerings now through the end of spring 1996.

The preview program on Sept. 15 began with a cocktail party in which Paper Mill Playhouse Executive Director Angelo Del Rossi and Artistic Director Robert Johanson presented an overview of the season.

On hand were the cast members of the premiere production, "Nine," winner of five Tony awards in 1982

including best musical, which is currently being staged at the Playhouse. There was great applause when Michael Anania, the scenic designer, was introduced. Del Rossi explained that "we really want to expand our audiences from surrounding areas including New York City. We want to appeal more to the 30s and 40s groups and offer serious thought to bring them to our theater," he said.

He discussed the history of the Paper Mill Playhouse, which he said "began in 1934, founded by Antoinette

Scudder. She bought it and had Frank Carrington as executive producer, and it continued until 1980 until the fire. Fortunately, the dressing rooms were not destroyed nor the upstairs gallery. It took two years and 10 months to open the new theater in 1982. And we've been in business for a long time. We're always looking for bigger and better things to explore — that we were never able to do before."

"We're developing new, more provocative productions. You know," Del Rossi said, "all of the arts got a 50 percent cut this year. For us, it is three-quarters of a million dollars. We are reintroducing our community with

James Harris. He also has a sister, Nancy. He graduated from Summit High School in 1984 and then "I went to college in Pennsylvania. Since I was 16, I wanted to write," Harris said. "When I was 20, I really wanted to write screenplays. I was always very good at writing dialogue. No one can teach you that. And watching

movies over and over again, well, it became a sort of osmosis thing. "It's a very special skill. Either you can do it or you can't. And there just aren't that many terrific screenplays written. There are plenty of scripts that are submitted from people and are placed on the shelves. I know the marketplace. You have to know what will sell and try to write for adults, intelligent human beings and hope somebody will pay to see your movie on the screen or on video. You have to have someone who will pay attention."  
Harris said that he "didn't have an

agent before. You have to have an agent to submit your material," he explained. "It protects you from being taken advantage of. But," he grinned, "most people are honest."  
"I have another idea for a script. I'm going to keep writing original scripts. You know," he said pensively, "there should be a middle ground when you write a screenplay — between something that interests you and that you understand. And something that will entertain an audience."  
"And most of all," Harris added, "you have to be a professional about it."
