

Success with boosted engines prompted research with any and every means of pressurizing the intake tract throughout the 1980s. The supercharger that has sprouted at least eight branches is due.

First, turbocharging uses the engine's exhaust energy to power a fan-like compressor wheel, which force-feeds air to the intake passage of the engine. A second approach, called pressure-wave supercharging, applies exhaust pressure, directly against intake air, within the honeycomb-like passages of a rotating drum. A belt from the crankshaft is used to spin the drum. Opel and Mazda both used the Cummins approach for these models and imported to the United States.

The second approach might be considered dead-end, but supercharging, since it uses a pump, is some sort driven by a belt from the engine's crankshaft. In 1980, Honda attempted to perfect a sliding vane-type pump similar to auxiliary air

injection pumps in use since the 1940s. That effort was not successful. Centrifugal superchargers use a rapidly spinning impeller that looks some thing like a pinwheel to supercharge air into the engine. In essence, these devices, identical to the compressor of a turbocharger, air enters at the center of the wheel's axis of rotation and is exhausted tangentially. Unlike a turbo, they are not rotated by a turbine, but by shaft drive from the engine. Since this type of compressor is efficient only at very high rpm, a system of gearing must be employed to step up crankshaft rpm to speed suitable for the compressor effect.

Piston superchargers, still sold in the aftermarket, are of the centrifugal type. Various manufacturers have tried with rotary piston compressors, invented by Felix Wankel during the 1930s, without commercial success.

The sixth type of supercharger, rotary vane, categorization. Called

the G-Lader and used, to date, only by Volkswagen, this device shares certain characteristics with the aforementioned rotary piston compressors. A moving rotor fits within a fixed housing. Both the rotor and the housing have spiral walls that mesh to provide a maze-like air passage. The rotor facilitates air in a eccentric shaft and the constantly changing internal volume between the spiral walls provides a pumping effect. Air enters at the periphery of the spiral walls and is exhausted near the central axis.

Another unusual design is the screw-type compressor patented by Svenska Rotor Maskining in Sweden in 1936. Two interlocking and counter-rotating screw-shaped rotors move air axially through a housing with a claimed 10 percent efficiency advantage over Roots-type blowers. SRM's developer company, Opon Automotive, has developed automotive applications in more than a dozen countries. Whipple Industries of Fresno, Calif., currently

imports these superchargers for after-market use.

One might consider, the Roots-type blower, keeps returning to popularity in spite of all the aforementioned challenges that have grown over the years. Simple in the extreme, the Roots blower and variations on that original theme provide a very efficient means of moving high volume air.

One of the most common applications of the Roots blower is not for supercharging. Detroit Diesel engines have used the blowers for scavenging.

Blowing out exhaust residue and charging cylinder at atmospheric pressure. For 60 years, Ingersoll Rand rollers, through the Roots-type blowers to their liking for drag racing and have kept the design for decades. Several West Coast companies manufacture copies of the Detroit Diesel blower, originally designed by GM. They admit how easy can be to make a poor, preserving the engineering problem to solve.

Other than an occasional distant blower, turbochargers do their work in silence. In sharp contrast, the Roots blowers, used by Mercedes automobiles in the 20s and 30s, shrieked like tormented babies.

The blower report comes from pressure waves as air is pumped into the intake and from the gears that keep the wastegate in proper position. Turning a supercharger for efficiency is a significant engineering challenge.

Superchargers impose a significant parasitic loss on the engine, since they are driven by power from the crankshaft. The blower may be less than one horsepower while cranking but 50 to 100 horsepower at full load. This is why turbo systems are provided to reduce induction around the supercharger when the boost is demanded during idle and crank mode.

Several air compressors operate at less than 10 percent efficiency, it is impossible to have the pressure of

intake air without also raising its temperature. For this reason, both superchargers and turbochargers benefit from intercoolers. These radiator-like devices dissipate heat in the atmosphere and cool the intake air stream before it enters the combustion chamber.

The use of an intercooler improves cost and packaging penalties, but increases parasitic power losses and superchargers exhaust equal loading.

With tightening exhaust emissions standards, heat energy in the exhaust stream has become a precious commodity. What used to be converted into energy is now used in waste-heat recovery, an operating temperature and containing the oxidation of combustion byproducts outside the engine. Since superchargers depend on this exhaust heat energy to operate, they enjoy a major advantage over the turbo approach in the use of ultra-low emissions.
