

Orthodox Jewish congregations have been formed in Springfield with an initial membership of 75 families. To be known as Young Israel, the congregation will be oriented toward young men and women and will offer a full program of religious education and activities, according to a local spokesman.

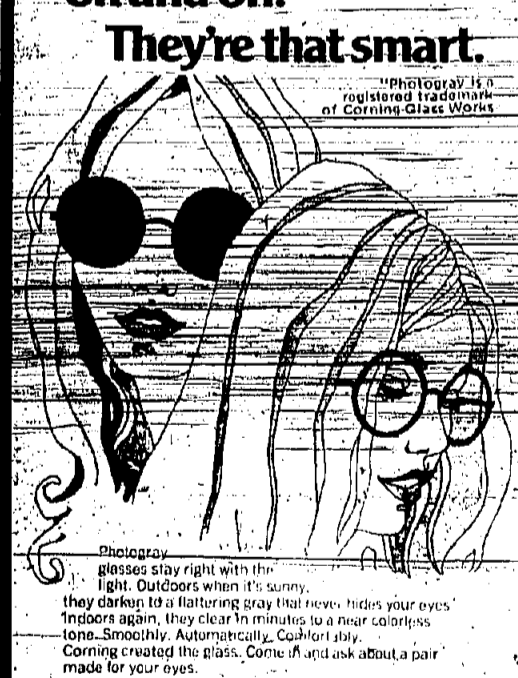
