Trinity has picked 'The Bad Seed' for Dayton stage play

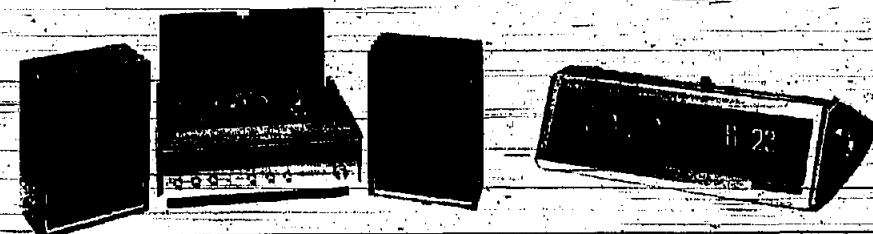
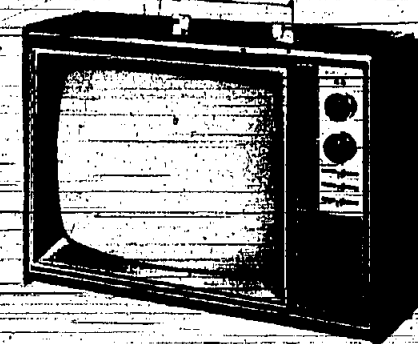

Editorial comment

RAISING HELP

The old cliché says that you can't fight City Hall. In Springfield, happily, you can always go to it to town hall, and so reasonably sure of a courteous hearing.

Last week's meeting of the Township Committee was a good example of democracy in action, with a crowd of 125 concerned citizens overflowing the meeting room.

Some 25 men and women had come out to "take care of the evening body, and all were heard but - until midnight.

Committee, by the nature of their office and no matter how hard they try, tend to be somewhat insulated from the day-to-day ideas of public opinion.

Too often, whether the issues are partisan, as on many topics, or nonpartisan, as in the long struggle for federal aid in flood control, there is a tendency to mistake unanimity, or disagreement, on the date for the same feelings in the community.

The general theme of most meetings is to make a decision. Satisfaction with efforts so far to alleviate the constant, and mounting, wave of floods.

And they had a full right to be happy, with talks ranging from boats in the streets to the need for furniture and appliances in their homes.

Still, the basic cause of local flooding was almost overlooked in the oratory. That basic cause is flood control.

Every time a new house, or factory or store or office building is constructed, that much land which used to absorb rainwater is covered.

Perhaps we need a moratorium on new building, until each builder accepts responsibility for disposing of the water which used to be absorbed by his property, and would now spill onto his neighbor's.

Obviously, little would be achieved by applying this concept to Springfield alone. The Highway 17 runs through several counties. Rt. 79, which has disrupted the town's entire drainage system, extends the width of the state, and beyond.

Efforts to secure relief in Springfield depend much more on federal, state and even county projects, rather than on what the town can do. And the town is doing whatever it can.

benefit from measures expected to be suggested in the forthcoming report of Gov. William Cahill's State Tax Policy Committee. The blue-ribbon citizens' group, which has spent over a year studying the present tax picture in New Jersey and considering alternative proposals for tax reform, is scheduled to come up with its recommendations some time this winter.  
Its findings on New Jersey's tax situation, though they won't be news to local residents, may come as a surprise to visitors from other states. For, although in most states more tax money is collected by the state government than by localities (on a nationwide average, 60 percent of the total state and local tax revenue is collected by the state), New Jersey turns this situation upside down. The state's non-property tax income comes out clearly in the fact that all state and local tax revenues, collected here, only about 40 percent is collected by the state. The rest comes from local taxes—57 percent from the property tax. These are spent at the municipal and county level.

EVERY HOMEOWNER can tell you the effects of this situation: to keep abreast of rising costs, local governments are forced to hike their property tax rates substantially each year. This causes great hardship, particularly to elderly people and others on fixed incomes, since the property tax bears little relation to the taxpayer's ability to pay. Although citizens of a community have no opportunity to vote on their municipal budget, in many cases they do vote on their school budget, also funded by the property tax. One indication of the growing "taxpayers' revolt" in this country is the fact that the home-owning middle class has begun to move to the suburbs, the tax base of the cities declined while demands for services actually increased. Tax rates on the remaining families holding sky-high.

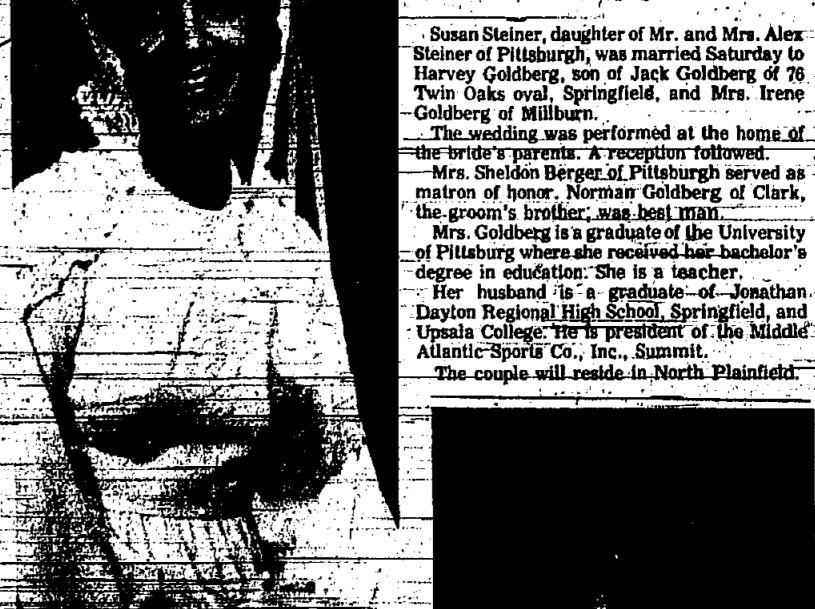

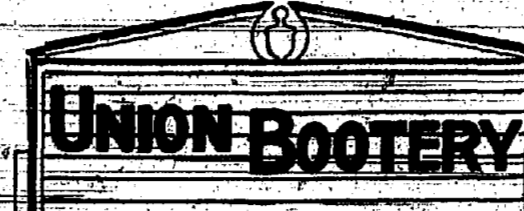

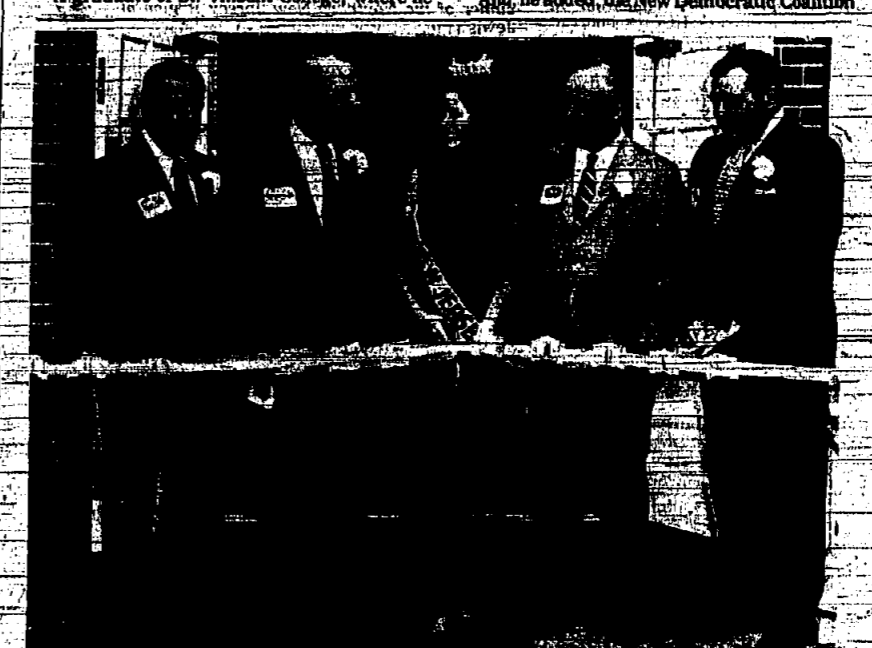
