

Bassano renewing call for creation of a river authority

Louis Bassano, 23, Republican candidate for Assembly in District 25, has renewed his efforts aimed at the creation of a **Rayway River Authority** by outlining a program of priorities he hopes will be followed by the state and municipalities.

"Every municipality struck with the awesome truth of flooding over the past few weeks has been looking for solutions that they hope will be control within their own boundaries," Bassano said.

"But this is not the answer. We must have a Rayway River Authority appointed and financed by the state which can oversee and correct the problems along the entire course of the river in Essex, Union and Middlesex counties."

Environment, Vietnam and economy major concerns, Dwyer survey shows

WASHINGTON — Rep. Florence P. Dwyer (R-12th Dist. N.J.) reported this week that her annual district-wide opinion survey shows that support for the environment, opposition to the war and concern for the health of the economy are the three biggest issues in the suburban communities of Union and Essex Counties.

"Substantial majorities of my constituents also believe that military spending is still too high, the quality of life has worsened in recent years, consumer problems demand serious attention and higher personal-income taxes would be justified if effective use of the funds could be assured in protecting the environment, finding a cancer cure and improving committee staff services."

On a key question, Mrs. Dwyer said, her constituents rated President Nixon's "performance in office" as follows: 44 percent good, 51 percent poor.

She noted, however, that the great majority of survey responses were completed in mid-July, prior to the President's initiatives toward Vietnam.

"On the wage-price front, for example, 62 percent of respondents said they believed wage-price controls were needed to control inflation, while only 22 percent opposed them, and 10 percent took no position on the question," she stated.

Although her constituents are generally suggesting a high potential for agreement with the President's recent actions, she noted that a cross-section of about 20,000 residents of the 12th District Mrs. Dwyer pointed out that approximately 20 percent who responded reflected a preference of those who were male, college-educated, middle-aged, Republican and with an upper-middle income.

"Support for environmental protection was especially strong," she said. "By a vote of 65 percent to 17 percent, respondents declared themselves willing to sacrifice some consumer income in order to reduce air and water pollution, and an impressive 82 percent to 13 percent margin favor of paying an extra \$10 in federal income taxes this year to clean up rivers and lakes if the money were used effectively."

Addressing the country's economy, Mrs. Dwyer summarized that poll results as follows: "The source of great concern with unemployment is, of course, second, though large minorities are unwilling to pay higher taxes to hold back inflation or to increase government spending to increase employment—nor would they permit unemployment to reach 7 percent if it were to present an opportunity of containing inflation."

Congresswoman Dwyer, covered three alternative approaches toward ending the war in Vietnam and all three received more "yes" than "no" votes.

Strong support went to the Congressman's own proposal for ending the war, which called for a 25 percent reduction in U.S. troops by Oct. 1. A 40 percent reduction in U.S. troops by Oct. 1 and a 60 percent reduction in U.S. troops by Oct. 1 were also popular.

There were sharp divisions between supporters on several issues," Mrs. Dwyer said. "Among them, 35 percent would accept government ownership, but only 20 percent would support a general national oil, 40 percent believe state and local governments should take control of coal, and 43 percent believe federal responsibilities but 31 percent disagree; 51 percent believe the draft is necessary while 29 percent don't."

The Congressman indicated special significance might be attached to the responses.

Editorial comment

EQUAL CREDIT

Anyone who looks out of a window these days will see, amid the falling leaves, the familiar sight of small boys tussling over a large football.

At the boys' game larger, the tussles grow larger, the excitement grows larger, the news pages of metropolitan newspapers—the mastheads of the National Football League—now have the world's only seven-month autumn season.

We should not forget, however, that autumn on the local scene is equally the time for two other sports from which high school athletes derive all the benefits of varsity competition.

Wrestler of course, to soccer and cross-country. Perhaps most important, however, is the sport in which the average young man competes, without possessing the special skills and physical attributes required for football.

The basic qualities for both soccer and cross-country are speed and endurance—both can be acquired by most boys if they are willing to work hard enough.

Soccer, which is one of the few world-wide sports, offers the excitement of a game played without the padding and anonymity of a football uniform. With the emphasis on speed, courage and teamwork, soccer has long dominated the sports of the sport bigness is hardly something to be measured in inches and pounds.

Cross-country, in one form or another, is perhaps the oldest of all sports and one of the most basic. It tests the athlete to the utmost, and he can credit no one but himself for his performance—aside from the coach who trains and motivates him to perform at the limit of his capabilities.

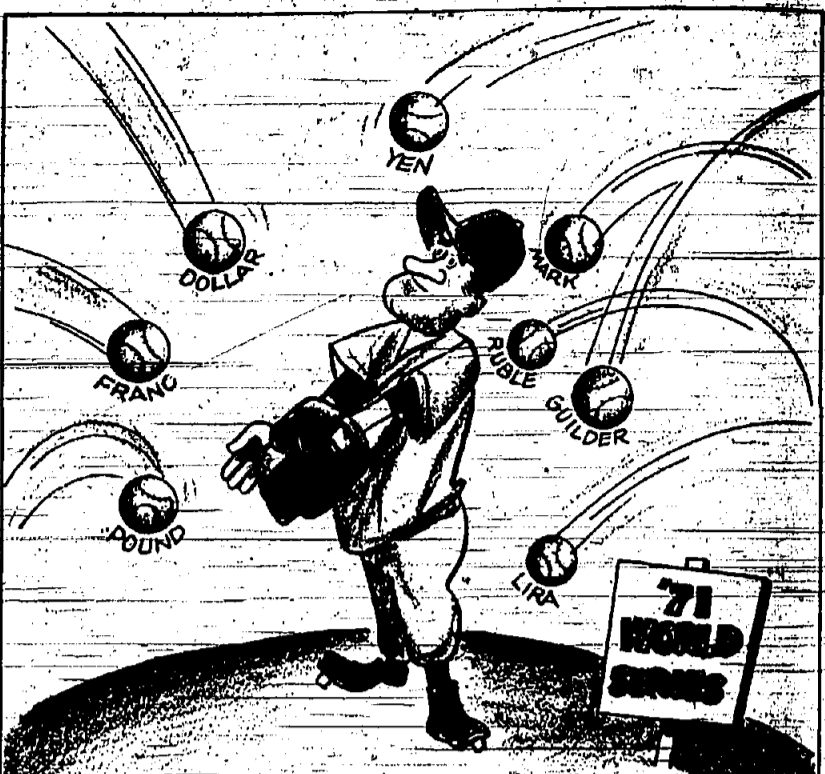
In addition, scoring of a cross-country meet depends as much on the contribution of the fifth man on the team as on that of the first. Competitions in both sports must do very large, without the incentives and the glamor represented by cheerleaders, majorettes and marching bands.

Some determined fans do turn out to cheer for their teams, but even the most dedicated have problems watching a race that winds through miles of parkland. Still, all the fans who take part in the organized excitement of a high school football game would do well to remember the contributions of the other athletes who work just as hard and merit as much acclaim for their achievements in the comparative privacy of the soccer field or the solitude of the long distance runner.

THE GENERAL PUBLIC frequently isn't sure just who is getting public assistance. Who is on welfare? There are 2.1 million families with 7.4 million children (an average of less than two children per family); 77 million aged, blind, and disabled persons; 11 million people receiving state aid. Of the 14 million receiving state aid, less than one percent are "black" families. The rest are white. Who can't welfare recipients work? This question has an obvious answer: they can.

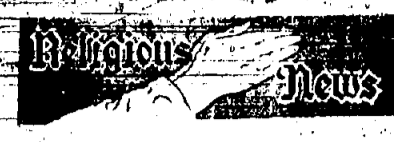

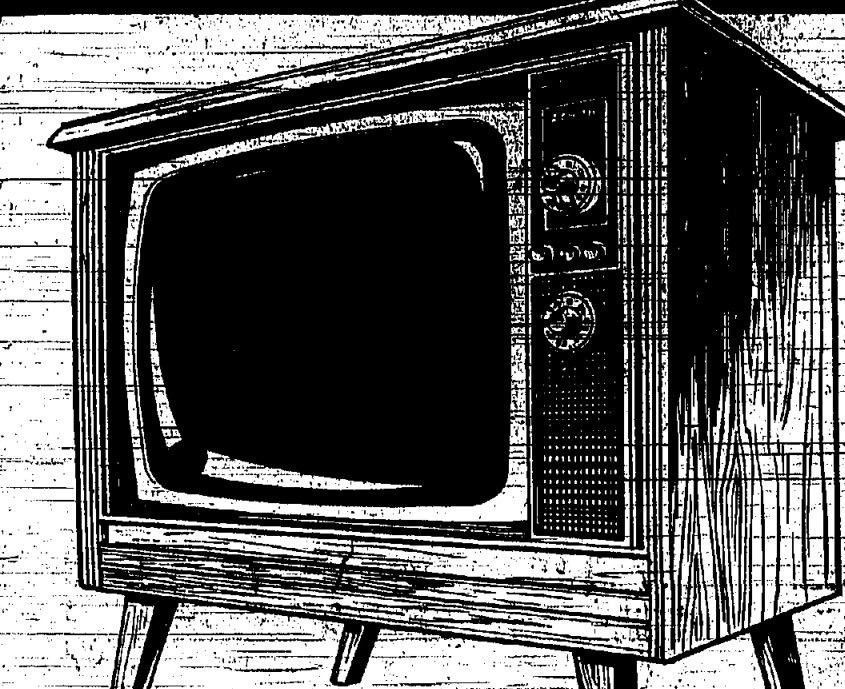

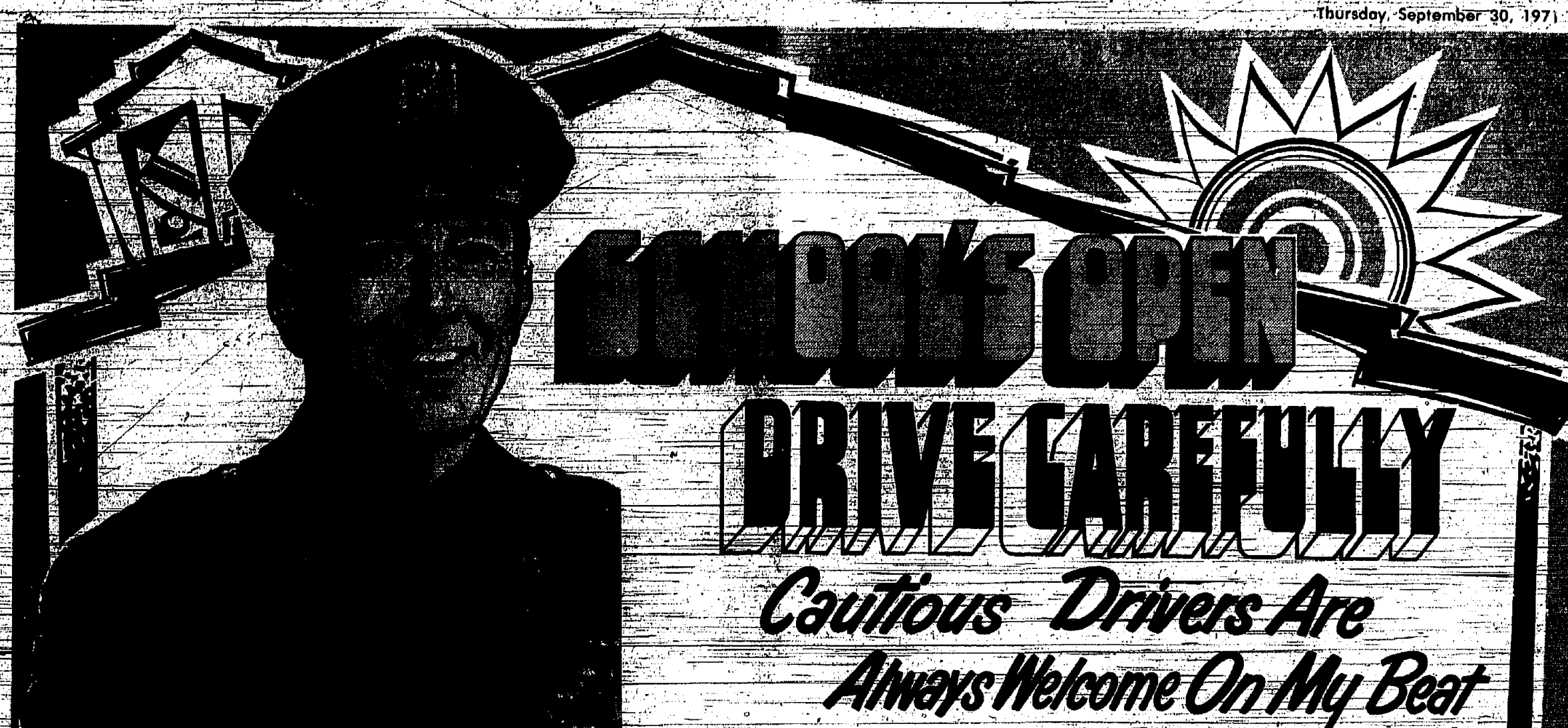

Flight training provided by CAP every summer

Civil Air Patrol, formed in 1941 by people interested in flying, has always sought to stimulate public concern for aviation and aerospace.

One of the ways it has done this at a national level is through flight training for cadets, a program which nearly always has been hampered by a lack of adequate financing.

At present, CAP sponsors a national level flying encampment each summer for cadets who are already qualified in solo flight. The encampments, four weeks in length, are directed toward enabling these cadets who have already earned to earn private pilot licenses through certification by the Federal Aviation Administration.

Institute at Rutgers planning to conduct state political polls

The Eagleton Institute of Politics at Rutgers University has announced establishment of the New Jersey Poll, to be financed in its first year by a \$10,500 grant from the Wallace-Elshar Fund and Eagleton Foundation funds.

"The purpose of the New Jersey Poll is to educate voters and government officials about themselves and each other," said Donald G. Herzberg, executive director of Eagleton, stressing that "the establishment of the New Jersey Poll is a further step in strengthening the identity of the state and its people."

During this first year of operation there will be four polls, with the results of the first to be made public during the third week of October, Herzberg said.

Each poll will concentrate on a specific subject or area of concern to New Jersey citizens and government officials, with the topics to be decided by an advisory committee of New Jersey judges, politicians and academics.

Each poll will consist of about 1,500 interviews drawn from a statewide-random sample. Technical aspects of the poll, including sampling, pre-testing, coding, tabulation and interviewer training will be performed by Opinion Research Corporation of Princeton.

Rooney cites plan for talent schools

Mickey Rooney has announced the formation of a new enterprise, Mickey Rooney's Talent Schools U.S.A., Inc., which will be devoted to teaching creative arts to children from three to 18 years of age.

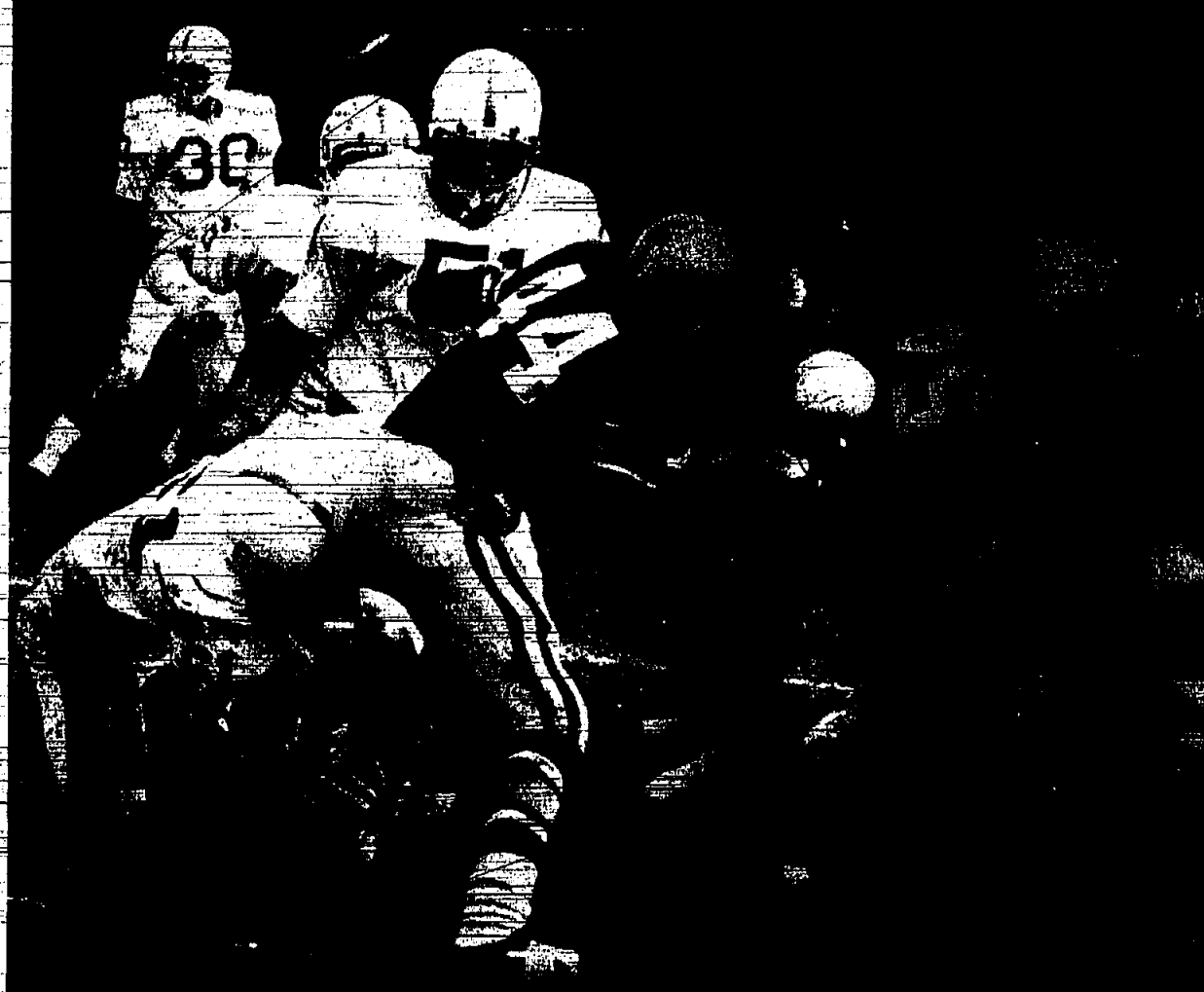
