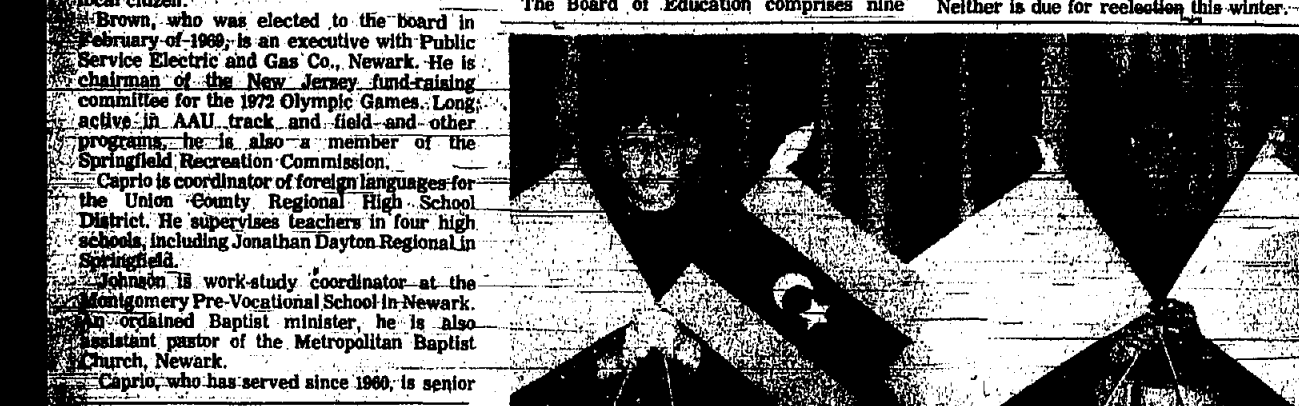

New voters' views much like elders, Rep. Dwyer learns in study of polls

WASHINGTON—Rep. Florence P. Dwyer (R-N.J.) learned the news a week ago: young voters had much in common with older citizens when it came to political opinions.

Most notably, she explained, young voters reached a higher degree of agreement on such issues as ending the Vietnam war, quickly opposing the draft, favoring a tight money policy, believing that military spending is too high, indicating a willingness to have small numbers of low-income housing units located in your part of town, and backing more pre-school education funds for deprived children.

President Nixon received "a somewhat lower rating" on his performance in office from younger voters than from voters as a whole, Congressman Dwyer noted.

The 18-24 age group, she said, rated the President 49 percent fair, and 23 percent poor, while the other group rated him 34 percent good, 28 percent fair, and 28 percent poor.

Mrs. Dwyer pointed out that respondents to her first poll were predominantly middle-aged, mostly those under 35, and were mostly male, while those under 21 were evenly divided between male and female, and between Republican and Democrat.
