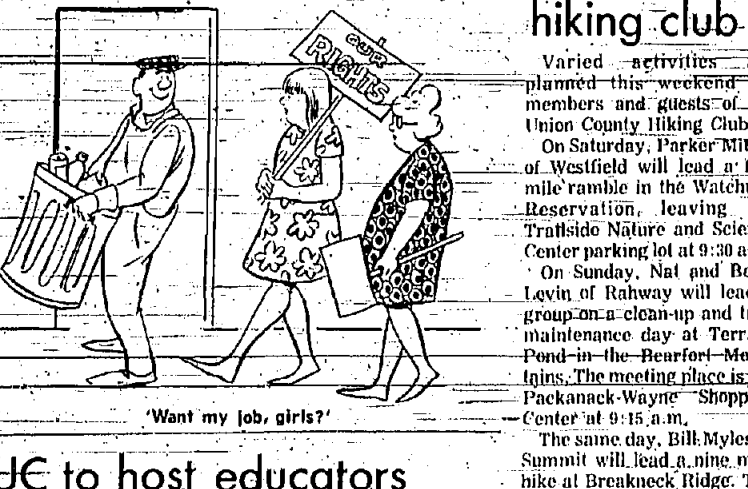


# Data by long distance
