

### Medical school affiliates with Muhlenberg Hospital

Signing of a major affiliation between the College of Medicine and Dentistry of Rutgers Medical School and Muhlenberg Hospital, Plainfield, was announced this week.

According to Dr. James W. Mackenzie, dean of the College of Medicine and Dentistry, this affiliation will help to become a four-year M.D. degree-granting institution in accordance with the wishes of its board of trustees and pending approval by the appropriate agencies. It will provide the clinical base necessary for medical students to continue into their third and fourth years.

Presently, Rutgers Medical School grants a master of medical science degree to students who successfully complete the school's two-year program. Students must then apply to another school with an M.D. degree-granting program. This coming fall, Rutgers will have its first class of three-year students continuing studies at the Medical School, and it is hoped, studied Dr. Mackenzie, that four-year...

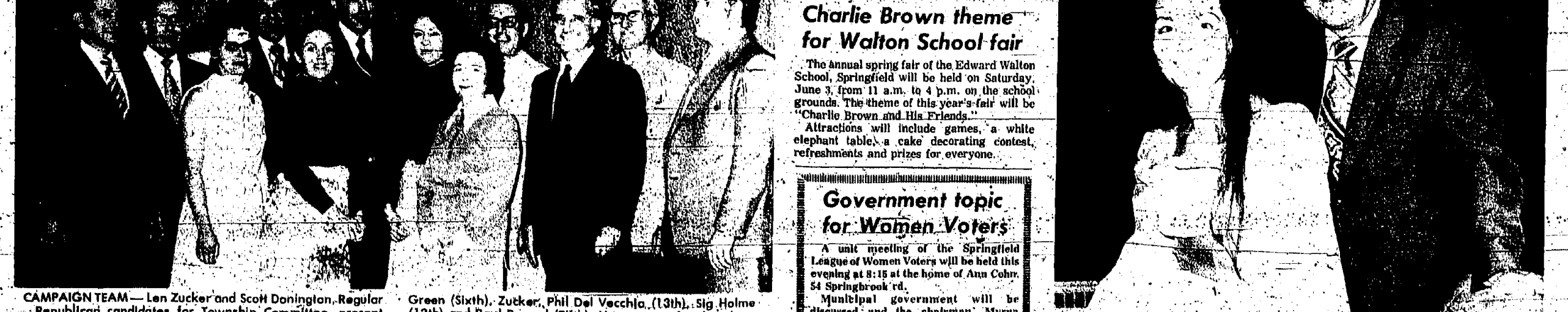

**Tax reform recommendations to cut property rates termed just, efficient**

Third in a series of articles on N.J. tax reform prepared by the League of Women Voters.

Remembering past promises, skeptics are saying the new tax structure proposed by the Tax Policy Committee won't offer any "real" property tax relief—that if the committee's recommendations are adopted, property tax rates may go down for a while but will be back up to today's level in a few years. The ever-increasing property taxes in New Jersey have been such an unfair burden on so many people for so long it's no wonder they find talk of relief hard to believe. But never before has such a thorough study been made of our total state and local taxing system. Never before has such a complete tax reform been recommended, with the basic goal of reducing property taxes.

After studying New Jersey's present state and local tax system, the Committee has concluded that it is both inefficient and unjust. The "correction" of these two fundamental defects, says its report, is the central problem the committee must resolve in its further recommendations. "Since the property tax is the most inefficient and unjust tax of all its reduction is of prime importance."

The committee goes on to recommend a massive reduction in the burden of the property tax, as a basic policy, accompanied by every possible improvement in the structure of the tax and its administration. The state should depend on the property tax for only one-third of total state and local taxes in any future year.

TO ACCOMPLISH THIS GOAL the committee has recommended several measures: that the state take over all the operating costs of the public schools (with about half the increased funding from state sources other than the property tax); all county and municipal welfare costs, county court and law ward costs and senior citizens' relief; and that veterans' benefits be reduced. Other recommendations are that the state pay taxes to local governments for state-owned tax-exempt property and that the Council Block grants be increased from \$25 million to \$100 million. This plan would reduce local property taxes by \$80 million for an average reduction of the state of about 40 percent.

IN ORDER TO PREVENT today's property tax relief from being lost by increases tomorrow, the committee recommends limits for each level of government using the property tax. The state-wide property tax (for schools) would be limited to the \$1 per \$100 now
