## Port Authority to study rail service to New York

The Port Authority Commissioners this week authorized a study of methods to achieve maximum train capacity in the Penn Central tunnels and Pennsylvania Station in New York as a step in achieving the objective of the Inter-Agency Task Force to provide additional rail service to Manhattan by New Jersey commuter railroads. The study was approved at the monthly Board meeting, according to Chairman James C. Kellogg, III.

The Inter-Agency Task Force, consisting of the New Jersey Department of Transportation, the Metropolitan Transportation Authority and the Port Authority, was established by Governors Cahill and Rockefeller in March 1970 to develop plans for specific improvements to the Interstate rail transportation system within the Northern New Jersey-New York Metropolitan Region.

The consulting firm of Goodenave & Colpitts of New York City, assisted by Westinghouse Air Brake Company (WABCO) of Pittsburgh, has been selected to perform the study to cost an estimated \$75,000.

Last year the Inter-Agency Task Force adopted a short-range plan for achieving optimum use of Penn Station in New York and New Jersey rail commuters from the Erie Lackawanna, Jersey Central and Penn Central.

That plan called for the provision of direct rail connections in the New Jersey Meadows between several branch lines of the Erie Lackawanna and Penn Central Railroads, as well as similar direct access to mid-Manhattan for some trains of the Jersey Central Railroad over existing Penn Central tracks between Newark and Penn Station in New York.

Goodenave & Colpitts and WABCO will explore various alternative ways to achieve additional capacity utilization of the existing Penn Station facilities. They will:

- (1) Study methods to achieve maximum train capacity in the Penn Central tunnels and Penn Station;
- (2) Evaluate these methods in terms of capacity achieved as against the system construction costs for rolling as well as fixed equipment that would be required;
- (3) Determine impact on existing New Jersey rail systems; and
- (4) Recommend one or possibly two systems as being most appropriate to meet the objective of optimizing the use of these facilities.

The study will take approximately three months to complete.

## Aerobic dancer picked by president

### Seton aide to conduct clinics for Nixon unit

Professional dancer-choreographer and long distance runner Jack F. Sorenson of South Orange, who is assistant director of recreation and director of women's intramurals at Seton Hall University in South Orange, has been appointed to President Nixon's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports as one of only four clinic staff members in the nation.

Council clinics are presentations and demonstrations by master teachers of latest research findings and new program concepts. Mrs. Sorenson will conduct a series of six clinics at colleges and universities throughout the nation to teach the theory and skills of her specialty, aerobic dancing.

Aerobic dancing is based on the idea of aerobic exercises which are designed to make the body use more oxygen by exerting the circulatory and respiratory systems. They not only improve the figure but also the functions of life-supporting organs, according to Mrs. Sorenson, who has been a researcher and co-developer of aerobic fitness programs and author of the best-selling book on aerobics, "Aerobic Dancing combines fitness with femininity making it one of the most desirable forms of vigorous exercise for women," states Mrs. Sorenson in a handbook she wrote on her specialty. "The ideal exercise for women combines basic conditioning with callisthenics to improve flexibility, grace and coordination."

**HER AEROBIC DANCES** have been choreographed to certain movements that enhance a woman's overall fitness, combining vigorous dance steps with bends and stretches that act on all 650 skeletal muscles in the body plus the heart and lungs.

"It is not unduly like to sweat," she emphasizes for students. "The inherent fun of dancing provides the motivation to exert oneself and benefit one's health. Mrs. Sorenson believes. "The idea," she says, "is to think dance rather than think exercise."

Also a long-distance runner, she averages 10 miles weekly for fitness and recreation. When in training, as for last year's Atlantic City Marathon, she runs 20 to 30 miles weekly. She finished second in the woman's division in the marathon, with a time of three hours 22 minutes.

A NATIVE OF CALIFORNIA and graduate of the University of California, Mrs. Sorenson has been trained as a dancer since the age of six. She was professional dancer in California and also won a scholarship and designation as the "Most Talented Dancer" in the Miss California competition. She is now attending classes at Seton Hall toward a master's degree in physical education.

Also a long-distance runner, she averages 10 miles weekly for fitness and recreation. When in training, as for last year's Atlantic City Marathon, she runs 20 to 30 miles weekly. She finished second in the woman's division in the marathon, with a time of three hours 22 minutes.

Mrs. Sorenson conducts 13 aerobic dancing classes weekly involving about 200 women at the West Essex and South Orange-Maplewood Ys and is in the physical education faculty at Bloomfield College where she teaches two sections of aerobic dancing. She also represented the national YMCA as consultant and lecturer on aerobics and aerobic dancing.
