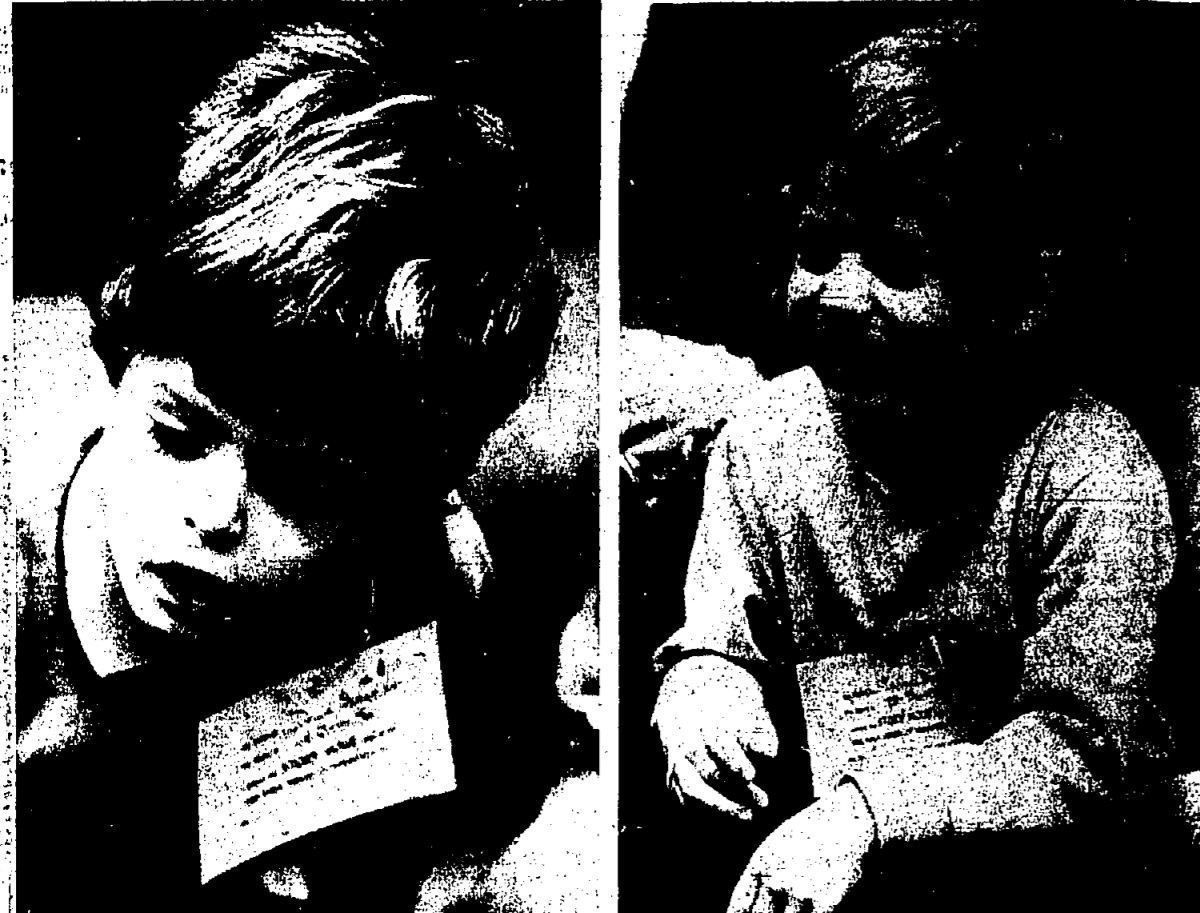

It results from the approval by the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare of the grant application of the Central New Jersey Comprehensive Health Planning Council, Inc.
