Fulltime tuition is hiked \$25 for UC, Technical Institute

Party chiefs look at reapportionment: new District 22 may be up for grabs

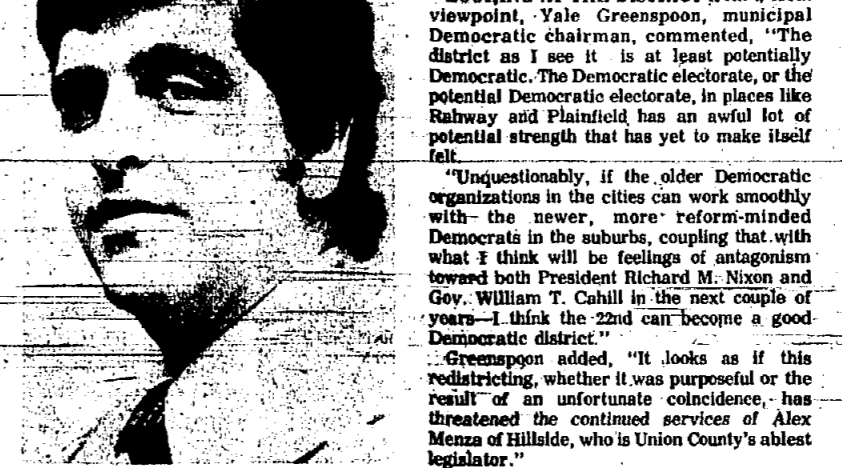

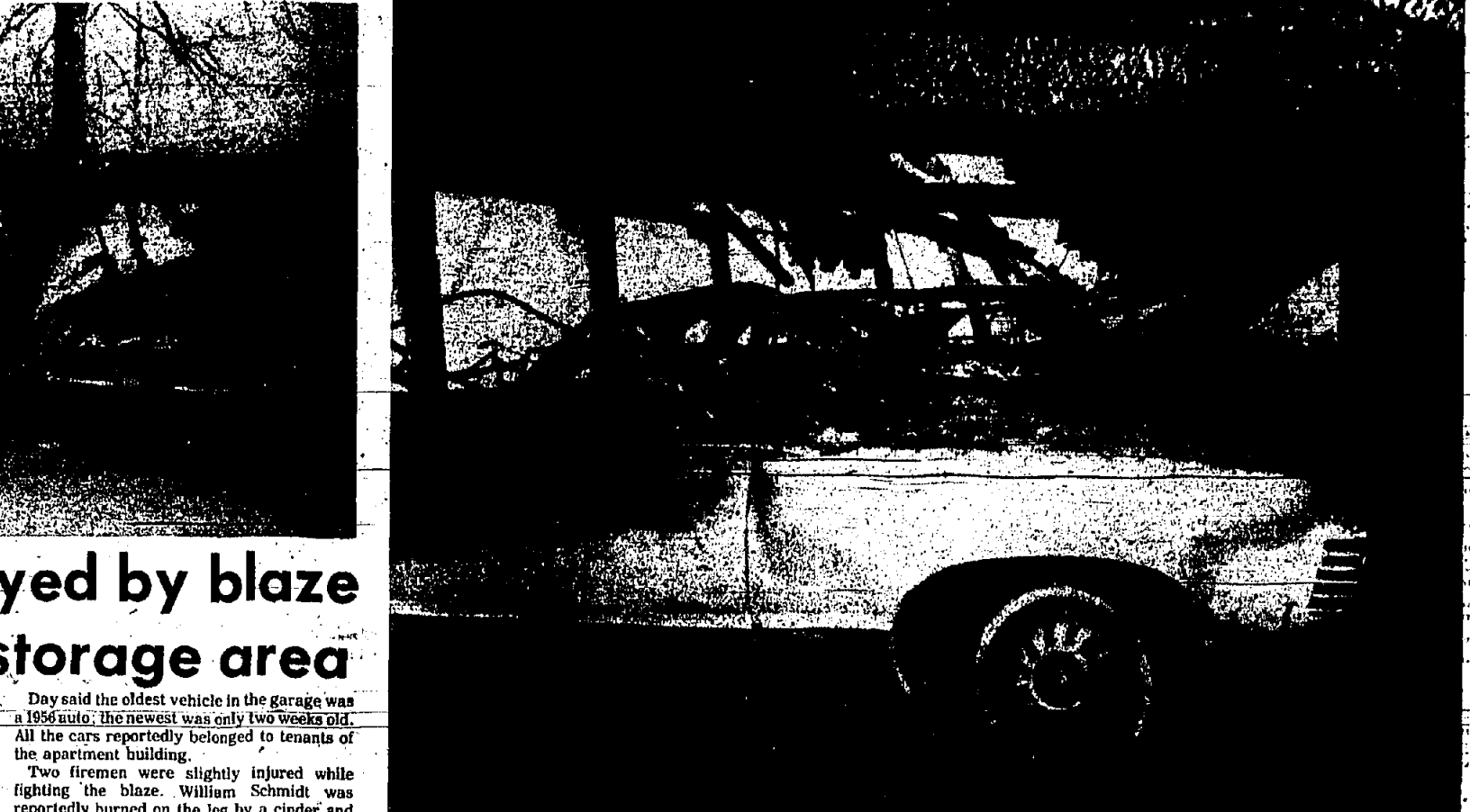

Editorial comment THE RIGHT TO KNOW

Two controversies are brewing these days in the Township Committee, and in neither one is the right answer clear and sharp.

One is the campaign of the Springfield Public Library for funds to construct a wing at the library to house a local historical museum.

The other is the proposal by the new Republican majority on the governing body to rescind the parking ban passed by the Democrats last year for the small shopping center along Mountain Avenue, south of Hillside Avenue.

No one can deny the worthy motives behind both proposals—to enlighten the community's rich heritage and to provide fair treatment for merchants without creating traffic hazards—but the work factor is lacking in both discussions to date in fact.

On the library museum plan, we have so far been unable to determine how much of the cost, reportedly some \$75,000, will come from federal and state funds and how much will have to be raised by local taxpayers.

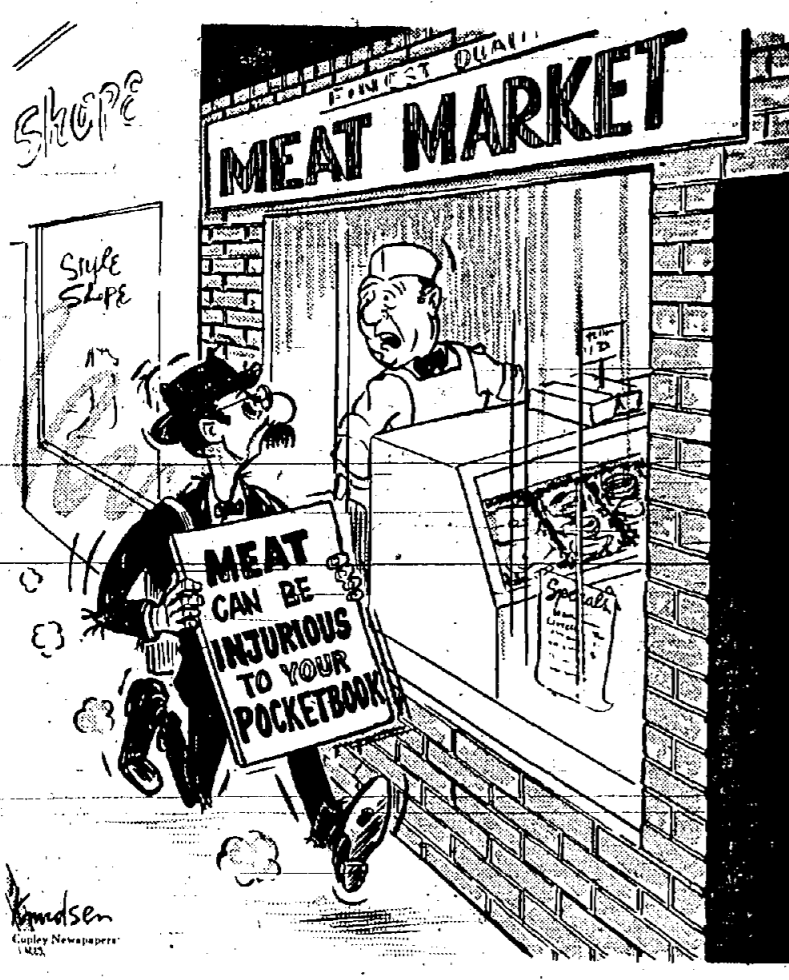
In addition, the Township Committee has not yet spelled out its list of planned capital expenditures. We should all endorse a full understanding of all the other competing calls for funds.

And while the township is making up its mind, the library board could perhaps help by listing some of the items to be included in the initial collection, as well as some of the other material which might be added in future years.

The other question, that of the parking ban, may well be even more complex. Only an overriding safety factor should justify depriving merchants of parking space permitted in past years, space for customers on whom their economic livelihood may depend.

Each week's fatal car crash just a few hundred feet away at Mountain and Hillside avenues, lends urgency to the discussion, but that particular hazard is not directly involved in this debate. The need for a traffic light at the corner has long been stressed by local officials in their pleas to Trenton, but it may be somewhat of a side issue here.

We should be told just what has been the economic impact of the no-parking ordinance since it took effect last year.

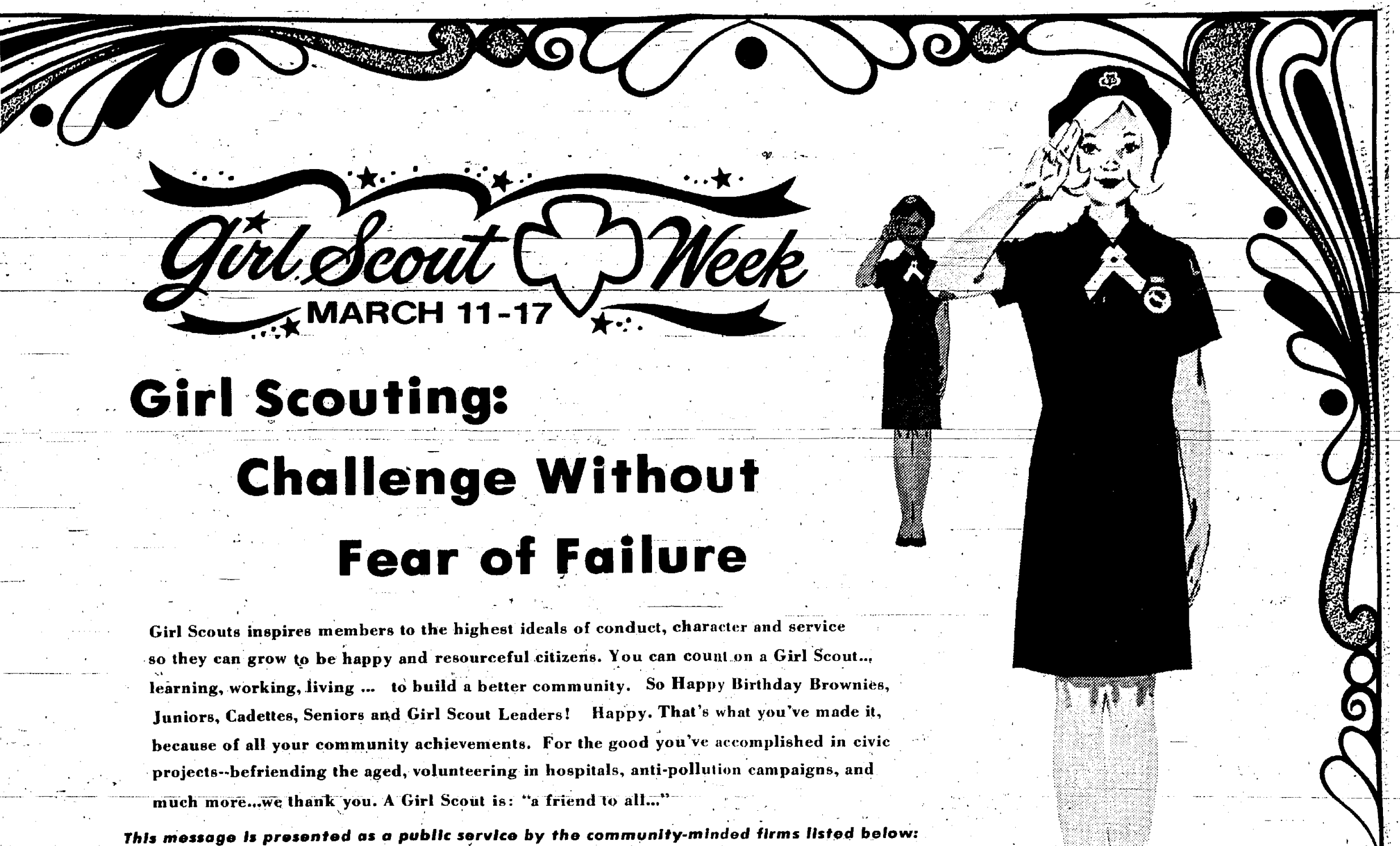

Williams advises flood-prone towns to seek insurance

U.S. Sen. Harrison A. Williams Jr. (D-NJ) has urged that officials of flood-prone communities in New Jersey which are not yet enrolled in the Federal Flood Insurance Program, submit their applications as soon as possible.

"In order for individuals and businesses to purchase low-cost insurance against flooding through the National Flood Insurance Program, their communities must be enrolled," Williams said.

"More than 1,500 communities throughout the country are already enrolled, and more than 100,000 policies are in effect," he continued. "But there are many other communities which are flood-prone and could qualify for the program that are not yet enrolled. The Spring Flood season is fast approaching, and I would urge officials in any community prone to flooding which has not yet enrolled in the program to do so as soon as possible."

He advised local officials to contact either the New Jersey Bureau of Water Control in the State Department of Environmental Protection in Trenton, or the Federal Insurance Administration in the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development in Washington.

Encouraging initial meeting held by county unit on aging

Freeholder Walter E. Ulrich, chairman of the Department of Public Affairs and General Welfare, Union County Board of Freeholders, announced that the newly-formed County Advisory Committee on Aging's initial meeting last week indicated that the group's efforts would be "fruitful." The meeting was attended by key people representing labor and industry, public and private social agencies and the senior citizens.

The purpose of the committee is to review all those problems affecting the older Americans, to study ways and means of bringing about viable solutions and preparing recommendations for consideration by the Freeholders, he said.

The committee will review all of the problems relating to aging—such as health, housing, recreation, etc., but he noted that it was felt that efforts should be directed on a priority basis.

Ulrich stated that Peter M. Shields, executive director of the Union County Office on Aging, reported on the various activities and functions of his office. The committee discussed several problem areas and appointments were made. Raymond O'Day, an officer of the Union County Senior Citizens Council, was appointed as chairman of the Transportation Subcommittee; Ralph Jones,

district manager of Social Security, was appointed chairman of the pre-retirement Counseling Subcommittee; Louis Glendon, housing consultant, was appointed as chairman of the Housing Subcommittee; and Paul Gelb, director of the Meals-on-Wheels, Inc., of Elizabeth, was appointed as chairman of the Utilization of Services Subcommittee.

Ulrich said the committee felt transportation was one of the major problems facing the senior citizens and will be given priority consideration.

"I'm particularly pleased with the first meeting," said Ulrich. "It definitely indicated that these discussions and the input by the various representatives of agencies concerned with our older people will prove fruitful."

Shields, executive director, Union County Office on Aging; and Freeholder Herbert J. Hellmann, Jr., member of the Department of Public Affairs & General Welfare.

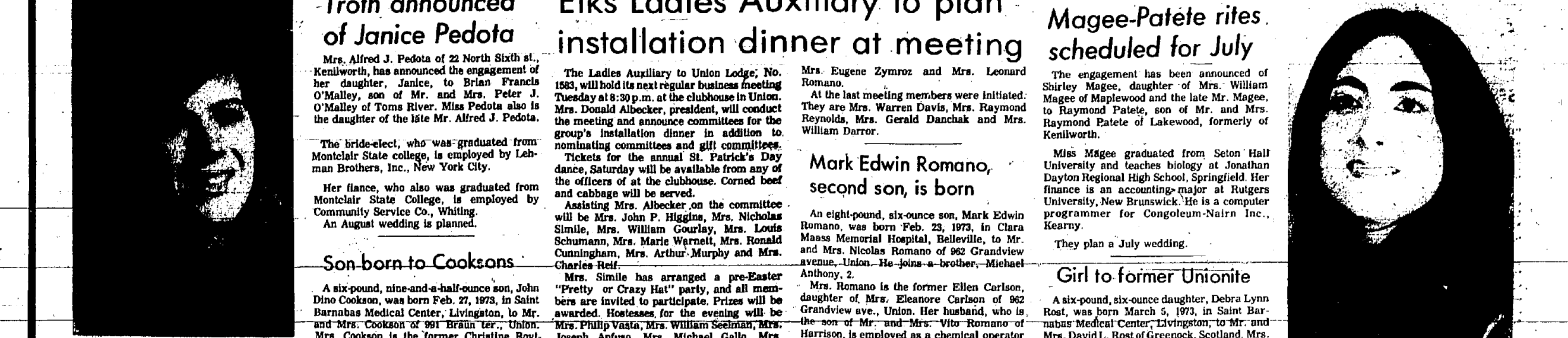

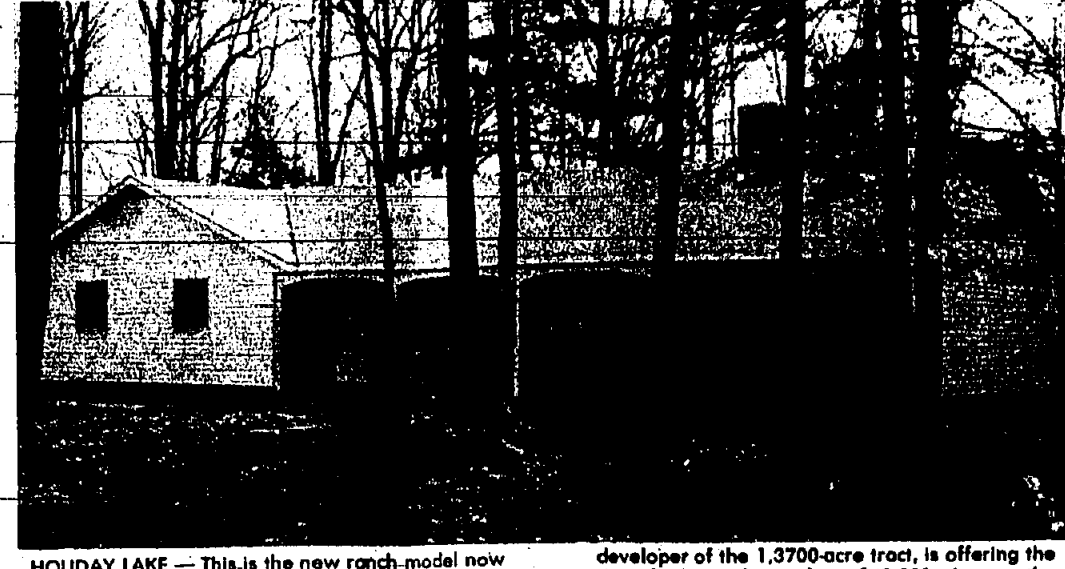
