

HOUSING URGENCY

While official Washington worries about an 18-month gap in tape recordings and other aspects of the Watergate and related disasters, senior citizens local across are the victims of an 18-month gap of their own.

We are talking, of course, about the 18-month freeze imposed by President Nixon on federal housing subsidies in January of 1973. That impoundment runs out at the end of next month, but so does the legislation under which the funds were authorized by Congress.

Speakers at the special open meeting held by the Township Committee and Senior Citizen Housing Corp. last week agreed on only one thing: the answers to Springfield's housing crisis for its elderly can be found only in Washington or Trenton, and not here in town.

Whatever delays in the planning process may have taken place two or three years ago cannot be remedied now, and we can gain nothing by reviewing the details. The one thing local residents can do is write, call, often and urgently, to our legislators in the Senate and House to press for new legislation which will provide the funds so badly needed.

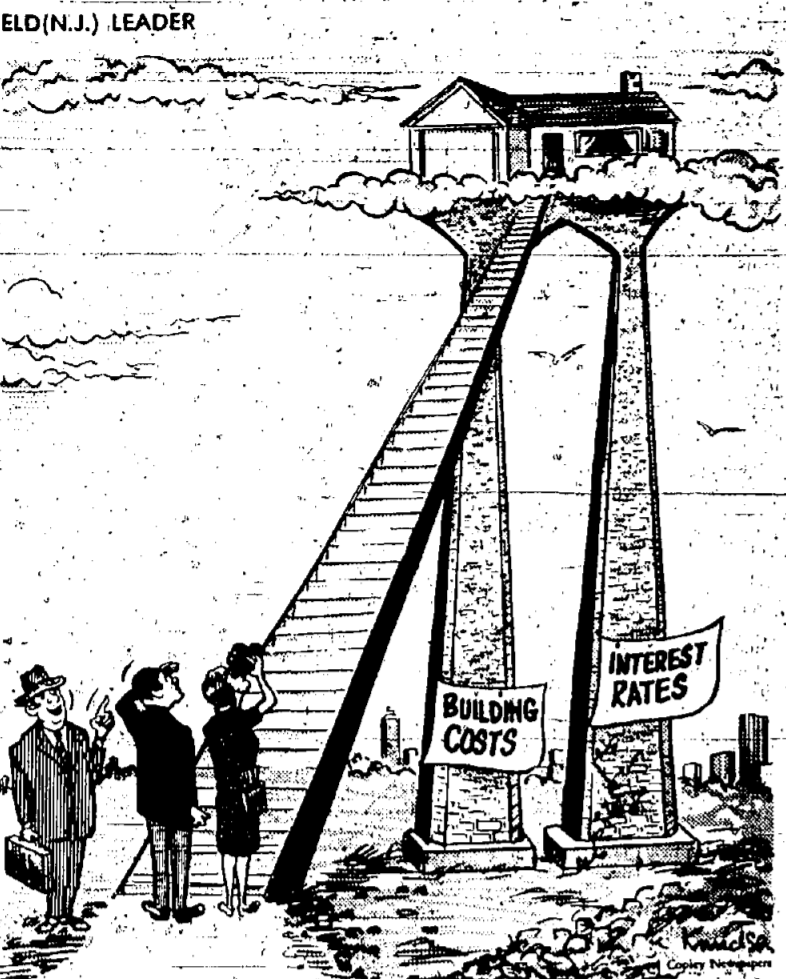

We certainly have no intention to belittle the urgency of the situation. Our population is growing older, and all too many of our neighbors are struggling in houses they can no longer maintain, apartments they can no longer afford and family households where they no longer feel comfortable.

What we do stress is that Springfield has an ample supply of houses over which we have jurisdiction, and on which we must find agreement. There is nothing to be gained by assigning blame when the answers lie elsewhere.

We should expect a more open channel of communication, and we should certainly anticipate immediate action when the time comes.

But the best way to make that dream a reality is to present a written form of our messages to our legislators. If we do our job, they should do theirs.

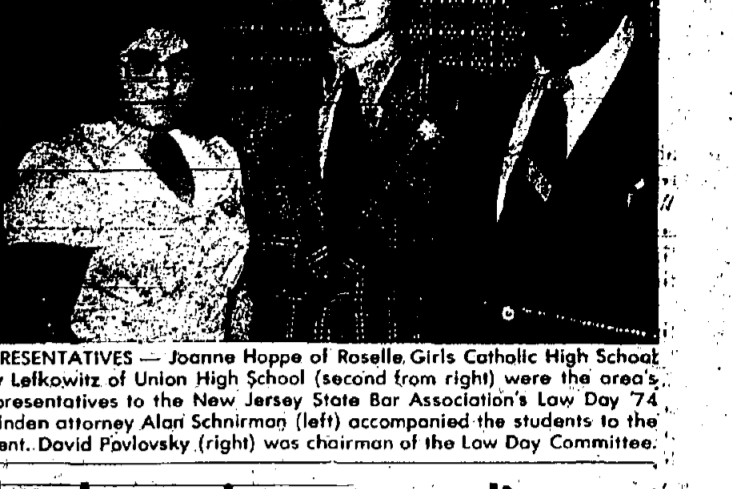

Health officer says state should ban smoking in tax-supported institutions

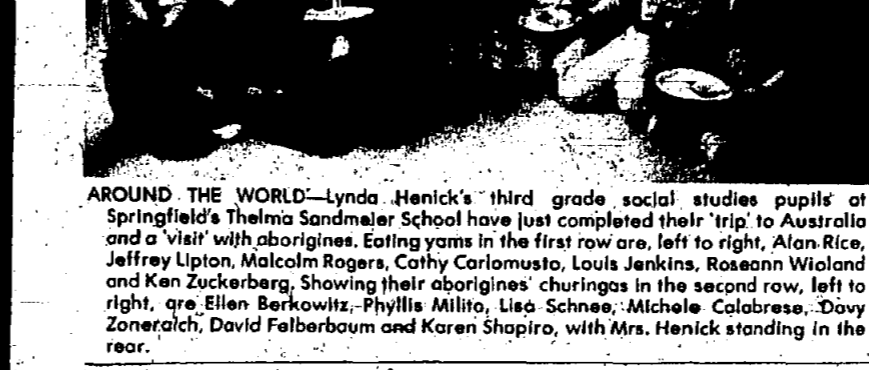

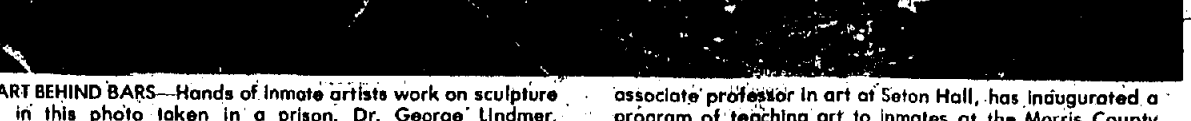
