






In addition to station personnel, backed b

detectives and other specialists, five State Police helicopters will patrol the state's heavily-traveled traffic corridors to assist ground patrols in spotting trouble areas and nating the free flow of traffic. Troopers will also fly as observers in the Turnpike and Parkway helicopters. Schedules have been arranged to provide saturation coverage by tactical patrol units, task force, radar, VASCAR and breathalyzer operators with special emphasis on the critical hours between 5 p.m. and 2 a.m., when most fatal accidents occur.

Marked patrol cars will be used to the fullest advantage, particularly where traffic flow is heavy. Dismounted posts will be taken at strategic locations and proopers will have personal contact with motorists and

From time to time I've noticed advertising claims by a store that infers their merchandise is selling at the lowest price. What I'm curious about is, how can this store know what his competitors are selling their merchandise at? feel if these advertising claims are true, then I don't need to shop around for the lowest price. Do you know if these claims are legit? HOPEFUL.

For many years the Better Business Bureau ded against the use of general lowest general price, price equalling, or un derselling claims. available to adults playment insurance and state plan temporary disability insurance is set by Jaw at 50 percent of the average weekly wage figure for 1973. The 1973 average is \$178.19. Fifty percent of this is \$89.10, which rounds to \$90. The law stipulates that for the purpose of these benefits the round should be upwards to the next whole dollar. The weekly benefit rate for workmen's compensation payments is set by law at two-thirds of the average weekly wages during 1973. In this case two-thirds of \$178.19 is \$118.79, which rounds to \$119. These rate figures are released each year before Sept. 1 in accordance with state law.

Commissioner Hoffman said, "Because we are tying these benefits directly to the average law changes, we now have greater flexibility in contributions by the employer to the Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund. What the benefits program now demonstrates is, of course, a closer relationship to economic reality. These changes permit us to reflect inflationary trends now in both contributions and in benefits," said Hoffman.

Day care is designed to upgrade and develop mal-personnel-to-work with youngster of nursery school age, Dr. Orkin explained. The program will also assist current personnel in meeting he proposed state licensing requirements for day care workers.



independent county authorities. - Since -1969, gross debt of the counties has.... risen \$209.6 million. The 1973 increase is greater than the combined increases of the three previous years. Five counties had increases of more than \$10 million in total gross debt in 1973. The top increase (\$22.5 million) was in Middlesex County, primarily to finance for Green Acres action twice before and both county vocational school facilities.
