Thirteen seniors at Jonathan Dayton Regional High School have been named Merit Program Commended students by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation.



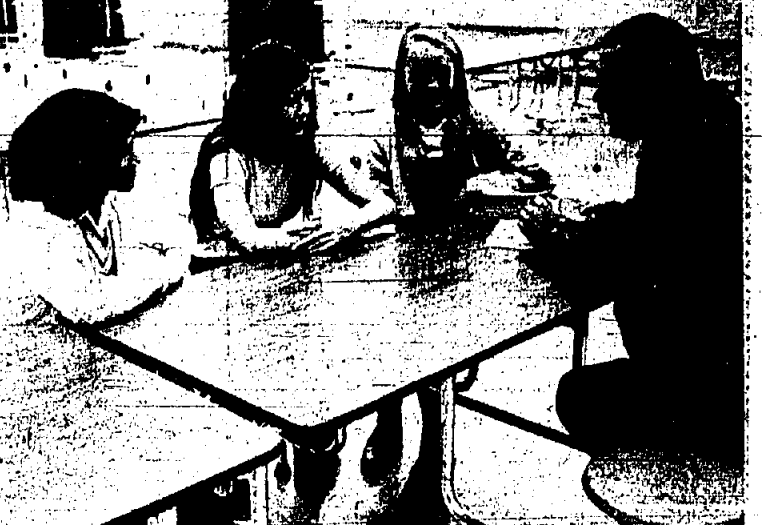

# Ecology chief asks adoption of flood control ordinance

The possibility that Springfield could lose its chance to participate in a county funding program for municipal flood control projects was raised this week by Marla Forman, Chairman of the Springfield Flood Control Commission.

# Looks are deceiving in Springfield: unemployment figures keep going up

A casual drive through Springfield's tree-lined streets would support the view of the township as an affluent community—well maintained homes, two and three-car garages and an absence of the blight that afflicts so many urban areas.

Under the new policy, Union County would provide to 50 percent of the construction cost of the projects, but to be eligible for the funding, a municipality must meet criteria set forth in the new Storm Water Control and Flood Plain Ordinance, approved by the Planning Board on June 10.
