Roads and floods dominate 1974 headlines

Transportation and environmental problems continued to dominate the news in Springfield throughout 1974. Floods, environmentalists and others have reported on the Environmental Impact Statement completed by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for the proposed Interstate 78 through the Washington Reservoir. The department had to start early in the year because a portion of I-78 and the new Rte. 22 Freeway will be opened from Springfield across to the Springfield-Kearney Scientific parkway in the next few months.

Local efforts for flood control received priority throughout the year. Work was completed along both branches of Dryden Brook and construction started on dikes along the Railway River near Washington Avenue and Riverside Avenue. Work along Van Hook Creek was halted, however, in late summer in the above project because local authorities turned down the county for help. The Army Corps of Engineers reported continued but slow progress toward Congressional approval of the \$10 million flood control project for Springfield. The Township Committee considered the work to be done and update the local flood control plan.
