

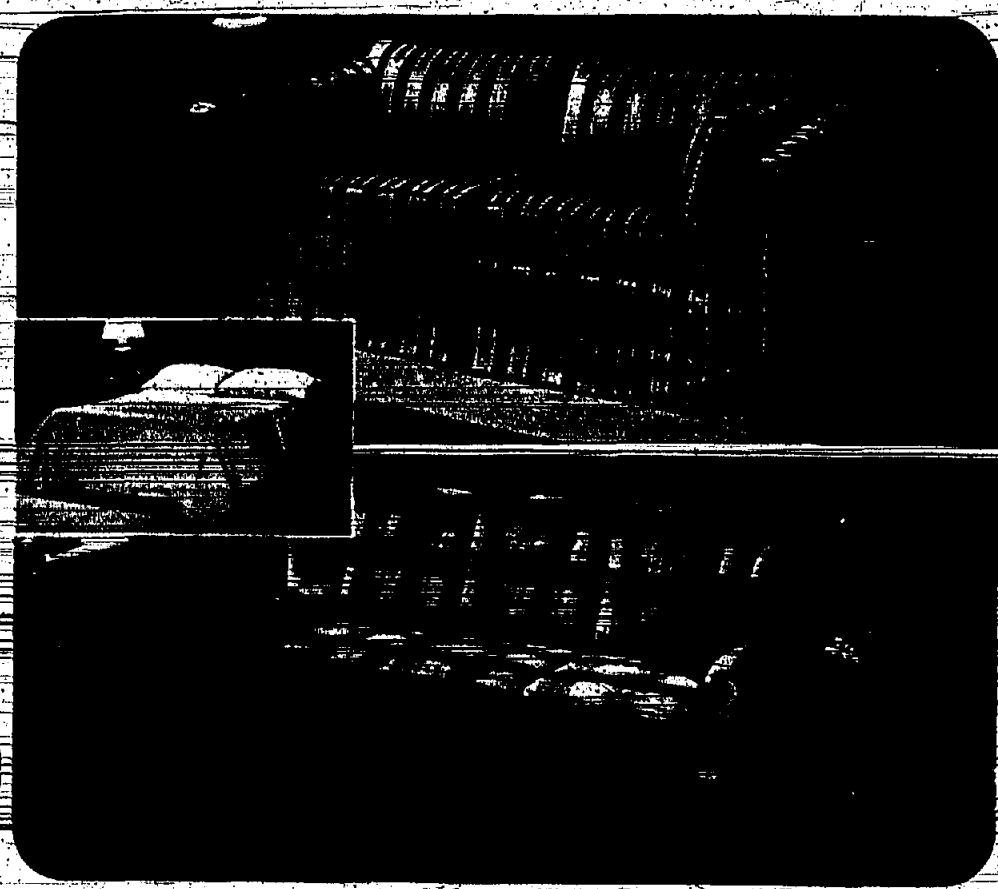

2.5 pct. rent limit sought after 3-year leases expire

The Township Committee Tuesday night voted to prepare an amendment to the rent control ordinance limiting rent increases to 2.5 percent in the year following expiration of a three-year lease. The ordinance limits increases to 2.5 percent per year. Landlords have been increasing rents by 7.5 percent a year since the ordinance was passed in 1972. In authorizing the township attorney, Leonard Zukas, to prepare the amendment, Committee Chairman William Rubeo stated that landlords had raised rents by 35 to 50 percent in the last three-year lease before expiration. We believe quite strongly that the Regional High School Board of Education took a step in the wrong direction last week when it voted to increase the number of students in the system of class rankings instituted for this year's ninth graders and extended for all subsequent years.

All courses are evaluated on the basis of difficulty and marks are weighted accordingly so that a B in a major course counts for more than an A in a minor course of the same grade.

Each student has been given the same amount of time to complete the course. The average class size is 25 to 30 students. The change to rank each student on the basis of the number of students in the class will have the effect of increasing the pressure on many students to take more courses than they are capable of handling. This is a step in the wrong direction.

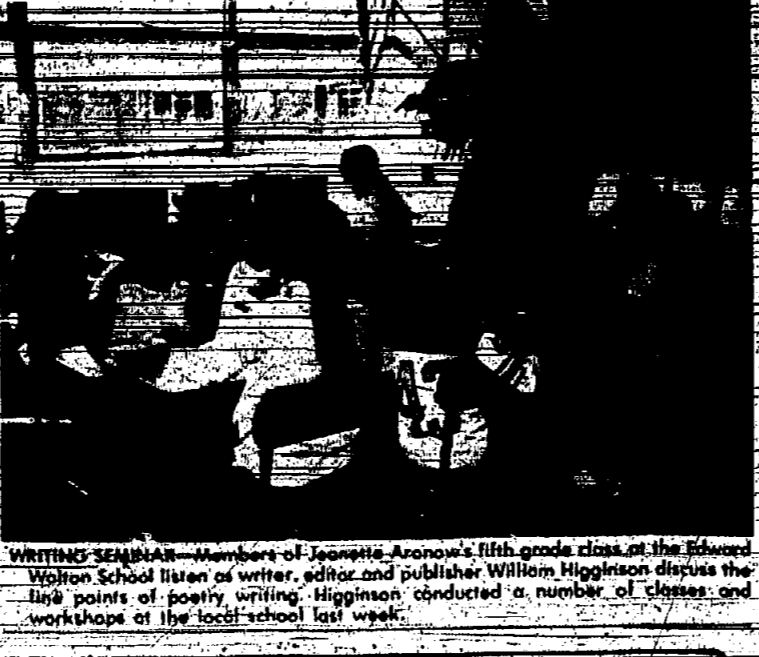
A poet in residence Walton pupils work with writer

By a vote of five to four, the Springfield Board of Education Monday rejected a motion which would have called for the resignation of Dr. Fred Baruchin, superintendent of schools.

Board members also revealed at their monthly meeting at the Highland School that in response to economic pressures and declining enrollment they are considering abolishing any one or all of four administrative positions: assistant superintendent, assistant principal, principal of the Highland School, and an administrator in the department of special services.

The possibility that administrators would be dismissed through a staff reduction has been a topic of discussion for some time. The board's decision to reject the motion for Baruchin's resignation means that the superintendent will continue to lead the district.

The board is currently reviewing the possibility of staff cuts to reduce expenses. This would be a significant move given the current economic challenges facing the district.
