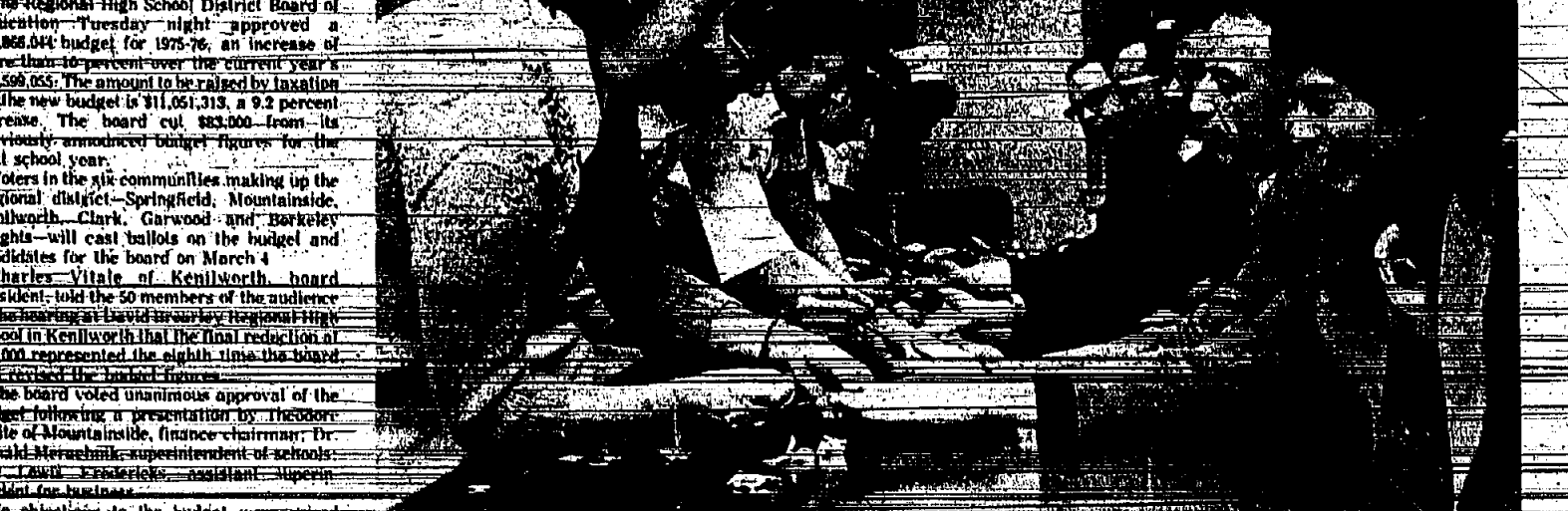

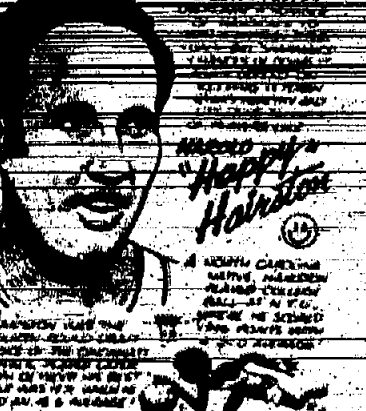

Householders hiring youths should check on insurance

Many New Jerseyans risk severe financial loss because they unwittingly violate labor laws in hiring youngsters to do odd jobs around the home or they fail to protect themselves by purchasing liability insurance.

According to the New Jersey Association of Independent Insurance Agents, many youths are not aware that the law forbids a youngster under 18 years of age from operating power tools — that includes lawnmowers, snow blowers and other instruments of all kinds — said James A. Burre, association president.

"Should an accident occur, there could be substantial financial liability," Burre said. "The problem is doubly complicated because homeowners seldom realize that youths employed for work around the home are not covered by standard homeowners' insurance. The homeowner's compensation insurance must also be provided."

A youngster working in your garden, youth who cuts your grass, the cleaning lady who comes in once a week, and even the family babysitter are entitled to workers' compensation if injured on the job, so that the employer has better "workmen's comp" insurance, said Burre.

Double compensation benefits, payable in certain circumstances, may run into the thousands of dollars, and could have a considerable impact on the homeowner's net worth if he did not have the correct coverage.

All youths under 18 must have working papers to be considered legally employed, according to Burre. "Even if they already have
