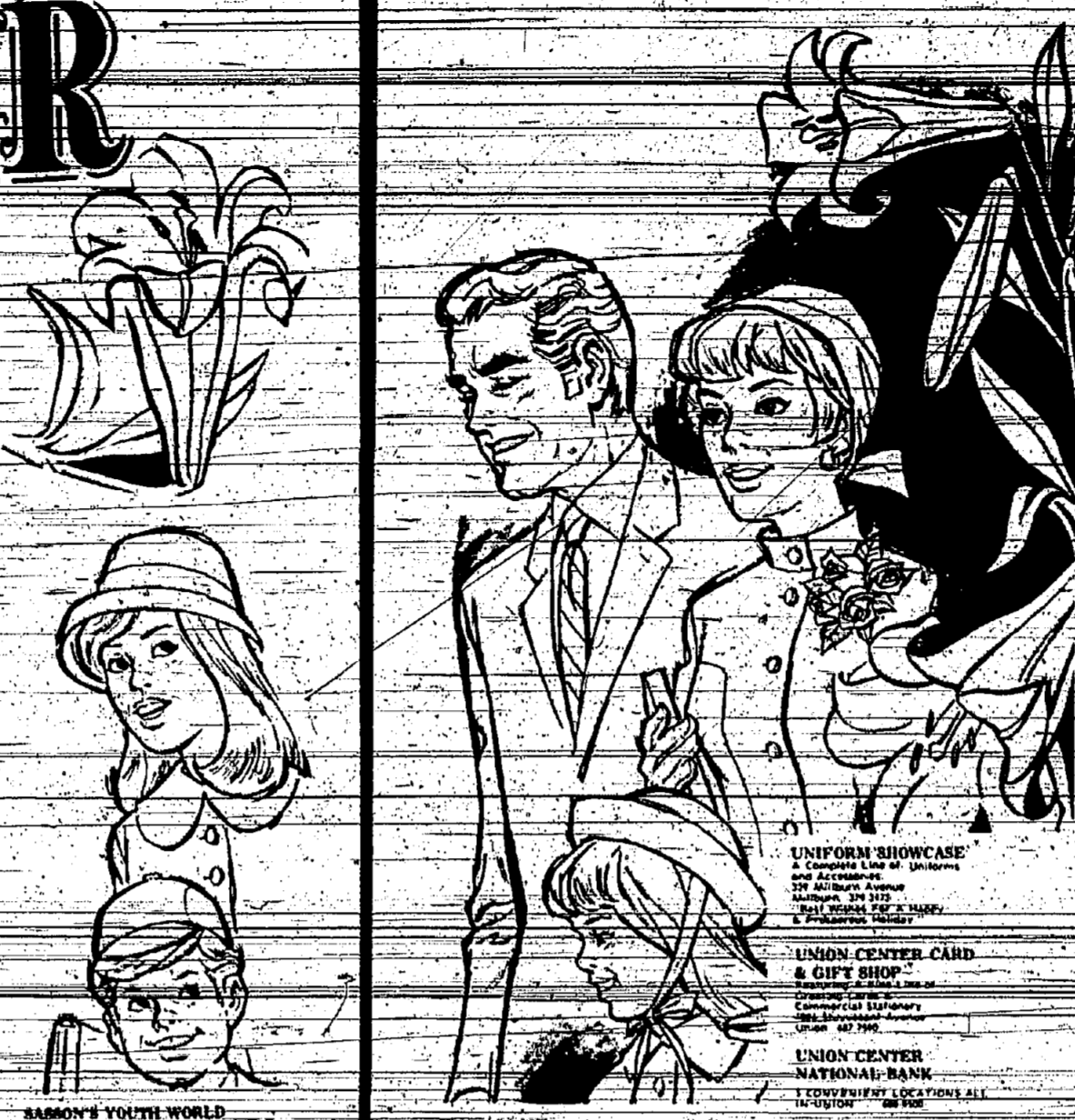

Reporting system for unemployment benefits changed

Lines at unemployment insurance offices throughout the state will decrease considerably in April through a new four-week reporting system and an increased benefit period, it was announced this week by Joseph A. Hoffmann, director of the N.J. Department of Labor and Industry.

Beginning the week of April 7, each claimant will report to his local unemployment insurance office every four weeks instead of the current two-week period. Checks will be paid to the claimant during their reporting period.

The new system has been tested for five weeks in the unemployment insurance offices in Plainfield, Trenton, Atlantic City and Butler.

"At this time," Hoffmann said, "our unemployment insurance offices are implementing the new system. All claimants should continue to report to their local office during their reporting period. The new system will not only reduce lines at the local office, but will allow more timely and efficient service. This is a major step in our effort to improve unemployment insurance services to the public."
