Dr. Lionel Tiger, professor of anthropology at Rutgers University and consultant research director of the Henry F. Guggenheim Foundation, will lecture in the Eugene O. Wilkins Theatre for the Performing Arts Monday at 7:30 p.m. Dr. Tiger's lecture, the fourth in a five-session series as part of the college's "Advances in Ideas Series," will be on "Aggression, Violence and the Human Nature Project." The lectures are free and open to the public.

Dr. Tiger's native of Montreal, Canada, is best known as co-author, with Robin Fox of "The Imperial Animal," a controversial book questioning the necessity for social scientists to take more account of "man's nature." He is also the author of "Men in Groups," a controversial entry in the women's liberation debate.

State investigates sex discrimination in insurance sales

The New Jersey Department of Insurance has begun a study of insurance company practices and procedures in the marketing of disability income insurance in the state's minority areas of sex discrimination, State Insurance Commissioner James J. Sheeran said today.

Sheeran said that the project, which is a follow-up to the study of sex discrimination in life insurance, is being carried out by Dr. Patricia J. Lewis, director of consumer services in the Department of Insurance.

According to Dr. Lewis, the study will be based upon an intensive examination of the practices and policies of insurance companies that are believed to offer a representative cross-section of the disability income insurance industry in New Jersey. The companies are: Prudential Insurance Co., Mutual Benefit Life Insurance Co., Travelers Life Insurance Co., Guardian Life Insurance Co. of America and Pacific National Life Insurance Co.

"From information the Department of Insurance has received," Dr. Lewis said, "it would appear that disability income insurance is the one area where there is the greatest degree of disparity in coverage between men and women. I am not persuaded that women should be charged as much as 25 percent more than a man for less coverage in this kind of insurance and that this disparity can in any way be justified."

Dr. Lewis said that the survey, which is being limited to the six companies because she believes that a representative picture of the market can be drawn from the data to be received and valid conclusions drawn that will lead to remedial action.

"From information the Department of Insurance has received," Dr. Lewis said, "it would appear that disability income insurance is the one area where there is the greatest degree of disparity in coverage between men and women. I am not persuaded that women should be charged as much as 25 percent more than a man for less coverage in this kind of insurance and that this disparity can in any way be justified."

The lower earnings were primarily caused by the following items: a fall off in sales, a lesser credit for allowance for income taxes, construction, greater depreciation and interest costs, and the higher cost of purchased gas.

The company said that its earnings for the first two months of 1975 were down 10 cents compared with the same period of last year, which had \$1,800,000 fewer shares.

A number of tenants have received notice that their leases will not be renewed because of the condominium plans. Tenant leaders have denounced the idea as a "backdoor" increase in rents. 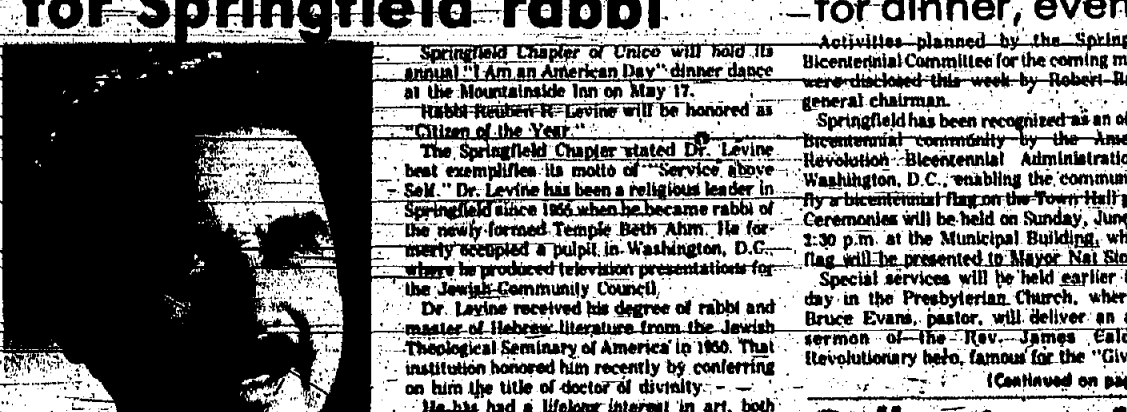
