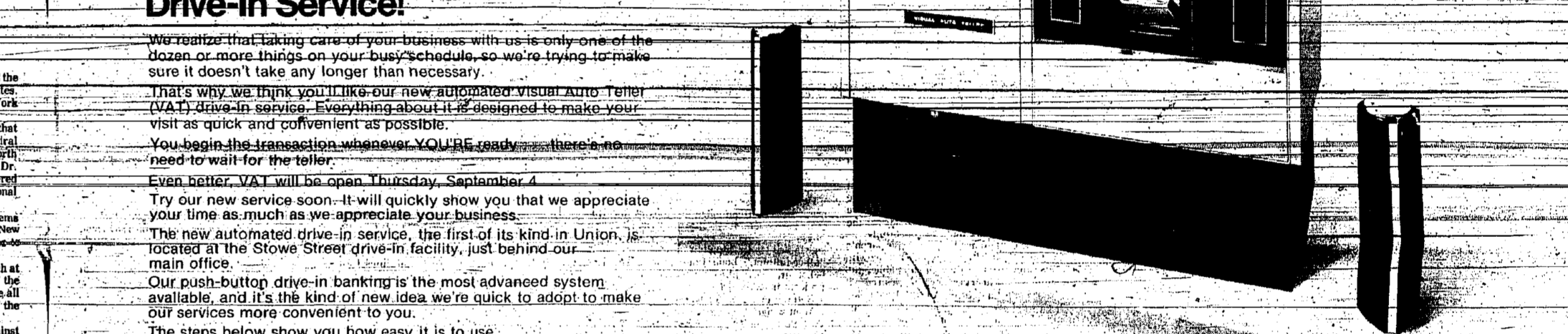

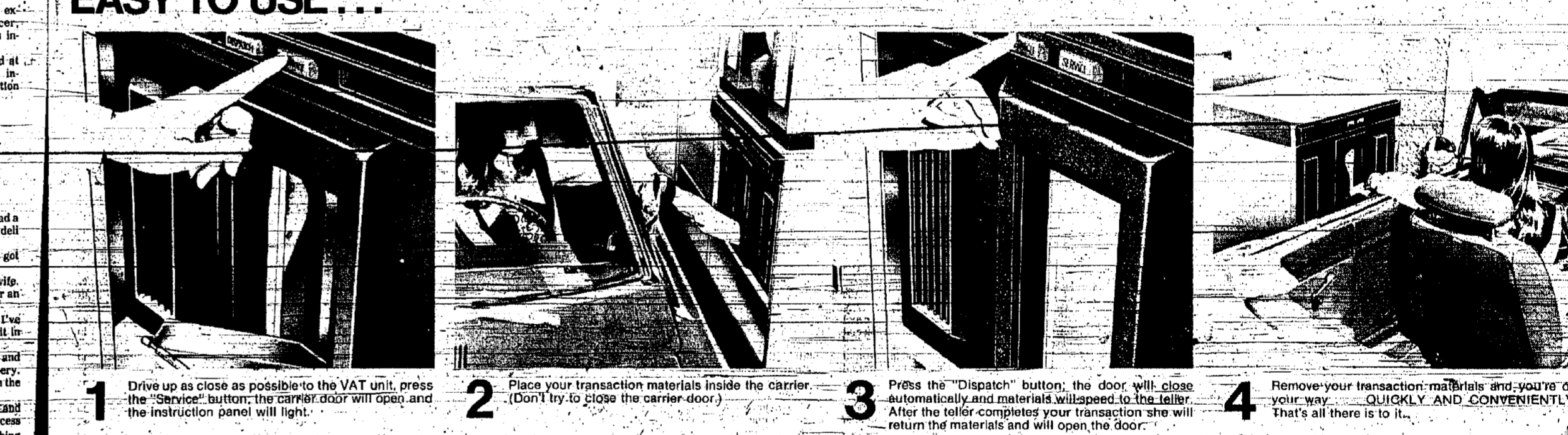

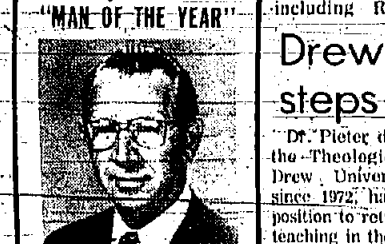

## New bill would ensure civil rights for retarded

A comprehensive bill of civil rights for the mentally retarded in New Jersey, including the right to education and training for all, is expected to be introduced in the State Senate next month.

The bill, which would have greater immediate effect on institutionalized persons, is the product of nearly a year of study and preparation by the staff of Sen. Alexander J. Mazza (D-Union), with the advice and counsel of the New Jersey Association for Retarded Children and the State Division on Mental Retardation.

Writing of the new legislation was specifically prompted early in 1974 when another bill, concerning the mentally ill, was near enactment. That bill, which became law last May, amended old references to mental retardation from a 1950 law that had combined

the two handicaps—since that time, administrative orders have filled in that "legal void." The proposed law would establish an advisory committee for the civil rights of the mentally retarded—a committee, basically composed of representatives of the State, the mentally retarded, and their families.

The bill would specifically establish a right to habilitation, which, in general definition, means the mandatory provision of programs and services that would enable a mentally retarded individual to acquire and maintain the skills—education, vocational training, adult education, and the like.

Particularly for the retarded in institutions, the law would require an individual "habilitation plan" to assure maximum development according to the judged mental and physical tools of the person.

A category of fundamental civil rights would delineate the issues of voting, licenses, permits and other privileges.

Also covered in the establishment of an advisory committee for the civil rights of the mentally retarded—a committee, basically composed of representatives of the State, the mentally retarded, and their families.

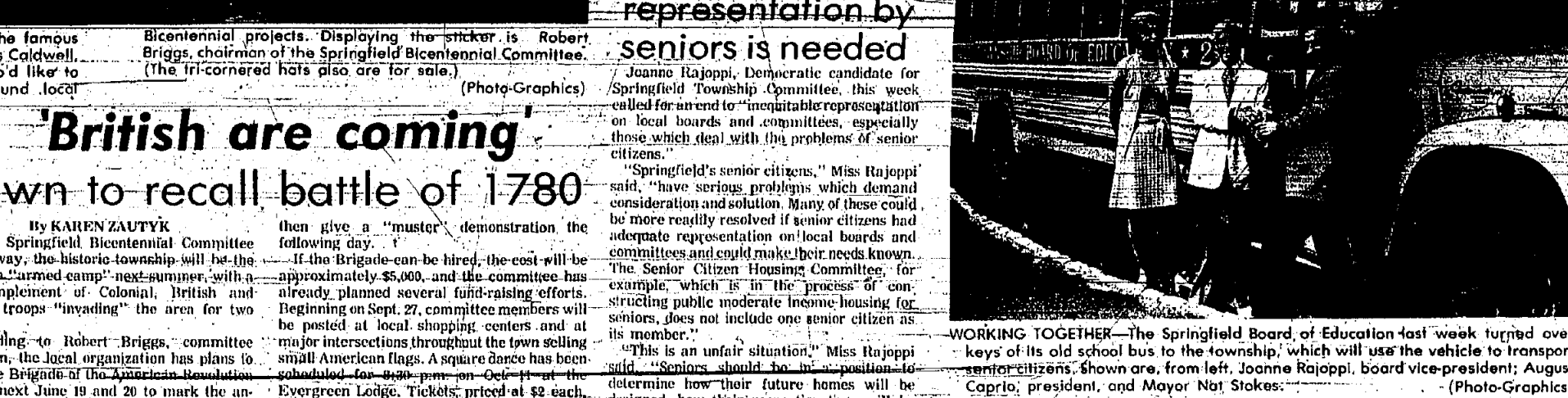

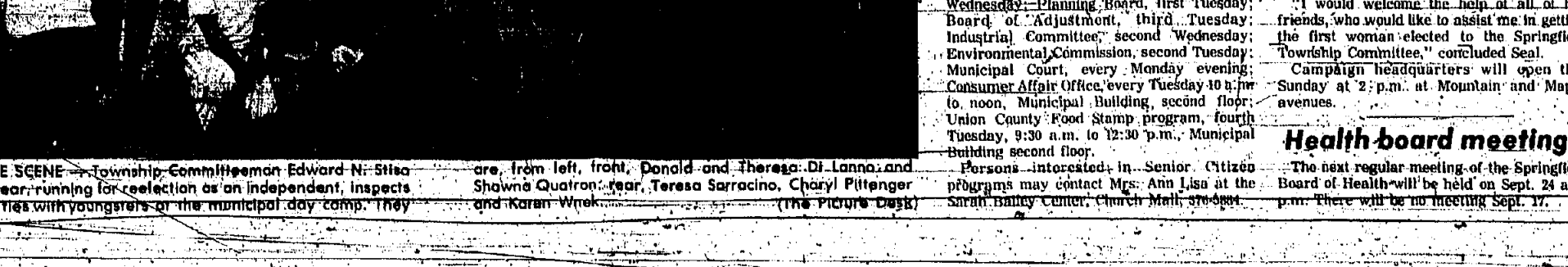
