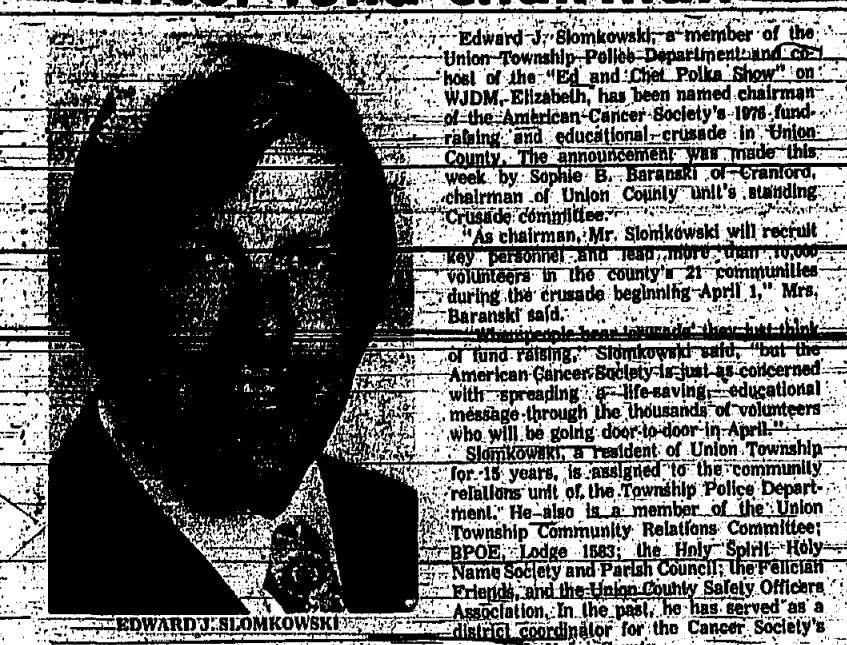

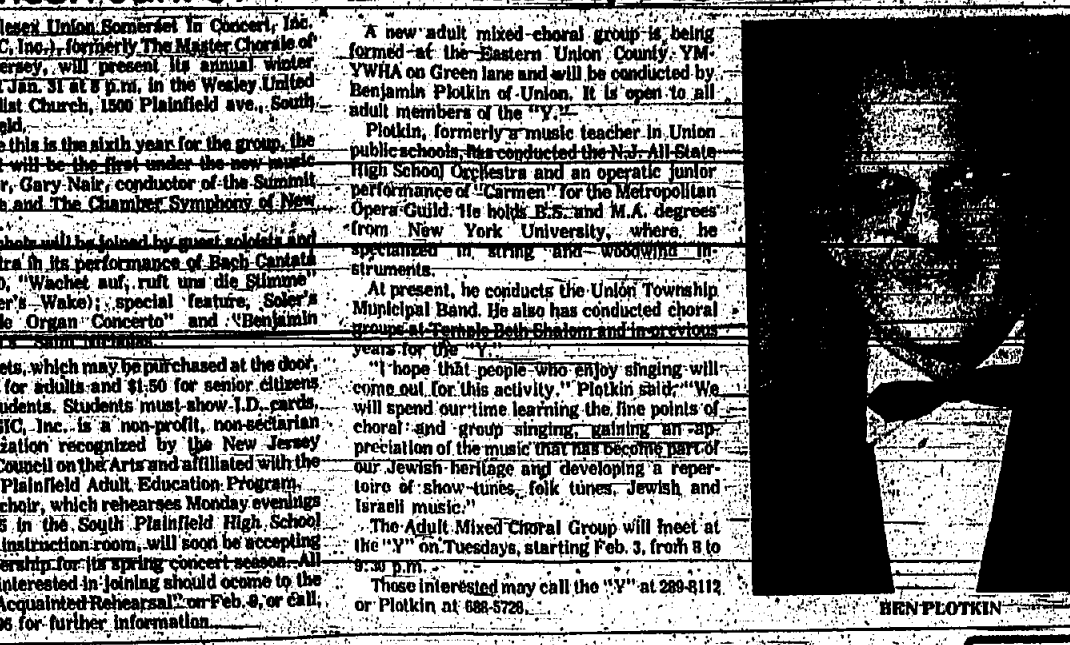

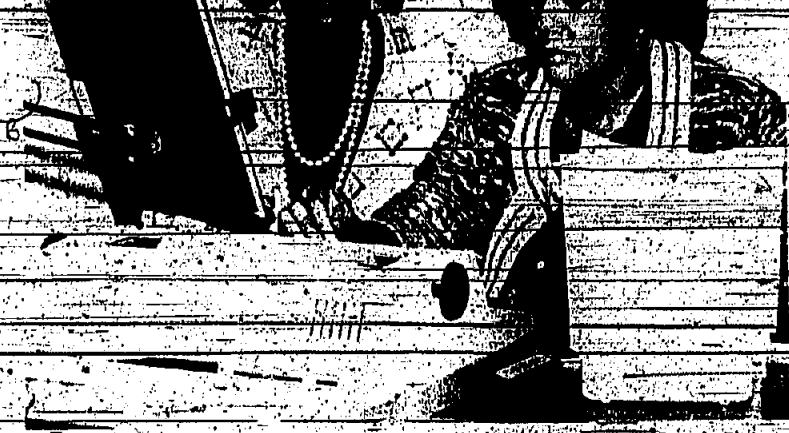
Zwillman to be awarded citation by B'nai B'rith

Largest UC enrollment seen for spring classes
