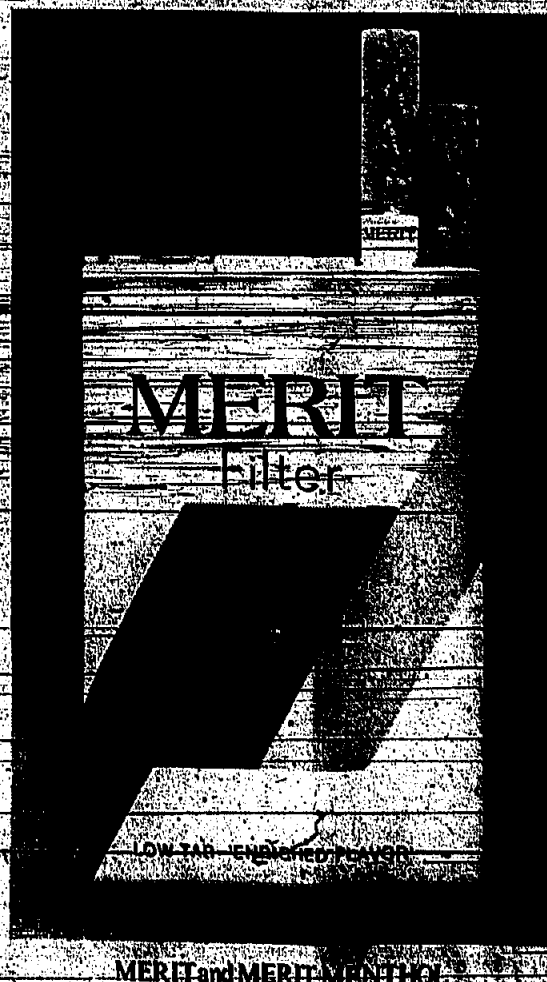

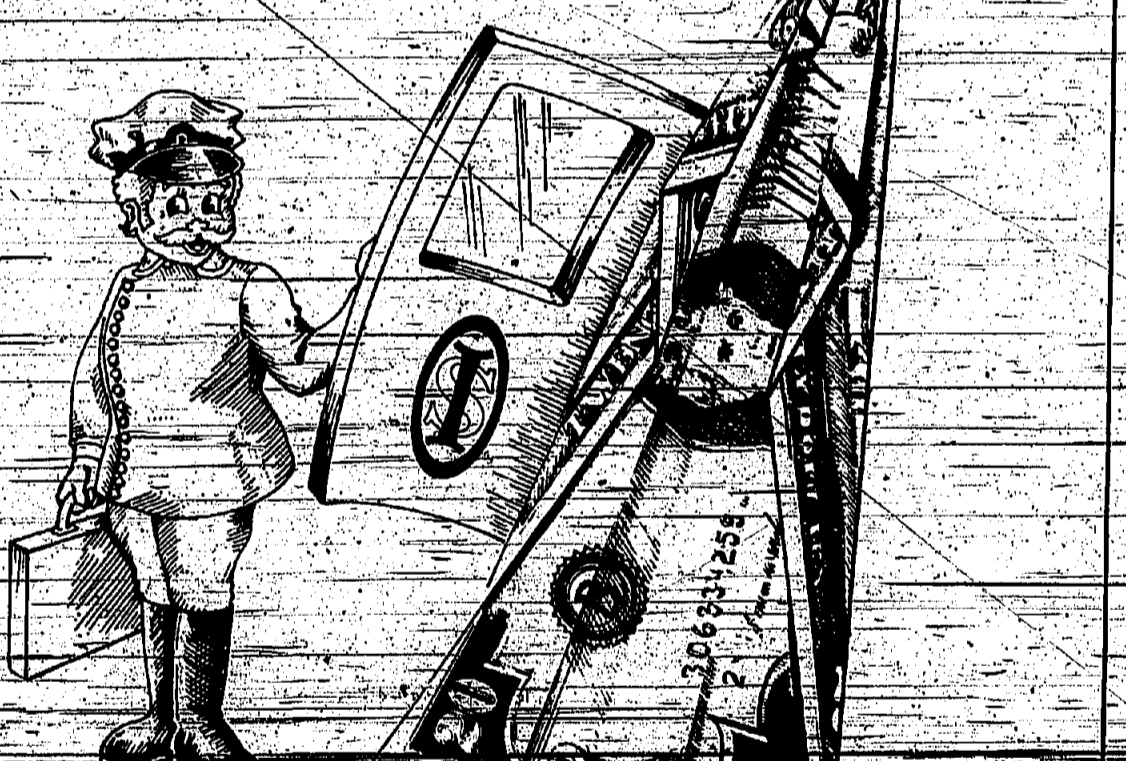

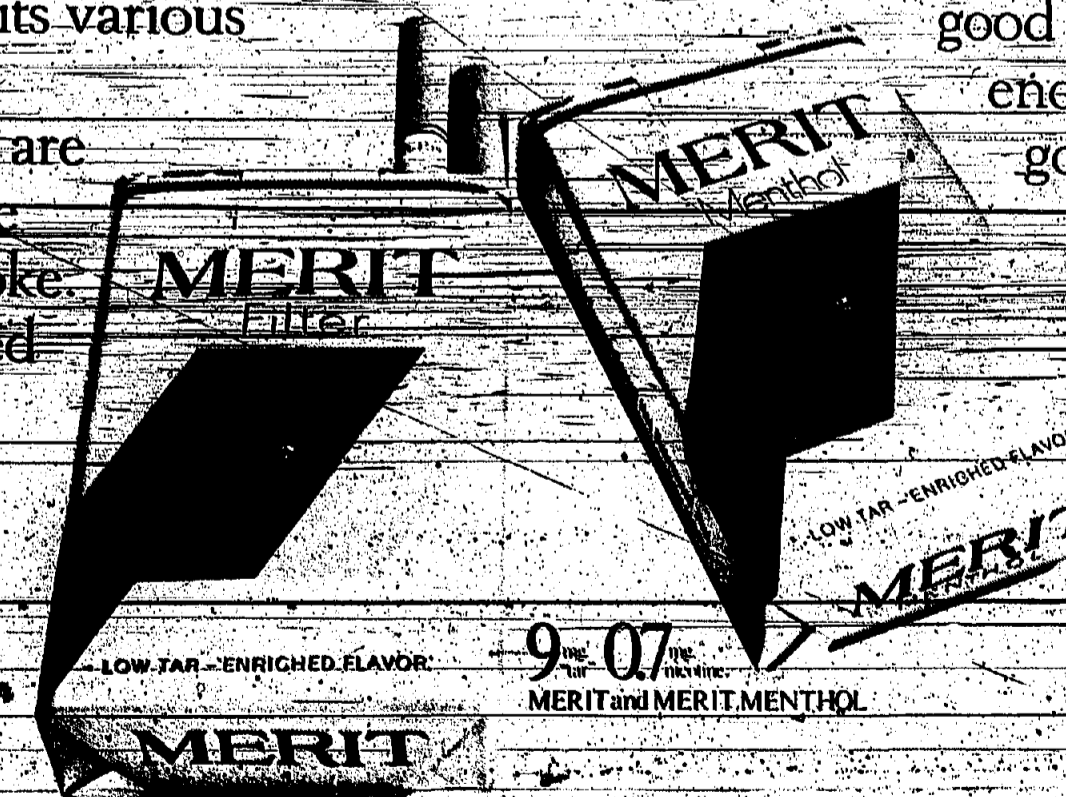

N.J. population reported up slightly by labor unit

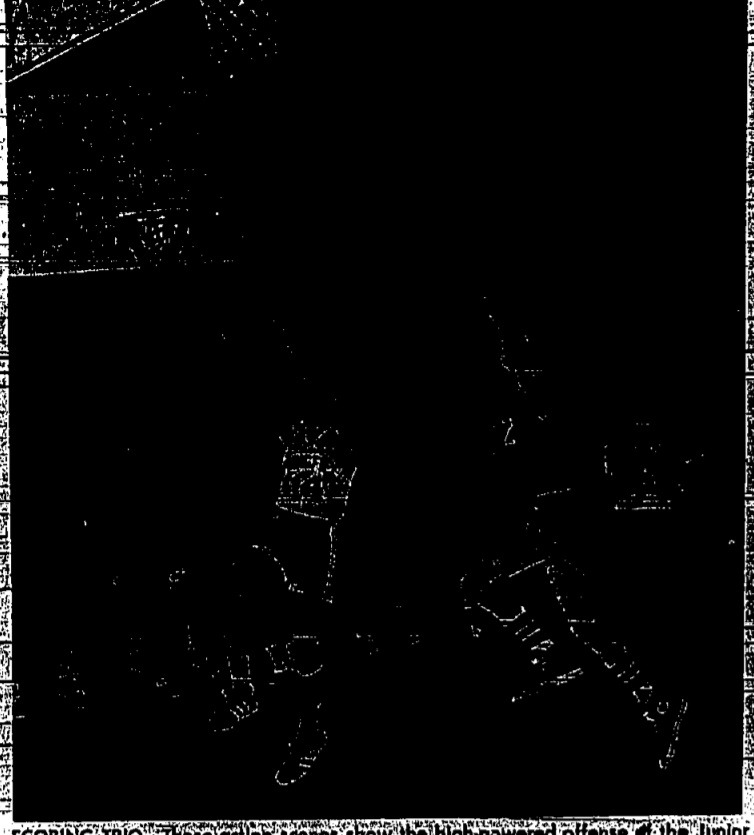

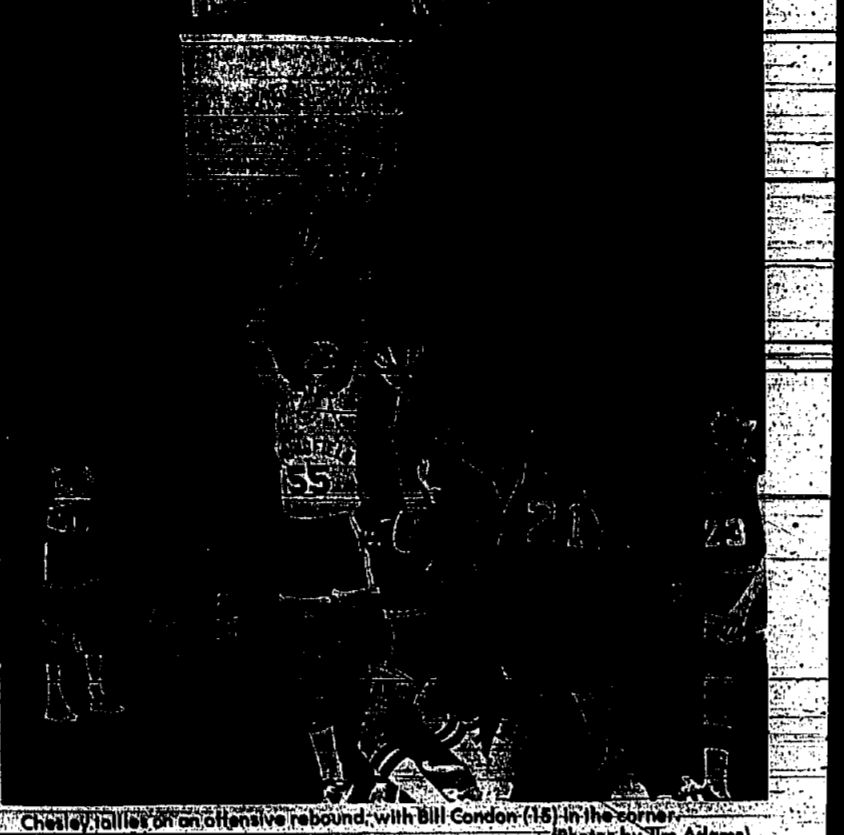
