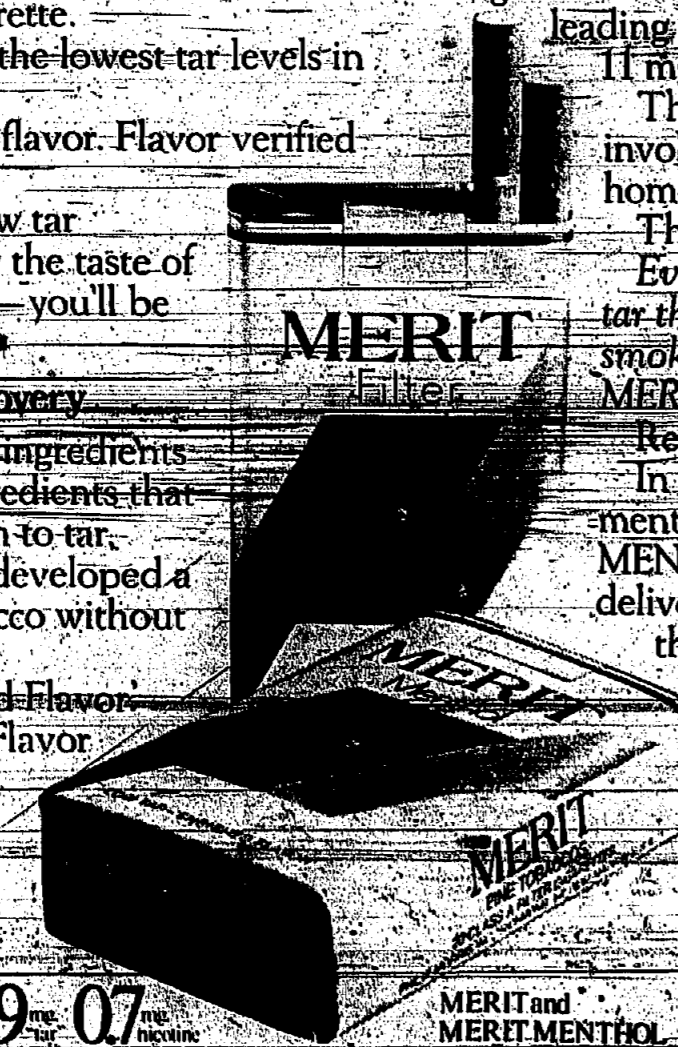

## Board candidates urge passage of budget



### Ideas differ on closing of schools

Shared service issue brings disagreement

By ANNIE GRAY

The tone of the annual Springfield Board of Education candidates' night debate Monday at the Florence Gaudreault School was established when several of the seven candidates for three seats to be filled on Tuesday declared that passage of the school budget is more important than their own individual issues.

All seven candidates joined in calling for support of the budget, which will require \$2,121,000 to be raised in local taxes.

The candidates are Anita Zappella, John Westfield, John Unterwald, Gloria Starr, Julian Westfield, Robert Rosenbaum and James Caldwell. The program was sponsored by the Springfield League of Women Voters and the Springfield Council, Carol Stebbins, president of the PTA group, opened the meeting. Robin Manrocco, past president of the Newark L.W.V., was moderator.

The only issues on which the candidates showed any signs of disagreement were the proposed closing of the Edward Wilson and James Caldwell Schools and the recently approved program of shared services with St. James School.

All candidates agreed with the board decision to request information on the educational and financial impact including the cost of expanded busing, before closing either school. However, Sigal and Rosenbaum said they favor a "higher-level" school, such as an elementary school, and Westfield said it can be a day care center. Both Sigal and Clark said they oppose closing Caldwell as the basis of present information.

On the shared services issue, Sigal said she would support the present level of shared services, but she would like to see some kind of enough input from the public and teachers. Nothing that seven lawyers were able to agree, Sigal said, such a school should not be settled by the board, but at a "higher level."

Rosenbaum said he would not support shared services. He stressed that she believes "in the separation of church and state as called for in the U.S. Constitution."

Westfield said, "This is not just a matter of church and state, but the welfare of children. If this splits the town as it has, the issue should not have been brought up."

Clark noted that the board "hasn't really discussed" the issue of shared services and the addition of St. James children to gym, shop and home economics classes at the existing Florence Gaudreault School. "I support the needs of the public over the private sector. It is not good to be neutral in any kind of this sort. I believe the board decision was unfortunate."

Zappella commented, "This was a decision of the board, based on the information available to it at that time. (Continued on page 10)

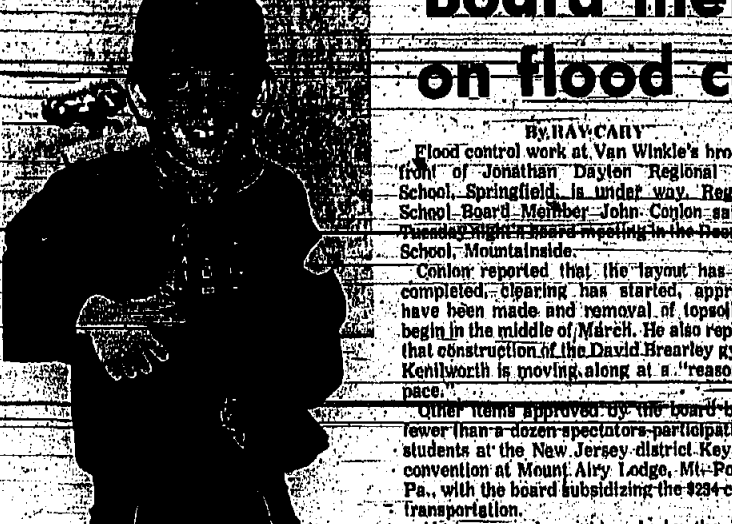

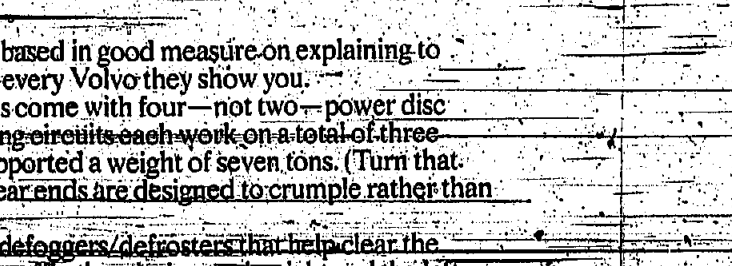

Editorial comment

Budget and candidates

The vital aspect of the Springfield Board of Education election to be held on Tuesday is that the budget must be approved by the voters to insure the future of an exciting, inspiring school system.

As several of the candidates said at Monday's annual debate, the election will survive whether they are elected or not, but a defeat of the budget, following the uncontested loss of state funds that will be paid to the schools here, would be disastrous.

We hope that all the parents and others who have called on the board in recent weeks to implement and expand various programs, to reduce class size for their children and to "provide other services which the board will be helped even to maintain the present outstanding level of education if the voters reject their projected budget.

We realize, of course, that local taxpayers are under the dual pressures of inflation and recession. But the target for all our frustrations should be the obedient legislators, of both parties, who refused to pass any sort of adequate bond-based tax to plug the gap into this crisis.

Turning to a more positive planning subject, we feel that all candidates for the three seats to be filled on Tuesday appear dedicated to the maintenance of an education system which will give each youngster the opportunity to realize his potential.

Our first choice for election is undoubtedly Charles A. Zappella. He has demonstrated an interest and through understanding of local school problems for some time. He has worked with experience in administrative and in helping young people, he would certainly be an asset to the board.

Our third vote could go to either John Starvo or Anita Zappulla. Both are articulate and well educated in the field of education. However, both seem more traditional than we might wish in their approach to the adventure of learning and perhaps less positive in their attitude toward the innovative spirit which makes the Springfield schools so exciting.

The other three candidates — John Siegal, John Unterwald and John Westerfield — are all people of sincerity and dedication. In other years, all would have merited election.

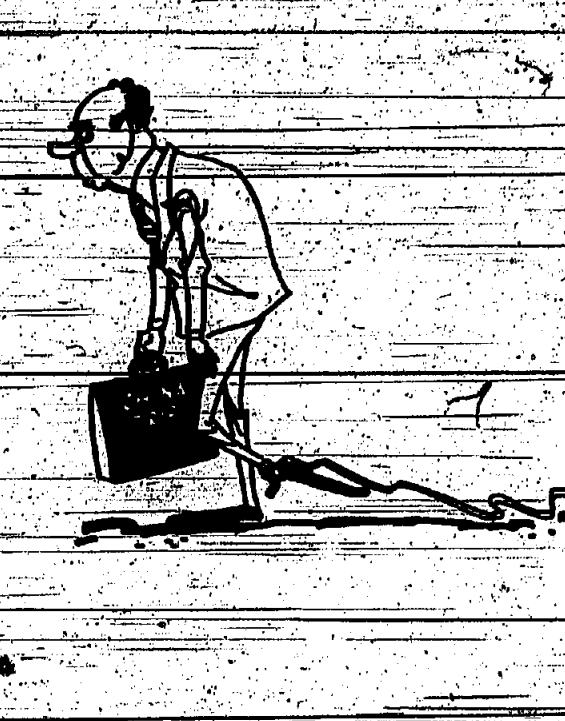

### Correction group asks involvement of county citizens

### Overlook treatment unit offers aid to alcoholics

Can alcoholism be dealt with eventually? Can the compulsive drinker be replaced by an equally ardent abstemious? Yes, say authorities at Overlook Hospital, Summit, where close to 40 alcoholic patients have been treated by the Overlook Alcohol Treatment Program over the past year.

"To be an alcoholic is not a disease. It is a disease in which some people are more susceptible than others," commented Arthur S. McEllean, M.D., director of community medicine at Overlook Hospital and Daniel J. O'Connell, M.D., Overlook's director of psychiatric services. He is co-director of the Overlook-Alcoholism Treatment Program.

Overlook's Alcoholism Treatment Program, funded by a million dollar grant from the National Institute of Alcoholism and Alcohol Abuse, "The Overlook ATP provides back-up for the patient. The community hospital, including out-patient support, occupational therapy, medical services, plus the expertise of a 30-member medical and psychiatric staff," said Dr. McEllean.

"After the illness, which hospitalizes the patient is alcoholic in origin. With physician permission, Overlook counsels more in a group discussion in the initial stages of alcoholism, working with counselors in the Overlook ATP."

"There are 'Bridge' groups during which patients with their spouses and others significant in their lives, share with volunteers who are sober, long-term AA and Alton members.

"Few people recognize that they have lost control of their drinking," commented Dr. McEllean. Often it takes a crisis—the wife or husband threatens to leave, perhaps goes to a lawyer, serious liver disease may develop; the loss says sharp stop-out."

The first step is to have the patient join a motivational group designed for help in the initial stages. The goal of the ATP is to motivate the patient to enter the program willingly, even if voluntarily.
