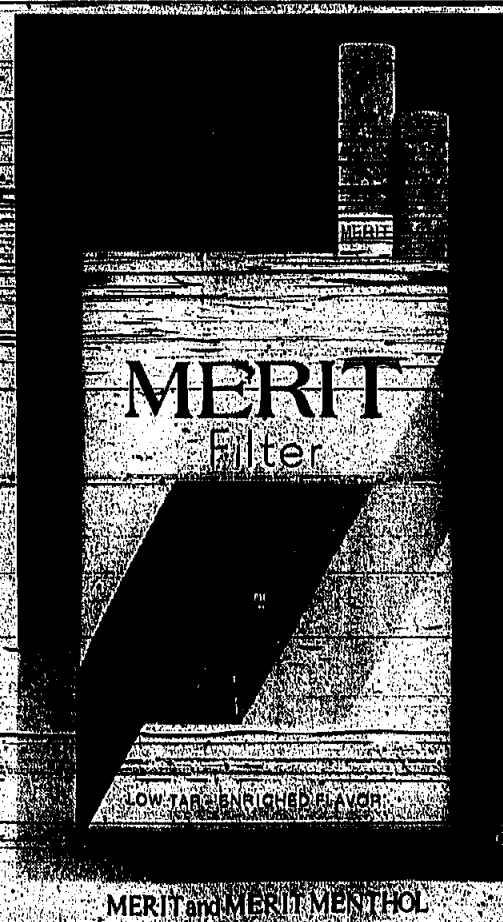

2 shared service cases approved

The Springfield Board of Education Monday night approved two requests to provide psychological testing and remedial services for youngsters at St. James School. Decisions which were accompanied by lengthy and frequently-impassioned arguments among board members and between several members and spectators.

Michael McIntyre was named board president and Charles Cohn was chosen vice-president. Both elections were contested. McIntyre defeated James Adams, even before McIntyre's first vote for vice-president, took had four votes; Doris Gilles, three, and George Doty two. In the second, Cohn outpolled Mrs. Gilles six to three.

Both applications for the special services at St. James were approved by vote of five to four, after attempts to table the motions failed by five-to-four margins. Voting to fulfill the services were McIntyre, Cohn, August Caputo, Doty and Adams. Opposed were Laura Hainbaum, Gregory Clarke, Mrs. Gilles and Gloria Starr. Mrs. Hainbaum, Clarke and Mrs. Starr were taking part in their first board meeting after having been elected the previous week.

Cohn, who presented the two motions for the school government committee, noted that the board was implementing its decision in the summer to provide special services for children at St. James and other nonpublic schools, on a case-by-case basis. Those services included that the services would violate the constitutional requirement for separation of church and state.

One key issue developed when the plan for helping one child included not only testing and counseling but also remedial services. Mrs. Gilles said, "Public school personnel would be going into the parochial school classroom. This is solely an institutional and it is not a minor infraction."

McIntyre said he felt the services would be constitutional. He said, "The legal proceedings tell us that entanglement is a matter of degree. We must look at the facts and the circumstances. This action is within the spirit of the constitution as passed in 1875."

Papers and magazines must be used or placed in paper bags and placed in the curbside bins. Papers also will be collected but only if filled with paper or magazines.

Regional board fails to agree on budget cuts

Town budget passes after 5-minute hearing

Reduction ordered by six towns

Brings rise of 2 points; total is 34

Hearing adjourned in bid for rent hike

The Township Committee Tuesday night unanimously approved its 1976 budget calling for a 3.4 percent increase in local taxes. The increase was approved after a five-minute hearing, with no discernible objections from any member of the audience of nearly 20 people.

The new budget represents an increase of \$1,014,000 over the 1975 budget calling for a 3.6 percent increase in local taxes. Committee Chairman William A. Ruocco disclosed that a previous estimate that the municipal portion of the total property tax in Springfield would increase by 4.1 points had been changed by news that the town will receive some \$500,000 in state aid that had not been anticipated.

The hearing adjourned at 10:05 p.m. after 10 minutes of discussion. Other components of the tax package were evenly divided, with a 1 percent local school tax, up 7 points, and Regional High School tax, up 10 points.

The committee's total tax increase of 34 points, or \$104.00 a house, resulted in a current market value of \$240,000, \$170 for \$200,000 value and for a \$20,000 house. Of the \$20,000 increase, only \$12 would be for municipal purposes.

The hearing adjourned at 10:05 p.m. after 10 minutes of discussion. Other components of the tax package were evenly divided, with a 1 percent local school tax, up 7 points, and Regional High School tax, up 10 points.

Regional budget cut \$250,000
The governing bodies of the six constituent communities in the Union County Regional High School District last week agreed on a reduction of \$250,000 in the district's proposed 1976-77 budget of \$12,857,771. The reduction followed the decision of the proposed budget committee on March 11, following a reduction of \$100,000 in the district's 1975-76 budget of \$12,957,771.
