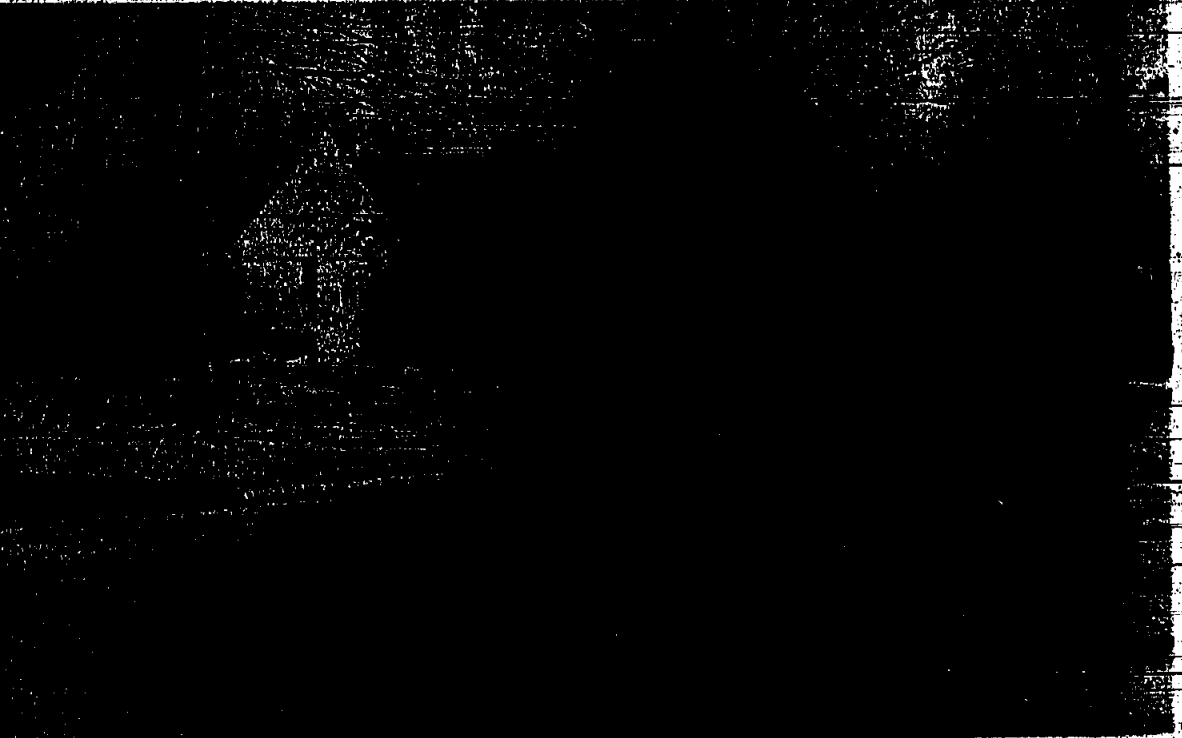

Town acts to finance dike work

Requests for signal go back two decades

Construction of a traffic light at Hillside and Mountain avenues, a top priority for Springfield for the past 20 years, should start this spring, Committee Chairman William Russo told the 20 members of the Township Committee meeting Tuesday night at Town Hall.

Three years and three months after the town's latest formal request was filed, Russo said, the N.J. Department of Transportation has had the study and received bids for the work. The bids will be opened on April 29, and a contract will be awarded within the next 30 days.

The first demands for a traffic light at the intersection, involving two county roads, were heard in Newark in 1956 when Mr. Peter Morrison, a local mail truck driver, was killed in a collision at that site. There have been other numerous accidents at the corner with one additional fatality.

Russo also received approval for a major stop financial assistance bid with the introduction of a \$38,000 bond ordinance for the flooding and silting of the Parkway River in the vicinity of Mountain avenue, north of Morris avenue. The work is expected to be a substantial measure of relief for residents of the township's worst drainage trouble spot.

In response to a question from Harold Jones, president of the First District Concerned Citizens for Action, Mayor Robert Wetzel said that the town had not concluded an agreement with Villa Contracting Co., owner of the land needed for the dike. He said that an agreement has been prepared and is awaiting the owner's signature. The mayor stressed that he considers no problem at all in obtaining the signature.

Wetzel also reported that the governing body on March 23 rejected an appeal for a hardship rate increase filed by Dr. Ferdinand Weiskopf, owner of the Springfield Village apartments at 415 Morris avenue.

Wetzel said that the committee found no reason for an increase after listening to lengthy arguments presented by the landlord and tenant.

Recreation Commissioner Joanne Rajopel presented a special appeal by Michelle Star, a fifth grader at the Edward Wilson School. Michelle was the best and state champion in her age group in the standard broad jump in last year's AAU Junior Olympics track competition for girls and boys.

Michelle's long-jump record of 16 feet 6 inches was recently recognized by AAU officials as the highest in the nation last year by a 9-year-old girl.

The committee introduced a recreation-related ordinance, raising the minimum age from 12 to 14 for the city's public swimming pool.

Jim Rajopel reported that construction is under way for an addition to the Sarah Haller Civic Center. She said the new facilities, for use

State DOT takes a step for new Morris bridge

The State Department of Transportation this week took one step toward the long road which could lead to eventual replacement of the Morris avenue bridge over the Parkway River. It issued a public notice declaring the project a "major action."

Designing a project a "major action" means that assessment will be undertaken to determine whether a full "major action" environmental study is required.

The bridge, at the boundary between Union and Springfield, has been described as a bottleneck behind which water backs up during

periods of heavy rain, causing flooding in both towns.

Its replacement by a new span is expected to be funded partly by the federal government and partly by the state. Morris avenue, Route 28, is a state highway.

The DOT is now waiting for federal authorization to approve the "major action" identification.

When the approval is received, the DOT Design Section will officially request cooperation of an assessment of the project's

Rinaldo conducts seminar Tuesday for local officials on getting U.S. aid

Many from the local government and business community are expected to attend a seminar on Federal assistance at the Union Township Municipal Building Tuesday, 11 p.m. The seminar is sponsored by Congressman Matthew J. Rinaldo (R-State District 11).

Top officials of federal agencies in the New York-New Jersey region will speak and confer with local and county officials on a broad range of programs.

They will review housing assistance, flood control, urban mass transit, community health services, community planning and development, manpower and emergency employment, social and rehabilitation services, and environmental protection.

The speakers will represent the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Department of Commerce, the U.S. Coast Guard, the U.S. Department of Transportation, and other federal agencies.

Congressman Rinaldo will open the seminar at 7 p.m. with a talk on "How To Use a Congressional Office for Assistance." The program will end at 11 p.m.

In announcing the seminar, Rinaldo said that severe cutbacks in federal assistance have forced many municipalities to expand their local assistance programs in order to avoid reduction in essential public services.

He noted that New Jersey's share of federal assistance increased by 15% within last year to a total of \$1.6 billion. "We can improve on New Jersey's share of federal assistance," he said.

He noted that several of the speakers are regional administrators and are acquainted with the programs in the County.

Although the primary responsibility for relieving the budget problems of local communities rests on the federal, state, and on state tax reform, Rinaldo said, "Congress has enacted a number of federal assistance programs and grants that can help our local communities."

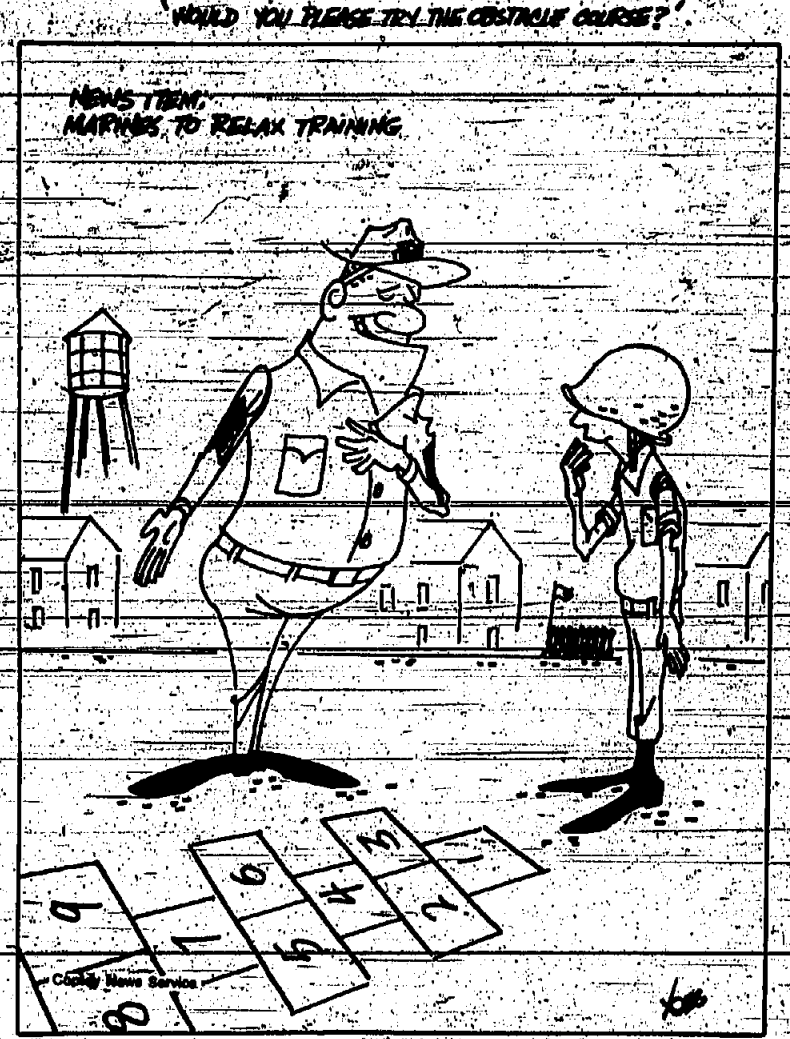

Egypt arms deal comes under fire

News of a deal for the sale of Egyptian arms to the United States has provoked the current U.S. Administration plan for the sale of arms to Egypt.

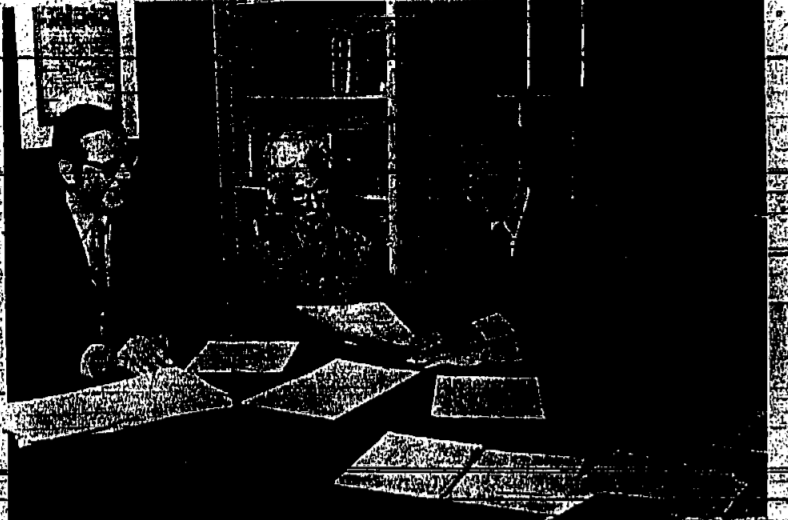

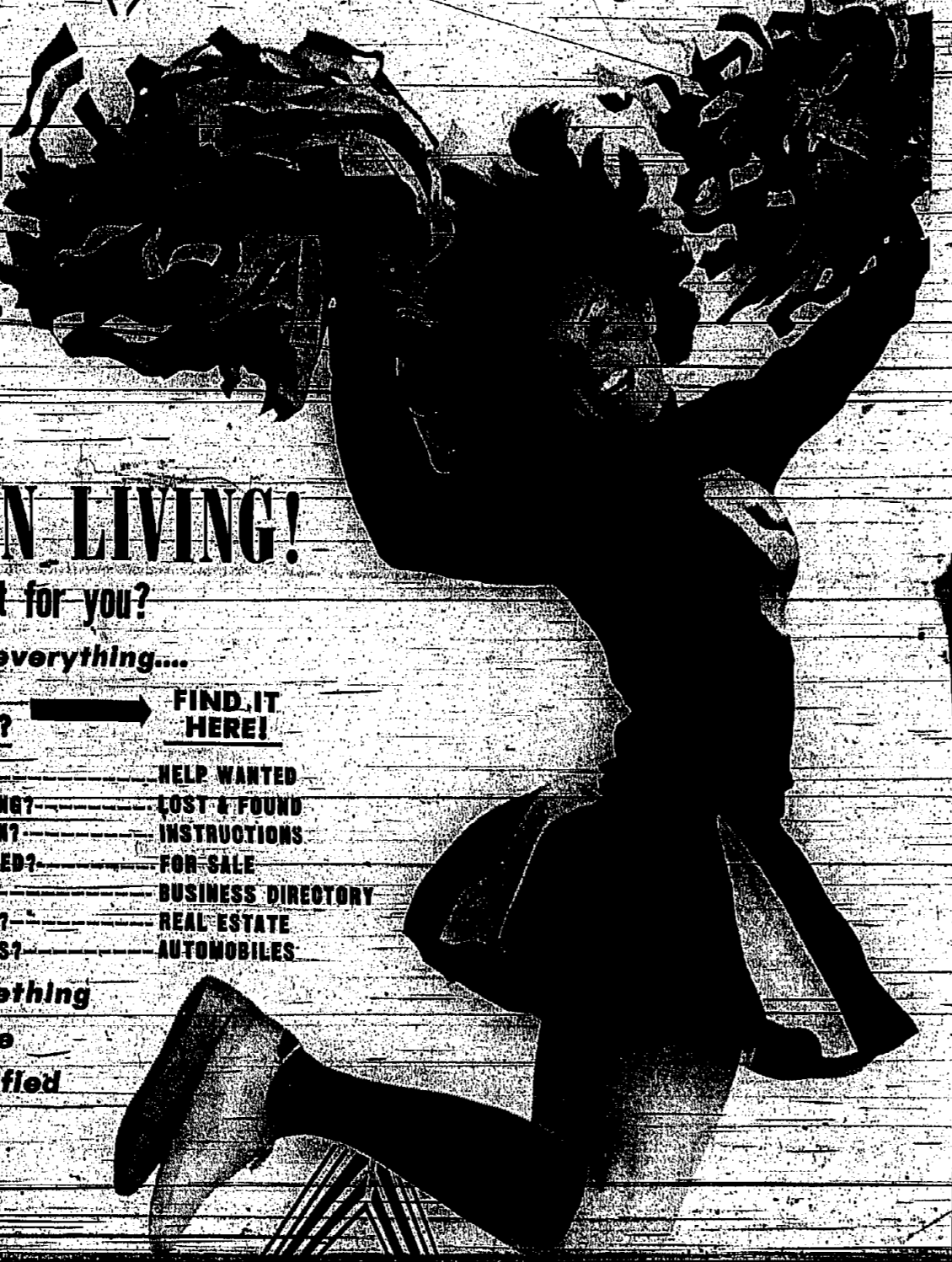

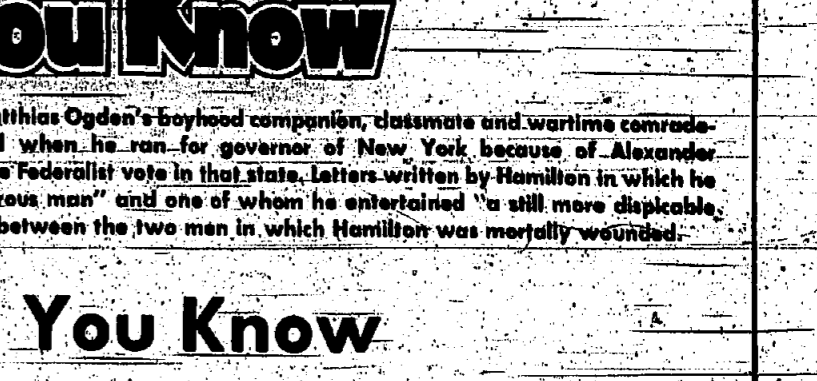
