### Federal appeal planned by school boards group

The New Jersey School Boards Association announced this week it will seek relief in federal court to enjoin the state Supreme Court order closing schools after July 1. NJSBA, President William T. Rosenberg said, "The state Supreme Court order is a violation of the federal Constitution. We must utilize every avenue open to us to prevent this order from being implemented."

The decision to file an appeal in federal court came after the state Supreme Court turned down the Rutgers-Park Haven Regional Board of Education and the NJSBA's request that the state Court modify its July 1 order closing schools on July 1. The appeal is being filed in the federal court in Newark.

The federal appeal will be based on violations of the federal Constitution and the federal Civil Rights Act. The NJSBA feels a challenge can be made in light of the fact that the children of New Jersey are being denied a "total denial" of educational opportunities.

"This denial cannot be allowed," Rosenberg said. "It is a total denial of educational opportunities. The impact of such a denial is devastating, affecting staffs, program planning and development, and most of all, the children of New Jersey. The NJSBA is determined to prevent this denial of educational opportunities."

The request by the Rutgers-Park Haven board and the NJSBA to have the appeal filed was rejected by a 5-2 vote of the state Supreme Court. The majority opinion was written by Justice Robert J. Caserio.

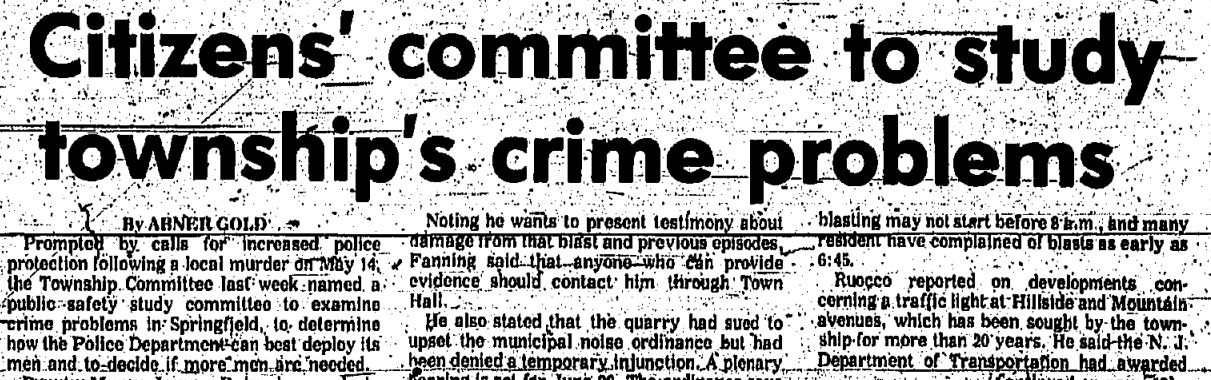

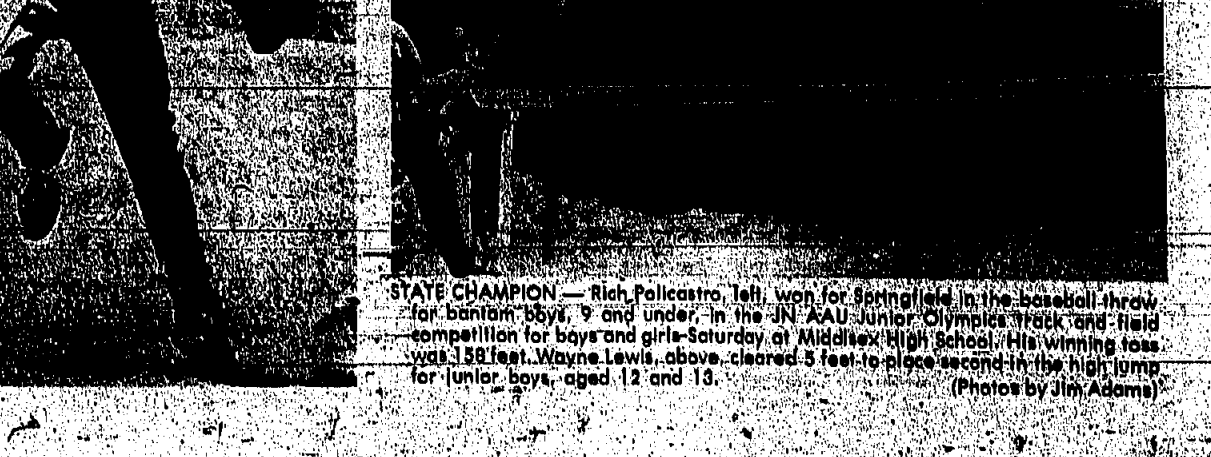

### Love as therapy

The Springfield Public Library lists the following titles among the recently received books:

**ALL FOR ONE**

"Son Hiss," by Barry Neil Kaufman. A young father learns the story of his third child's son Raimo who, shortly after birth, became seriously ill, suffering severe damage to his ears.

Noting first a definite hearing deficiency, then deafness, Barry and Suzi realized that their beautiful son was quiet, remote, disconnected but not destroyed, having the attributes of an autistic child.

From the hospital, Barry and Suzi took their son home, but soon were forced to conclude that only "they themselves," through self-education and investigation, could give their child a chance.

In his search for self-awareness, Barry had studied psychology, philosophy, religion and mysticism, and had discovered the Gurdjieff Method. This was a "positive means" of investigating and making new choices, of "discovering self" and "re-creating self" through the process.

Armed with this philosophy, the family found the resolve to accept and love the precious child, without imposing standards or making judgments. They devoted a year to this, with the assistance of George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Benjamin Franklin, John Adams, King George III and the people of Boston.

### Confidence in Trenton falls

Confidence in state government has dropped sharply in the past two years, according to the latest New Jersey Poll conducted in May by the Eagleton Institute of Politics at Rutgers University. The Poll found that only 38 percent of the state's adult residents said they had "a lot of confidence" in the government in Trenton, as compared to 48 percent in March 1974, shortly after the Byrne administration took office. The poll also found that confidence in state government has fallen sharply from 48 percent in 1974 to 38 percent in 1976. While confidence in state government has fallen, confidence in the federal government has risen somewhat. Those with a "lot of confidence" in the government in Washington numbered 68 percent compared to 63 percent in 1974. Those with "not much confidence" remained stable at 33 percent presently and 32 percent two years ago.

Confidence in local government in New Jersey has also declined. Although these with a "lot of confidence" remain about the same—28 percent in 1974 and 28 percent in 1976—those with "not much confidence" without much confidence have risen from 22 percent to 30 percent.

The poll also found that different kinds of voters felt alienated from the state and the federal governments. Those with low confidence in state government tended to be wealthy, white, and young. # This 'bell' rings true Wood Liberty is exact replica

You won't have to travel to Philadelphia this year to see the Liberty Bell. There is an exact replica of this best-loved symbol of American freedom now being displayed at Allied Chemical's corporate headquarters on Columbia Road in Morris Township. It will be part of the July 4 parade in Morristown.

Constructed of bronze-painted wood, the bell is a full-size version of the original including the well-known crack.

Made under the supervision of Rocco Barbolla, foreman in the facilities and services department, the bell is the latest display that Barbolla and his team of seven men have created. The other displays include a commemorative for the three main buildings at the Allied Chemical site, displays for the company's annual "War" anniversary and a float in the shape of an American Eagle, which will transport the "liberty bell" during the July 4 parade.

"The idea for building the bell was prompted by the need for an appropriate Bicentennial theme for the site," Barbolla said.

After thinking about all the possibilities, the "liberty bell" seemed to fit the bill," said Barbolla. He had the idea of making two large paper mache bells for the Christmas display and had a pretty good idea of what bell building was all about," he added.

And so, Barbolla and his crew began to research the bell's vital statistics. This included writing to the Independence Foundation in Philadelphia for the dimensions of the original and a weekend trip made there for photographs, facilities and services foreman, who photographed the bell from every possible angle.

Armed with color photos and blueprints, Barbolla's crew started work on the bell four months ago by gluing circles of wood to the inside to resemble the shape of a bell. The men worked in their spare time, carefully following the photos to make sure that each detail was correct.

"Sometimes we worked into the night, so we'd meet our deadline—displaying the bell at Allied Chemical for the Bicentennial," Barbolla recalls.

The finished bell was unveiled on schedule and displayed in a flower bed. It's a red, white and blue floral tribute to the Bicentennial.

Although this is the first "liberty bell" that Barbolla has made, his wide-ranging interests in art make the bell a logical project. In his spare time, Barbolla, who attended Arts High School, Newark, pursues his hobby and paints in both oil and watercolor and makes wooden and metal sculptures.
