\$23,100 firehouse plans item passes vote, but faces opposition

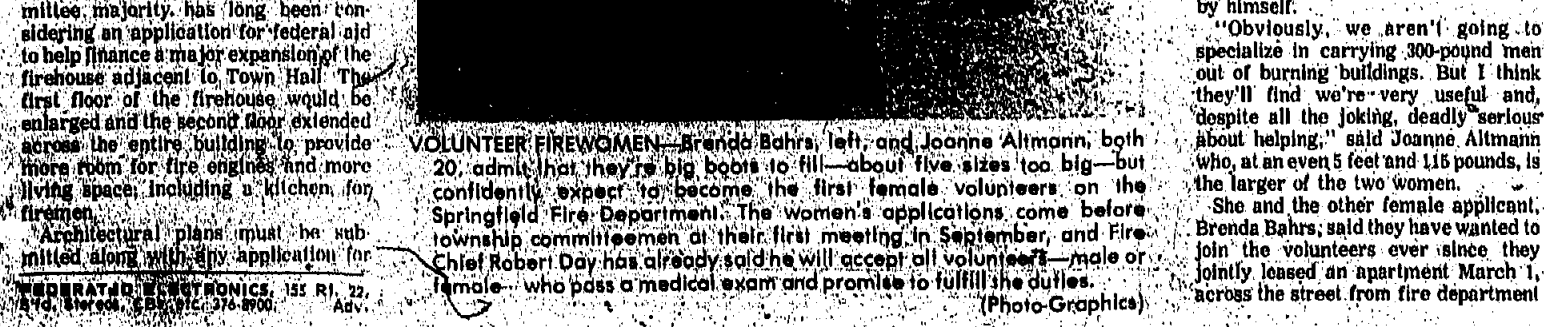
The Springfield Township Committee has introduced a proposal to spend \$23,100 for architectural plans that would lead to a long-range, \$200,000 expansion of the firehouse.

In an action Tuesday Township Committee members Nathan Stokes and Norman Banner, Environmental Commissioner Allan Zeller and Township Committee member candidate Stanley Kish, launched Springfield opposition to a variance for a \$2 million firehouse.

Banner, Stokes and Mayor Joanne Rappaport were the only Township Committee members at the meeting Tuesday, and it took unanimously from the three for any official action.

The unanimity was strained on the \$23,100 revenue package, Stokes said he wants the measure trimmed down to \$22,000, including only the land and equipment purchases.

### Children's Specialized seeks swim volunteers

With the opening of its new 60-bed addition which includes a larger therapeutic pool Children's Specialized Hospital, Mountainside, is expanding its hydrotherapy activities for physically handicapped young people. More adult volunteers who are themselves swimmers and enjoy water activities are needed, however, to work with the young patients on a one-on-one basis in the pool, which is five times the size of the pool in the present facility. Headache, facial tenderness, and post-nasal drip are some of the miserable symptoms of sinusitis, an inflammation of the sinus cavities surrounding the nose. Americans spend millions of dollars each year for medications that promise to relieve this painful condition.  
Sinusitis occurs when the mucous membranes that line the sinuses become infected. Viral infections that affect the nasal passages, such as the common cold, are the most frequent cause of sinusitis. This happens because the nasal membranes, which are highly vascular, can successfully prevent free entry of "sinusitis" bacteria and certain fungi into the sinuses.  
Another source of sinusitis problems is the overuse of certain antibiotics to "kill" an almost infinite number of susceptible individuals. Allergens such as dust, animal dander, and pollen can create sinus swelling and discomfort that are often difficult to treat.

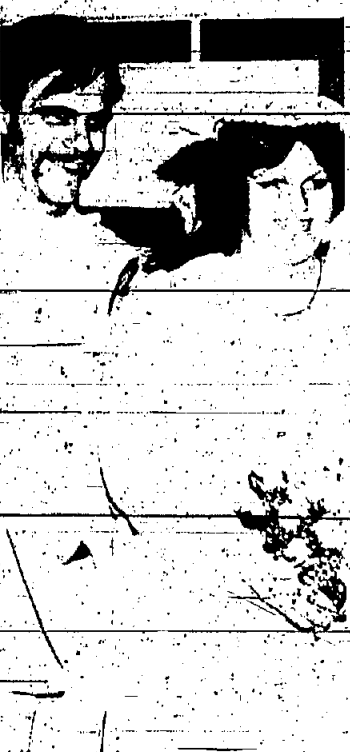

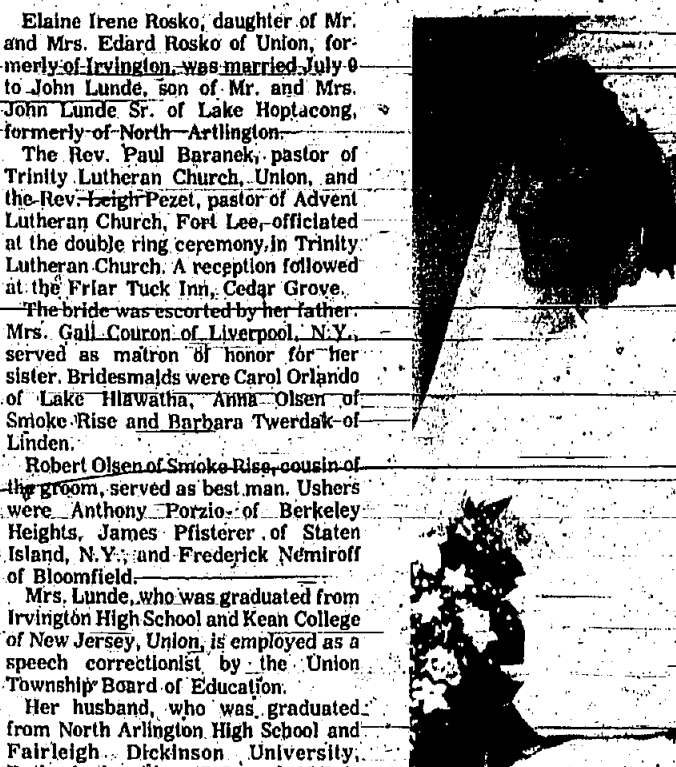

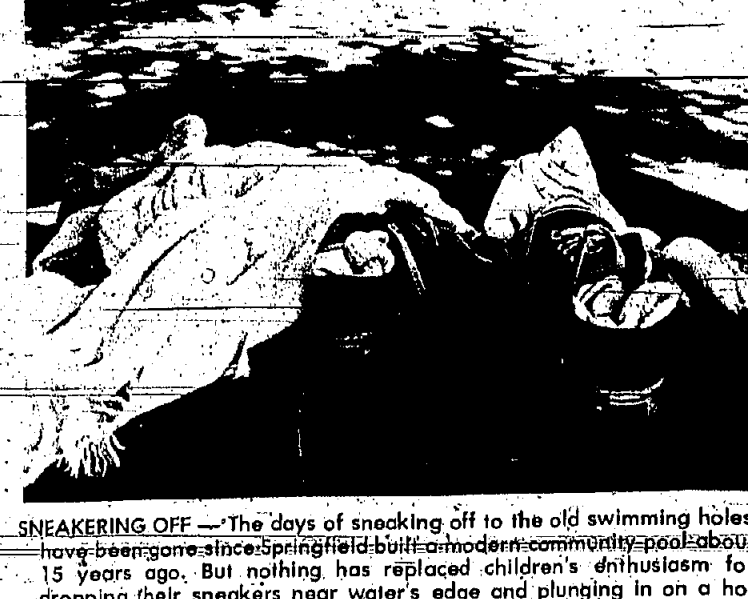
