

Fraud is found in pay benefits

More than 1,000 cases of fraudulent collection of unemployment benefits have been uncovered in the six-month period ending June 30, John J. Horn, commissioner of the N.J. Department of Labor and Industry, has announced. Horn said the bureau of unemployment control in the Division of Unemployment Insurance investigated and reported 1,074 cases of fraudulent collection of unemployment benefits in which the individuals involved collected 5,546 weeks of benefits for a total of 745,944 weeks.

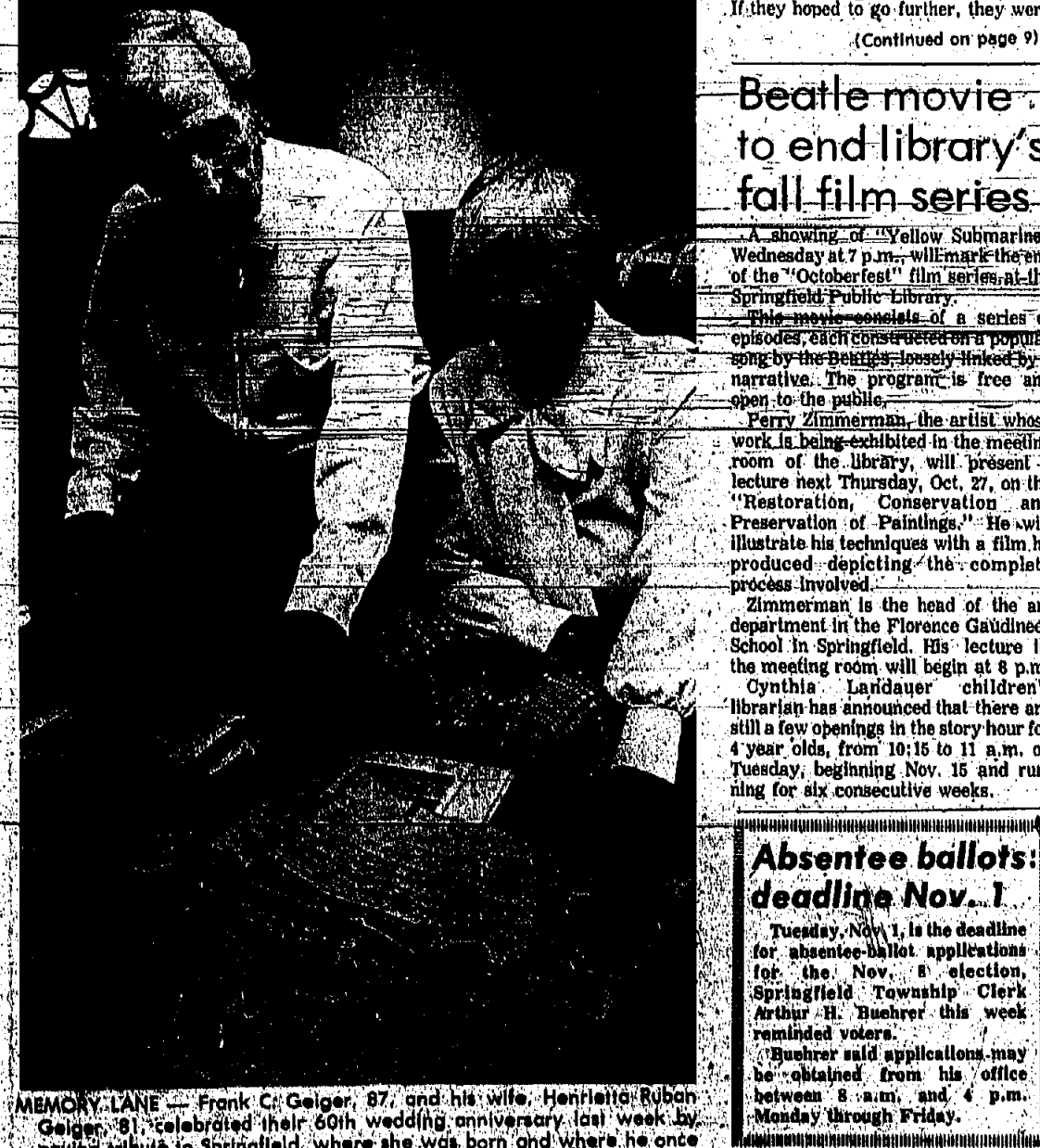

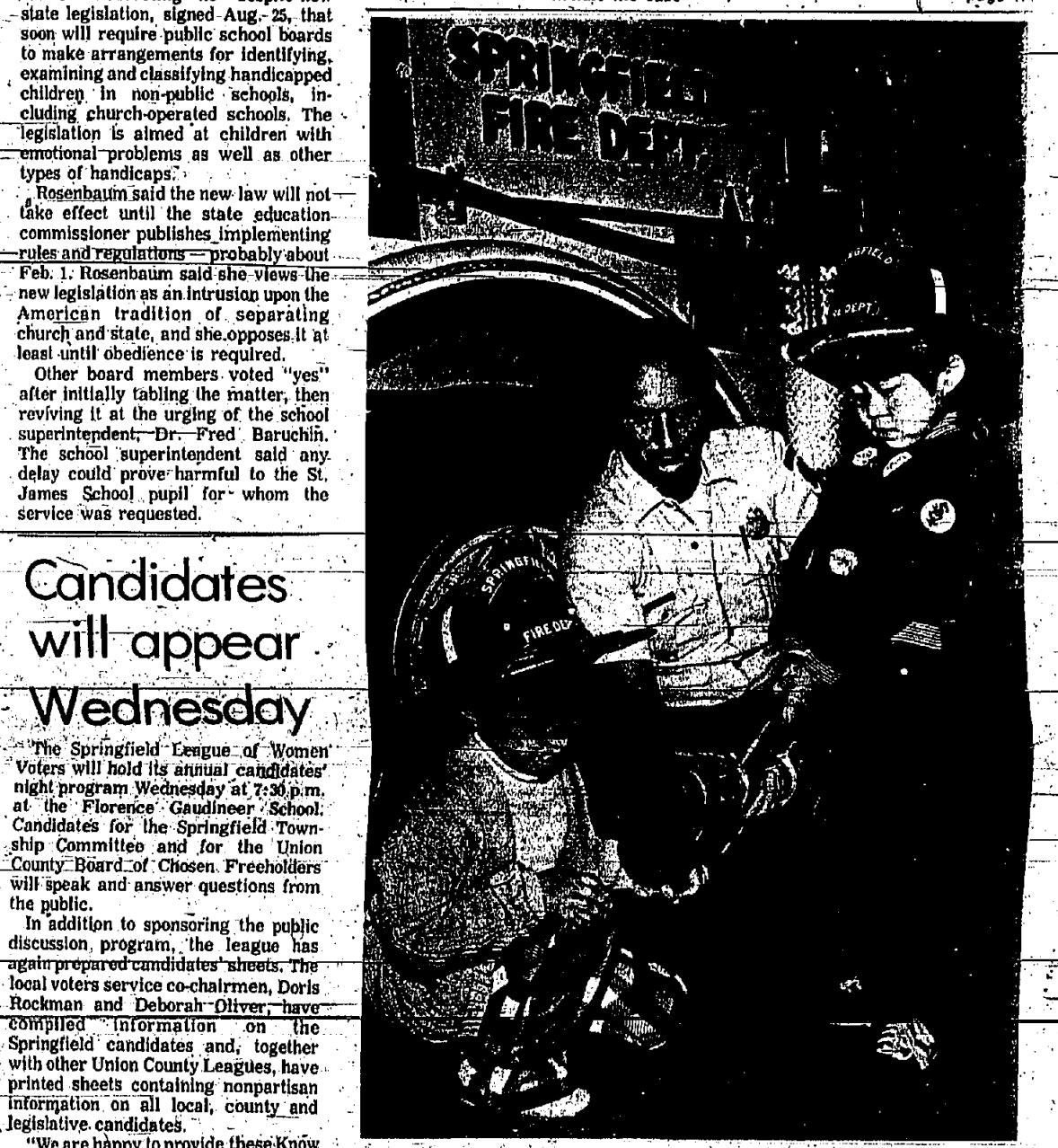

In the 125 years of its ministry, the Evangel Baptist Church has grown from about 20 German immigrants who met in the New York City home of a lay preacher, Frederick Hof, to a congregation of almost 800 who meet in the modern church in Springfield. The

Dr. William O. Goulden of Springfield has been elected chairman of the board of directors of the newly formed Buffalo Color Corporation West Paterson. The firm has acquired all of the assets of the defunct business of Allied Chemical Corp.

The next pastor to serve Evangel was Dr. Maurice A. Barroch, who resumed the radio ministry of the Evangel Hour and instituted a weekly, and later monthly, church newspaper, which is still continuing. He also resigned to go into "missionary service," becoming home director of the Sudan Interior Mission.

In 1902, at the golden jubilee celebration, a bronze tablet to the memory of Father Hof was unveiled. This tablet hangs on the wall of the main hallway of the present church.

In 1919, Pastor Frederick Niebuhr, also bilingual, started his work with about 100 members, many of whom were not residents of Newark. During this time, land was bought at the corner of S. 20th street and 18th avenue, on the Irvington line. The first section of the new building was dedicated in November 1921. Church services and Sunday School started encouraging growth, and the main auditorium was dedicated in 1924. During Pastor Niebuhr's final year as evangelist, Evangelist "Mac" Bergson conducted a radio program on Sunday evenings from the church auditorium, called the "Evangel Hour," which attracted many visitors to the church.

The pioneers of Mr. Bergson proved to be a period of great growth, especially in the area of young people's work, and worldwide missionary interest and giving. He later became director of the Conservative Baptist Foreign Mission Society.

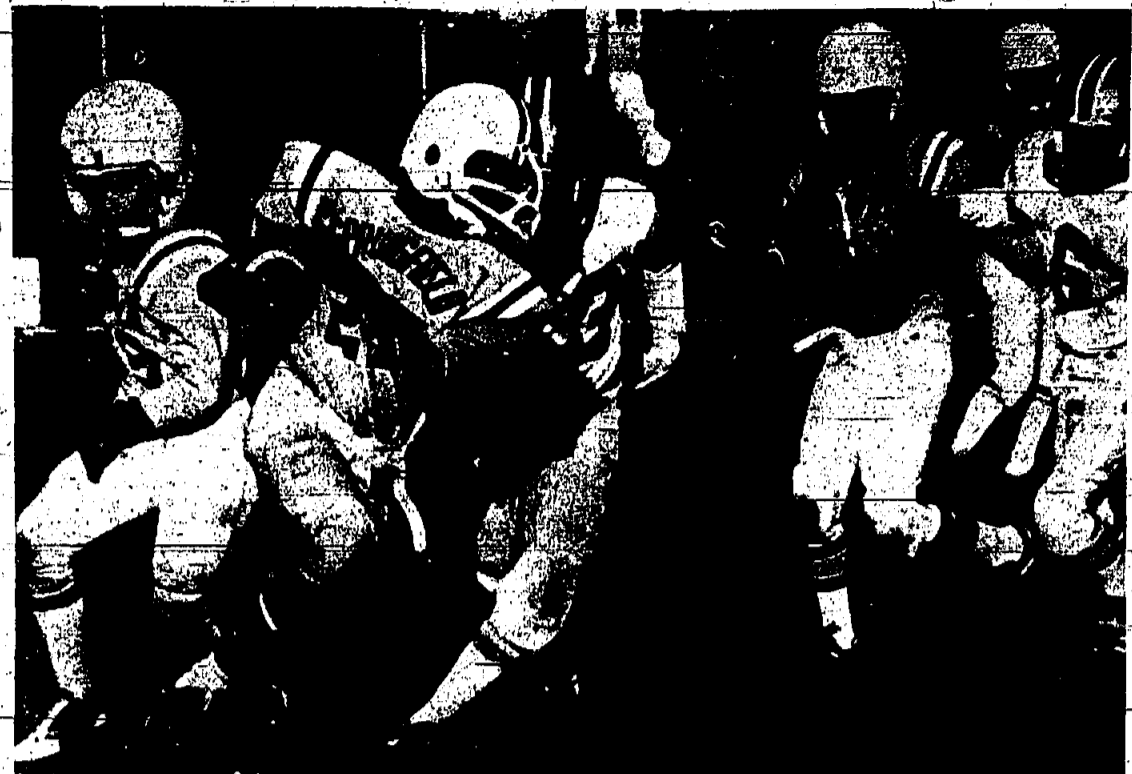

The drug phenylcyclidine (PCP) is commonly called "angel dust" because of its effects on the hospitalized at least 1000 young persons in one major U.S. city during the last three years.

The young people showed schizophrenic-like symptoms after use of PCP and described its effects as sensations of numbness, extreme suspiciousness, feelings of isolation and an inability to control their thoughts and actions.

Phenylcyclidine was originally developed as an anesthetic. In the late 1950s, but its use was abandoned because of the drug's erratic and unpleasant side effects.

According to a report issued by the National Institute on Drug Abuse, the illicit drug can cause visual and auditory hallucinations, feelings of apathy and estrangement, drowsiness, inability to speak, delirium, abdominal cramps, vomiting, and in some instances, coma and death.

The drug is legally restricted to use as an animal tranquilizer.

Depending on the amount taken, PCP may act as a stimulant, depressant or hallucinogen. Frequently, the purchaser of PCP believes he is buying another drug — it is often sold as or mixed with other drugs such as mescaline, LSD, or cocaine, or sprinkled on marijuana. When sold in capsules, PCP is called "peace pill" or "hog." In powder form it is called "angel dust."

Unlike the usual schizophrenics, PCP users generally have no history of psychosis and respond much slower to treatment.

According to a federal report, PCP has replaced LSD as the primary hallucinogen sought by drug abusers. First observed in New Jersey in 1967, PCP under a variety of labels had spread to New York and other major cities by 1969. Today, the dangerous PCP is available in most parts of the United States.

2 grants given to Dr. Bardell

Dr. David Bardell of Elizabeth, a faculty member in the Biology Science Department at Kean College has received two research grants this year.

The National Science Foundation has granted \$3,300 which will be matched from a non-federal source. The American Philosophical Society has granted \$1,000 through its Percece Fund.

The monies from the National Science Foundation and its matching fund will be used in the purchase of equipment needed to implement a course in immunology.

The American Philosophical Society grant will be used in a project to determine the damaging effect of adrenoviruses on human cells. The project is in the field of virology, a new division of microbiology.

The program, consisting of individual therapy supplemented by group counseling under the direction of Dr. Joyce C. Heller, a faculty member in the Department of Special Education and Individualized Services at the college.
