NOVEMBER STATE REFERENDA GIVE VOTERS LAWMAKING VOICE

New Jersey voters will have an opportunity on Nov. 7 to participate in all three types of referenda questions authorized by the State Constitution. The result of the shift transfers from county governments to the state the costs of operating county district courts in each of the 21 counties.

Maguire faults Byrne on funds for highways

A failure of the State Department of Transportation to spend over \$500 million in monies made available for construction projects is a major reason the state is "shortchanged" in receiving additional federal aid, according to Republican Assemblyman William J. Maguire of Clark. He said Gov. Brendan Byrne "misled" the voters when the money is "gathered in" in various state banks.

Maguire said the money is "gathered in" in various state banks. "How can New Jersey expect to get its fair share of available federal monies when she sits on funds already received?" Maguire asked. "I am not at all surprised that Urban Mass Transportation Administration (UMTA) associate administrator John Taylor has warned the state we will have a 'rough time' acquiring aid monies in the future."

Maguire noted that Byrne, during a debate with former State Senator Raymond H. Berman last year, had said the monies were "allocated to specific projects," implying they would be spent to improve the state's rail and highway transit facilities.

"That apparently didn't tell the whole story," Maguire said. "The dollars spent only 41 percent of the dollars available, leaving over \$500 million unspent despite our highest in the nation unemployment rate and the desperate need we have for mass transit and highway improvement."

Maguire said the state DOT was "a disservice" to the state's former Commissioner. He said he has "high hopes" that the new commissioner, Louis Gambacorti, will receive a "high degree of competence" in the department.

"It is particularly important that New Jersey take advantage of our existing allocations from the federal highway trust fund, complete our Interstate and state-imposed tolls, and mass transit in the central corridor," he said. "We are in poor shape indeed when federal officials who hold the purse strings look at our program and call us 'inept.'"

Maguire said the \$500 million had accumulated over several years but remain unspent. "In this period of double-digit inflation, we will eventually get a rate of least brick and mortar for every year wanted," he said.

Another question involves a constitutional amendment of the gambling section to give the Legislature power to authorize state-regulated jai alai games with pari-mutuel betting. Net proceeds to the state from jai alai meetings would have to be used to relieve municipal real property taxes in those counties in which meetings are operated.

Remaining three referenda involve approval of a new state general obligation debt of \$25 million bond issue for the state's school construction program to be used for developing master plans to control facilities; a \$10 million bond issue for planning and construction of public buildings for four of the state's executive departments; and a complex financing question which involves state guarantee of a \$17 million bond issue of the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority to refinance the initial Meadowlands Sports Complex.

Awaiting final action by both the Senate and General Assembly and the Governor is another bond question for a \$20 million authorization for purchase and development of lands for recreation and conservation purposes—Green Acres.

Although the ballot questions cleared the Legislature with little opposition, it is important for citizens to understand all aspects of the questions. The New Jersey Taxpayers Association, as part of its role of informing citizens about governmental operations and finance, will provide background information on each question in a series of columns prior to the November election.

IN CONGRESS

This same approach has been successful on a regional basis. As an at-large delegate to the Northeast-Midwest Economic Advancement Coalition, I have worked with members of Congress from New England and the Midwest to persuade Congressional committees and federal agencies to develop new aid formulas that reflect the growing economic problems in these regions.

Stanley, contacted by the Leader on Tuesday, said the Springfield case is the "first I've heard about" since the July 21 meeting. "I didn't ask the police chiefs to contact me about each one, so there might have been others."

Municipal prosecutors handle alleged blue-law violations, which are minor "disorderly person" offenses that do not reach the county court system where Stanley and his staff prosecute more serious charges. Stanley said he spoke to the police chiefs in his other role as the county's chief law-enforcement officer.

At Channel's main office in Whippany, a spokesman said Tuesday that company policy prohibits non-attorney executives from making statements on a court case.

"I haven't been authorized to speak for the corporation," Irwin Hoffer, vice-president for operations, explained. "But I can speak for myself and personally, I think the statute is people get to vote on this (blue law), the better."

Hoffer said he will personally join the lobby asking Trenton for legislation "that would bring this to a referendum and allow the people to make the decision" on whether the blue law should stay on the books in each affected county.

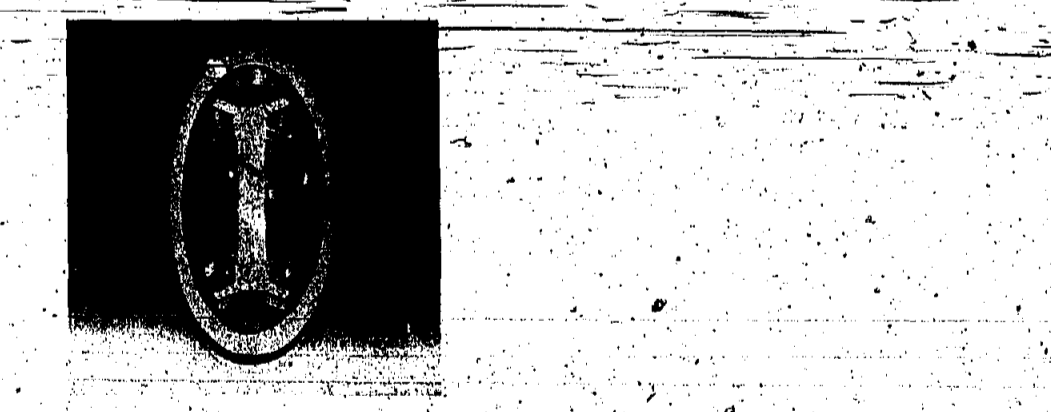

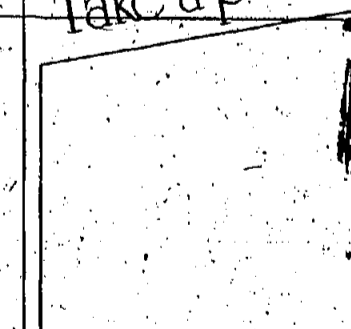

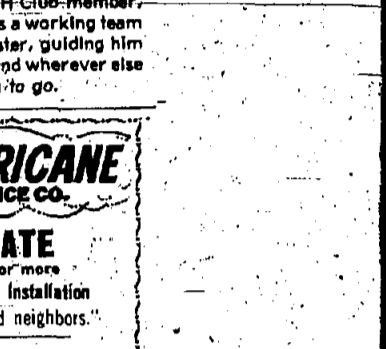
