Schools dominate headlines during '78

The year 1978 will be remembered in Springfield as a year in which most of the headlines were generated by school-related issues. The latest controversy was settled for the first time last month when the Board of Education voted to keep all schools open for the 1978-79 school year. However, the board made no promise to the 1980-81 year, so with enrollment continuing to decline, future school boards can expect to grapple with the question of consolidation. The school board lost a battle to amend the mandated 1978-79 budget and was forced to operate within a \$2.8 million limit instead of \$3.8 million. The board gained the younger members in Springfield history when voters elected Lt. Governor Jim and Nancy Heller. Other school-related issues included funding for an eight-grade class trip, a lawsuit to abolish class ranking, and the selection of a new athletic director and football coach. The latter pair, Charles Sanchez and Joseph Salvo, respectively, failed to land around Dayton Regional's football fortunes as the Bulldogs went 0-2-4 this fall. Outside of the school, opponents of Rt. 78 managed to get through another year of stalling completion of the Interstate highway link; an all-Democratic Township Committee during the one year of WILLIAM RUCCO regained a seat on the governing board, and various citizens of the year awards went to Joseph Crispino (Amico), the Rev. Edward Oehlberg (UNICO) and Seymour Rosenthal (Chamber of Commerce). Oehlberg, assistant pastor of St. James Church for more than 22 years, was later named pastor of a church in Park Ridge. 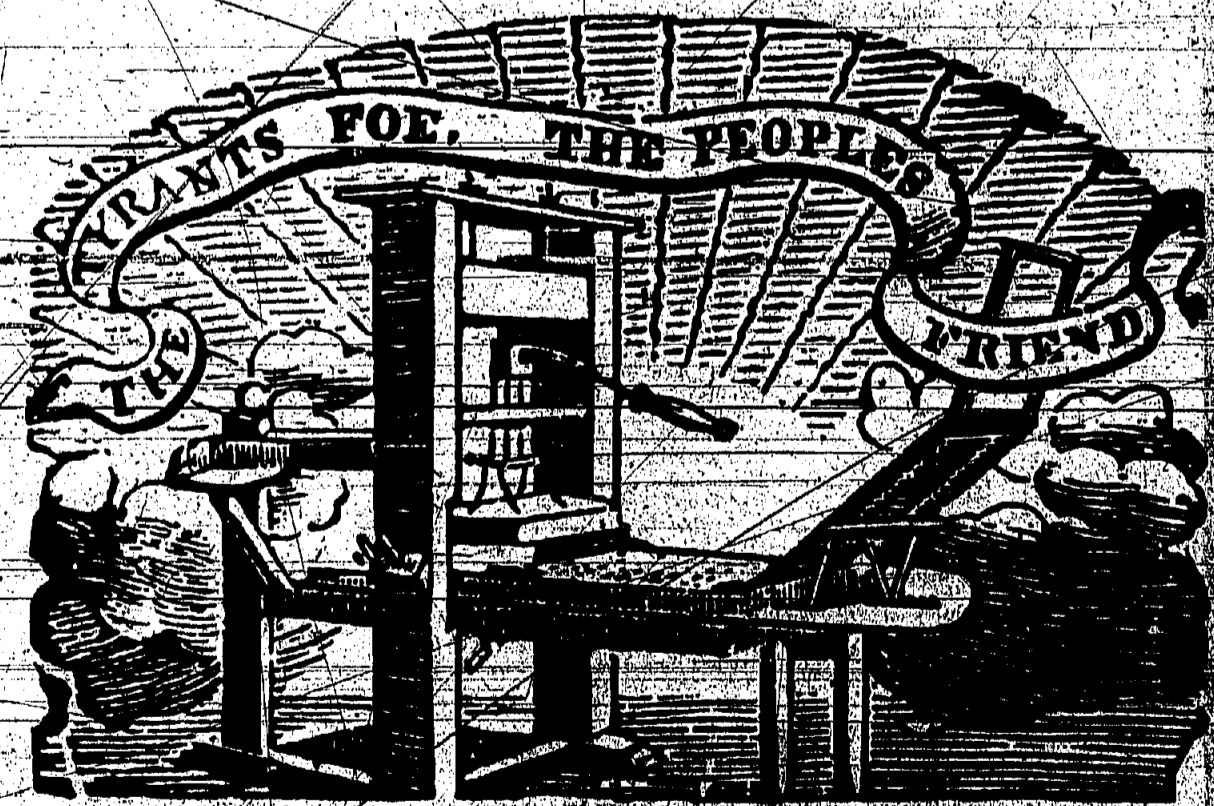
Recycling push urged for '79

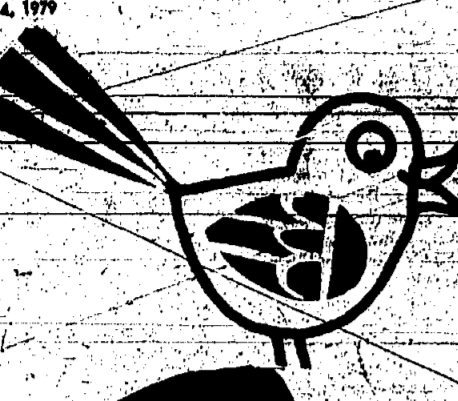
