Deaf children think creatively, says poet

Deaf children are able to think as creatively as those who hear, according to the results of a new book published by the New Jersey State Council on the Arts. The book, "Elastic Ideas: A Rough, Crazy Weather," was written by Stephen Dunn, assistant professor of creative writing, following a four-day visit with students at the Ketchikan School for the Deaf in Trenton. The book includes poems by the deaf children. Despite their inability to hear, Dunn found that the students had remarkable imaginations. "The students had a spontaneous response that surprised all of us," noted the poet. "It showed that the students had tremendous imaginative energy in the territories of the United States was forever prohibited."

State ousts housing board, cites conflict

The state has taken over the Springfield Senior Citizens Housing (SCH) Inc. because, a federal official says, it was a conflict of interest for the Township Committee to control appointments to the board of the nonprofit corporation.

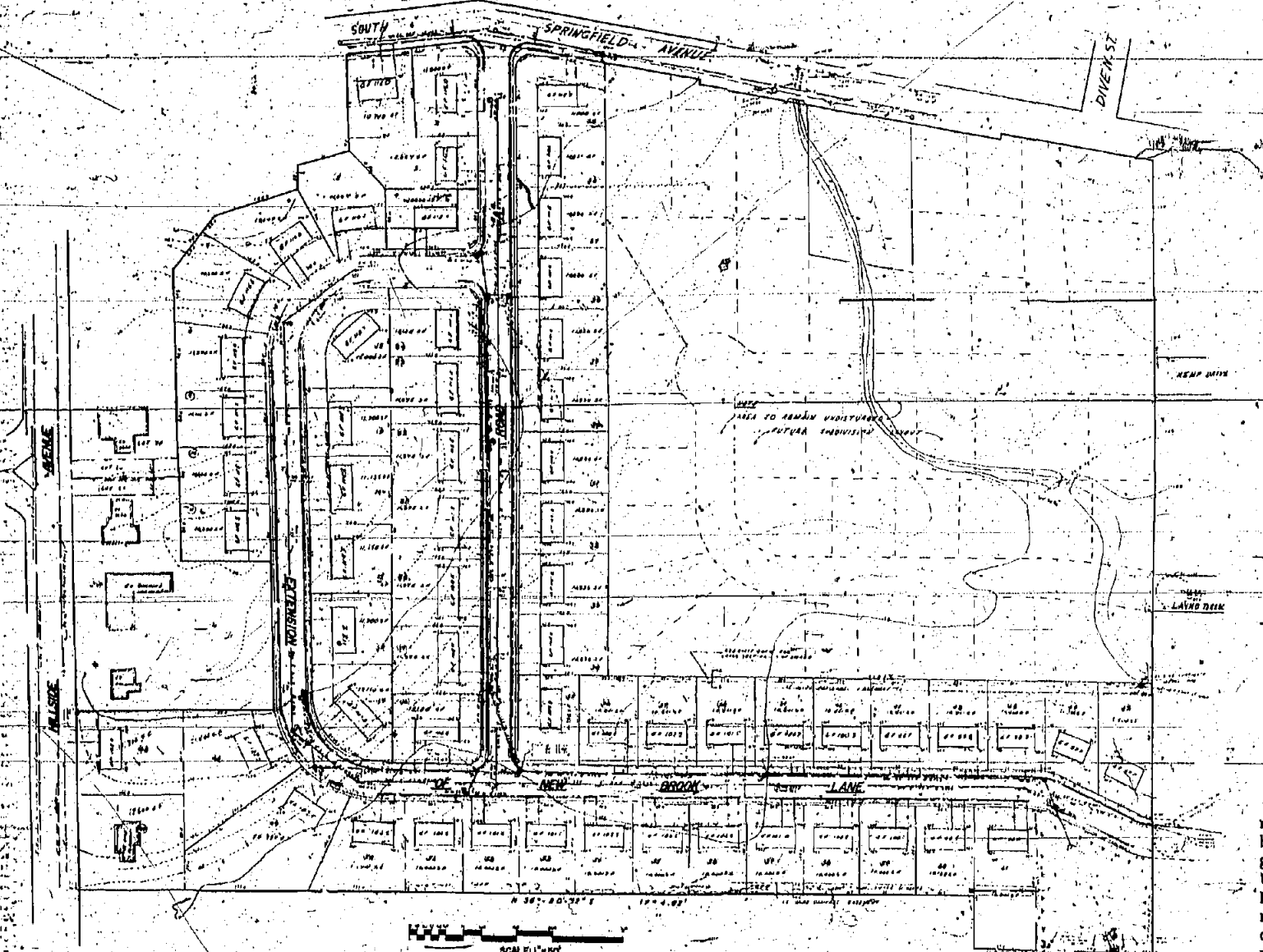
The New Jersey Housing Finance Agency (NJHFA) removed the entire Springfield housing board and appointed some of its own officials as interim trustees of the nonprofit corporation, which is scheduled to open a \$4.9 million apartment complex this month between S. Springfield Avenue and Nelson Avenue.

The state's action "will in no way jeopardize occupancy" of the apartments, according to Beatrice Einstein, president of the Springfield board whose members were ousted. Federal intervention, which prompted the takeover by the state, apparently was a victory for Einstein and her supporters in an old dispute with the Township Committee over control of the nonprofit corporation.

While technically ousting the Springfield members from the housing board, the state immediately asked them to propose a reorganization plan for the corporation within 30 days—a plan virtually certain to strip the Township Committee of sole power over appointments. The state also kept the former board's rental agent on the job of screening prospective tenants. The project includes 123 apartments for persons 62 and older, as well as 13 apartments for handicapped tenants of any age.

The apartments were financed with a mortgage secured by an HUD-backed issue. The state issued the bonds after the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) promised so-called Section 8 subsidies so that each elderly or handicapped tenant will pay no more than a fourth of his or her income as rent.

The apartments were built on land which the nonprofit corporation leased from the Township of Springfield after months of apparently bitter negotiations between the SCHC board and the municipal governing body. It was no secret that Einstein, charter president of the SCHC board, and her mayor, Joanne Rajoppi frequently clashed in the closed-door talks that led to the lease in 1977. (Rajoppi is now a county freholder and Democratic nominee for State Senate.)

The revised plan was scheduled for a hearing last Tuesday before the Springfield Planning Board, but board chairman Azeglio Pincanti Jr. postponed it until Aug. 7. He said neither the board nor the audience had been given sufficient time to examine the new plan, completed June 29. A spokesman for the audience of 50 people—most of them residents of New Brook Lane, Kemp drive and Lavy terrace—requested the delay.

Pool members sit on Committee as free use of chairs disappear

At least 100 members of the municipal swimming pool are "extremely aggravated" that chairs have not been provided this year, a spokesman said. The Township Committee sits on the pool's governing body.

The spokesman, Saul Kornblum of the Hills Avenue, turned in a petition which, he said, had been signed by 150 of about 180 pool users whom he approached.

"Most people said they were as annoyed as I was that the chairs are missing," reported Kornblum, who said members received no explanation but rumors about the chairs' disappearance.

Index of crime rose 11 percent

WASHINGTON, D.C.—Crime reported to law enforcement agencies in the United States rose 11 percent during the first quarter of 1979 when compared with the same period of 1978, Attorney General Griffin B. Bell has announced.

Increase in both the violent and property crime categories of the Crime Index were noted in Uniform Crime Reports statistics released by J. Edgar Hoover, director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

"There have been indications that the level of crime is rising and this significant upswing is very disturbing," Bell said. "The need for vigorous efforts at all levels of law enforcement to reduce the volume of crime, especially violent crime—is evident."

Collectively, the number of violent index crimes was up 17 percent. All offenses within that category increased. Murder rose nine percent, forcible rape 11 percent, robbery 10 percent, and aggravated assault 17 percent.

As a group, the index's property crimes increased 11 percent; burglary increased 11 percent and motor vehicle theft rose 15 percent.

Statistics regarding arson, a newly established index crime, has begun but data is not yet available.

In cities with populations of more than 50,000, reported crime was up 11 percent. Suburban areas experienced a 13 percent increase, rural areas scored a 6 percent rise. In cities outside metropolitan areas, the recorded rise was 13 percent.

College to train aides for deaf

Lincoln College, whose work has been hampered by their state's first degree program in interpreting with deaf people. The college is offering a certificate program in 1979 semester. The program can lead to either an Associate in Applied Science degree or a two-year program, or to the one-year certificate. The program, broader in scope, includes courses in deafness and human services, but also in the liberal arts.

In addition, evidence from similar programs elsewhere in the country shows that the demand for trained professionals, but once there are few of them in an area, they are available and their services become known to the population at large. The program is aimed primarily at people who will be working in admissions hot line, 272-human service fields but also in other areas.

Rainfall in June under 3 inches

The total rainfall for June was 2.61 inches, with 36 inches falling on June 11, compared to the 8.76 inches recorded in 1972, the wettest June on record, and slightly more than the 1.06 in 1963.

Through the end of June, 28.61 inches of rain, snow or sleet fell in 1979. Only 1972 recorded more, 32.09 inches of overall precipitation, in the first half of the year.

Average humidity for the past month was 65.72 percent with a maximum of 80 percent June 3 and a minimum of 37 percent June 14.

June 12 was the coldest day of the month with a degree reading chillingly close to the lowest temperature record set in 1979 with 28 degrees.

On the opposite end of the temperature scale, the high for the month, 82 degrees recorded June 16, was only nine degrees less than the record high for June, recorded in 1961 and 1968.

Thunder rumbled in the area on five days last month. Fog rolled in one day and there was one day of damaging local winds.

FTC director to talk on federal laws, rules

Leroy C. Richie, than 30 consumer affairs Credit Reporting Act, regional director of the Federal Trade Commission, will be the keynote speaker at a consumer affairs conference of state, county and municipal consumer affairs directors Thursday, July 19, at Union College, Cranford.

The Union County conference will be the first of a series of similar conferences in other counties.
