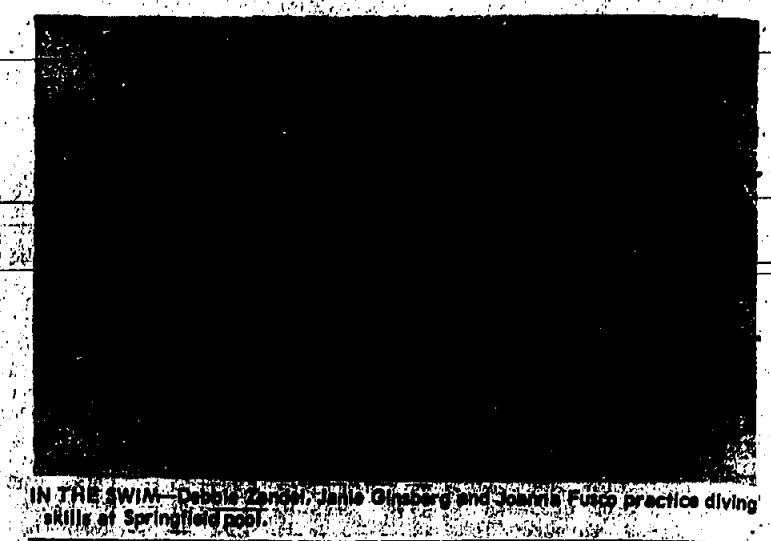

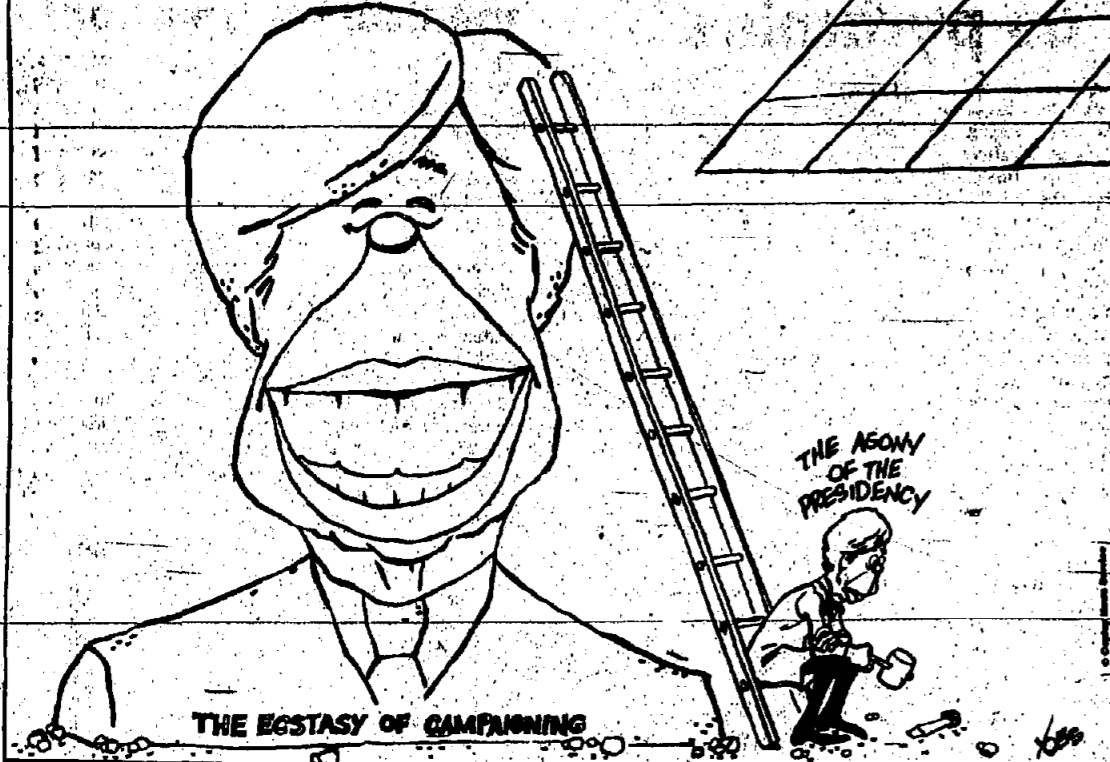

Public library Art authority

AN UNPARALLELED ART CRITIC
"Ernest Berenson,"
by Ernest Samuel

The subject of this biography had, for more than half a century, "reigned as the world's foremost connoisseur of Italian Renaissance art." For his contribution to the international world of art he was, on his 90th birthday in 1955, awarded medals, honorary degrees, prestigious society memberships and honorary citizenships.

The son of a poor Jewish peddler, Berenson was born in Lithuania in 1885, spent his childhood in Boston, attended Harvard and planned to become a writer. Sponsored by friends, he went abroad, and—inspired by Walter Pater, William James and Giovanni Morelli—he turned to the special study of art. He gradually became skilled in detecting counterfeit art and in explaining its deep love and appreciation for the great art.

Berenson's forte as the foremost art authority lay in establishing the financial stability of his country by purchasing and selling art. He was the first to buy the Vatican's collection of Raphael's "The School of Athens" and to sell it to the United States.

His friendship with Mary Cassatt, their friendship and ultimate marriage and her contribution to his success were of immeasurable importance. Traveling (London, Paris, USA), essay-writing on art, lecturing, acquiring notable art works, entertaining intellectuals and dignitaries from all over the world, covered the early years of his life.

Every crime against a person is an act of violence against the self, no matter what the nature of the attack may be: assault, murder, rape, robbery, burglary, pocket-picking or purse-snatching. And no less painful than physical harm is the emotional injury—both of which require long periods of adjustment. It is during this difficult time that the victim needs comfort and help.

Victims need to know that their experience is not unique. They require specific information concerning the police and the courts; their trauma should be alleviated by the knowledge that their family and friends care about their condition.

In most situations presented by the media (especially TV) the victims are usually brought to justice. Unfortunately this is not so in real life. Some victims, waiting this way or even better in a room, are crying, considering if an execution in justice. The criminal may not be caught, he may not be convicted, he may not be granted a lighter sentence by pleading guilty (plea-bargaining). 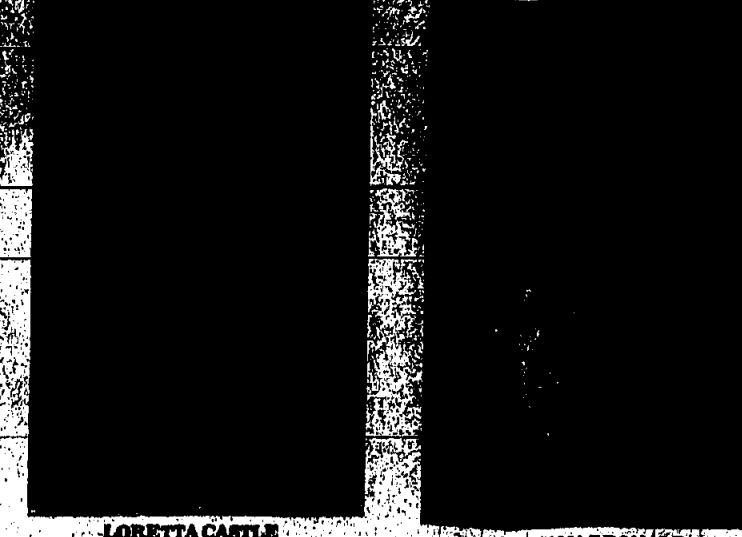

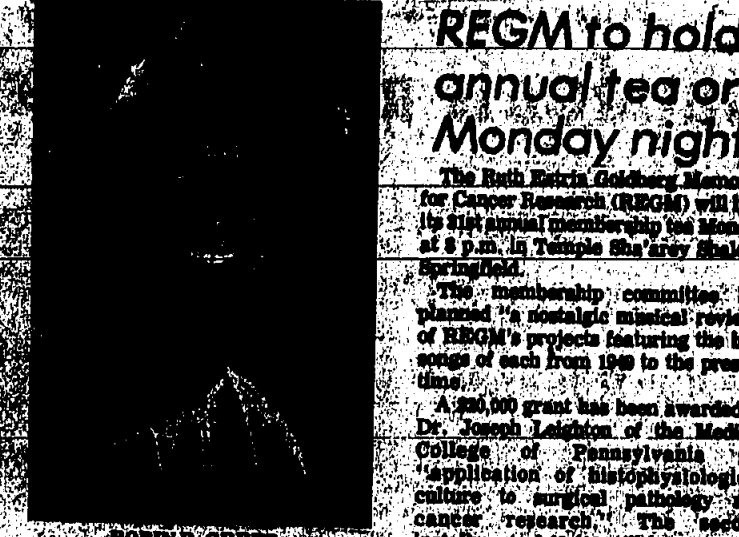
