Springfield Township Committee was punctuated by three heated debates between individual residents and committee members when the Tuesday night meeting was opened to public

Francis Crossett objected to Quik-Chek, a convenience grocery store on Mountain avenue, saying the store staved open past the township's 9 p.m. closing time. Crossett, who lives around 6 a.m., insisting that a township ordinance lists opening time as 7 a.m. Crossett has objected to the store since it was first proposed some five years

Committee member Robert Weltchek said the store owners were given a summons for staying open after 9 and have complied with the township's closing time since. Crossett insisted that Weltchek

assured him opening time would be 6 a.m. The resident aimed, what he called, "a dangerous question" at Weltchek, shouting, "Who are you covering up for?" "That's a rotten term and I resent it," replied the committee member, while shouting.
