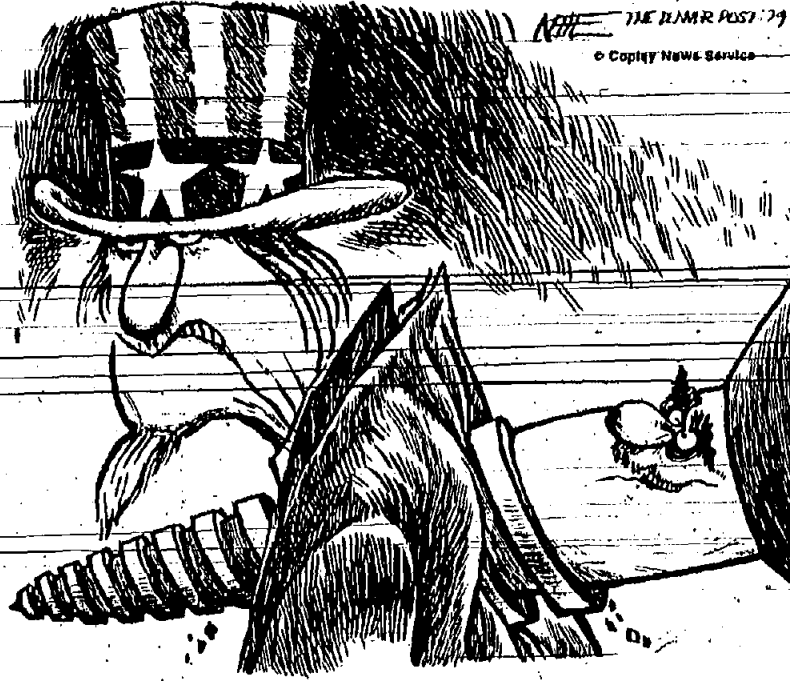

Since her father Jim was a staff member of Hearst's International Service, Dorothy Kilgallen's talent for writing and reporting came naturally. 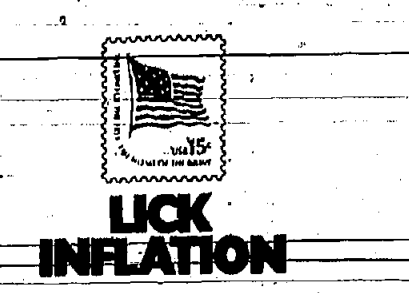
