He or she graduates from the local schools with two assets—all the knowledge that specific rson can absorb and the confidence that he or she is impo

The high school district, with four schools serving six towns, provides a wide range of courses, and levels of in-struction, which no one school could make available to any one of the six small towns. Our teenagers are fortunate in being offered instruction in so many specialized fields and at so

many achievement levels.

With the state budget cap hanging over the dollars and cents decisions like the spirit of Ebenezer Scrooge, we can be sure that ou<del>r tax money is well speht.</del> And for those who no longer have children in the schools, the skimpy increases which will be on the ballot will certainly be outwelghed by the growth in the value of our houses.

### Please be counted

Now is the time, to adapt the cliche, for all good men to come to the aid of the counting. The national census will get under way later this month with questionnaires to be sent to

Besides a natural desire to stand up and be counted, we all have a direct\_financial interest in making sure that our numbers receive full weight. A great deal of federal financ-ing is distributed on the basis of population, particularly on

To phrase the matter another way, vox populi will gain U. S. largesse in accordance with the largeness of the populace. Much of the publicity concerning the need for a full count has been directed toward the inner city, where fragmented families and allens of uncertain status have tended to avoid the census takers. At the same time, residents of the more affluent suburbs are subject to the same deadly inertia which can turn too many of us into non-persons. In addition, New Jersey faces a serious threat of the loss of

at least one congressional seat as the result of national population shifts. Perhaps, just perhaps, a united effort to count all our noses might avert the loss of one, or even two, volces in congress.

We should also anticipate a re-shuffling of state legislative districts. The alignment is badly gerrymandered enough right now, and we would be well advised to prevent it from

The one thing each of us must do is fill out the questionnaire and mail it in as quickly as possible. For reasons ranging rom civic pride to protection of our pocketbooks, everyone has a direct interest in achieving a full count.

In many ways, anyone who falls to be counted will be thrown into the garbage heap until 1990. That'a a long time to
