





Everyone regrets the loss of a major business, but the damage goes much further than that. he store was the only sopermarket within walking distance for the many elderly persons living in and around the Morris Avenue shopping center. Its closing placed a heavy burden on all the senior citizens who can no longer dea with additional problems, financial or physical:

The township took one major step to mitigate the crisis, rescheduling the senior citizen bus to provide more, and more frequent, stops at the nearest lood markets. The smaller food stores have done what they could, but they are not really set up as a prime food source.

We hear constant rumors that the Township Committee

and other agencies and individuals are seeking a new tenant for the empty building. All we can do is hope that a new supermarket, particularly one with general services suitable for senior citizens, can be found, and quickly. The basic task of survival is hard enough for many of our elderly neighbors, with incomes eroded by inflation and homes requiring ever more care. All the rest of us should do

The ratings might have some slight effect in encouraging the mediocre districts to try a little harder (with budget caps, they can't really spend more).

The same ratings will do nothing at all about making the best schools even better. They are already doing as well as the made-in-Trenton strait ackets will permit. And the unsatisfactory ratings will do nothing but harm. They will hasten the flight to the suburbs of those citizens,

After all, when a youngster finds himself with inferior housing, interior refuse collection, inferior police protection and now officially interior schools, it is hard to make him procedures available to help a school system do a better lob. volving more state aid and more municipal desire. But

forcing victims to wear yellow stars will never give them much of a chance to get out of the ghetto. The other step backwards is the announcement of a battery of compulsory courses, without which students will be ineligible for an already downgraded diploma. English and mathematics are certainly vital, but any high school worthy of offering secondary education has been requiring such

Other courses such as art and help in choosing a career are. important, but only for those youngsters who want or could benefit from them. For others, they would simply waste time or take away precious hours where the students acquire specific information to meet their needs. In a society where a future doctor might have her mind

nade-up-in-the-third-grade, or a hairdresser be sure of his vocation in the 10th, job guidance would just be a blend of boredom and drudgery for such youngsters. Others, including those who will change their majors five times in four years of college, would greatly benefit from job
